Thursday, January 1, 1970

1st day - 364 days follow

Awake to a clear, ^{New Year's Day} beautiful day around 9:30. Late breakfast. John Heins phoned, then came out to talk over water problems.

With time out only for dinner. Bill and I worked steadily on our Christmas letters.

Just before bedtime we got things in order in the kitchen and dining room in preparation for early breakfast guests.

Friday, January 2, 1970

2nd day - 363 days follow

Lovely day. At 8:30 seven people arrived for a sourdough pancake breakfast - Dave, Connie, 2 students from Stanford and 2 Arcata based students - all active in the "ecology" organizations. Bill cooked while I served - and everyone was gone by 10 o'clock - back to their busy work at Dave's place.

Went to Iris and Lee's for dinner around 7 after a slight delay with others here for cocktails - Dave, Greg, etc.

Saturday, January 3, 1970

3rd day - 362 days follow

Somewhat cloudy.

Did some house cleaning and sealing. Prepared large macaroni salad for Lina's club potluck dinner.

Light rain began as we drove to Arcata at 6:15.

Fairly good turnout, about 30 people, for a vacation time meeting.

Ralph Holzinger was asked at last minute to do a slide program when it was learned that the slides for the scheduled program had not been brought down from Prairie Creek.

Dave gave brief run-down on proposed freeway routing around Fed. Smith State Park. Ken Lytle covered Snow Mt. Wildflowers / Sealing.

This was the first time for me to conduct a meeting as new chairman for this year.

Afterwards we stopped by Dave's where we found Ray Peart, Greg Krall & the group of students.

Sunday, January 4, 1970

4th day - 361 days follow

Phoned David Bartlett - his birthday.

Robin & Butch MacLarter here for dinner.

Monday, January 5, 1970

5th day - 360 days follow

Lovely day. ^{Cool.} Anthea phoned early to cancel
our dinner with her tonight - touch of flu?

Went up to David's place after lunch to
cut stencils and run off mimeo copies of extra
"Xmas letters." - about two Larus work.

Tuesday, January 6, 1970

6th day - 359 days follow

Beautiful day - cool and ^{Epiphany} crispy. Frost on deck.

Showed the Huff's place to two different people during day, which kept me trapping - one a teacher at C. of Redwoods, the other a teacher at Trinidad.

Came here for dinner.

Wednesday, January 7, 1970

7th day - 358 days follow

Up by 8:30. Very, very windy all morning - and cloudy.

Spent most of time dismantling Christmas tree and packing things away in the attic.

Anthe brought a young couple down to look at the Huff Lane, after which they enjoyed our living room view briefly.

Thursday, January 8, 1970

8th day - 357 days follow

Cloudy, but quite warm. Showers threatened.
10 o'clock tee-off time at Baywood. Foursome
included Helen Clancy, Maria Hassenauer and Charlotte
Harkin. From 1:30 to 2:30 we got caught by rain, but
played out last three holes anyway.

Dave came in with some (Jed. Smith) long map
lettering to do, stayed for dinner and we were
joined by Chuck Kennedy.

Friday, January 9, 1970

9th day - 356 days follow

Raining - windy. Up by 7:45. Bill off for
school before 10. Dave showed up to
work on "flyer" about Jed. Smith freeway
hearings. I typed his rough drafts, then we
went to his place for final typing. Then off to the
printer in Eureka - pouring rain. Came back to car to
find dead battery. Then we sat until tow truck arrived
to get us started. Headed for nearest garage. While repairs
took place we munched a hamburger at The Red Barn.
Finally got home again around 4:30.

Dave returned later for dinner. We dashed off
separately to attend an Audubon meeting at the
Ryan Bldg. in Eureka - from 8:15 - 11:00.

Much discussion about freeway planning at Jed.
Smith, led by Dave's presentation and recommended
route by Sierra Club. Finally the members voted to
support the Sierra Club's recommendation for a
"modified" orange line which would not touch the
park lands.

Back to the house for a hot drink and talk.
Headed for bed at 2 A.M.

Saturday, January 10, 1970

10th day - 355 days follow

Alarm set for 7. Ready to leave for "look-see" trip at Jed. Smith at 8:30. David Anderson and Duke Cairns went with us. Cloudy with light rain at times. 16 people met at the park entrance. We proceeded in 4 cars, Bill driving with Dave in lead car. I rode with two women from Del Norte Co. part of time.

Lunch in Simpson-Reed Grove and some walking around the area. Trip over by 2:30.

Stopped for coffee before leaving Crescent City. Picked up some groceries in preparation for surprise party for Dave. After quick change of clothes we returned to Dave's to find 25 people there, the place decorated, spaghetti cooking, etc. All great fun - and with good food and music.

Finally got home at 11 and headed straight to bed!

Sunday, January 11, 1970

11th day - 354 days follow

Cloudy, breezy and some rain.

Chained up kitchen (some things left since rush on Friday night) and finished up some long neglected ironing.

Went up to Dave's place at 2:30 and worked until after 5 on mailing project. Ken, Cheryl, Doug, Duke, Chuck and Greg also there.

Came home to change clothes, and with Bill returned to Dave's for dinner. ~~Stayed~~ Doug + Greg there.

Then all of us headed for the student organizational meeting for the April teach-in on the environment.

Back home by 11 to talk it over - over a warm drink.

Monday, January 12, 1970

12th day - 353 days follow

Raining, often quite hard. Went up to Davis for a couple of hours work on mailing. Came back home to do washing. Worked on statement for freeway hearing.

Dave popped in briefly before - and after a meeting at the college where he explained the proposed freeway routings.
In bed by 12.

Tuesday, January 13, 1970

13th day - 352 days follow

Cloudy with scattered showers.

Did some ironing before lunch.
Went to Arcata and Eureka for errands and shopping. Home by 4.

Went to Environmental Council (North coast) at 8 P.M. with Ken Lytle - at Ev Watkins home in Eureka. Meeting lasted until midnight. Raining. ~~For~~ (Gary Monroe took us from his place on Agate Hill to Eureka - pick up got stuck in soft road edge as we left Watkins place, but some one else with pick up pulled us out in short order -).

Dave got to meeting late - after talking freeway at Wildlife Group on campus.
Home by 1:30.

Wednesday, January 14, 1970

14th day - 351 days follow

Raining. Worked around house. Typed up statement for hearing. Haircut appt. 11 A.M.

Went to Crescent City at 6. Duke Cairns driving - Dave, two students and me.

Presented statement for Redwood Region Audubon Society before giving personal testimony. Capacity crowd at dining hall of El Del Norte Fair grounds. Mr. Loomis from Weaverville was hearing officer.

"Locals" supported "blue route" through park, "outsiders" supported routes north of park, still others asked that no freeway be considered in the area. Dave presented Sierra Club position and proposed "modified" orange route. This had many supporters.

Bill arrived late, with Greg. Both gave testimony.

Had late dinner (bacon & eggs) before returning home. Back at Moonstone 2 A.M.
Raining.

Thursday, January 15, 1970

15th day - 350 days follow

Shower. Cancelled golf game, but went out later to help with scoring - from 2-3. Only 12 women finished 18 holes.

Spent 2 hours (11-1) helping Dave on more mailing - and took stuff to Arcata post office on way to golf course.

Friday, January 16, 1970

16th day - 349 days follow.

Rain - after heavy. Rivers rising.

Spent 6 hrs. doing "Bitterroot" paste-up (from Missoulian series) for Dave.

Dave here for dinner - then we went to his place later to play Yahtzee awhile. Home by 1:30 - still raining.

Saturday, January 17, 1970

17th day - 348 days follow

Rain - heavy at times. ~~Dave left first~~
~~and~~ ~~hears on afternoon plane, but first brought~~
~~a "chicken" by pup-dog" sleeping bag down to~~
~~be mended locally.~~

Bill and I went shopping in Arcata from 2-4.

Prepared dinner for Andy and Emanuel, who arrived around 7. Pouring rain.

Dave and Greg came in for awhile around 9.

Howard King phoned from Eureka - on way to Orick.

Sunday, January 18, 1970

18th day - 347 days follow

Cloudy. Dave brought his sleeping bag down for a quick patch job - where the day had chewed it - before taking plane to SF. and Reno.

Howard King came for dinner and a wonderful evening of talk and looking at his collection of large photographs.

He presented us with a "space" of the gorgeous one we had framed -- of redwoods in Jd. Smith in early morning foggy light.

Monday, January 19, 1970

19th day - 346 days follow

Showers, heavy at times.

Went to McKinleyville before noon. Stopped for coffee with Shirley B.

Spent afternoon doing washing.

Shirley arrived around dinner time - so we had them join us - and spent the evening. Showed VHS slides.

Tuesday, January 20, 1970

20th day - 345 days follow

Raining. Spent most of morning doing washing.

Went to Board of Supervisors meeting from 3-4 - McKinleyville forming Community Services District. Raining hard all afternoon.

Home by 5:15. Found Bill and Howard King ahead of me - just arrived. Told Howard into staying for dinner and the night -- he on his way home.

Showed Montana slides. Greg dropped in briefly on way home from evening class. He left by 1.

Wednesday, January 21, 1970

21st day - 344 days follow

Apparently rained all night. Power went off sometime. Got up at 9:45 but clocks said 8:05!!

Bill made sourdough pancakes for breakfast. Howard and Bill were gone by noon.

Cleaned up kitchen, then clipped newspapers. Rain continued all day.

Steve popped in around dinner time - just off the jet flight from San Francisco - very weary and coming down with a cold. He stayed for dinner, which didn't take much coaxing.

Greg dropped in briefly - around 9:30 - then both left.

Read awhile then headed for bed - before midnight. Some heavy downpours during evening hours.

Thursday, January 22, 1970

22nd day - 343 days follow

Rained most of last night. We looked "drenched" by 8 A.M. Some gusty winds and light rain off and on during day. A few road closures in the county after nearly 2 in. of rain in 24 hr. period. Rivers high, but leveling off close to flood stage.

Afternoon spent catching up on some personal letter writing - some Xmas letters!

Martin & Jeff in for a bit around noon to talk about their house and renters. Received two phone calls from prospective renters.

After dinner we went up to Dave's to play Yahtzee and listen to some new records.

Home about 11.

Friday, January 23, 1970

23rd day - 342 days follow

Rain most of day. Worked on Sierra Club agenda for meeting and ~~that~~ read a few papers.

Bill got home around 6 - we gulped dinner and headed for Arcata by 7. Bill went to college (advisory to a group) but didn't locate meeting place, so came to Exec. Com. meeting at the Friendship Room.

All ~~but~~ Bert & Munchheimer present. Good meeting, lasted until almost 10:30.

Went up to Dave's later to play Yahtzee. Home by 1:30. Still raining.

Rivers coming up in all areas - near flood stage. Some roads blocked by slides.

Saturday, January 24, 1970

24th day - 341 days follow

Cloudy most of day with occasional sunny periods.

Up at 8. Dave came down for breakfast, then he and Bill took off for a reconnaissance trip into Six Rivers Natl. Forest in preparation for trip with writer and photographer from Life.

Went into McKinleyville for groceries around 2. Had some lunch, put a rope on Alvin Temple and we took a beautiful walk to Suppenhally Beach-- the Scenic Drive closed to traffic due to slides. The crashing waves were chocolate colored, but beautiful to watch. Gulls were having an undisturbed convention on the beach. A few other people were out walking, too. Trail to beach was messed up by a gooey, blue clay slide just above the beach so Alvin Temple and I didn't try to get any farther.

Dave and Bill returned around 7 after an eventful day of episodes along the Smith River-- slide closed road behind them near Patricks Creek.

Went up to Daves to play Yahtzee awhile. Began raining again during evening.

Drove back cautiously on Scenic Drive-- barricades were down.

Sunday, January 25, 1970

25th day - 340 days follow

Up at 8. Raining. ^{Septuagesima Sunday} Dave came down for sourdough hotcakes and then we all hopped into the Jeep and headed for the airport to meet the fellows from Life, Jeromy — and Mike — photog. ~~Long~~ Low ceiling prevented them using helicopter. Dave Zebo and Les Pierre were on hand making weather checks, then decisions. We went to the Red Barn for coffee, then on to Crescent City. Mike got carried away with the redwoods in the rain in Jed. Smith park, along Howland Hill road, on our way to Little Jones Creek area. At 3 we stopped to cancel helicopter (by phone) and pick up some snacks—in Gasquet.

Mike found what he wanted for a dramatic shot — high in the watershed. Some snow lying about in places. Bill had to shove one huge boulder out of the way with the bumper of the Jeep before proceeding. Roads flooding badly with constant rain fall.

Could not get back in time for connections at Eureka airport, so streaked into airport at Crescent City. Luckily planes going both north and south were available — Jeromy headed to Los Angeles immediately. Mike had time for a cheeseburger before going to Portland.

Dinner at home around 10:30. Dave got some steaks and brought Alvin Temple down. Duke Cairns dropped in for awhile.

Dave stayed for a short session of Yahtzee. In bed after 2 a.m.

Monday, January 26, 1970

26th day - 339 days follow

Raining - STILL! Spent much of morning cleaning up kitchen.

Rained hard all day long - and all evening.

Went to Huffs for dinner at 6:30 - home again around 11 when Dave dropped by. Played some Yahtzee - one hour.

Tuesday, January 27, 1970

27th day - 338 days follow

Woke up to hail storm, then rain, and then it began clearing.

Did some ironing before going to Eureka at 2:15 to see Cathy French on Girl Scout tree planting participation. Dropped Dave off in Arcata for about one hour - home by 4:30 after having coffee together.

Did some typing and paper clipping before Bill got home. After dinner, did more typing.

Dave came down around 9:30 to play some Yahtzee and receive phone call here.

Rising all began receding today, except the El at Fernbridge.

Wednesday, January 28, 1970

28th day - 337 days follow

A magnificent, clear, frosty morning.

Dave brought Music Temple down at 11 - to leave her for a day and night.

Went to Tee-off luncheon - Baywood Womens Golf Association - at 12:30. Good crowd - tables lovely - good crab salad. Home around 3. (Won a golf ball - fall Eclectic Tour.)

Took Music Temple for a romp on the beach. Quite a few people there besides us.

Sue Shipley came in to borrow some things to work with in getting the Huffs' loft ready to move into.

Met with committee on McKinleyville water supply, alternatives to HB MWD, at Phil Kirby's from 8-10:15.

Returned home to find that "pup-dog" had chewed up one shoe, one slipper, and fringe from corner of one Navajo rug!

Bill reported that Dave had phoned - would be in Washington, D.C. for a few days.

Thursday, January 29, 1970

29th day - 336 days follow

Cloudy all morning. No frost here, but in other areas.

Left at 9:30 - dropped Music Temple at the kennel and kept my 10:10 tee-off time at Baywood. Course soggy, but playable.

Rain and wind hit our 4-some on the 15th tee and we headed back to the clubhouse in a downpour, about 2 P.M.

Drove into Emeka to pick up a map of the County coastline from the Court House.

Greg dropped in before 5 and Bill arrived soon after that. Invited Greg to stay for dinner. He left around 8.

Light rain during evening.

Friday, January 30, 1970

30th day - 335 days follow

Up early so I could get to the Eureka Inn for Elkhorn Council meeting. Light rain. Meeting began 9:15 with speakers until luncheon. Ike Lissmore was guest speaker - he re-stated his position in regard to the River - against drowning out Round Valley with a high dam at Dos Rios, but not against water projects in northern California as long as the environment was protected. Talked with Gen. Cannon and Col. Roberts of C.F.

Lu-Flo at meeting. Sat with her at luncheon. Ray Peart arrived in time to tape Ike's speech.

Picked up some groceries and got home in time to greet Hal - at 3:30 and student Dave Stewart.

Hal took off to pick up some fresh coaks at Katy's Smoke House in Trinidad.

Dinner around 7:30.

Saturday, January 31, 1970

31st day - 334 days follow

Last Day for employers to file quarterly Social Security Tax Return and Wage Report, covering three previous calendar months.

Raining. Up by 9. Left at 11 to drive to KNRC studios near Colusa to cut some "guest spots" on tape with Ray Peart for ~~the~~ his "California Outdoors" program - one for Saturday (today) and another for Sunday.

Meanwhile Hal and Bill visited the Sanpines while Dave explored the dunes area. Started fixing dinner when I got home, around 4:30.

Showed some slides and movies after dinner. In bed by 2.

Hal and Bill found Scalioapus bigelovii in abundance on the Old Stagecoach Road north of Trinidad. This was my first introduction to this small, strange, member of the lily family.

Sunday, February 1, 1970

32nd day - 333 days follow

Fair today. Bill fixed sourdough hotcakes for breakfast.

Around 11 Hal, Dave and Bill took off to the north to collect plants.

Around 1 (after cleaning up kitchen) I helped get out the Sierra Club newsletters, working until after 5 o'clock.

Picked up some more crab for dinner.

Spent evening at home. In bed by 12.

Dave phoned from Washington, D.C. to get many telegrams out to oppose Timber Supply Act.

Today Hal and Bill and Dave brought back a tiny, beautiful Trillium rivale from near Darlingtonia.

Monday, February 2, 1970

33rd day - 332 days follow

Up by 8:30. Hal and Dave got away around 11 after a leisurely breakfast. Fair today - scattered clouds.

Spent most of afternoon on telephone to Sierra Club members.

Drove to airport at 6:30 to pick up Ursula Brown - here for brief visit during semester break from San West Valley Jr. College (Campbell).

Spent good evening catching up on her life since we last saw her in 1963.

Tuesday, February 3, 1970

34th day - 331 days follow

Cloudy. Up by 9. Had a phone call from Ray Peart - would I be guest on "talk show" at radio station KNCR between 1 and 2, covering Timber Supply Act and other interests of Sierra Club.

Mrs. and I left at noon after cleaning up kitchen.

The hour with Dick Bailey on the "Comments" phone-in program went extremely fast and was fun to do. Response by questions of listeners was good.

Made several stops on way home, including time out for a seafood salad around 3 - and picked up some fresh coats for dinner.

Raining lightly. Stopped briefly at COK, then HSC.

~~State~~ then Grey dropped in around 9:45. Duke came by around 11.

Act folded up to read at 11:30.

Wednesday, February 4, 1970

35th day - 330 days follow

Clear, starry sky at 5:30 when Ursula and I got up so she could catch 6 a.m. flight to Red Bluff - to stay a couple of days with Kit and Jan. Went back to bed until 9:20. Awakened by phone call earlier regarding coastal access near Ferndale - a Mr. Graham.

Did some ironing, then some house cleaning - and even pulled a weed or two. Thin clouds began forming in late afternoon.

Evening at home, but busy, busy on phone. In bed around 11:30 to read awhile.

Thursday, February 5, 1970

36th day - 329 days follow

Variable cloudiness - some nice warm, sunny periods.
Tee-off time at Baywood - 10:20. Played 18 holes with Batty Schorliq and Lou Wilson.

Went to County Planning Commission meeting in Supervisor's chambers from 3:30 - 5:00. Bill Van Fleet presented Audubon Society's plan for ~~forest~~ zoning bay areas not so far zoned.

