1. No student who is on probation may represent Humboldt State College in a public appearance of any organized student activity. The term "organized student activity" shall be interpreted to include:

(a) Competitive Athletics

(b) Dramatic Performances (c) Musical Performances

Probation, as defined by the recently adopted plan of probation and disqualification, is "any student who drops below a cumulative average of "C" (i.e. an index of "1") shall be given a warning notice, a copy of which will be sent to his parents. If a student's scholarship index for a semester falls below .50 (midway between a "C" and a "D") he shall be placed upon probation for the
