

This year we are authorized to name our first new postwar building "Jenkins Hall" after our beloved "Pop" Jenkins. This year one new permanent building is started with others being planned.


This is the year of many interesting and stimulating student activities when our students have been hosts to many high school and adult groups.






When they beat the Southern Oregon eleven in the first part of the season, it looked as though they were going to be the conference champions, but the breaks were stacked against them.