(Pulp mill odor pretty bad this afternoon at Baywood between 2 - 2:30.)

Many phone calls during evening concerning outcome of Hance action on Timber Supply Act. We did not know for sure until Dave phoned from S.F.

"We slaughtered them" - it never came to a vote!

Picked up Dave at airport at 12:15. Duke and others showed up to hear the Washington story and we didn't fold up until 2:30 or 3 A.M.

Dave staying here now.

Friday, February 6, 1970

37th day - 328 days follow

Up late. Nice day with a few scattered clouds.

Dave and I drove to Burlington Heights - near Weatl to hear Rudi Becking explain his work on redwoods which have been silted in around Rockefeller Forest and the Founders Tree. He showed slides to members of his class, park rangers and us Sierra Club members, including Greg, Ray Peart. (Dave and I wandered around the woods, sat on bank of river in sun - there were joined by Ray Peart - before the group gathered.) This was followed by a field trip to inspect the damage from upstream erosion on Bull Creek - the rip-rap on banks, dead trees, etc. It was dark when we left Bull Creek.

Once home we snatched Bill and all went down to Merrydens for dinner. (Greg rode home with us from Bull Creek).

Around 11:30 Dave and I walked Greg home - a crazy walk on a beautiful star bright night - we went down the washed out trail to Luffenholty Beach, where I stepped into deep creek; Dave had to help Greg across as tide was coming in; then scrambling back up to highway - straight up steep bank.

Walk home was brisk. Bill had also started out - with cat - but cat panicked on highway and he had to take her back.

She bed around 2.

Saturday, February 7, 1970

38th day - 327 days follow

Lovely day - up by 10. Bill took off to do some shopping, while Dave went to his place to do some work.

Fixed up a dish of hot "Goop" for Sierra Club palooka at 6:30.

Had good meeting - about 100 people attending. Archie Glassman gave program on Africa - people and wildlife and population problems as land areas diminish through mis-use.

Home by 11:30. Duke stopped by awhile afterwards, as did Greg, and we had a crazy evening that ended up with Greg getting doused with catsup, movies of the nonsense, etc.

Played Yahtzee before going to bed.

Sunday, February 8, 1970

39th day - 326 days follow

Up late. Beautiful, warm day. Did some washing, which was interrupted in order to go up to Davis place to help Ken and others get petitions for creation of a National Wildlife Refuge established on Sums Island Bay.

Bill and Dave went collecting around Big Lagoon.

Home again by 5:30. Dinner here. Played Yahtzee before bedtime.

Monday, February 9, 1970

40th day - 325 days follow

Lovely warm day. Dave started bringing some of his equipment down here - Stereo, typewriter, records, etc. All was confusion in the living room for awhile.

Dave took me into Arcata and Eureka to do errands and get lists of leaders from Boy Scouts and Campfire Girls.

Home by 5. Dinner at home. Worked with Dave on resolution regarding alternative ^{water} supply to McKinleyville residents.

Tuesday, February 10, 1970

41st day - 324 days follow

Warm again (60°) - Scattered clouds. Prepared to go to Santa Rosa for Redwood Chapter Exec. Com. meeting. Dave drove. We left around 3:30. Nibbled cheese, pepperoni sticks and candy en route. Arrived down town Santa Rosa about 7:40.

Meeting concluded around 10:30. Had pizza and coffee before heading home. Ran into rain south of Ukiah, then thick fog from Willits north. At 3 A.M. we reached Gerkerville - low on gas. - Had to rant out gasoline from 3A garage man after having coffee at all night cafe.

Finally got to Moonstone at 5:20 A.M.!!!

Bill gave talk about Sierra Club and Timber Supply Act to Humboldt Archers Club - in Eureka.

Wednesday, February 11, 1970

42nd day - 323 days follow

Cloudy. Up late th Wednesday. Did some washing in afternoon.

Dave and I worked some more on a resolution regarding McKinleyville Water Supply.

Thursday, February 12, 1970

43rd day - 322 days follow

Cloudy. Up at 8:15 - ^{Lincoln's Birthday} Left for golf course at 9:50. Played four holes only when driving rain storm hit and drenched us thoroughly. Glad to get dried out again, once home after doing a few errands.

Dave busy here phoning, writing, etc. Raining hard all afternoon.

Robin Tarach here for dinner, then work on publicity for S. C. meeting. Greg dropped in awhile.

Played Yahtzee before going to bed.

Friday, February 13, 1970

44th day - 321 days follow

Up at 7. Left at 7:45. Picked up Robin at 8:00 in Arcata. Drove to Ferndale in pouring rain, over Wildcat Grade, down to beach. Stopped to watch a few birds - Larks, gulls, etc.

Clouds moved on and ocean was beautiful. Met a group interested in problem of beach access. Had coffee with Dan and Martha Graham before driving back.

Home again by 1:30. Dave came in and prepared to leave on 7:20 plane for L.A. for Sierra Club Directors meeting.

Took a nap between 3 and 4. Grabbed dinner in M.K., got Dave to airport, then went on to the college to attend an Audubon meeting - from 8-11.

Clear, starry night - also cool.

Did some phoning on Tree Planting Program in late afternoon.

Saturday, February 14, 1970

45th day - 320 days follow

Slightly cloudy. Valentine's Day up by 9. Leisurely morning, but busy afternoon. Phoned Girl Scout and Campfire Girl leaders regarding tree planting program.

Bill took off to do some shopping, returning around 5, and I received a beautiful pot of tulips for Valentine's day. Good dinner together - with special wine, etc. Greg came in - joining us for coffee, talk, piano playing for rest of evening. Bill also played piano and experimented with new recipe for some dough bread.

The Tongva Flycatcher got her kicks today by bringing us - first, a lizard - and later, a female house wren!

In bed by 1.

Sunday, February 15, 1970

46th day - 319 days follow

Up at 9. Cloudy. First Sunday of Lent. Greg came down after 10 for some doughnut breakfast and to pick up some reading material on Chile and S.A. in general.

In mid afternoon Bill returned Anita's portable stereo after replacing a worn out needle. Meanwhile I phoned Campfire Girl leaders in the area - on the phone for about 3 hrs.

Bill drove to airport at 6:30 in case Dave came in on early evening plane. He didn't.

Made a few more phone calls after dinner.

Andy Allo phoned (finally able to reach us) about having some typing done before the end of the quarter.

Quasty winds came up in late afternoon. Small craft warning went out. Some rain during evening.

Monday, February 16, 1970

47th day - 318 days follow

Lovely day - scattered clouds. Went in to McKinleyville at 10 for haircut.

Spent some time phoning campfire leaders and girl Scout leaders about tree planting program.

Dave phoned that he'd be in on ~~late~~ evening plane - in time for dinner.

Played yatzee before bed time.

Tuesday, February 17, 1970

48th day - 317 days follow

Early phone call from Clancy Gordon (from Missoula) about man arriving in our area in week to follow - regarding interviews with students about environmental awareness education in Montana in summer.

Wednesday, February 18, 1970

49th day - 316 days follow

Spent most of day at home. Dave in and out.

Went to proposed National Wildlife Refuge meeting at 7:30. Overflow crowd had to be moved from Supervisor's Chambers in Canal House to City Hall Council Chambers.

Home again by 10:30. Bill and Dave did not go along.

Played Yantze before bedtime.

Thursday, February 19, 1970

50th day - 315 days follow

Beautiful day - but cancelled golf game in order to make arrangements for Assemblyman John Dunlap's arrival tomorrow.

Dave drove me into Eureka. Went to air pollution hearing from 2-3 - then cornered Supervisors, mayor, etc. to extend invitation to join Mr. Dunlap for lunch at Sazias. Arranged press conference, plane flight, lunch, etc.

Stopped to see Music Temple at vets - her broken jaw had been pinned.

Also dropped in on Bill Van Fleet - about Dunlap's visit.

Showed various people about potluck dishes and fixed a huge fruit salad as my contribution.

Friday, February 20, 1970

51st day - 314 days follow

Beautiful day. Dave and I drove into Eureka by 10 to meet the Dunlaps at Eureka Inn. Bill Van Fleet also there - plus Bill Kortum (COAST) and candidate Barry Keene from Santa Rosa - plus Ilo Garsaway, who offered to drive during ground tour. Greg drove second car. Headed for Gold Bluffs beach - then back to City Hall for press conference at 1:30 - then to Sazias at 2.

Attending were Mayor Trood, counsel Mel Johnson, Supervisors Lusher, Rice, Lindley, County Counsel Schneider, Greg Conversano and Herb Peterson (Arcata city council), the Van Fleets, Ray Peart, Bill Kortum, Barry Keene, Dave, Ilo and myself - and Janet and John Dunlap.

At 3:30 Dave got Bill Kortum & Bill Van Fleet, Ray Peart and Mr. Dunlap into the air for inspection of coast to Shelter Cove. Meanwhile Ilo drove Mrs. Dunlap, Barry Keene and me around the area. We covered the HSC campus, Jolly Giant Commons, the Samoa peninsula, etc. Then everyone arrived at Moonstone after 5 to relax a bit. Bill played bartender and would drive into Arcata later with the Dunlaps. Dave & I went ahead to get set up. About 40 people showed up, including Arcata Mayor Ward Falor. It was highly successful and the evening ended with Ray Peart showing a movie and Bill Van Fleet showing slides.

Home by 11:30 - Dave taking Bill and I rode with Greg.

Played Yahtzee before bedtime. Took time out at midnight to watch partial (5%) eclipse of moon in perfectly cloudless sky.

Saturday, February 21, 1970

52nd day - 313 days follow

Up early. Beautiful day. Left for Bull Creek at 9. Bill and Dave would bring camping gear and dinner and slides for evening program later.

Did much talking with Tony Look and others at meeting place, and had lunch there, before going to the planting site - up above Cueno Creek.

Lots and lots of people swarming the slopes with buckets, shovels & their little Mong. fir seedlings.

Left the slopes about 5. Drove to Burlington camp ground to wait for Bill and Dave, having selected a campsite.

Supt. Wendell Davis, Tiny Philbrook and Jim Trynor (Resource Mgr. from Sacramento) came by to talk to me about the program.

Hurriedly cooked dinner just before evening program. Howard King came by and walked over to Rec. Hall with us. Trynor showed slides of rip-rap work going on in Bull Creek, plus floodtime problems. Dave gave a talk on the Timber Supply Act. Bill showed slides of Glacier Park - to an overflowing crowd.

Back to our camp around 11. Made coffee, fixed beds (Bill slept in Davis' truck) and fell into the sleeping bag around midnight.

Sunday, February 22, 1970

53rd day - 312 days follow

Up by 9 o'clock. Washington's Birthday Beautiful day.

I headed for the planting site right after breakfast, leaving Bill and Dave to pack up the gear. They returned to Moonstone.

Planted trees with Howard King and Tony Look. Had lunch with a gang up on Panther Gap - Tony, his wife Bernice, Howard, Al Jamison and a student type Sierra Clubber from S.F.

The view was magnificent - looking out over the Eel, Van Duzen & Mad River watersheds with snow capped mts. in the distance - all under clear, sparkling and warm skies.

Finally drove home about 3:30.

Got cleaned up and relaxed, then drove into Arcata at 7:30 for Mexican dinner at The Red Pepper.

Back to relax again with game of Yahtzee. Meanwhile we learned CBS News (Cronkite show) would arrive for work in area tomorrow.

Drove the Jeep Wagoneer for the first time - to get in practice for tomorrow's run into Six Rivers N.F.

Monday, February 23, 1970

54th day - 311 days follow

Up early in order to get to Eureka Inn by 8:30 for breakfast with Gonkito crew. Bill Stout was the correspondent with 4 in production crew, headed by Sam Roberts.

Beautiful day. Bill Stout and 2 others went with me in jeep, loaded with camera and sound equipment, to Gasquet airport. There we met the troops who had gone in small plane from Murray Field. All were piled into jeep. First a lunch stop, then Dave drove up French Hill Road to a perfect filming location about 16 miles from 199. Dave interviewed at length by Bill Stout with devastated slopes as background. Weather perfect. Out until 5. Three returned by plane, which had waited at Gasquet air strip.

Took time to have a cocktail at Lib Room in Eureka Inn with Sam Roberts and Bill Stout. Finally got home around 7:30. Bill had some steaks thawing out. Late dinner.

Beautiful night. Walked to beach at late hour - had toasted marshmallows and coffee. Clear and crisp.

Tuesday, February 24, 1970

55th day - 310 days follow

Up by 7:15. Beautiful day. Drove to Eureka to meet Jake Kittle and wife at 8:30 at Fireside Motel. Jake and I headed for Ferndale High school, contacted David Anderson for interview on Environmental Awareness Education summer program in Montane. Back to Arcata High to meet with Evelyn Pigg about prospective students.

Returned to Fireside Motel for quick lunch and to get my car. Jake and wife on their own all afternoon. He had 25 in tow for interviews.

Stopped for a few groceries. Found Dave still here when I got home.

Met the Kittles at Merryman's at 6 for cocktails and dinner. Good viewing before dark, good dinner, good talk.

Back home around 9. Got comfortable and played Yahtzee.

Wednesday, February 25, 1970

56th day - 309 days follow

Up at 9. Beautiful, warm day. Spent entire day at home doing many loads of washing and some much needed house cleaning.

Dave here part of afternoon - and for dinner. Watched to Cronkite news - no local film shown - NTSA.

Ken came in at some late hour while we were playing Yahtzee.

Thursday, February 26, 1970

57th day - 308 days follow

Up early. Beautiful day - warm. Shaked for golf course at 9:15. Tee-off time 10 - with Marnie Lannell, Idelle Abrahamson and Kay Peterson.

Home again by 3:35. Dave reported Timber Supply Act never got to floor vote today - WE WON!

Bill got home around 5 - we celebrated quietly, had dinner around 7:30 and then Bill took a nap from 8:30 - 10:00.

We played Yahtzee awhile and ate ice cream for late dessert. Dave sorted records for us.

Went to bed to read - at 11:30.

Friday, February 27, 1970

58th day - 307 days follow

Beautiful, warm day. Worked around house all morning.
Dave drove me to Eureka and Arcata to do errands -
2 until 5 - Ran across Bill in Safeway after 5.

Dave went to dinner at Lytles.

North Group Exec. Com. met at 7:30 in Arcata.
Ken and Dave arrived a little late. Good meeting.
Got some committees established.

Home sometime after 11.

Played Yahtzee and had ice cream and coffee.

Saturday, February 28, 1970

59th day - 306 days follow

Woke up to rain. Heavy rain much of day.
Got busy typing items for North Group newsletter.
Ken came down to use typewriter.

Antha and Walt stopped to pick up a cot mattress.
Place a hectic mess - dirty dishes, typewriters pounding,
everyone rushing to meet Greg's deadline for material.
Greg stayed for lunch.

Phone rang constantly all day - and all evening.
John Tuttle called also.
Finally got the kitchen cleaned by ~~4~~ 4:30.
Then started immediately to fix "goop" for dinner.
Had Greg down - at 8 - for dinner.
Played records along with Yahtzee - off and on -
In bed by 2.

Sunday, March 1, 1970

60th day - 305 days follow

Up at 8. ^{Third Sunday of Lent} It had rained during night but it remained scattered clouds all day. Rather cool. From 12-2 worked up at Dave's place (?) on Sierra Club Newsletter mailing. Bill, Dave, Greg, Ken, ~~and~~ Vic Aubin and I whipped the work out.

Back home to iron, write letters, read, make phone calls, etc.

Enjoyed sunset with cocktails - Dinner around 7:30.

Played short game of yahrtzee before bedtime.

Monday, March 2, 1970

61st day - 304 days follow

Light showers during day. Up at 8. Did some ironing after cleaning up kitchen. Dave worked quietly all morning.

Went to Arcata and Eureka after lunch. Saw Paul Hoff at KVM-TV for about 3/4 hr. - like talking to brick wall - starting with Timber Supply Act!

At Eureka Office Supply for few items - then with Phyllis Leal, 2 employees, and Florence Goldberg we chatted over coffee.

Home by 5. Found Dave here - with Marie Temple - in good shape.

Dinner after 7. Greg dropped in briefly.

Played yahrtzee before bedtime.

Tuesday, March 3, 1970

62nd day - 303 days follow

Light showers throughout day. Not feeling quite right I stayed in bed until noon time. Bill brought breakfast to me.

Dave prepared to leave for Santa Rosa - finally getting away around 3 o'clock.

Wrote letters to Jean and Lue.

Bill fixed some dough banana bread to bake while we had dinner.

Phone rang almost continuously from 6 until 9 - one call was from Ed Wayburn.

Andy Alts came out around 9:15 and stayed until 11:15. I fell asleep awhile on couch.

In bed by 11:30.

Wednesday, March 4, 1970

63rd day - 302 days follow

Mostly cloudy all day. Up at 8. Did two large loads of washing - interrupted by phone calls on occasion - long conversation with Lu-Flo.

Bill home by 6 - watched sunset and TV news - then Bill went to Lions Club meeting at Bella Vista Inn - came home a LION!

Worked on Blue Chip stamp books, wrote some notes, had bath and shampoo.

In bed by 12.

Thursday, March 5, 1970

64th day - 301 days follow

Beautiful, bright, sunny morning. Up at 8:15. Stopped briefly in Orinda to mail letters on way to golf course. On the tee at 10:10 with Thelma Willard, Vivian Bonniksen and newcomer Jean Fisk. Wonderful day for golf, though quite damp underfoot. Had a fairly good game (48-47)=95. Stayed for a couple of drinks with a small group. Home by 5.

Dinner early - in time to get to McK. High library for water meeting - but phone call caught me. Mr. Don Graham from Petrolia, about beach access.

Arrived at meeting just as County Ag. Commission concluded talk about Eudien, etc. used in reseedling - (and that's mainly why I went there!)

Home by 10:15.

Had nice note from Jake Kittle today.

Friday, March 6, 1970

65th day - 300 days follow

Up by 9. Glad to have a day at home to clean house and do some newspaper clipping and filing of Sierra Club material.

Able to Eureka by 7 PM for dinner with Robin and Butch MacLester.

Good evening with them. Home by 1:15.

Saturday, March 7, 1970

66th day - 299 days follow

Up at 9. Cloudy, with showers. Did some more filing, then prepared big macaroni salad for potluck dinner.

Left at 6 PM for Accata.

Good attendance at meeting - lots of new faces. Heard about Tiddlands ownership in Humboldt Bay from Mel Johnson, city atty. and Terry McGovern, city engineer.

Dave showed up (from S.F.) in time for the program.

Had coffee at Bins later with Ray Peart and Dave. Home by 12.

Played Yahtzee and listened to records until 3 A.M.

Sunday, March 8, 1970

67th day - 298 days follow

Lovely day - with light ^{Fourth Sunday of Lent} breezes in afternoon. Up at 9. Had breakfast on the sun deck. Bill made poundcake latcakes.

Dave brought Minnie Temple here for the afternoon - and the night.

Bill and I did some work on our roof to try to stop some nuisance leaks.

Leaned during late afternoon. Late lunch - late dinner (9:00).

