# NISKEY, LIMA, MOORE COME UNDER WIRE JUST BEFORE CLOSING PERIOD

Several last-minute candidacies were filed with City Clerk J. C. Barkdull yesterday, for the municipal election June 19, but the closing of the entry list left Mayor John F. Quinn with only one opponent, and three city officials unopposed.

Mayor Quinn, who was elected by the council in December, 1937, to succeed the late Frank R. Sweasey, will be opposed by H. R. Simmonds, well known Eureka business man.

Nominating petitions were filed yesterday by George Manson Moore, seeking election as city assessor in opposition to George F. Stewart; Jack Niskey, who became the fifth candidate to enter the race for superintendent of public works; and Albert J. Lima, who became the fourth to seek the fifth ward seat on the city council.

Without opposition when the filing period closed were J. C. Barkdull, city clerk and tax collector; E. S. Mitchell, city attorney; and Mrs. Shirley M. Putnam, city treasurer.

Moore, the new candidate for assessor, is a former councilman and has run for various other city offices.

Niskey has been dispatcher, business agent, and secretary of the local unit of the International Longshoremen's and Warehousemen's Union for the past five years and is on the Pacific coast district board of the I. L. W. U. He is familiar with all lines of construction work and spent a year and a half in France during the World war, he said, adding that his petition was signed hurriedly after he agreed to run at 3 o'clock yesterday afternoon.

Lima was a defendant on a charge of rioting, following fatal disorders at the entrance to a local mill in June, 1935, but none of the scores of persons arrested at that time were convicted.

The complete list of candidates is as follows:

Mayor, John F. Quinn, incumbent, and H. R. Simmonds,

Councilman, first ward, Dr. H. H. Stuart, incumbent, and Anthony Massel.

Councilman, second ward, G. H. Schulze, incumbent, and Angelo Franceschi.

Councilman, third ward, John W.
