



English 318: Rhetoric for Writers Wild Tongues Cannot Be Tamed: Writing Identity into Research

This course examines how academic writing, storytelling, and cultural contexts are intimately connected, inviting us to write into and from our reality. We'll explore literary and personal essays, multimedia texts, physical spaces as cultural texts, and even our own writing, to analyze the relationships of rhetoric, language, and writing to race, culture, gender, class, and accessibility. Ethnic Studies 245: Hip Hop & the Black Experience Tim'm West. Wed 17:00-19:50. Sync

By centering voices that are systematically forced to Hip Hop's margins, the course will navigate around a critical question: How might elevating counternarratives in Hip Hop culture illuminate the relationship between Blackness and the struggle for political, social and economic empowerment? This DCG-d class will count for Ethnic Studies and MQS minors and majors, and for the Ethnic American Literatures minor

About the instructor:

Poet and hip-hop artist Tim m West embraces the power of words to challenge ideas of masculinity and race. A hip-hop scholar, he is featured in many awardwinning documentaries, including Pick Up the Mic, Hip Hop: Beyond Beats and Rhymes, and Mario Van Peebles' Bring Your 'A' Game. With degrees from Duke University, The New School for Social Research, and Stanford University, he is the author of several books and hip-hop projects, and is widely anthologized. West's first book, Red Dirt Revival: a poetic memoir in 6 Breaths, continues to be read in college classrooms nationwide, including HSU. West currently leads Teach For America's national LGBTQ Community Initiative, advancing safer and braver classrooms for LGBTO students and their educators.

American culture emerge anyway, frequently offering an alternative site for reading the nation and its contradictions.

We'll begin with poetry carved in the walls of Angel Island immigration detention center and John Okada's groundbreaking novel No-No Boy, and continue with fiction, memoir, poetry, and spoken word by a range of contemporary writers including novelist Jessica Hagedorn, queer disability justice activist Leah Lakshmi Piepzna-Samarasinha, and poets Bao Phi, Franny Choi, Ishle Yi Park, and Chen Chen.

EN/ES 336 is a domestic DCG course and fulfills requirements for English, Ethnic Studies, and the interdisciplinary minor in Ethnic American Lit.







 <u>Academic Peer Coaching</u>

 Peer to peer coaching is now available to help students identify and use effective academic strategies in their practice. Coaching is offered on a first-come, first-served basis.

Connected Tutoring -Tutors are now paired with specific courses and sections so students can get to know and find their course's tutor easily. In addition, the ERE department is partnering with the Learning Center to offer embedded tutoring for select courses.