Played 2 short games of Yahtzee before going to be around midnight.

Monday, March 9, 1970

68th day - 297 days follow

Up at 7 to wake up Dave to make phone call, then back to bed until 8. Raining.

Dave took Music Temple to vets for check - all O.K. until dinner time when she bumped against a clamp in the living room, bending the pins under the clamp.

While Bill and I attended a State Fish & Game type meeting at Eureka High School, Dave had to leave Music Temple back at the vets for the night.

Director Sam Arnett of F+G was main speaker. Comed of 2 million (Trout Unlimited) sponsored the sparring match between F+G and Hawkish conservationists - over water projects, wild rivers, etc.

Home by 11. Played Yatzye before folding up.

Tuesday, March 10, 1970

69th day - 296 days follow

Cloudy all day. Worked around home until 12:15. Picked up Dave in Eureka at garage (where he left his car) and went flying for about one hour (50 min.) Went in Cessna 172 with right hand door off - Herman Fogarty piloting. Weather turned messy - no good for photos, so we only got as far as Redwood Creek. Had good close viewing of slaughtered plovers and the measly Little Stip along Redwood Creek which became part of the National Park. Also saw where Arcata Redwood Co. had starting logging east slope of Redwood Creek - right on ridge near Bald Hills Road.

Had coffee at Stanton's, then headed home, leaving Dave to wait for his car.

Bill home early. Dave arrived with Music Temple - the pins gone and clamp removed.

Dave and I went to Northcoast Environmental Council meeting at 8 at Co. Watkins' home. Ray Peart and Ken Lytle only others there. We had a discussion session only, and got home by 10:45.

Played Yatzye until midnight.

Wednesday, March 11, 1970

70th day - 295 days follow

Light rain in early morning - then cloudy all day. Dave had to take his car back to garage, having "pup-dog" with me most of day.

Did some washing.

Dave back for dinner.

Thelma Klineman and nephew Dan Triplot arrived as we sat down - and stayed until about 10:30.

Dave had taken Marie Temple to the gal in Trinidad who took after her during his absence, then returned. Played Yahtzee before bedtime - 1 A.M.

Dave would fly out in morning on 6 o'clock plane to S.F.

Thursday, March 12, 1970

71st day - 294 days follow

Cloudy. Played golf at Baywood with Lou Wilson, Lee Ann Peterson and Jan Fisk. Light rain began as we finished 18th hole at 3:30. Rained most of evening.

Went to "strategy meeting" - the Committee for a Wildlife Refuge - from 8-11 in Eugene.

Friday, March 13, 1970

72nd day - 293 days follow

Showery. Went to Logging Conference at Redwood Area from 10:45 - 12:00 - Panel on forest roads. Spent next 2 hours with Ru-Fla. Quick late lunch around 3, then to a "highway" meeting from 3:30 - 5:00 - on proposed projects in the county. Chamber of Commerce yearly "affair".

Home by 5:45. Hurried dinner, then off to 8 o'clock Audubon Society meeting in Eureka.

Chuck Kennedy gave good program of fish checking procedures in various North coast streams and lakes.

Rained hard while driving home - and continued raining throughout night.

Found Dave was back again. Wake him up from a nap so we could play Yahtzee and hear about latest Club activities.

In bed by 7:30.

Saturday, March 14, 1970

73rd day - 292 days follow

Up at 7:30. Packed and ready to leave for Santa Rosa by 10:45. Dave decided to remain home to clean up unfinished work.

Some rain, light, here in northern section. Wonderfully warm in Sonoma County. Spring in the air everywhere. Wild iris out, blue eyed grass was spotted - fresh greenery all about.

Arrived at Spiridonoffs at 4. Quickly changed clothes and went down town to Saturday Afternoon Club home for Exec. Com. meeting from 4:15 - 6:15.

Cocktails preceded Annual dinner, which started at 7:30.

Bill, Ray Peart, Ken Lytle and I were placed at the head table -

Dr. Richard Garcia, entomologist, gave excellent talk and slide show - pollution in Lake Tahoe, Santa Barbara Channel, etc.

Ray spent a bit of time at Spiridonoffs later, then drove back home. We were comfortably bedded down by 12:30.

Sunday, March 15, 1970

74th day - 291 days follow

Up shortly after 8. ^{Passion Sunday} Mocking bird and other bird song, plus sunshine, woke us up. Had good breakfast, said our thank-yous, and headed home at 9:50.

Beautiful drive - all the way. A few clouds in Eel River Basin, but clear again to the north. Took a coffee break in Gasherville. Home by 3:15.

Did two large loads of washing. Dave fixed Tacos for us for dinner. Learned about recent spraying along roads using 2, 4, 5-T. Took flashlight to check Moonstone Beach Rd. Our plants had received the treatment at road edge - and we were mad!

Played Yahtzee before going to bed around 12:30.

Monday, March 16, 1970

75th day - 290 days follow

Cloudy, then drizzly, then sunny. Up at 7:30. Phoned Public Works Director Guy Kilstad shortly after 8 - then phoned Co. Ag. Commissioner Don Thomas - about use of 2, 4, 5-T in road spraying. Don wanted to meet with me at 3 PM. Joining us were Greg and Vic Aubin. Dave showed up, as did Bill, but they did not drive up the road (Scenic Drive) with us. Don returned to house where we queried him until 4:30. Dave pulled out at 4 to catch 4:30 plane to S.F.

Snake dropped by while we were getting dinner prepared. No time to sit down to eat. Had to get some Refuge material to meeting of S.A.W. Ex. Board in Eureka before 7:30. Then dashed to City Hall for City Planning Commission hearing on Wildlife Refuge. Spoke for Eureka Sierra Club members supporting the proposed Refuge. Many proponents gave statements, but there were no opponents on hand. City manager gave good recommendation and Commissioners voted to support Refuge - unanimously! Hearing adjourned by 8:20.

Returned home to prepare statement for Supervisors meeting in morning - on stopping use of 2, 4, 5-T. Typed it up and got to bed before 1.

Bill had remained home all evening working on a test.

Tuesday, March 17, 1970

76th day - 289 days follow

Beautiful day, but ^{St. Patrick's Day} winds were strong - gusty. Up at 7:45. Made phone calls, then went to Supervisors meeting, arriving in time for 10:30 presentation. Had the Board going for 35 minutes on use of 2, 4, 5-T. Don Thomas was requested to make a report. Home again by 12:30. Took short nap after cleaning up kitchen.

Good news coverage on radio and TV (locally) on the 2, 4, 5-T blast. Dave phoned from SF about 4:30. Would be in.

Fixed dinner for Bill, but had to eat on the run in order to get to the school in Klamath for highway '69 hearing at 7:30. Hearing over by 8:45. Back home by 10. Read awhile - new Audubon magazine.

Bill busy correcting papers.

Dave missed early evening plane but finally got in at 12:30.

Played short game of Yahtzee before going to bed at 2.

The Turquoise Flycatcher brought in a lizard today - after much playing with it outside.

Wednesday, March 18, 1970

77th day - 288 days follow

Up before 8. Beautiful day - warm, but breezy. Had several phone calls. Cheryl brought some stuff down to type and reproduce - had their 2 mos. old baby with her.

Finally got kitchen cleaned up at 11:30. Did some typing, writing, mending, reading.

Dave took off to do errands -- in and out all day.

Decided not to go to Wildlife Refuge "Strategy" meeting, but Ken did and stopped by at dinner time.

Dave brought Muir Temple here after spending part of evening with Greg and friends.

Played Yahtzee before bedtime.

Thursday, March 19, 1970

78th day - 287 days follow

Beautiful day. Up by ^{East of Esther} 7:30. Skated for golf course at 9:30. Had good game (~~score~~ 94) and won a golf ball for "tee to green" score.

Found Bill home typing highway hearing statement as Dave finished writing it. I had stopped for haircut at 4 - so only had time to bath and change clothes before taking off at 6:10 for Weitchpec. Dave's car out of gas here in driveway. (Bill had to stay home to correct test papers.)

Munched a sandy bar and had thermos of coffee aboard. Stopped in Willow Creek to fill gas tank. Beautiful, clear moonlight all the way. Delayed 25 minutes on route 96 to Hoopa - highway work! Blasting a hill down where big slide had occurred in January storm. Got to Weitchpec Elem. school (on road to Orleans) at 8:45. Leaving still going strong.

Many Indians speaking up - both for and against proposed route along Klamath River.

I presented statement for River Club urging no route along river, and that Klamath may become Wild River - Stayed until 10:30. Home by 1:15 after finding a place in Arcata to grab a postponed hamburger-type dinner.

Went straight to bed. Bill stayed up to finish the test papers.

Friday, March 20, 1970

79th day - 286 days follow

Beautiful day. Up shortly after seven became a noisy bird, which turned out to be a Linnet, woke me up with his jayzing singing. Dave got up early, too, and took Patsie Temple for a run.

Bill was up by 8:15 - had to get grades in by 9.

Dave left on 11:20 plane for S.F. but I had to dash to airport with his forgotten wallet.

Bill home all afternoon. Took pesticide "stories" to various people, highway statements to Mrs. Haberman (Hoopa Reservation spokesman) and District Engineer of Div. of Highways. Attended Chamber of Commerce highway priority recommendations meeting from 3 - 4:30. Home by 5.

Changed clothes to go to cocktail hour of Empress Views 10th Anniversary event at Merryman's beach house. Bill went for Anita before 6 to deliver her there to sell door prize tickets.

Congressman Don Clausen there. I engaged him in serious talk about environmental action on his part. Dashed home again to change clothes and get to Arcata for North Group Exec. Committee meeting at 7:30 - which lasted until after 11. Home at 12:30 - in bed by 1.

Saturday, March 21, 1970

80th day - 285 days follow

SPRING! And a beautiful, warm day with ocean breezes to cool us. Did some housecleaning, weeding in garden and letter writing. Bill did the shopping. Dave returned on 7:30 plane - just in time for dinner.

Ken dropped in after lunch to borrow Dave's big typewriter.

Sunday, March 22, 1970

81st day - 284 days follow

A beautiful day! Up ^{Puri} by 8:30. Phone rang all morning long. Palm Sunday

At 1:30 Bill went up to Anthea's to bring her down to our house to go through some books for ideas for a rug she's contemplating. Meanwhile Dave and I went up to the Coleman place on the Old Quarry Road out of Trinidad to see what petroleum products had done to a lovely stream (and water supply) in a trillion covered redwood and spruce forest. Area had been logged of old growth in 1912. Spent a couple of hours looking over the damage and talking with a concerned neighbor. Sample of water had already been taken by County Health Department. Quarry operator had diverted, then subsequently blocked natural flow from springs above. Stream, called "Hidden Creek" by locals empties into ocean immediately south of Trinidad. Stopped briefly in Trinidad to observe progress of Indians carving dugout canoes from large redwood logs.

Had a late, late lunch with Anthea, here, then Bill took her home. This meant a late dinner for us. Andy also dropped in as we were sipping after dinner coffee - at 9:30 - and was gone by 11. Straightened up kitchen before playing Yahtzee. Dave put up new tent on ocean side of house and slept out - after we all took a walk on the beach in the moonlight.

Monday, March 23, 1970

82nd day - 283 days follow

Beautiful day - ^{Shushan Purim} warm enough to wear shorts.
Did some garden work and two loads of washing. Bill left the Jeep to get Warn Lubs installed. I brought him home in the morning and Dave took him in to retrieve the Jeep in early afternoon.

Dave took Missie Temple to the vet. to have back pin in jawbone removed and left her overnight.

Chuck Kennedy ^(HSC) and Cynthia Spalding ^(COR) here for dinner and evening. Discussed environmental fair plans for "April 22".

In bed - on deck in sleeping bag - by 12:30. Moonlight -

Dave busy most of day while movers packed his goods for storage.

(Turquoise flycatcher not feeling good today. Would not eat until late evening.)

Sergei Spiridonoff phoned from Eureka at dinner time. He had been out on the Old Quarry Rd. to see the stream damage and had suggestions to present to Bd. of Supervisors.

Supervisor Guy Rucker had also phoned about the situation.

Slept on deck.

Tuesday, March 24, 1970

83rd day - 282 days follow

Slept on deck.

Beautiful day, but high north wind blowing. Up to birdsong at 7:30. Sun already on breakers. Beautiful beyond words. Had sound sleep - felt wonderful.

Wrote short statement to present to Board of Supervisors at 1:30 PM - concerning polluted water near quarry site and urging change in use permit conditions in the future to protect water users down stream and to protect the ecology of the area.

Made brief stop at Div. of Highways office with suggested map of proposed route to skirt Jed. Smith State Park.

Home before 4 o'clock.

Dave back for dinner - with Missie Temple - now in good shape.

"Turquoise Flycatcher" busy routing out baby moles all morning. Played with two, but didn't try to eat them. Feeling bouncier, back to normal all day.

Played Yachtie before bedtime at 12:40!

Wednesday, March 25, 1970

84th day - 281 days follow

Another glorious morning. First awakened by noisy birds at 6:15, then by tap on shoulder at 7:15. Fixed lunch stuff and gathered up things to drive down to Cape Mendocino and Punta Gorda.

Have got ready to drive to S.F. We left at 10:10, taking Music Temple with us. Arrived at Graham's at 12:45. ~~Had lunch, then.~~ Went to beach, then back to their place for quick lunch, then down to the mouth of the Matate and a walk to the old light house - almost.

High wind - ocean riotously beautiful and exciting. Two other dogs along - Music Temple had wonderful run.

Brought a student back to Arcata with us - not staying overnight at Punta Gorda. Came over Monument Road, which drops down into Kio Dell.

Home by 8:15.

In bed - tired from beach walk - 5 miles, some against high winds by 11.

Thursday, March 26, 1970

85th day - 280 days follow

Clear and windy - ^{Maundy Thursday} VERY windy. Small craft warnings up again from Trinidad Head northward.

Typed up some news items for Seize Club Newsletter after early breakfast - 7:30.

Left for golf course at 9:30. Joined Lois Watson and Lynn Lawson for fast game - they in cart and me doing doubletime to keep up. High wind was frustrating to some. Lynn had good game, however.

Home before 3. Bill took Music Temple and went off grocery shopping. Went through mail, magazines and newspapers and made a few phone calls before dinner.

Mary Ann Kost showed up - for a visit overnight - just as we were finishing dinner - on vacation from Chico State.

Have phoned during evening from S.F.

Friday, March 27, 1970

86th day - 279 days follow

Beautiful day - still ^{Good Friday} windy, but so marvelously clear!

Mrs. Forbes from Trinidad dropped in - concerned about water pollution - and her land, which lies on the coastline and should become park lands someday.

Spent afternoon evening. Mary Ann visited friends and stayed with them for dinner.

Saturday, March 28, 1970

87th day - 278 days follow

Up at 7. Beautiful day, ^{Holy Saturday} but still with high, gusty winds. Mary Ann and I packed a light lunch and headed north in her car at 8:15 to join Greg Kesh and others on Sierra Club outing in J.E. Smith Park. 13 persons took the beautiful 3 mile walk to the Boy Scout Tree and Gossely falls beyond. We left at 10 and returned to the cars by 3:30. Pleasant weather down under the towering red-woods, but wind was blowing hard through the tree tops. Trilliums were bountiful - and beautiful all along the way.

We stopped briefly at National Park Headquarters in Crescent City, but no one seemed to be around. Home by 6.

Dinner at 8 - and then Mary Ann took off to Bayview for an evening of square dancing.

We were in bed by midnight.

Bill had taken Music Temple with him during the day for plant collecting.

At 4:30 A.M. we ^{all} got up to view Bennett's comet, but couldn't locate it in the eastern sky.

Sunday, March 29, 1970

88th day - 277 days follow

Beautiful morning - ^{Easter Sunday} quiet and no wind before 8:30. Bill up early to go to Lions Club Easter breakfast at the Dinner Bell in Arcata at 8:30. I was up by 7:30. Bill home again by 8:30 - and went back to bed until 10. Worked outside - pruning shrubbery. Mary Ann got up around 11:30.

Ken came in awhile to do some typing. Bill fixed a new "landing" at the sub basement door and I went on working outside. "Goldie" and Music Temple played outside until exhausted.

Ran off 750 Wildlife Refuge petitions before Greg arrived to finish running off 2 pages for Newsletter.

Worked on newsletter up until dinner time. Mary Ann and a friend's daughter helped awhile.

Greg had a bacon and eggs dinner with us and then we finished the mailing work on Newsletter.

Mary Ann returned from dinner with her friends around 10.

In bed by 12.

High winds and some drifting fog "puffs" during afternoon - cooler today -

Monday, March 30, 1970

89th day - 276 days follow

Yet another beautiful day, but with wind by mid-morning. Up before 8. Took several Navajo rugs out on deck to sweep off dew and eat Rais - before the wind came up.

Spent much of the day house cleaning - between phone calls. Talked to Dave briefly - in S.F. office.

Mary Ann showed up around 12:30 and finally got away around 2:00.

Bill home around 3:30. Started writing up Redwood Chapter Exec. Com. minutes. Vic Aubin came in for an hour or so before dinner to work up some material with Bill on pesticides.

John Heino dropped in briefly around 7. Received phone call from Rex Flo - in Hospital -- heart trouble -- sounding good, though.

Worked on stencils after doing dishes and bathing while Bill napped from 8:30 - 10:30.

Duke Cairns dropped by at 11.

In bed by 11:45.

Tuesday, March 31, 1970

90th day - 275 days follow

Clear, warm, but still windy. Up by 7.

Started typing stencils, then ran off three sheets between other jobs. Bail off to college by 10. Jean Nagood dropped in around noon - stayed about $\frac{1}{2}$ hour. Turned out 700 Wildlife Refuge petitions and 25 copies of minutes to be mailed.

Cheryl Lytle had stopped by at 11, but petitions weren't finished then.

Got everything finished by mid-afternoon.

Went to Committee of a Wildlife Refuge meeting at Supervisors chambers at Court House from 8-10:30.

Wednesday, April 1, 1970

91st day - 274 days follow

Bail up early for 8 o'clock class.

Clear, warm, but windy until 4 PM when fog started coming in and it turned cool.

Tried to get a couple of loads of washing done but it took all day - due to all kinds of interruptions. Vic Aubin came out to copy some letters. Many phone calls.

Around 4:30 we drove up to Mrs. Coleman's place near end of old Quarry Road out of Trinidad. Looked over the clearance work done on her water supply - then stayed for tea and talk for a short time.

Dinner around 7:30 - then worked on Redwood Chapter stuff for mailing - did a map for Exec. Com. members to locate Moonstone Beach on April 11 weekend.

Went to bed by 12.

Thursday, April 2, 1970

92nd day - 273 days follow

Lovely morning - no fog. Up at 7 in order to play golf at 8:50. Some high, scimpy clouds all day, but little wind on golf course. Edie Lewis, Lou Hartley and Doris Haseman in my foursome. Had good game - 44-46-90- with 21 HDC. Net 69. Home by 2:45 after delay retracing steps on back nine looking for car keys, lighters and cigarettes, which apparently fallen out of small golf bag.

