"This book approaches the complex phenomenon of *deictics* in a new light, by reporting not only on the textual marks left by an instance of enunciation, but also on the movement and process of *deictization*. On the one hand, it offers a fundamental theoretical and epistemological reflection; on the other hand, it calls on very varied case studies based on authentic corpora taken in their entirety and complexity. It goes beyond verbal language, first by tackling visual and syncretic languages, and then, by focusing on interactional practices."
