WATER PROJECT COST NEEDS INVESTIGATING

According to Mayor Quinn's radio address it must have been awfully hot in that Washington, D.C., hotel which lacked an air conditioning system.

Perhaps the voters and citizens of Eureka will be hot after this rain storm, when the cloudy waters of Mad River Dam come flowing through the faucets due to the lack of a filter system.

A RIDDLE

After Mayor Quinn's lengthy address over the radio, there seems to be more confusion about the water project costs than there was before.

On November 8, 1934, the City dads approved an Ordinance incurring a bonded indebtedness of \$959,000. This was to pay for the completion of a reservoir on Mad River, conduits therefrom, and a regulating reservoir in Eureka. It was pledged that the revenue derived from the water project was to pay for the principal and interest on the bonds, besides the cost of operation, maintenance and depreciation.

The original estimate of costs of the water project was \$1,134,000, of which the U. S. Government was to grant \$209,000 and the balance, \$925,000, to be raised by a bond issue.

Then, on June 23, 1937, the City dads approved another Ordinance incurring another bonded indebtedness, this time for \$625,000.

All told, approximately \$1,982,000 was raised through bonds, Government grant, etc.

TO DATE, MORE THAN \$2,074,000 HAS BEEN SPENT, AND THE PROJECT ISN'T FINISHED YET. No reservoir in Eureka. No filter system. But plenty of muddy water.

Mr. and Mrs. Taxpayer and Citizen: This riddle is a little deep. Will you try to figure it out?