Bill went to College of the Redwoods to talk on pesticides to experimental class - from 12-1. He reported it to be a good "affair".

Dinner at 6:30. Left at 7:15 to attend April 22 meeting at CES. Home by 10:15.

Musie Temple sat in car patiently.

In bed by 12.

Friday, April 3, 1970

93rd day - 272 days follow

Beautiful day - A-B-A-N!!!

Did some house cleaning. Greg and Doug stopped by on way to Trinity for weekend - to borrow a jacket.

Bill home by 4.

Drove up to Forkes (Old Stagecoach Rd.) about 4:30. No one home, but we wandered about - looking the place over.

Spent quiet evening at home - Bill worked on paper (hand-out) regarding 2, 4, 5-T and 2, 4-D.

In bed to sleep before 12.

Saturday, April 4, 1970

94th day - 271 days follow

Up at 8. Fog cleared very early. Worked outside awhile, then went grocery shopping before 2 P.M.

Fixed a salad for potluck dinner. Dave showed up around 4. Vic Antun here awhile before we went to Sierra Club meeting at 6:30.

Large group in attendance. Bob Allison, Supervisor of Six Rivers Natl. Forest gave illustrated talk on "Multiple Use Management." He was hit with many questions, from priorities to pesticides - for 3/4 hrs.

Meeting was fast and various until 10:20. Al Whitney, wife and daughter attended.

Home by 11:45.

In bed by 1:00 A.M.

Minigraphed Lark out before going to meeting.

Sunday, April 5, 1970

95th day - 270 days follow

Up at 8:00. ^{Low Sunday - First Sunday after Easter} Foggy, but it cleared and moved off shore all day long until sunset, when it stayed clear and beautiful.

Worked in garden all day. Bill & Dave went to Clam Beach Lagoons to do some collecting for about one hour, returning around 4:30.

Finished raking up prunings, set sprinkles, and sat on deck to enjoy view - with cocktails. Decided to bring out portable barbecue and fix steaks for dinner - but ate indoors.

Very low tide. Lots of people on beach. Had late bath, then played one line of Yahtzee before going to bed - around midnight.

Monday, April 6, 1970

96th day - 269 days follow

Light rain began around 9. Bill gone by 2:30 for 8 o'clock class.

Census enumerator showed up around 11.

Dave left on 11:20 plane for S.F. - Music Temple with us again - or yet!

Spent 2 hrs. clipping & reading newspapers. After lunch I did the ironing - until finished!

Sun came out again in mid-afternoon.

Ken stopped in with some work (typing) to be done - around 7.

Late-ish dinner. I was tired!

Greg came by around 9.

Bathed aching muscles in deep tub and headed to bed at 10:30 to rest and read. Stars shining brilliantly - cool.

Tuesday, April 7, 1970

97th day - 268 days follow

Up by 8:00. Bill slept until 10 - then off to do some collecting and to his office for a few hours.

Did some mimeographing on the Wildlife Refuge - after typing stenils - after doing Roque vacuuming around bedrooms.

Dave phoned from S.F. airport - on way back here soon.

Vic Aubin came out for an hour or so.

Dave arrived mid-afternoon.

Beautiful day with wisps of clouds only. Low tide again.

Dave brought some steaks home to barbecue for dinner. Cooked them on deck; ate with ocean view - in living room.

Listened to City Council meeting on radio (regarding Wildlife Refuge - passed 3 to 2) after viewing 1 hour of "Pollution - a matter of choice" on NBC-TV.

Played 3 lines of Yahtzee. In bed by midnight.

Wednesday, April 8, 1970

98th day - 267 days follow

Up at 7:45. Bill off to school then.

Lovely, warm day - a few widely scattered, thin clouds.

Left for Eureka around 10:30. Had to have tie fixed in Arcata first. Did a few errands, got permit for City Public Works. Left for visit to Gunther Island on Sunday, then picked Dave up at McLean Motors at noon. (He had taken his car in earlier.) Lunched together at Stanton's, then I took him to college campus, then downtown Arcata and left him there at 1:30. Did some more shopping - home by 2:15.

Ran off 100 more copies of 2, 4, 5-T paper of Bill's. Kept Music Temple with me all day.

Went to meeting (at the college) for Environmental Fair exhibitors, while Bill went to Jolly Giant Commons for talk on pesticides with John Yarnell & Roger Weiss - a student Science Club program.

Went to Tree Key later where John, Roger and Bill guzzled down 2 pitchers of beer. Home by midnight.

Thursday, April 9, 1970

99th day - 266 days follow

Overcast all day, but nice for golf. Teed off at 9:50 with Bart Devine, Lee Thorpe and Mary Gurney. Shot 92 for qualifying round of spring handicap tournament. Fended in championship flight with a net 72. Stayed for a "short" cocktail - home by 4:30.

Friday, April 10, 1970

100th day - 265 days follow

Lovely day, but I couldn't get out of bed. Right shoulder, neck and ear hurting. Made appointment for 2:45 with Hank Frank. Dave drove me into town and did my errands while I waited to see Hank. He gave cortisone shot and prescribed pills for what might be bursitis.

Dave picked up John Tuttle and Phil Kay at Arcata airport. (They had flown from Napa in John's brother's small plane - and brought Davis' big typewriter with them).

We had dinner at Merrymans, then checked ^{with} the Roods when they arrived later at the house, but stayed in cabin at Ocean Grove Lodge, north of Trinidad.

John went with me to deliver Wildlife Refuge petitions to two gals living near campus in Arcata. There was a dynamite explosion while we were in an apartment at Redwood Manor shortly after 11 o'clock.

John & Phil, Steve and Anna Moore and Jerry Fitch, who came with the Roods, bedded down in The Huffs' house.

Saturday, April 11, 1970

101st day - 264 days follow

Beautiful day - somewhat gusty winds all day - extra low tide - some scattered clouds over area - up at 7:30. Some of gang up earlier - out walking on beach.

Got everyone fed by 9. Waited for Sergei until 11:20 then left note and drove alone to Dedication Site on Bald Hills Rd. Others (2 cars) already there.

Had sack lunches in sunny spot in grove before continuing on to prairie overlooks. On way down, picked off, piled out and walked new logging road (Arco's) below ridge - above Redwood Creek. Log hauling going on. The Roods mostly stayed near car.

Back home by 4 - picked up fresh sets at Katop's in Trinidad, then started dinner.

The "gang" walked on beach, or helped with dinner or read magazines - all happy.

We dove into crab, hot french bread and tossed green salad, coffee and cookies.

Sergei and Charlotte Stevens arrived in time for meeting! The living room was crowded when Duke, Guy and Ray Peart showed up - but it was a good evening, meeting adjourning about 11.

Sunday, April 12, 1970

102nd day - 263 days follow

Up at 7:15. ^{Second Sunday after Easter} Lovely morning. Fed people as they arrived or arose. Left at 9 for tour of Bay by car caravan. Stopped at Anate Baforns near Simpsons "dead end". Very low tide.

Mud flats impressive. Bridge piers now looming big and ugly as they cross from Gunther Island. Then we drove around to the Paladini docks in Eureka to view the nesting egrets in the cypress grove on Gunther Island. The trees were seemingly loaded with the splendid, big white birds. We continued south to Beatrice Flats (College of the Redwoods) to look over South Bay area of proposed Wildlife Refuge. Around noon the "south" gang headed home and Ken & I in separate cars headed back north.

Bill was working on income tax "materials". Dave was cleaning house! I took the vacuum cleaner over to Kluff's and cleaned up there before bathing and heading for the Weiss "affair" for supervisorial candidate Ray Beart.

Dave got some steaks - which we grilled on deck, then ate in living room.

Monday, April 13, 1970

103rd day - 262 days follow

Up by 7:30. Raining - and had rained all night - with gusty winds. Only occasional showers during day, but still high wind and some evidence of clearing.

Did two loads of washing before noon - in between phone calls!

Drove to Trinidad School to pick up basic statement on Wildlife Refuge from Ken. Dave helped me edit it. Tipping up to the last minute and making copies for the press, I was just able to grab some scrambled eggs, change clothes and drive like mad to the Eureka High School by 7:30. I arrived breathless and windblown, but in time. Since that was #7 on the list of testifiers and the statement read well. Large turnout - about 400. Hearing lasted until 11:20. Nearly 80 persons appeared for oral testimony.

Very cold tonight. Home by midnight. Dave already sacked out. Bill returned from pesticide confab with Jack Garncel and Vic Aubin just moments after I got in.

Ate some hot chocolate and cinnamon toast and fell into bed before one o'clock.

Phoned Anita at 8 AM to wish her a happy 75th birthday.

Tuesday, April 14, 1970

104th day - 261 days follow

up by 7:30. ^{President Lincoln's Assassination} ~~Staring~~ looking, but sun peeking through clouds occasionally. Left for golf course at 9:15. Tee off time 10:00. 1st round of handicap tournament. Opponent Helen Harmon. Others in foursome: Betty Schorlie and Joan Fletcher. Some light rain in early part of game. Variable rest of day. After very cold or with high winds.

Helen won the match at the end of the 16th hole. I was 3 down, after being 1 up at the end of nine holes. Good match, though I had to give her 4 strokes.

Home before 4. Had to turn around, drive to Eureka, all for extension of time forms for Income Tax!

Bill went up to Luthas (while I went to Eureka) to bring back ^a macaroni dish for dinner.

Dave fixed hamburger patties on grill - ate indoors at 7:30 or so.

Phoned Wayburn this morning. Talked with both Ed and Peggy. Agreed to serve on Senator Cranston's Conservation Advisory Committee.

Wednesday, April 15, 1970

105th day - 260 days follow

Thursday, April 16, 1970

106th day - 259 days follow

Scattered clouds - chance of rain. Left for golf course at 9:15. Tee-off at 9:50 with opponent Joan Fletcher. Our match ended on the 16th hole when Joan got me three down and not enough holes left to recover - even though our match had see-sawed over the first 12 holes. Shot 96. Clouds began gathering around 2. Thunder and rain followed. Home by 3:30 to start doing some typing for Dave.

Bill was up early and gone by 7:45 to get to TV station in Eureka to do a tape on pesticides with Vic Aubin and Al Marmetstein at 8:30 -- to be shown on KVIQ at 6:30 P.M.

Naturally, we watched TV! And it was a good half hour presentation on the potential dangers imposed by 2,4-D and 2,4,5-T on the entire ecosystem. Dinner followed TV.

Friday, April 17, 1970

107th day - 258 days follow

Sunny day. Did some errands in town - with Dave.

Worked up agenda for Exec. Com. meeting of North Group - in Arcata at 7:30. Dave grilled steaks for dinner - I ate and ran. Home by 11.

Saturday, April 18, 1970

108th day - 257 days follow

Rain! Fairly hard throughout day.

Sunday, April 19, 1970

109th day - 256 days follow

Third Sunday after Easter

Around home all day - working - writing -
reading -

Monday, April 20, 1970

110th day - 255 days follow

Beil off to school early.

Dave left for SF by plane after lunch.

Tuesday, April 21, 1970

111th day - 254 days follow

First Day of Passover

Dave back by dinner time. I went to Redwood Acres fair grounds - alone - to check on exhibitors space - at 8 PM. Home by 10.

Wednesday, April 22, 1970

112th day - 253 days follow

Earth Day! Hectic! Phone ringing all day. Bill went to COR on panel about "poisons."

Thursday, April 23, 1970

113th day - 252 days follow

Cloudy - off and on. Tee-off time 9:40 at Baywood. Home by 3:30.

Bill did "poison panel", again, at HSC this time. Drove on another panel from 2-4-

Friday, April 24, 1970

114th day - 251 days follow

Busy day. Gathered up photos, did lettering, took lumber to Fair Grounds for Science Club booth. Greg and Vic Rubin on hand to help build things. Home for dinner, then back to fair grounds to pound nails, arrange photos, hang posters, letter messages - until 1:30 A.M. (Heavy rain hit at midnight.)

Did more lettering - until 3:30 A.M.!

Bill worked late on 2, 4, 5-T poster.

Saturday, April 25, 1970

115th day - 250 days follow

(1:30)
Up early. Weather: variable, cloudy, threatening. At fair grounds in Eureka by 9:30. Place open to public at 10. Great crowds all day and all evening - Never left the exhibit.

Ate natural foods (dark bread, cheese, etc.)

Bill and Dave showed up in late afternoon (Dave had gone in during morning awhile to set up speakers in Arts and Crafts building for the play). Ann Weiss and Greg on deck.

Kept working on lettering until early morning.

(Heavy rain hit at 9 P.M. closing time)

(Doug Ayers brought in hamburgers for Greg and me at 5 P.M.)

(Ray Pearl brought sandwiches and coffee for Ken and me in late evening.)

Sunday, April 26, 1970

116th day - 249 days follow

Cold! Snow on ^{Fourth Sunday after Easter} Hill and other low places. Off to the fair grounds by 9:30. Another day of great crowds. Went to play at 2 P.M. while Guy, Vic, Robin and Carol A. looked after booth. Dave and Bill showed up to spend rest of day and evening, taking in play at 7 P.M. Had "confrontation" with U.S.F.S.'s Bob Allison. Robin Tarrach brought Lam burgers in for us. Started dismantling exhibit at 4 P.M.

Monday, April 27, 1970

117th day - 248 days follow

Had barbecued steaks for dinner. Ron Hunsinger here from 10 - 2:30 - Dave folded up at midnight. I kept typing until 1:30.

Thursday, April 30, 1970

120th day - 245 days follow

Last day for employers to file quarterly Social Security Tax Return and Wage Report, covering three previous calendar months.

Up by 8. On tie at 10:20. Good game - 91.
Stayed at Baywood to help the Thorpe
celebrate 75th birthday - with cake + coffee.
Home by 4.

Dave left for SF before noon. Bill's
birthday - home nearly all day.

Sighted first whale going north today -
before dinner time. Spouts were just beyond
breaker line - body visible in shallow waters.

Went to bed fairly early after good bath
and shampoo.

Fixed a large roast for birthday dinner
for just us two - alone.

Friday, May 1, 1970

121st day - 244 days follow

Foggy! Sun broke through in mid-afternoon -
bright and warm.

Did 2 loads of washing before lunch. Spent
afternoon cleaning house.

Bill home from school around 2 - and
kept busy typing letters for information on
2, 4, 5-T "restrictions" or "bars".

Sighted about 6 whale spouts before
sunset.

Dave phoned from Phil Kay's place around 9.
Greg and Doug dropped in for awhile.

Read Missoulians while Bill bathed, then
I got my chance to get clean and ready for
bed by midnight.

Saturday, May 2, 1970

122nd day - 243 days follow

Beautiful morning. Warm. All set to leave for Oakland by 10 A.M. Left Music Temple at Kennel near Arcata. Drive south exciting with new spring growth and wildflowers, but shocked to see extremely low water in South Fork Eel River - and devastation wrought by new highway construction in Southern Humboldt County and No. Mendocino County. Hot around Ukiah. (Lunch on Ridgewood Summit). Arrived at Jack London Square 5:30. Made quick change at nearby service station from slacks to dress. Wandered about - enjoying scene and flowers and harbor, then indulged in the "happy hour" prior to Sierra Club Annual dinner. Saw many long time friends and met new people - including dinner speaker Senator Alan Cranston.

Paul Fritz sat with us for dinner. Dale Burk from staff of The Mission Inn also surprise to see there. Dave on hand for cocktail hour, but not for dinner. Saw him later when we shared Phil Kay's trailer home in Vallico.

Beautiful, clear, starry night. And only beginning to cool off at midnight.

Sunday, May 3, 1970

123rd day - 242 days follow

Up by 8. Already warm. Followed Dave over Hwy 37 into Penn Grove outskirts for late breakfast, then to Santa Rosa airport where he left his car.

Beautiful drive home with brief lunch stop in Garberville and equally brief shopping stop in Eureka.

Fog came in by time we got home, but Dave barbecued steaks on deck and we ate in living room. In bed by midnight.

Monday, May 4, 1970

124th day - 241 days follow

Up by 9. Foggy (or low clouds). Went to MCK. for haircut at 11, but first had quick visit from Howard King and friends on way home from Hagwoods in Olick. Picked up Julie Temple from kennel after lunch.

Heard tragic news about student kidnaps by National Guardsmen at Kent State (Ohio) campus.

Spent afternoon ironing and listening to news reports.

Hung on TV and radio around dinner time - an upset nation tonight.

U.S. invasion of Cambodia being blasted by many.

Tuesday, May 5, 1970

125th day - 240 days follow

Low clouds all day - spotty sunshine. Up by 8. (Shops (arrived late last night) asked us over for coffee around 11.

~~Bill off~~ True prairie flycatcher found dragging a hind leg - taken to vets' immediately after breakfast - and picked up again around 3. (Abacus treated).

Did some typing on redwood report for Dave.

Bill at his seminar 5-6. ^{high} Late dinner - Barbered ^{hair} streets.

Wednesday, May 6, 1970

126th day - 239 days follow

Up by 8:30. Bill phoned at 9:20 to give us latest college news - A rally at noon. Bill home around 4:30.

Watched TV news before dinner - then headed for campus at 8:30 - catching end of another student gathering - with faculty also participating.

Spent 2 hrs. at Brundts, where ^{a few} faculty ^{members} proposed to aid students by choosing a stand ^{that} no punitive action be taken if they go on a "symbolic" strike next week.

Home by midnight. Clear and cold.

Thursday, May 7, 1970

127th day - 238 days follow

Up by 7:30. Cloudy. Ascension Day. Let Bill sleep in. Took Dave to airport at 9:30, then arranged for car to be greased and worked over while I played golf at Baywood.

Flag day tournament. Shot 47-48 with an eagle (2) on 17th hole. Planted flag near pin on 18th. Many went on to 19th hole. Light, light rain fell at 2 PM.

Retrieved car after 3, then headed for Dr. Gaylord's office in Eugene. Two toes (one on each foot) needed attention. Home by 5, after picking up plane ticket for S.F. in morning.

Duke and Sandy (?) came in around 11:30 to tell us latest college happenings. Duke had come by before dinner to borrow a sleeping bag and a back pack for his little brother this weekend.

In bed by 12:30. Dave ^{let} phoned that he would meet me at airport in S.F.

Rain began at 11 tonight.

Friday, May 8, 1970

128th day - 237 days follow

Up at 5:30. Raining hard. Bill took me to airport to get on 6:15 GPA flight to S.F. (15 passenger plane).

No scenery - too cloudy. 1 hr. 20 min. flight to S.F.

Dave met me as planned. Had breakfast at nice Hyatt House nearby, then drove down to Menlo Park to go to Sunset offices. (Dave to see travel editor Jeff Phillips). Beautiful place - gorgeous gardens - handsome building.

Light drizzle began and kept up all day. Dave then drove me out to Wayburns to attend meeting from 11 to 2 of Cranston Conservation Committee.

Interesting group, which included Alf Heller, George Trichel, Lois Hogle, Mrs. Bauckey, (Portola Valley mayor) Mrs. Gilman (Marine Conserv.) Bob Girard (law prof Stanford) and Senator Cranston's sister, Mrs. Fowle. Others not there: Mr. Wallace Stegner, Mrs. Clark Kerr and Cranston's field men (they were back in Washington on the Cambodian issue).

