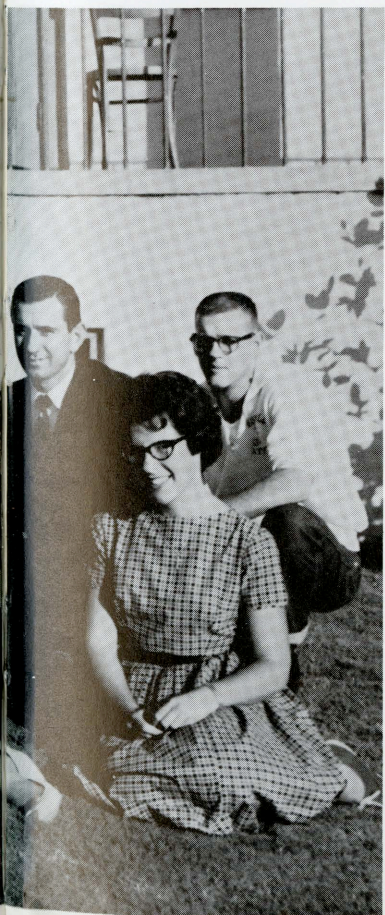
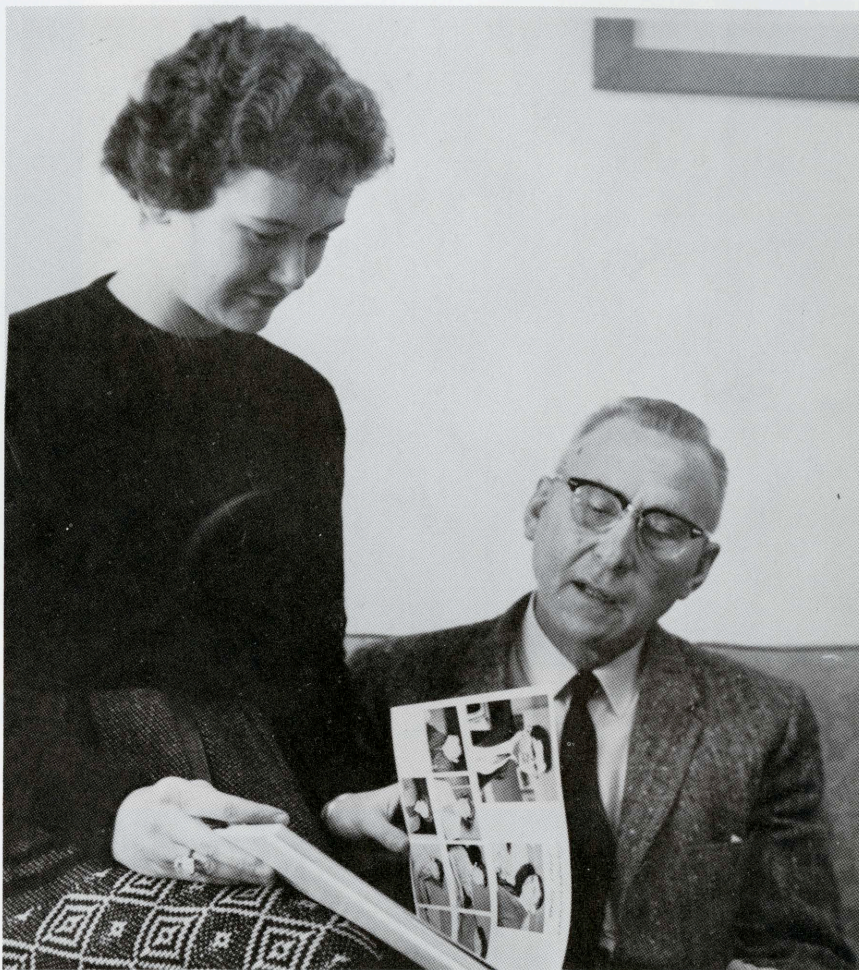


Freddie Slack, Eureka real estate man was chosen Dad of the year for the 1961 Dads' Day.

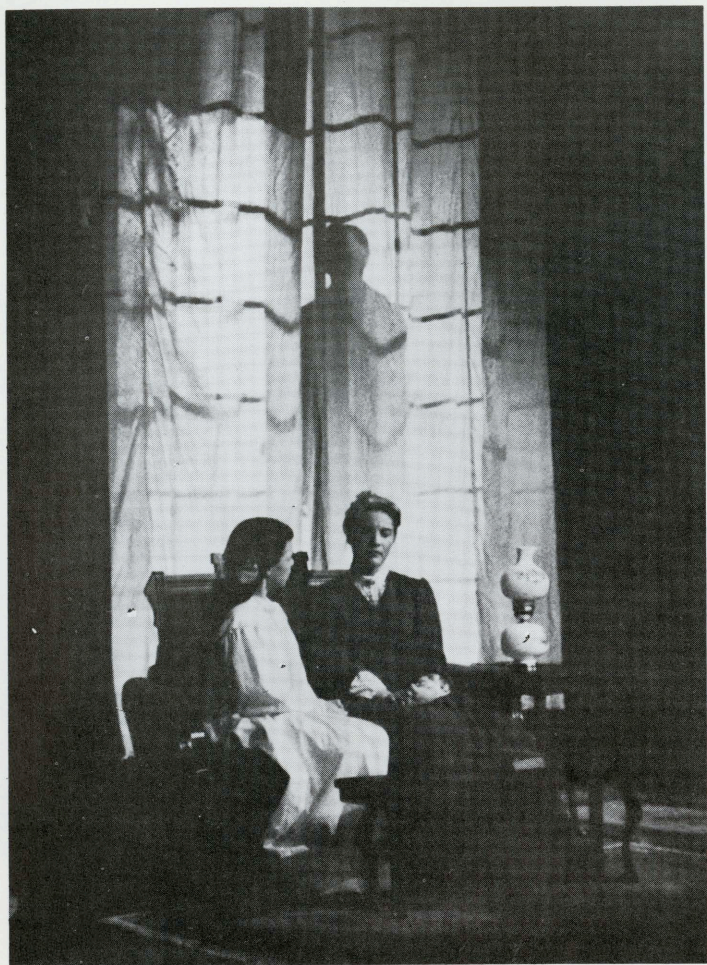
Program Notes
