





Eviction Prevention Program

There are two programs providing rent and mortgage assistance. One is through the City of Eureka, and one is through the county. If you live in the city limits, you apply to the city program. If you live outside of Eureka city limits, you use the County Program.

The contact person for the City of Eureka program is Kristen @ 707-441-4209. You don't have to provide a social security number to apply. You do have to prove a decrease in hours/pay due to COVID. You also have to show proof of employment which could be a pay stub or a letter from the employer. They have applications in Spanish. To have an appointment in Spanish you need to schedule in advance to ensure interpretation services are available. This program offers up to \$2500.

The number for the County of Humboldt Program is 1-877-410-8809. It is through social services. This program provides up to \$5000.