Recommendations to the Senator were made for forwarding - highest priority: Will Rivers in no. Calif. - and other good items.

Dave arrived around 3:30 to pick me up again. We headed north at 4:45. Rain much of the way.

A quick drive-in type dinner at Willits, a stop to collect Camos north of Willits, a gas stop in Eureka - and home by 10:45.

In bed by 12:30.

Saturday, May 9, 1970

129th day - 236 days follow

Cloudy. Dave gone again shortly after 8 - (caught plane to S.F. thence to Davis).

Up at 9:30 after breakfast in bed. Shoulder hurting again.

Bill met potential outing participants at HSC library at 10, but called off outing and returned by 10:20.

Vic here from 1-2. Went to grocery store around 3. Fixed salad for potluck tonight.

Sunday, May 10, 1970

130th day - 235 days follow

Mother's Day

Shower - followed by a lovely, sunny afternoon. Worked around house after late breakfast. Bill cooked some dough hotcakes for Doug and Greg and Dave - around 10:30. Worked in garden part of afternoon.

Monday, May 11, 1970

131st day - 234 days follow

Stayed in bed until 9:30 - feeling luv - shoulder hurting.

Dave did errands for us - like getting income tax forms to us for signing and mailing.

Did some washing during afternoon - as I felt like it.

Made "goop" for dinner - after making some candied orange peel.

Greg came by awhile after dinner - Made a few phone calls to get messages out regarding Escalante Wilderness.

Played 2 games of ^(Lives) Yahtzee before bedtime.

Tuesday, May 12, 1970

132nd day - 233 days follow

Fine. Drove to Dr. Gayland's office in Eureka by 9:45. Learned how to treat my big toenail problem and looked at X-rays of right toes - one possibly out of line from long ago possible break - Can be corrected anytime with a bit of whittling!

Vic here awhile to work with Bill on pesticide paper up-dating. "Whole watched" for long time before sunset. 3 in class. Vic stayed (while we ate dinner at 9) until about 10:30.

Drove off to S.F. again today.

Wednesday, May 13, 1970

133rd day - 232 days follow

Lovely day.

Spent most of afternoon ironing. Cat brought in lizard - left it wandering in bedroom - prompted some furniture moving and vacuuming.

Vic, Carol & baby here for dinner and much of the evening.

Broke part of an upper tooth off before bedtime!

Thursday, May 14, 1970

134th day - 231 days follow

Up at 6:30. A beautiful, clear morning. Left at 7:30 for Redwood Empire Golf Club - out of Redwoodville for 1st meet of year for NWCA. Shotgun tee-off at 9:00 A.M. Pleasant golfing until wind came up around 1 P.M. 65 women in the field - play was in five zones and it went smoothly. Shot 46-47-93 (included one bad hole with a 10!) Luncheon at 3 when day awards were given. A net 73 gave me a \$4⁰⁰ merchandise order. (It was a four way tie) Home by 5. Had a couple of drinks and chats with Gloria and Martin before cooking dinner. Dave phoned from S.F. Greg dropped by around 8:30.

In bed by 11:30.

to Arcata on errands (Dave with me).
Home by noon.

Went up to Autha's at 2:40, after getting
our portable stereo from Greg Knell.

People began arriving at 3 for our
10th anniversary party (Autha style).
Sunshine - lovely - good gang -
about 30 people (friends of all)
food galore, following cocktails.

At 8:30 the fog came back
in and we cleared everything
off outside tables and moved
in around the fireplace.

The Oubousons appeared late, as did
Hal Wildman, and we ended
the delightful party around 10:30.

Returned home to find Dave
"laid out" - not feeling good -
hard time breathing. Tried to

Wednesday, May 20, 1970

140th day - 225 days follow

Up at 5:30. Picked up Chuck Kennedy in Arcata at 6:10. Dave gone already to pick up Ray Peart in Eureka. We all met in Willow Creek for breakfast at 7:30. The TV two on hand already - and through breakfast as we arrived. Moved cars after unloading river equipment near Hoopa. One car taken to O'Rourke place upstream from Peewee a few miles. I drove mine to Martins Ferry Bridge. Dave picked us drivers up and we hurried back to the put-in spot. By 10:30 we were headed down the Trinity - 3 rafts. Dave with Dave Mougies, Chuck with cameraman Ralph, Ray Peart with me as passenger. Blue skies emerged from morning fog - beautiful!

Thursday, May 21, 1970

141st day - 224 days follow

Up by 8. Lovely day. Headed for golf course around 9:30. Picked up a 3-some on the 12th hole. Lynn Lawson played 10 and 11 with me later to finish out my 18 holes. Shot 45-46. Won a golf ball with low net score of 71. Home before 5 - sunburned over sunburn!

Dave flew to S.F. and back - showing up in Trina for dinner.

Friday, May 22, 1970

142nd day - 223 days follow

Up by 7:30. Lovely day. Worked around house - cleaning mostly. Bill at school from 10 till 5.

Dave cleaned up equipment, packed things, made preparations for his trip to Nevada.

At 4:30 I took Dave to Enns to retrieve his car from the garage and left "M.T." at the kennel for the weekend.

Barbecued steak for dinner while Dave continued chasing around getting ready to leave - and he finally got away at 10:30 P.M.!

Meanwhile I began getting ready to go on the Canyon Creek outing into the Trinity Wilderness - and got to bed at 11:45.

Discovered that "Turquoise Flycatcher" was limping this evening - perhaps bitten by large gopher she presented to us around dinner time.

Talked to Rose Stephens at length concerning work on Ray Peet's campaign.

- Canyon Creek -

Awake early, but not out of sleeping bag until 8. Others already up - fire going. Washed face in icy cold, tumbling water before waterfall. Beautiful morning - and a rare place to have breakfast (tea and toast). On the trail around 9. Fast - gaining downhill most of time - but getting warm, too, by 10. Passed two couples on the trail. Looked closely at some flowers - and checked out a bird or two with field glasses. The dogwoods and the gorgeous stream were as enchanting in morning light as they were yesterday. By 12 we were back at the trail head.

Drove into Ripstein campground to finish up my scanty "snacks" before heading home. Warm dining, especially around Willow Creek. Stopped to pick up a good, thick milk shake to consume as I drove.

Cool breeze off ocean could be felt by the time I reached Blue Lake. All clear and warm on the coast. Beaches loaded with people.

Enjoyed bath and shampoo and decided to go to dinner at Hazards. Took Greg with us. Howard King there. Had good evening, then returned home by 10.

Cat still limping. Bill took her to vet. yesterday where shot was administered.

143rd day - 222 days follow

Sunday, May 24, 1970

144th day - 221 days follow

Up at 5:30 - away by 5:50. ^{Trinity Sunday} Beautiful driving -
little traffic all the way to turn off at Junction City.
Stopped for gas in Willow Creek at 7. Arrived
Ripstein camp ground (13 miles on Canyon Creek Road) by 9.
Small group (8) hit the trail at 9:15. Ken Lytle
(leader), Bill Howell, Betty Jain and three youngsters -
Lou, Peter and 8 yr. old Martha - and Linda Walcott.

Beautiful hiking near the rushing, always tumbling,
stream. Dogwoods flowering all about us. Saw
one gopher snake, one yearling deer - 10 ft. away across
stream - and delighted in all the variety of birdsong.

Rested briefly at McKay Camp around 11. Our
lunch stop was in woods - cool - surrounded by large
Thuja, Pinus ponderosa and Picea Breweriana near
Canyon Creek meadow. The trail was pretty steadily
upward from there on. We paused at lower Canyon
falls, middle falls and upper falls. Then the back
climb put us at lovely lower Canyon Creek Lake. Only
one other party there - a young couple - fishing and sunning.
Ken, the boys and I shed our packs, took off our boots
and ^{waded} across the icy outflow (very swift water) and
then hiked the short distance to upper Canyon Creek Lake.

Nice day. Finished making arrangements for press conference for Don Engdahl. Dave took me into Eureka by 1 - to meet everyone at City Hall. He took his car to garage and missed meeting Don. Good news coverage on radio, newspaper and TV.

Did four loads of washing, after returning, finally finishing up around bedtime.

Wednesday, May 27, 1970

147th day - 218 days follow

~~Dave took cat to Vets.~~

Nice day. Spent long time morning - then had to lie down because my legs gave out.

Guy came in around 5:30. Then Howard arrived. Then Bill got home.

The Huffs arrived before dark - they sold their place - and came up to move out some things.

Late, late dinner - (barbecued steaks).

Then Jonathan Ela and Jeremy Crane arrived - late. They threw their sleeping bags out on the deck.

Picked up the cat from the vets in afternoon - around 4:30.

Thursday, May 28, 1970

148th day - 217 days follow

Up at 7:30. Sunshine here, ^{Corpus Christi} fog hovering here and there. Jeremy and Jonathan left for the Trinity area around 11, according to Alene, who left in late afternoon to join them. Bill went to Big Lagoon to meet Howard King for some collecting and photographing of bog plants. I went to Baywood to golf - at 10:20. I had lousy game, but enjoyed Lei Blau's good game.

Home around 3 after getting some groceries in M.K. (where Dave scared me ~~but~~ by coming up behind me in store).

Barbequed chicken breasts for dinner. I had leg, knee, and shoulder problems - so went to bed (so did Bill) at 9:40.

Friday, May 29, 1970

149th day - 216 days follow

Up by 8. Lovely day - some cloudiness "around the edges." Bill at school most of day. Ripped up linoleum from kitchen floor.

Mr. Coleman brought us large box of *Trichuris* to plant here.

Ann Weiss (and young Paul) came in for awhile in mid-afternoon, bringing material for 50 newsletters.

Worked on floor (scraping, prying, etc. on adhesive) before and after dinner.

In bed by 12.

Gave cat 2nd dose of medication for gimpy foot.

Saturday, May 30, 1970

150th day - 215 days follow

Beautiful, warm day. ^{Memorial Day}

Typed up some items for the SC newsletter.

Enjoyed quiet day and evening at home.

Sunday, May 31, 1970

151st day - 214 days follow

Another beautiful, very warm day. Hordes of people on beach.

Greg here for soundough Latrade breakfast. Worked around house and garden until Greg and gang came back at 3:30 to put newsletters together. Bill Nevell joined us - and stayed for dinner.

Steve returned - looking absolutely beaten from his hike. Jonathan and Jeremy came in later - had a cocktail, then looked for bay area.

Monday, June 1, 1970

152nd day - 213 days follow

Tuesday, June 2, 1970

153rd day - 212 days follow

Fog in on shoreline all day - only glimpses of blue sky once in awhile.

Started some washing, then helped Dave take some measurements for sliding panels at his "other" house.

Back here for lunch after voting and picking up packages at Westham P.O.

Wednesday, June 3, 1970

154th day - 211 days follow

Breakfast in bed.

Foggy until after lunch. Made some phone calls, then took Dave + AT and headed for Eureka at 11:15. Stopped at City Hall to check on agenda for Council meeting tonight - wildlife refuge.

Shopped with Dave - home by 2:30.

Prepared brief statement for tonight's meeting. Dave helped me. Duke called for ride later.

Early dinner - quick bath - Ken arrived to use typewriter - Duke and I took off at 7:45.

Picked up girl at dorm - arrived City Hall in good time.

Gave statement when item rolled around. Good audience. Many besides SC asked for reversal of previous council action.

Home by 10.

Beil on work party in Arcata with Lions Club - arrived home immediately ahead of me.

In bed by 12 after catching up on papers, letters, magazines.

Thursday, June 4, 1970

155th day - 210 days follow

Foggy. Played golf at Baywood, but only 16 holes - had to miss first 2 holes (some cancelled - had to join earlier 3-some).

Home by 3:30.

Friday, June 5, 1970

156th day - 209 days follow

Foggy. Did some ^{Feast of the Sacred Heart} washing, telephoning, etc. Dave left at 8:30 for S.F. and Modesto. Worked on kitchen floor - sweeping off old linoleum.

Bill home by 5:30. Picked up Anita around 7 - drove to Jo Finens lovely home in Eureka. Nice informal dinner, then showed Grand Canyon river running movies.

Home by 2 A.M. - tired, sleepy.

Saturday, June 6, 1970

157th day - 208 days follow

Overcast all day. Did some housecleaning, straightening up, making room for 4 overnighters.

Bill left at 12:30 to work on Lions Club exhibit booth and got home again by 3:30. Meanwhile Howard King arrived by car. Then a call from McK. airport that Michael and Tony Losh had arrived with Vern Van Vleet (piloting his 7 passenger plane!)

Had time for cocktails - after preparing a large macaroni salad and gathering things up for Sierra Club meeting.

Dave phoned from Modesto with urgent message on conservation for the meeting.

Went in with Howard. Bill took others. Good meeting. Jim Trayner (and Tony) told the story of Bull Creek watershed - with slides. Large turnout for potluck dinner AND meeting. Howard's display of color photos of redwoods was well received.

Home by 11:30. Talked awhile, then everyone visiting packed out - Tony on deck, Michael on large couch, Vern on small couch, Howard in dining room. We kept M.T. and cat in our bedroom all night. MT not feeling good - I worried.

Sunday, June 7, 1970

158th day - 207 days follow

Up at 6:30. Got everyone fed, then off to Arcata airport (at Mck.) by 8. Ven had to gas plane first. Fog already breaking - promising nice day.

Howard took off to photograph beach plants and/or bog plants, depending on weather.

I cleaned house while Bill ~~coll~~ corrected papers. MT still not too spry - wouldn't even chase bones or sticks when I went out to pull a few weeds.

Lots of people on beach after 2 P.M. Wind came up, but it stayed warm.

Sue Shipley came in for awhile, just before we ate - around 4:30.

Sergei S. phoned.

Spent part of afternoon ironing - then did a news story about the meeting and a rough draft of letter to Assemblywoman Davis regarding a road in Anzo-Borrego St. Park.

Ready for bed by 11.

MT finally ate something and began to perk up.

Lots of clam diggers out at low tide around 7 A.M.

Monday, June 8, 1970

159th day - 206 days follow

Tuesday, June 9, 1970

160th day - 205 days follow

Up at 7:30. Raining lightly, but steadily. Dave and Bill slept late, but managed to leave for moving job at Bill's office by 10:15. Checked with Ken about departure time to drive to meeting in Napa - then phoned Al Whitney, so we could arrange to pick him up.

Left at 2:15. Big, bouncy clouds all the way down. While Ken napped I drove from his cell to Garberville. Phoned Al one more because we were later than predicted. Picked him up near freeway at Ukiah at 5:45. Decided to go by Hwy. 128 - through St. Helena + Calistoga. Perfectly lovely that way - past the big Christine Bros. winery - and - we thought, faster than going by way of Santa Rosa.

Meeting began at 7:30 in the Nurses Conference Room in the Administration Bldg. of Napa State Hospital.

We left there at 11 after a private conference with John Tuttle regarding Trinity-Salmon Study. Stopped at the Whitneys, where I had cake, ice cream and coffee while Ken napped.

Left Ukiah at 1:50 - or after 2 - by the time we got gas and a snack for the road. I drove from Willits to a few miles north of Laytonville, where we stopped for an hour. Neither one of us awake enough to drive.

Wednesday, June 10, 1970

161st day - 204 days follow

Awoken about 5:20. First Day of Pentecost (Jewish) Managed to continue driving to Eureka - then Ken took over for the last lap home. Beautiful morning - some ground fog, some clouds - mostly fair. Saw many deer and many dead small ones - crunched on the highway. Reached Moovstone at 6:45.

Found the house in a mess. There had been a party all evening I learned.

Dave got up around 8:30. Bill was up, looking pretty low, at 10:30 or 11. I was already busy cleaning house - and pretty upset.

MT not feeling good. Dave finally took her to the vets - and took Bill to the college to drop off grades. Had short nap.

Howard King stopped for a few minutes on his way home from Quik - happy with his few days of photographing around the bogs and beach at Gold Bluffs.

Light dinner. Saw Watson and friends come in awhile - Sue Shipley appeared - interested in renting house this summer.

In bed by ten to read.

Thursday, June 11, 1970

162nd day - 203 days follow

Played golf - but played badly -

Friday, June 12, 1970

163rd day - 202 days follow

Did some shopping with Dave in Eureka.
Helped Dave at his place awhile - cleaned a few
windows and started putting fresh shelf
paper in kitchen.

Lunch and dinner at Moonstone, then Bill
joined us in evening.

In the dark I injured my left (hip to knee)
leg as I fell off the walkway, glancing blow on
edge of planks.

Home by midnight - leg throbbing - found
huge lump just below hip bone.

Saturday, June 13, 1970

164th day - 201 days follow

Worked most of day at Denise's place. Cleaned windows - from high ladder - cleaned rain gutters, vacuumed two rooms - while he repaired, moved, cleaned, etc. in other areas - and fixed a pathway - and chipped wood.

Both had lunch at Moonstone, then returned to do more cleaning.

Finished putting paper on shelves.

Sunday, June 14, 1970

165th day - 200 days follow

Flag Day

Worked at Denise's place again. Scrubbed stone and defrosted refrigerator.

Spent a full day - working hard in spite of leg bruise.

Monday, June 15, 1970

166th day - 199 days follow

Promised Dave a few hours of cleaning that I could do - and wound up my bit of help for him.

Tuesday, June 16, 1970

167th day - 198 days follow

Did some washing and housecleaning, putting in another full day. Too tired to attend City Council meeting with Wildlife Refuge re-vote on agenda.

Bill Devall was in for short time. Caught last of Council meeting on radio. Vote came out the same as before 3-1 (one absent).

Wednesday, June 17, 1970

168th day - 197 days follow

Lonely day.
Worked at home - washing, cleaning etc.

At 1 o'clock Wallace & Peggy Rushkin & 3 children arrived to look at the house - to rent for 5 weeks - and paid in advance without batting an eye. They would move in Sunday evening.

Went on washing like mad and was exhausted by late bed time.

Thursday, June 18, 1970

169th day - 196 days follow

Up at 6:30 to get Dave up. Beautiful morning. Clear here, foggy around the edges, but moving out as morning went on. Dave gone at 7 o'clock to get "Redwoods" film to NPS in Klamath (for preview and later showing).

Off to Baywood at 8:30. Tee-off time 9:10 - with Mary Lybeck, Maryanne Hilger and Ruth Elliott. Absolutely beautiful day - even got a bit warm. Shot 45-50. Home by 2 after getting silverware into bank ^{safe} deposit box. Young conservation type law student, Jamie Sutton, arrived about 4:45 - after contacting Dave - who returned from working at his house - to talk here. Jamie here on coastal access problems - with court action in mind.

At 6:30 The Jeep was taken into Arcata to leave for a trailer hitch job first thing in morning. Sue Shipley here a few minutes.

Barbequed chicken for dinner. Roasted last of our marshmallows later.

Magnificent full moon.

Scrubbed kitchen cabinets while Bill bathed. Dave folded up early - not feeling too sharp - bad cough.

In bed around 1 A.M.

Friday, June 19, 1970

170th day - 195 days follow

Cleaning, packing, washing, throwing away things.

~~Had to take Bill Dave took Bill~~ Cleaned stove, washed windows, etc, etc.

Saturday, June 20, 1970

171st day - 194 days follow

Worked like crazy - Defrosted refrigerator. Had Dave take left over food stuffs up to his place.

Ate dinner at Seascap with Dave - before 9 - then back to house for Falcon to go to Patrick's Point State Park to see Kay Chaffey - group entering there - Home again by 11.

Dave working at his place until I phoned him about helping Bill. But Bill bathed and went to bed instead.

Sunday, June 21, 1970

172nd day - 193 days follow

Loosely day.

Father's Day

Washed, washed, scrubbed, put things in attic - up and down, back & forth - on the run all day.

The Rushniks arrived at 7:30 - we barely had our stuff down in the garage. Vacuumed & vacuumed more!

Left stuff soaking in laundry trays over night - too late, too hungry to finish.

Cooked up some dinner at Dave's.

Fell into bed by midnight - sleeping in the loft in our sleeping bag.

Monday, June 22, 1970

173rd day - 192 days follow

Beautiful misty redwoods our eye opener scene from the upstairs sleeping quarters.

Back to work at Moonstone by 10. Finished the clothes washing and drying and began packing the trailer. Dave helped Bill to the electrical look-ups.

Pretty cat in a dither - too much going on. She tried to get in the trailer, then the jeep, then the Falcon - Sweet thing - she knew something was drastically different.

It nearly broke my heart to pull away - just before dark.

Dashed to Seascape for quick dinner. Too tired to eat. Greg with us.

Back at Dave's place for the night. Good bath and shampoo - ready for bed by 11. Every body exhausted.

Tuesday, June 23, 1970

174th day - 191 days follow

woke up at 6:30 - heard Dave leaving. Said goodbye, then back to bed until after 8. Greg had soup for breakfast and headed out shortly afterwards. Cleaned up the kitchen, then began packing last minute things in car. It was jammed! I had to ride with overnight case & purse and wading at my feet. Left the Falcon at Lytle around 12:30 - and headed north. First stop - Quick - to say goodbye to Hagoods and have a hamburger. Also saw Joanne & Allison at NPS hq's. Beautiful through the redwoods. Rhododendrons were splashy everywhere you looked. Stopped to show Bill the Humboldt lilies to photograph at roadside in Del Norte Coast Park. Warming up as we neared Grants Pass. Stopped around 7 to eat somewhere along Sams Valley on way to Crater Lake. Still a lot of patchy snow on and near the rim. The lake was deep purple - no, royal blue at the edges as the shadows crept downward - with a pinkish glow.

At 10 we stopped for coffee at La Pine and inquired for a pull off spot. Found one about 4-5 miles up the road - on East Lake Rd. turnoff. Beautiful starry evening - very pleasantly warm.

Wednesday, June 24, 1970

175th day - 190 days follow

Up by 8 - Bill up much earlier. Drove 22 miles into Bend for breakfast. Already feeling warm at 9:30. Quite warm when we stopped at Biggs Junction for lunch. Over 100° in Walla Walla. Stopped there for a milkshake. Over 92° at 7 when we pulled into Lewiston for cool vodka collins and dinner. Drove on out to Cornwell - coffee stop at 10 - before finding a wide spot to pull off for the night.

Slept above the rushing waters of the Lochsa river - right on the edge of the bank.

Thursday, June 25, 1970

981 miles from Trinidad 176th day - 189 days follow Yellow Bay

Up by 8:30 - Beautiful morning. Beautiful drive into Lolo Junction - 62 miles or more - but a long wait for breakfast! Dozed off and as - very warm again.

Shipped around Alisoula - arrived at Yellow Bay at 3:30. Breezy here, but it kept getting warmer as we unpacked at the same old cabin.

Feel asleep on the bed as soon as it was made. Bill went to dinner without me. I was exhausted and every joint and muscle was aching.

Bill went on with unpacking - down in Botany Lab.

Friday, June 26, 1970

177th day - 188 days follow

Awakened to light pattering of rain drops. It turned cooler and remained cloudy most of the day.

Spent entire day in bed - sleeping off and on - much noise from trucks on highway and boats in Yellow Bay.

Bill brought me a little bit of lunch and then at 6:30 a little bit of dinner. Too tired to be very hungry - shoulder hurting again.

Mavis came in awhile - as I ate. Managed to walk down the hill for a shower around 9:30 - then right back to bed.

Bill brought me some coffee then returned to work until 11:30 in Botany Lab.

Saturday, June 27, 1970

178th day - 187 days follow

Rain, heavy, earth shaking thunder and scattered showers throughout day. Bill brought me some toast and coffee.

Got up around 10 - puttered around - put things away - then started sewing around 11. Continued sewing up until bedtime - ab 10 - or so.

Bill brought me a sandwich and coffee for lunch and later - at 6:30 a tray of dinner, but I didn't eat very much.

He showed up again at 10:15 with a thermos of coffee and some mail.

Read "Night of the Grizzlies" for awhile. Bill came in around 12:30.

Sunday, June 28, 1970

179th day - 186 days follow

Had a real "gully washer" during the night. Woke up several times to pounding rain.

Woke up around 8:30, but didn't get out of bed until after I had toast and coffee - which Bill brought up to me around 10.

Dressed - cut up some material for curtains (an old sheet) - then began typing cards for SC North Group membership file. Bill brought lunch tray around 1:30. Went on typing until 5:30 when John Tibbs (Director) came by to invite us for cocktails before dinner.

Ended up having dinner at Blue Bay with Tibbs' and the Prescotts.

Phoned the Rushkins at Moonstone. Pretty Cat now in boarding kennel - 2 in family allergic.

Phoned Dave about Trinity property in question by Sierra Club Foundation. Returned to cabin to write him further details - and a separate, trip description letter.

In bed around 12:30. Cool tonight.

Spent a few minutes talking with the Vogls this afternoon - sitting out in warm sun.

Monday, June 29, 1970

180th day - 185 days follow

A dark, rainy morning. Didn't wake up until 9:45! Had breakfast at Yellow Bay store around 11, then headed for Palson. Made appt. with M.D. Dead for 4:30. Did small items shopping, had light lunch after 2, then returned to Station. Put things away and left again for Palson at 4. Still raining, lightly but quite steadily.

Dr. Neal diagnosed the shoulder pain as "Thoracic Outlet Syndrome". Was given shot, then had electrical current, deep penetrating, therapy for about 15 min. Meanwhile, Bill went out to get a prescription filled. Had bacon + egg type dinner at South Shore Inn coffee shop around 6:15 before headed back to Yellow Bay.

Cabin so cold I took some typing to do down in the warm, now incandescent Botany Lab. First found student store manager, who kindly took a heater up to our cabin.

Still raining when I went to bed - this night with sleeping bag as extra cover, as well as heating pad at feet.

Hands cold as I write at midnight.

Began another page of letter to Dave.

Feeling some relief in shoulder and neck area, but writing is not easy.

Tuesday, June 30, 1970

181st day - 184 days follow

Up at 8:15. Mostly cloudy. Quick breakfast in Lab. Marie went to Palson with us at 9. Bill "sat in" on my "Neodymator" treatment - about 15 min. We both got our typhoid and tetanus shots. Did some quick shopping and returned to the Station by 11. Fixed myself a sandwich for lunch in Botany Lab.

Fixed lenses in one dress, then typed SC file cards until finished. Sent off letter to Dave, one card to Ken + Cheryl Lytle, and one card to Marilyn Maher.

Received card from Jean Patton which worried me. Not good - as went a report from Margaret Browne to Bill the other night.

Seminar at 7. D. Z. Kochanski (from Poland) on "Prediction making in Biology." Strange, but interesting.

Went down to Botany Lab for coffee, then took some up to cabin for another sewing and typing routine - until bedtime. - 12:30.

SNOW down to 6000' level today on Mt. Mission. We saw it as clouds hugged the peaks - when we drove out of Palson. Beautiful!

Wednesday, July 1, 1970

182nd day - 183 days follow

Up at 8:15. Another quick breakfast in Lab. then off to Polson at 9. Went through hair raising session with electric current treatment for 15 minutes at Mr. Deak's office at 9:30. Back at Station by 10:30.

Scattered clouds today. Snow visible on all surrounding mountain ranges as far as the eyes could see. Lunch - alone - in Lab.

Spent most of afternoon sewing and did a little ironing - using board in Bath House.

Alden Gauvin gave 7 PM Seminar on "The Use and Abuse of our Water Resources."

At 8:30 I returned to cabin to write letter to SC Foundation and do some more sewing.

Finished hemming (raising hem) one good deer during afternoon and fixed one shirt to do tomorrow.

Bill came up to cabin by 12:30 - to read awhile.

Thursday, July 2, 1970

183rd day - 182 days follow

Up at 8:15. Scattered clouds all day. Quite warm at times. Left for Polson at 9. Had another shoulder and neck treatment for 15 min. Did a bit of shopping for sewing materials. Back at Station before 11. Had coffee, then decided to go into Kalispell for other shopping. Had lunch when we got there. (75°). Bill made appt. for eye examination with Dr. Angjow. Coffee and pie after 3 - then finished up and headed back at 4.

Kens returned my ironing board, so I went right to work on cabin curtains - and continued working on them after dinner. Around 9:15 I walked down to Botany Lab for coffee and to read papers which came in mail.

Showered and Shampooed after 10. Still pleasant out though clouds persist.

In bed to read by 12. Bill came in at 12:45. Both read until 1:30.

Friday, July 3, 1970

184th day - 181 days follow

Slept until 9:30. Awakened to beautiful, clear, warm morning. Started some washing around 10. Time out for breakfast, then finished hanging things out by 12:30. Lunch in lab.

Sunbathed awhile outside cabin while sewing on small curtains. Went to lab for coffee at 4:30 - stayed until dinnertime.

Very warm all afternoon. Lots of activity on Yellow Bay. Chuck Stark came in to see us, having boated up from Finley Point.

Seminar at 7. Mr. Ruffelt - from Sweden. Returned to Lab for coffee and reading. Marie & grandsons returned around 9.

Went up to cabin to do some ironing and sewing. Lovely evening - doors open until bedtime.

Planned to take Mr. Ruffelt to Glacier Park tomorrow.

Saturday, July 4, 1970

185th day - 180 days follow

Up by 8:30. Mostly ^{independence} clear and warm in A.M. Left for Glacier Park shortly after 10 in University vehicle. Marie with us, also. First stop, Argon Village for early lunch. Then up to Logan Pass.

Botanized in the meadows. Many, many people there - all over the place. Air crystal clear - thunderheads beginning to appear. Glacier looks beautiful as ever. Snow heavy in patches - melting fast. Water courses all tumbling, full. Enjoyed painting out flowers - and other park features to our Swedish visitor. Drove on to Mary glacier. Marie checked to see if Royal was around - (day off from naturalist duties; hacking steps in ice to Sperry Glacier!)

Botanized on return trip in meadow below Mt. Apeskunny. Decided to return by way of Marias Pass. Saw handsome coyote, about to cross roadway, not far out of West Glacier - going too fast to get picture - no place to turn around quickly and hope it would still be there.

Had leisurely dinner at West Glacier Cafe. Back at Station by 9:30. Clouds were beautiful over the Mission. Took time for coffee before going up the hill for a shower. It had been a warm, sticky day.

In bed by 12:30 - after chatting with a couple of fellows - who were relaxing, cooling off, near the Bath House. We talked bears, people, parks and poor forest practices on U.S.F.S. lands.

Warm enough to have all doors and windows open. Yellow Bay extremely quiet for the 4th.

Heard thunder, saw lightning over lake around 11.

Sunday, July 5, 1970

186th day - 179 days follow

Up by 9:30. Fair - scattered clouds, some wind - but never enough to really cool off. It was a very warm day.

Finished sewing curtains, got them all pressed and hung — and then the curtain rod broke!

Steaks, cooked outside dining hall, for dinner tonight.

Opened museum to air it out. Bill hung some art work by Pat Howe.

Talked with Ray Hauberg briefly this morning — first time I had seen him since we arrived.

Put some SL photos on cabin walls to liven them up a bit.

Pleasant evening — once it cooled down. In bed to read before midnight.

Monday, July 6, 1970

187th day - 178 days follow

Up at 9. Beautiful morning — a bit cooler than yesterday before noon, but it warmed up after midday. Did two large loads of washing — started at 1 — finished at 3:30. Sheets dried in 30 minutes!

Did some letter writing and sewing and swept out cabin.

(Dr.) Joe Elliott gave seminar at 7 on work done in St. Louis with Barry Commancer.

Went up to Margaret Brown's afterwards, returning around 9:30. Shoulder bothering me again.

In bed to read by 11:30.

David (Bartlett) phoned around 7:15 — to find out just WHERE we were this summer.

Tuesday, July 7, 1970

188th day - 177 days follow

Up around 9. A beautiful day - kind of warm, but beautiful. (92° F.)

Did some ironing. Visited with Nagle - looking at recently acquired Indian basket collection and other old items of western nature.

Clancy Gordon here for brief stop-over on way to Columbia Falls.

Went to beach after sunning near cabin. Water comfortable - sun, HOT!

Bill came down from 4:15 - 5:45. Enjoyed chips and sunning.

Wrote letter to Utah Road Commission in opposition to proposed route from Glen Canyon City to Hole-in-the-Rock Road.

Talked to a student about Indian Country in Southwest. (Nick Savko.) He had taught at Layenta for 1½ yrs.

Beautiful evening - crescent moon tonight. Noted number of visitors had been in Museum.

Wednesday, July 8, 1970

189th day - 176 days follow

Awake at 9. Another beautiful day - warm again.

Did some ironing, finished by 1 - went to lat for lunch and to read mail.

Marie returned at 2:30 - with a sprained (?) ankle. I drove her to M.D. in Palsen. X-ray showed no breaks, so it was taped and we were back by 5:30. Did some incidental shopping, then sat in M.D.'s office while waiting for Marie. Began reading book about Navahos - "Son of old man", which Nick Savko brought in.

Hung curtains (changing rods around cabin) before seminar at 7. Dr. Lawrence Mitchell (V.M.) talked on "Mosquitoes and mosquito bites" - very interesting.

Back to cabin to sew awhile before showering.

Received package from David today - a map with routes and remarks about his & Janet's recent trip.

Saw Mrs. (Herman) Stark, then Lorie, in the doctor's office.

Thursday, July 9, 1970

190th day - 175 days follow

Up by 8:30. Beautiful, quite warm. Thunderheads over surrounding mountains throughout day. Heard 2 drops of rain in mid-morning - a cloud passed over.

Did some more sewing - fixing hems in shirts and dress and made several "Hiloise scrubbers."

Went to lake shore from 2:30-4:00 - mostly sun bathing, but dips in water were nice to cool off. Bill went down, alone, at 4:30.

(Marie's grandson, Ron, got a fish hook caught in the back of his head - so, into the A.D. with her as she got her ankle checked.)

At 9 Marie, Bill and I drove to Blue Bay for a "refresher" - back by 10.

In bed to read at 11:45. Still quite warm. A quarter moon in the western sky tonight.

Friday, July 10, 1970

191st day - 174 days follow

Awake by 9:00. A cloudy, gray day with very light rain at times.

Walked up to Yellow Bay store around 12:30 to get lunch materials, careful to take umbrella along. Plucked some flowers on the way back for color in the Museum.

Got started pasting Blue chip Stamps in books, then went to lab around 4:30 for coffee. John Tibbs brought Marge Anderson down. We talked until almost dinner time.

Got Marie (from lying down in cabin) to go to dinner with us at Blue Bay. The sun finally broke through clouds around 8.

Spent a few hours with John & Sally Tibbs, talking over plans for Open House July 26.

Back to lab for coffee and talked with Sam Johnstone - from Auckland, N.Z. then up to bed by 1:30. Stars out by that time.

Wrote letters to David, Ursula and Jean.

Saturday, July 11, 1970

192nd day - 173 days follow

Up at 9:00. Beautiful morning, scattered ~~the~~ clouds.
Thunder showers after lunch.

Surprise visit from Joe Santone, travelling in the west with 3 high school juniors from deep within the city of Philadelphia. He and boys staying at Yellow Bay State Park on way to Glacier + Banff, after such sights as Grand Canyon, old Mexico, Yellowstone, etc.

Started to do a polymer emulsion, but couldn't find ~~the~~ slide I wanted to paint from. Started reading instead and fell asleep - waking up again at midnight.

Sunday, July 12, 1970

193rd day - 172 days follow

Up by 8:30. Scattered clouds all day.

Did some reading and some typing on rough draft of 1st issue of the Spider Web.

Began a painting of Yellow Bay as viewed from "postcard" point south on highway - using Bill's color slide of 1969. Worked on 14" x 18" canvas - in cabin.

Went to lab to read awhile and have coffee - 9:30-10:30. Then showered and climbed into bed to read.

Wrote letter to Kay (Macdonald) this morning.

Pileated woodpeckers close by were better than an alarm clock this morning!

While painting, one was on tree just outside large windows in cabin.

Monday, July 13, 1970

194th day - 171 days follow

Woke up to rain drops at 8:15. Rain steady all morning, all afternoon and on till just after dinner.

Did some taping on Spider Web material, then stayed in cabin near heater working on painting.

Seminar at 7. Scott E. Fisher (student) gave survival problems, based on Montana's problems in a way - population, pollution, mining, U.S.F.S. C of Eng. destroying state, etc. He urged more teachers to be conservation oriented in their education and politically active as well on environmental issues.

Read awhile in lab. Developed headache so headed for bed by 10. Read only a short while.

Weather obviously beginning to clear. Cool tonight.

Tuesday, July 14, 1970

195th day - 170 days follow

Up by 8:30. Lovely morning - somewhat cool-ish. Widely scattered clouds.

Spent a couple of hours before lunch taping Spider Web onto ditto masters - 3 pages only first issue.

Sharon tied up with installation of Xerox machine to run the ditto machine until after dinner.

Left at 7 o'clock for Kalispell to attend public meeting on Wild and Scenic Rivers - the North, South and Middle forks of the Flathead presently undergoing study for classification.

Meeting dominated by conservation oriented residents. Question & answer period was taped.

More than half full, the moonlight on the lake was beautiful on drive back. Appeared to be absolutely clear skies as far as could be seen. Lights on shoreline were bright.

In bed by 12:30.

Wednesday, July 15, 1970

196th day - 169 days follow

Up at 8:30. A beautiful morning - bright & clear.

At 9:30 Ters and I put the finished Spider Web into mail boxes. Hope Miller had helped her put them together last night.

The pile driver "Hodge" put in awhile just south of the Holiday motel. John Tibbs and Bill drove over, hoping to talk to Frank Hodge, but only 2 young men were on hand.

Walked up to Yellow Bay store at noon for some lunch stuff - and marmalade for my breakfast treat!

Did one very large load of washing from 1:30-3:00. At 4 I went to the beach. Sun bathed and took brief dips and tried swimming again, but shoulder held me back. Water was calm, clear and pleasantly warm close to shore.

Seminar at 7. Dr. Alt, geologist from U.C., explained formation of Flathead region.

Started a new painting. Mt. Harding in the Missions.

At 10:30 Had good shower and Shampoo. Beautiful moon tonight - and quite warm.

Thursday, July 16, 1970

197th day - 168 days follow

Up by 8:30. Mostly clear - a few scattered clouds before lunchtime.

Did some sewing (hemming) ironing, reading, and painting throughout day and evening. Worked on scene of Mt. Harding.

Increased cloudiness in afternoon - thunder over the Missions. Lightning in very late evening. Full moon hazy with clouds as it rose over the Missions - about 10:30.

Bill came up to cabin around midnight. Both read awhile.

Sally Tibbs came down to Botany lab during evening to discuss plans and preparations for Open House - Visitors Day.

Friday, July 17, 1970

198th day - 167 days follow

During the night there was a heavy storm going, but when I got up at 8:20 all was clear and bright and fresh from rain.

Wrote note to Ray Beart and made Visitor Day notes for Sally Tibbs.

Mostly read and painted. Got nice and warm in afternoon. Bill came up around 4:45 to go swimming. Wind on lake, so we only sun-bathed.

Went to dinner at Blue Bay shortly after 6. Found the Prescotts and Maile there, too. We had all remembered this was "fish night" at the Station.

Fiddled around painting, then went to lab to read - from 10 - 11:30.

Clear - moonlight tonight!

Saturday, July 18, 1970

199th day - 166 days follow

Up around 8. Lovely morning, lovely day.

Left for Palom at 9:30. Attended annual meeting of Flathead Lakes from 10 until 1. From here were John Tibbs, Arden Gaufer, Steve & Ginny Herw. Arden, John & Steve gave brief presentations.

Chuck Stark and his father / Herman sat near us. Talked to Mr. Jessie Bierman briefly. Good meeting, though lengthy.

Lunch at South Shore coffee shop - the town was crammed for Koda, Show boat, etc. Did some quick shopping and returned by 3:30.

Brought 8 lbs. of Bing cherries near station entrance at 50¢ a lb. Delicious!

Went swimming with Bill from 4:45 - 5:45. The water was delightful. Did some actual swimming until my shoulder tired -- too nice to have to get out -- for dinner.

Went to lab around 8 to read Task Force Report on Management of the Bitterroot Forest.

Shown short reel of movies from last Thanksgiving with Patterns - just developed!

Warm and windy when I returned to cabin at 11:30.

Sunday, July 19, 1970

200th day - 165 days follow

Up at 9:15. Lovely morning, lovely day, lovely warm evening. Thin scattered clouds only.

Washed to mail box for Sunday paper while coffee brewed.

Began letter in support of Voyageurs National Park. Lunched alone in lab around 1.

Went to Sally Tibbs' house at 2 - with other women from station - for coffee and talk of plans for Open House.

Around 4:15 Bill and I headed for beach. Swimming wonderful; sun hot! Lots of water skiers out.

Checked Museum after dinner. Bill went through some photographs. I returned to lab to do some small signs for Visitors Day, then went to cabin at 9:45.

Monday, July 20, 1970

201st day - 164 days follow

Up at 8:30. Beautiful morning that turned quite warm and humid by mid-afternoon.

Left for Kalispell for shopping at 10:30. Got poster supplies for Open House among other things.

Back by 2:30. Read papers and cub poster board.

Bill and I headed for lake at 4:45. Beautiful clouds passed overhead for short while. Water was smooth and perfect for swimming.

Seminar at 7. Mr. Andrew Sheldon.

Worked on a poster board until 9:30 after seminar ended at 8.

Very warm evening - all doors and windows open in cabin. Some thunder in distance.

Tuesday, July 21, 1970

202nd day - 163 days follow

Awakened by rain, wind, thunder, banging doors, squeaking doors, etc. as a wild storm passed over.

Up at 8:30 to cloudy skies.

Stayed in botany lab most of day - University Information Service sent a crew of 3 in. Bill and I were each interviewed separately and photographed at 1 PM - about the Museum.

Read and worked on a poster. One great thunder shower (downpour) around 1:30 - then it began to clear a bit.

At 3:30 I decided to go ahead and do some washing - finishing up just in time for dinner.

Film at 7 - "The Silent Spring of Rachel Carson".

Stayed in lab until 9:45 - then up the hill for a shower.

Ran into Gary Gagermeier (and a girl) as I emerged from Bath House - so we just stood and talked for about an hour.

In bed to read by 11:45.

Wednesday, July 22, 1970

203rd day - 162 days follow

Up at 9! Scattered clouds, scattered thunder showers. Cool. Had to change from cotton to wool bermudas.

Did most of the morning before going down to lab at 1 to fix sandwich. Rains began - so stayed there, reading. Sherm Price and Klaus were in for short time - and just missed Marie, who returned from glacier with her mother.

(Dr.) Richard Vogl gave seminar at 7. wonderful slides of little known (scientifically) area on island of Maui, where Nature Conservancy had had an expedition. Next to existing national park land, this area could be destroyed by wild (ferile) goats and pigs and wild ideas of the mammal, man!

Remainder of evening was spent in botany lab reading the Navajo book.

Went up to cabin around midnight - to read again. Very cold tonight. Extra blankets on bed, heater on, windows closed - before bedtime.

Thursday, July 23, 1970

204th day - 161 days follow

Up at 8:30. Scattered clouds over mountains -- keeping it cool all day - but not sweater weather. Left at 9:45 for Kalispell. While Bill got his eyes examined by Dr. Anzjon, I got a haircut. Did a few errands, then headed back to Bigfork for lunch at the Lake Cafe.

Picked up a large bundle of "postage due" newspapers and magazines. Spent much of afternoon and evening scanning or reading them.

Seminar at 7 by Gerry McGahan on Quano Birds of Peruvian Islands - slides and movies of birds, seals, condors, etc. Fascinating and shocking. Brutality to condors shown in movies of Andean Indian fiestas.

Finished "Son of Old Man Hat" before going to cabin around 11:30.

Finished reading "The Frail Ocean".

Friday, July 24, 1970

205th day - 160 days follow

Alarm got us up at 9. A mostly cloudy, grey day - only brief spots of sunshine, but it was comfortably warm. Late breakfast (with Lake Cafe special big, good, filling cinnamon rolls) - so light lunch after doing a little ironing and cleaning of cabin.

Read and clipped papers awhile, then typed up letters on Voyageurs Park and fooled with acrylics.

Went to Blue Bay for dinner. Marie, her mother, and Bill Harding with us. Returned by 7:20.

Royal and Betty Brunson came by to pick up Mrs. Brunson on way to Missoula.

Jim Hakeck, Dick Vogl, John Tibbs gathered in lab. Discussion of open house plans. Carol U. also there awhile. Then just talk and coffee - about people, parks, bears, forest practices.

Began letter to Regional Forester in regard to management of Bitterroot National Forest.

Up the hill for a shower around midnight. Read very short time. Warm tonight. Still cloudy.

Saturday, July 25, 1970

206th day - 159 days follow

Up by 9:15. Raining. In fact, rained hard all morning. Spent most of the day working on signs and marking labels for the Museum and grounds.

A horde (about 50) of retired Civil Employees made a tour of the Station - here from 2-5.

Bill worked on photo displays for Museum at moments away from research work.

Rains let up by late afternoon -- rather cool.

Went up to cabin around 10:30 to start getting things together for wilderness trip.

Cool 57° at 11:30 P.M.

Reading "Since Silent Spring" by Frank Graham, Jr.

Sunday, July 26, 1970

207th day - 158 days follow

Up by 9. Scattered clouds all day. Walked out for paper. Put up signs around area (directional), swept Museum, fixed fresh flowers, etc. Children busy cleaning up any litter on pathways.

Quick lunch at 12, then changed clothes. Visitors began arriving right at 1:00 P.M. Spent next few hours - until 4:45 - in the Museum. Steady stream of visitors, including Paul Fritz's brother from Minnola, and some of his family. Bill was kept busy giving his slide show "The History of the Biological Station", along with Olean Miller with comments and slides on "Edible and Poisonous Mushrooms".

Changed clothes again quickly in order to throw gear in jeep and get to Glacier ^{Port} International Airport in Kalispell for 6 o'clock flight. A little late, after stopping in Bigfork for extra film, and slow traffic on highway. Also, we got to Yellow Bay store, had to turn back to get forgotten camera!

In two Cessna 180's we loaded and headed out just ahead of a storm front. Flight was beautiful! Over the valley, a checkerboard of farm lands, the fanciful course of the Flathead River, over the Jewel Basin - and views of mountains and more mountains. In $\frac{1}{2}$ hr. we dropped down at the Schaffer Meadow landing strip - on the rear edge of the Bob Marshall wilderness. Our plane set down only moments ahead of Marie and the gear in the second plane.

Carried light stuff up to Chuck Ray's packing outfit camp, about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile. He brought other things up later by pack horse.

He fixed us a light dinner and we bedded down in tents around 9; Marie & boys in one, us next to them.

Everyone anxious about going into Beaver Lake.

Monday, July 27, 1970

208th day - 157 days follow

Everybody was up around six. Chuck had marvelous breakfast for us of pancakes, bacon + eggs, fried potatoes and coffee. Skies overcast and rain began as we headed out of the corral around 9. Chuck led with 3 pack horses.

It rained almost continuously for 3 of the 4 non-stop hours of trail riding to Beaver Lake. Everyone was well equipped - only pantslegs got wet.

Had a quick lunch after unloading gear, then put up tents and rested - and explored the marshy lake edge. Rain, thunder and lightning began after marvelous dinner of elk rib steaks and other goodies.

Everybody bedded down early - before 8:30 - because of storm.

Tuesday, July 28, 1970

209th day - 156 days follow

Up by 6:30. Washed in stream near outlet of lake.

Marie's tent was wet during night, but ours remained dry - though they were alike. Ours was faced differently. Good breakfast. Marie, the boys, Bill and I, took the horses and headed up a new trail to the top of the divide and briefly out of the wilderness. The boys watched the horses as they grazed in a lush meadow near the beaver pond where Marie was collecting. (We had ridden about 2 miles.) Saw one big blacktail doe as we stopped the horses in the meadow.

Spent an hour or more wandering around looking for new plants and photographing the area.

Returned to camp around 10:30. Threatening skies prompted us to pack up and head back to Chuck's camp - after we had all agreed in seemed a wise choice. Left around noon, without lunch.

Pleasant enough riding, though great masses of clouds were on the move. Meadows brilliant with wild flowers. Views were excellent of nearby peaks and middle fork Flathead - below us. Arrived, non-stop, four hours (1.5 miles) later back at Corral. Barely off the horses when torrential, wind swept rain, then hail, let loose. Heavy rain lasted $2\frac{1}{2}$ hrs.

Meanwhile we had a wonderful dinner - ground moose, corn, mashed potatoes, macaroni and cheese, etc. Dixie, Chuck's daughter was there, too.

We were all ready for bed long before dark. Chuck had built fires in each tent to relieve the extreme dampness - and to dry a few things out.

Wednesday, July 29, 1970

210th day - 155 days follow

up by 6:15. Heavy fog over river valleys. Prepared for a ride to top of Chair Mt. Left at 9:30. Trail soggy in woods. Forged middle fork - up to stumps - fast and clear here. Chuck led the way. Dixie joined us today. Marie, Mike and I had different horses today. Bill and Ron had their same ones - Nick and Sonny. The weather was comfortable with big, fluffy clouds moving over the mountains. We went along Shaper Creek awhile, then the Wally Varden briefly before hitting 17 switchbacks - right up the mountain. Magnificent views the higher we got. Going at the last, on the bare mountain top, was rough and steep. We led the horses over one bad rocky place on barren slope (except for downed, fire destroyed (1910) trees).

Right on top was a clump of small, weatherbeaten firs. There we tied the horses for shelter from high winds as we looked all around us. Mountains, mountains, mountains, as far as the eye could see -- an unbelievable spectacle -- peaks in Glacier Park -- high peaks in the Swains -- ridges, valleys, peaks and more. Clouds added to the immensity of the view as they moved over ridgetops, casting shadows here and there. We looked far down to the wiggly course of the middle fork Flathead, and saw the area we had come from yesterday. Flowers galore on south slopes near top. Showy larkspur and scattered Zygadenus.

Walked the horses quite a distance down trail, leaving at 1:30. Chuck went ahead to prepare dinner. Dixie got us back by 4:00.

Bill and I went on our prearranged 6 o'clock plane. Air a bit bumpy, but extremely clear. Saw moose at edge of Scott Lake.

Flew over H.H. Reservoir near Spotted Bear and the Jewel Basin -- right over top of Mt. Anas. Wonderful flight -- only $\frac{1}{2}$ hr.

Shopped for a few groceries in Kalispell and were back at the Station by 8. Read mail before showering.

Thursday, July 30, 1970

211th day - 154 days follow

Didn't have breakfast until nearly noon! Scattered clouds all day and rather cool. Spent hours reading papers and new Audubon magazine. Finished unpacking trip gear around 4:30.

Seminar at 7. Dr. Gary Crosby on Geological studies of Flathead Lake. After seminar a student showed slides of flowers and water fowl.

Went to botany lab where Bill Harding showed his latest collection of slides of Glacier, the Bison Range, flowers and algae.

Went up to cabin around 10:30 to read. Very cool.

U. M. "Summer Times" featured Biological Station. Our interview on Museum included.

Friday, July 31, 1970

212th day - 153 days follow

Last Day for employers to file quarterly Social Security Tax Return and Wage Report, covering three previous calendar months.

Up around 9. A beautiful day, though cooler than usual. The lake was blue - then - blue, the air sparkling clear - barely a cloud in the sky.

Tipped up rough draft of comments on management of Bitterroot N.F. before noon. Bill went to Kalispell to pick up his new glasses.

Washed two large loads of washing, taking two hours! Had bite of lunch around 3, then read mail and magazines.

Kurt Garpfin brought me Tess' material for the "Spider Web" to go over.

Botany lab uninhabited today - very quiet - algae class in Waterton for 2 days - many gone.

Went to Blue Bay at 7 for dinner. Drove up to see Margaret Browne and chatted until nearly 10. Beautiful evening - even warm.

Tipped up letter to Regional Forester by midnight, then off to bed to read. Bill came up around 12:15.

Saturday, August 1, 1970

213th day - 152 days follow

Up around 9. Another beautiful day - not too hot, not too cool. Did some typing for Spider Web - and some ironing. Lunch around 1:15. Marie was back! They had seen a mountain lion near Scott Lake! And the boys had caught 14 nice cutthroat trout.

Dick, Jane, Tina and Sanaa Solberg here for dinner - and the night.

We joined the Solbings, MacCarters, Joe Elliott and Mark Astwell at "The Ranch" in Polson around 10:30. (Great bolts of lightning and rain as we drove toward Polson.) Quiet, dull, at The Ranch so we went to the Smoke House on Main Street of Polson. Mostly Indians there. We "people-watched" awhile, then went to South Shore Inn. Crowded and lively -- with live music. Lightning continued, along with driving rains at times.

Back by 2:30.

Wrote long letter about wilderness trip to Greg Knoll during late afternoon.

(Dick bathing me today).

Sunday, August 2, 1970

214th day - 151 days follow

Up around 9. Very cloudy. (Lots of thunder during night), worked on Spider Web material until 1 o'clock, then took it to Ters for final proof reading.

Around 2:15 we, plus Marie and boys, left in a terrible downpour (sky extremely dark beforehand, lights flickering) for Bigfork and on to Table Bay for picnic with Ruth Smith and family. Spent a little time in the Flathead Gallery while Marie purchased a lovely, large Chimayo rug (\$90.00) and we looked at books and paintings.

The worst of the rain let up as we swung down the west shore and stopped by the time we piled out of the car at Ruth's place, around 4.

A fire was started near the water's edge. Everything was drenched. The sun broke through and we enjoyed a lovely picnic. The boys led us up to the top of Table Rock. Trail was steep, and slippery in places. View of lake and almost the entire length of the Mission Mts. was beautiful. We didn't have a camera along. Going down was tricky and slow, but it was "short distance - just very steep."

Had a delightful dessert and coffee while watching water skiers from nearby resort. Stayed around fire until 8. Skies darkened again and thunder rolled.

Right after getting onto the highway again, rain hit and stayed with us most of the way back -- by way of Polson. We had circled the entire lake.

Read in the lab awhile and sipped coffee. Raining lightly going up to the cabin at 10:30.

Monday, August 3, 1970

215th day - 150 days follow

Up at 9. Cloudy and cool in morning. Sunshine by noon, with only scattered clouds rest of day.

Walked up to Yellow Bay Store around noon for a few groceries. Read until 3 - collection of papers - then went to cabin to do ironing. Read until chime time.

Went up to Margaret Brown's for a couple of hours.

Showered late. In bed to read more at 12:20. Cool tonight.

Tuesday, August 4, 1970

216th day - 149 days follow

Awakened by knocking on door at 9:15. Marie -- with message from John Tibbo to help escort visitors around. Piled into our clothes, dashed to open Museum and grabbed coffee and toast in botany lab. While Arden Gauslin had the group of 10 in tow. From the Rocky Mountain Environmental Field Center near East Glacier, 3 faculty and 7 students had arrived to look around. They were staying at the State Park, their summer session now over. Interesting new group, designed for Jr. & Sr. High School students for ecology in the field and conservation ^{education} back in the winter cities.

Ginny & Steve Kern were in to gather up newspapers for packing - they are leaving Bigfork. Ginny stayed to talk for awhile.

Did some washing - lovely, warm day - finishing around 4. (Reading SST book.)

Seminar at 7 by Mr. Loganson on Pollution effects on Aquatic life - studies at Duluth, etc. Over at 8:30.

Read papers until 10:30, then took clothes off lines and hopped into bed to read.

Wednesday, August 5, 1970

217th day - 148 days follow

Woke up to rain drops on roof at 7:30. Remembered a few things still on outside clotheslines, so grabbed them (almost dry), then returned back to bed, not to wake up again until 8:45. Overcast all day. Very warm -- humid, with few rain drops.

Went to Palen around 11 for 2nd typhoid shot, and to get a few art goods and groceries. Had lunch at Pines. Found Aileen and Al Whitney in the Museum, around 2, and they stayed until 4:30 -- on their way to Glacier.

Marie was "bored" -- so at 5:15 we headed to Blue Bay for cocktails and dinner -- and missed Dr. Iwings' seminar about his work on one of the birds. Am hungry, so headed for cabin at 8:30.

Thursday, August 6, 1970

218th day - 147 days follow

Up before 9. Lovely day - kind of warm by late afternoon.

Typed a new ditto master for Museum distribution. Talked with a few visitors in the Museum around noon time.

Fiddled around with some painting - up in the cabin - after putting gesso on all our assorted sizes of canvas boards.

Dressed for dinner at the Terrace with Marie. Left around 6. Good dinner - very leisurely. Home by 9. Changed to shorts - quite warm - then back to changing a foreground on my painting of Yellow Bay.

Went down to lab for coffee, and to read, at 10:30, returning to cabin around midnight.

All doors and windows open.

Friday, August 7, 1970

219th day - 146 days follow

Up by 9. A day for shorts - lovely - and a bit warm again by late afternoon.

Slept Museum out and fixed fresh bouquet of fir branches, pine needles, with cones around base. Cones were full of sawdust as I shook them to get other debris off.

Started a new desert (canyon country) scene on small (5x7) canvas, working from photograph out of Arizona Highways. Decided to shower at 4, just returning when Bill showed up to go for a swim! I didn't join him this time. Instead, got partially dressed (to keep cool) and went on painting until time to leave.

Picked up Margaret Browne around 6:15 - only we took her car for cocktails at Denny's, then dinner at The Terrace. Returned to Denny's for B+B, then on to Margaret's place for a night cap - and talk.

Back at Station around 1.

Saturday, August 8, 1970

220th day - 145 days follow

Up before 9. Cloudy skies. Back to jeans and sweat shirt.

Walked up to Yellow Bay store in light rain after breakfast for lunch materials.

Went to cabin to paint some more. Raining still. Worked on portrait of Indian girl.

Read mail over lunch in lab. - good letter from Wanda from Kay's, plus partial letter from him.

Finished one painting and took it to Bill. After dinner started another - this time a Siamese cat.

Worked for about two hours, then took it down to Bill (still unfinished). Stayed to read until 10:30.

Back at cabin again, I started still another small painting - Monument Valley.

In bed by 12:30 to read. Rain ended in mid-afternoon; it got breezy. Yellow Bay was running a good current.

Cool tonight.

Sunday, August 9, 1970

221st day - 144 days follow

Awake before 8:30 with pine squirrels bombing the cabin with cones and chattering like mad. Lovely morning, lovely day, with cooling breezes in afternoon.

Walked out for paper - comfortable in shorts and sweater.

Played a few games of Yahtzee with Mike - much to his great pleasure by beating me - with 5 Yahtzees in 3 games!

Worked on paintings. Sta Cathy Davis, girl forester, visited briefly. Cathy to leave in December on Fire Research program in Canberra, Australia.

Showered at 4. Went to Tibbs at 4:45 for cocktails, preceding dinner at The Terrace - for faculty and others. Delicious prime rib.

Stopped at Derry's for after dinner drink - just us two, getting back to Station at 10:30.

Beautiful evening on the terrace at The Terrace. Air sparkling clear and temperature perfect.

Looked around with Monument Valley painting. In bed by 12:30.

Monday, August 10, 1970

222nd day - 143 days follow

Up around 9. Beautiful day - cloudless.

Prepared canvas for new painting - Monument Valley this time. Worked on it for about 2 hrs, then went down to lab for lunch and to read mail.

Back at 2 to work some more. Fun to watch it take shape - fun playing with colors. Mike came in around 4 - then we went to the lab and found that Bill wanted to "take the sun". So, back up the hill for bathing suits. Mike joined us. He and I played Yatzy while Bill wandered around the point with his camera. Wind on lake kept us from being inclined to swim.

Mike came up to cabin right after dinner - I had promised to finish a Yatzy card.

Seminar at 7. Dr. Bruce Parked. "Algae Antics in the Antarctic" - very interesting with simultaneous movies and slides.

Around 9 we decided to go to Phil's for pizza. None of us had enjoyed our dinner very much. Marie, Mike, Ron, Bill Harding, Bill and myself all piled into Marie's "truck". Beautiful evening with $\frac{1}{2}$ full moon shining on lake. Enjoyed our pizza to the fullest. Back by 10:30.

Showered and shampooed before midnight.

Bill received a batch of slides today - Home scenes plus Bob Marshall wilderness.

Tuesday, August 11, 1970

223rd day - 142 days follow

Up before 8:30. Another beautiful day, which got nice and warm by mid-afternoon.

Did the washing before noon - one very large load.

Painted from 2 until nearly 5.

At 7:30 Tess, Marie, Bill and I went down to Blue Bay to "relax" for an hour. Came back to show color slides for Mike, Ron & Marie, who would be leaving in the morning.

Went up to cabin before 10 to start packing a box for Jim Kaplan to take back to Humboldt. Bill was doing same in lab.

In bed by 11:15 to read.

Wednesday, August 12, 1970

224th day - 141 days follow

Up around 8:20. Beautiful morning. Stayed down at Lab to say goodbye to Marie and the boys.

Around 11 we drove to Polson to get our final typhoid shots and do a little shopping. Had lunch at Pici's before returning - about 1:30.

Stayed at cabin most of afternoon. Did some ironing, then some packing, then some reading. Turned warm in mid-afternoon.

Bill came up around 5:20 - to relax and contemplate packing - before dinner. (Good Strawberry Shortcake tonight).

A seminar at 7. Dr. Rude - FWPCA - Bill went, but I stayed in cook Botany Lab to read.

Back to cabin around 9 to do some packing. Very warm, clear moonlight evening.

Gangs took off for Bigfork Hotel to whoop it up - before leaving - or before exams.

In bed before 12 to finish reading about SST's and what they may do to the environment - a wild, unnecessary expenditure!

Thursday, August 13, 1970

225th day - 140 days follow

Up around 8:30. Lovely day with some scattered clouds and gusty breezes that whipped up the lake and the bay.

Spent some time packing, then ironing, then more packing - in the cabin.

Seminar at 7. Bill - on the "History of the Biological Station". Marge Anderson arrived in time to view the slides, then stayed to discuss the writing of the Elrod era for Montana History Magazine.

Returned to cabin around 11 and fooled around with the Monument Valley painting until nearly one o'clock.

Friday, August 14, 1970

226th day - 139 days follow

Up by 8:30. Lovely morning. Did some reworking between 10-11.

Worked in cabin much of afternoon -- packing, painting, ironing, etc.

Many people gone by noon, more before dinner. Went to Blue Bay for cocktails and dinner.

Back again by 8:15. Hauled things from cabin in jeep.

Talked awhile with John Tinko - in the Museum, about the Museum and about the station operation in the future.

Did a bit more packing in the lab, but AFTER Bill Harding took me sailing around Yellow Bay. It was spur of the moment - and beautiful. Nearly full moon and water smooth as glass. Both of us comfortable in short sleeved shirts.

In bed by 12:15. Cabin looked pretty empty.

Saturday, August 15, 1970

227th day - 138 days follow

Up by 9. Lovely day. ^{Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary} Bill Harding's father & 2 little brothers had arrived late last night, so they got food and ate in the botany lab with us, then left as soon as the mail came in - around 11. Solbergs arrived.

Bill went up for last commissary meal. Worked in cabin most of afternoon, packing more things. Solbergs returned from ^{island} wedding.

Showered before 6. Dined for dinner at Mr. B's in Jones - with the Solbergs, Prescotts, Garfins and Tinko. Jane went with us, Dick with the Prescotts, because their car was loaded -- and had a flat tire! Not a cloud in the sky anywhere around the lake.

Nice dinner - good rib steaks (3.50) and live music at 9 PM. Even danced once or twice.

Back at station by 10:30. Saw and Bill only ones left in lab.

Sunday, August 16, 1970

228th day - 137 days follow

8.

Up by 9. Lovely day - much too nice to have to get serious about leaving. Only a handful of people left. Bill loaded last load of cabin things in the Jeep. Had cabin scrubbed and "buttoned up" by 12 o'clock. Then worked on packing the trailer until 4 P.M. Bill packed the Jeep. Both loaded to capacity. Showered, dressed for traveling, then took art materials back to Margaret Browne and said goodbye. Also said goodbyes to Puscots, Sally Tiths, Sharon and Jan, who was driving a University vehicle back to Missoula. Hooked the trailer on and headed out at 6 P.M. Very warm, now. Stopped in Pocatello for cocktails and dinner at South Shore Inn. Drove right through to Lochsa Lodge, where we had coffee and ice cream and alerted people to the partial eclipse of the moon. Still underway at 9 P.M. - Idaho time. Then on to Canyon Creek pull out for the night. Fixed the bed, climbed in, watched the moon creep over the mountains above us, then flood us in brilliant white light. Enjoyed the mild evening - sipped a glass of sherry, and finally fell asleep to the lovely water sounds of the river below us.

Monday, August 17, 1970

229th day - 136 days follow

U.S.

Canyon Creek - about 7 mi. e. from Lamez, Idaho (12). Awake to traffic noises before 8. Beautiful, clear morning - very comfortable with just a sweater. Watched my face in my "favorite" Lochsa. Underway with sun just on us (after creeping over the mountains) before 9. Had breakfast at the little cafe in Lamez. Beautiful day for traveling - temperature never too great. Water level far lower than when we saw it in late June.

Stopped in Pomeroy (elevators for grain mostly) for lunch in a tiny, crowded cafe.

Stopped for photo of McNary Dam (from fancy \$8.50 visitor's parking area - an overlook.). Warmer, here.

Drove on to Unsatilla, where we paused for a milkshake. Gas stop in Arlington - even warmer here - then on to Biggs Junction and on southbound highway 97 to Bend, etc. Mountains all pale and hazy, but peaks visible. Near Madras, among the fragrant mint fields, Bill photographed back lit (sun just disappearing) Mt. Jefferson.

Dinner at 9 in Redmond -- Chinese dinner. Drove on south of Bend 22 miles to pull off -

Tuesday, August 18, 1970

230th day - 135 days follow

about 4 miles no. La Pine - Pauline - E. Lake Rd. turn off

Awoke around 8. Very cool - clear. Away by 9. Breakfast close by in Lapine. Scenic drive through Crater Lake with a lunch stop before reaching Gold Hill. Warm - 85° in Grants Pass. Cooler as we neared the coast. Had a milkshake in Gasquet. Fog greeted us in Crescent City around five o'clock. Patchy fog from there to Trinidad.

Only incident was delay at "bug station" Had to undo the trailer to prove we didn't bring in any unwanted "critters" in our empty ice chest.

Stopped at Saunders Market for breakfast materials. Dave just emerging from there. Had cocktails at his place, then went to dinner at the Seascope. Back to his place until 11 - and finally got home.

Found everything ship shape. Unpacked a few things before bathing. Ready for bed by 1. Sound of the ever-rolling surf delightful to the ears.

Wednesday, August 19, 1970

231st day - 134 days follow

High fog most of day. Up before 9. Dave here for breakfast. Picked up Fallon from Lytle's around 11 - when Dave gave me ride to Trinidad. Washed the car before going in to kennel for "Putty-cat". She knew us and was happy to be home with us again, but somewhat jumpy at first. Had fun watching her get re-acquainted with surroundings.

Dave came in awhile after we had dinner - then we went up to his place to listen to some new records. Returned home at 1:30 in drizzly wet fog.

Cat happy to go to bed with us

(Phoned Antha to say hello again.)

Thursday, August 20, 1970

232nd day - 133 days follow

Awake at daylight with the cat jumping around, pawing small items from dresser top to watch drop to floor; perched on my chest, staring me in the face and purring like mad. Phone got me out at 8:30. Dave wanted ride to airport at 9:10.

Dressed hurriedly to go pick him up -- a race to catch 9:30 flight. High fog most of day -- not uncomfortable. Worked at cleaning Bill's "office".

Greg here around noon -- on way to Eureka. Took time out for lunch.

Worked until 2 -- then cleaned up kitchen. Sue Shipley dropped in around 4:30. Cocktails followed. Greg arrived at 7 -- would be having dinner with us.

David (Bartlett) phoned -- arriving Sunday evening -- just he and Jeanette.

Late dinner. Bill made sourdough biscuits. Greg had to return to Crescent City -- left at 10:30. Cleaned up kitchen mess before bathing. Ready for bed by 12.

Putty-cat brought us two live lizards in rapid succession while Sue was here.

Friday, August 21, 1970

233rd day - 132 days follow

Awake around 8. Foggy all day -- high fog -- dry. Worked at housecleaning and some garden clean up nearly all day long -- and unpacking things here and there as we went about getting rooms in order.

At 4:30 we went to Alameda for silver from Sofe Depasist box, curtains from Bill's "office" to the cleaners, and some more groceries.

Dinner around 9. Read papers and mail (magazines, etc.) until bedtime.

Hon Graham phoned.

Read about the Pattons suit against Kimberly-Clark's pollution of Sacramento River in local paper.

Saturday, August 22, 1970

234th day - 131 days follow

Up by 8. High fog all day. Perfect weather for getting a lot of housecleaning done. Concentrated on our bedroom, then the living room while Bill unpacked and moved things from attic to "office" and straightened shelves in garage.

Went up to Aunt's around 5:30. Barbara and Walton had arrived from Chicago area. Had dinner there.

Home by 9:15. In bed by 11.

Sunday, August 23, 1970

235th day - 130 days follow

Up by 8:30. High fog until very late afternoon. Did some washing and housecleaning.

David and Jeanette showed up in mid-afternoon. Talked over coffee; talked over cocktails; talked over a late dinner.

Both Bill and Jeanette folded up around midnight. David and I were still talking at 2 A.M. !!!

Jan Hagood phoned to welcome us back.

Monday, August 24, 1970

236th day - 129 days follow

Up before 9. David and Jeanette took off under clear skies around noon.

Ursula Brown phoned. In Robinsonville, she would be here later with friends.

Went on with housework and some putting away of "things".

Ursula and friends showed up around 8. They had all eaten, so we had our dinner while they took the view.

Spent evening just talking. Greg phoned.

Connie Flatbush phoned early morning - would be up this weekend with Esther Litton.

Ursula + Georgia Dow slept on deck - stars bright + beautiful.

Tuesday, August 25, 1970

237th day - 128 days follow

Up by 8:30. Foggy over beach.

Bill fixed doughnut pancakes for a late breakfast - 10:30.

Sun out at Trinidad!

Fixed a lunch, grabbed cameras and field glasses and headed north around one o'clock.

Went up Bald Hill Rd. Walked to dedication grove and Berry Glen overlook just beyond. Viewed big chunk out of Skunk Cabbage redwoods.

Went to Gold Bluffs beach and walked through Fern Canyon. Marvellous close hand viewing of beach herd (25 counted) elk. No wind - just beautiful. Spent some time watching elk, - photographing, noting pelicans & other birds.

Drove to view point above College Cove at Trinidad, then went to Seascape for dinner.

Home again - we viewed slides of winter at Yellow Bay and Glacier Park.

In bed by 11:30. Gals back out on deck under starry skies.

Wednesday, August 26, 1970

238th day - 127 days follow

Foggy. The gals went for walk on beach, then came back for breakfast.

Jean Hagood appeared and had marvelous chatter for a good hour. Then, around noon, on her way to Eureka she took Wanda and Georgie down to 299 junction - where friends from Fernbridge would pick them up and drive to Red Bluff.

Thursday, August 27, 1970

239th day - 126 days follow

Up by 9. Took jeep into Arcata to be gassed; also the trailer, by 10. Went on to Eureka in Faxon to pick out floor tile at Wards for kitchen.

Call for boxes at ^{Jim} Kaplan's office and retrieve jeep around 4 P.M.

Friday, August 28, 1970

240th day - 125 days follow

Sunny and foggy, depending on where you were up by 8:30. Went to Mr. Gaylord's in Eureka at 10 to have toe checked on.

Started some washing. Chris King arrived before 2 - from "meditating" at HSC campus.

Lovely afternoon - even warm. Dave appeared around 3:30 - in from Idaho week on ~~the~~ Sawtooth park bearing.

At 4:30 we left with Dave for meeting in Redding of wilderness subcommittee - Shasta Group. Stopped for quick dinner at Big Bear cafe. Warm evening in Redding. Meeting held outside Congregational Church front door.

Had bite to eat - Luis Ireland and wife joined us - before heading home at midnight.

Arrived home 3:40. Connie F. and Esther & Donnie Litton all bedded down in living room. They had arrived around 10.

Saturday, August 29, 1970

241st day - 124 days follow

Foggy here most of day - sun close by. Awakened by 8:30 phone call from Martin Litton. Dave came in at 9:15. Martin phoned again, so I decided to stay up once the coffee was ready. Jean Hagood phoned, too.

We all sat down together for breakfast at 10:30. Connie and Esther & Donnie left around noon - and Dave headed out for Hoopa area.

Did dishes, finished yesterday's washing attempt, then worked in garden until 5.

Changed clothes and headed for dinner at Hagoods, arriving there about 6:20.

Large gang included relatives and friends - good fun and good food. Connie & Littons there for night. Home by 10:30. Phoned Dave about Trinity trip he indicated in note for us.

Sunday, August 30, 1970

242nd day - 123 days follow

Up at 7:10. Dave here about same time. Gathered things up for a lunch and headed for Hoopa after breakfast. Left about 9:15. M.T. with us, too - all in front seat of Dave's little station. After getting gas and some liquids for lunch in Willow Creek we went on to Big Hill Rd. out of Hoopa. A logging road, dusty and wide - and bumpy took us about 15 miles to a jeep road into Grogan Vale. Even rougher and dirtier, we covered about 3 miles where a washout made ~~up~~ the decision -- we walked from there.

While Bill explored and collected plants in Grogan Vale, Dave and I worked our way to the top of a heavily forested ridge. Lots of bear signs in downed timber. M.T. found us after about an hour, having deserted Bill.

We hiked on, got ourselves located, and wound up on a trail to Water Dog Lakes. Warm and lovely on high meadowlands. Magnificent view to east - Mt. Shasta dominant in overall panorama. One of the small, very shallow water dog lakes had about 10-12 inches of water - and waterdogs! ~~See~~ Other lake dry as a bone. Found a spring we could get refreshed by.

Meadow wild with deep blue gelatins! Gorgeous.

Headed back around 6:15. Found a trail. In deep forest spotted large CAT track - Dave missed it, having rushed on ahead. Reached jeep trail and found Bill exploring near where we left him hours earlier. Made some sandwiches and rested before hiking ^{jeep} trail back to car. Came out as sun went out of sight. Back home at 11:15, with a 10 P.M. milk shake & coffee stop as we passed thru Willow Creek.

Dave ended up spending night on couch.

Monday, August 31, 1970

243rd day - 122 days follow

Up by 8:30. Late breakfast. Dave got busy cleaning out his dusty car, making a real project of it.

Colinne phoned from Luis. The family would come out later - and did - around 5.

~~Dave~~ and Bill fished out his wet suit and diving gear and Pat had to try it out - amidst a lot of hilarity. Very low tide. He had to walk a great distance to submerge. We watched through field glasses from deck; those who didn't go down to beach.

They had to get back for dinner with Lee and left about 8:30.

Fixed our own dinner then and remembered we hadn't eaten any lunch!

Dave showed up for late coffee and a couple of lines of Yachtzee.

In bed by 12.

Took stray kitten to pound in Eureka before noon. Returned to find Paul Fritz and Jean Hagood here. They came back again after going to Eureka awhile.

Tuesday, September 1, 1970

244th day - 121 days follow

10:00. Breakfast in bed. Shoulder hurting again. Up by 12:00. Foggy awhile in A.M. Then warm and clear. Dave was in and out as he did errands, then around noon he and Bill went into the college to look over changes - and would do grocery shopping for gang coming out for dinner.

Did some pruning in garden while waiting for groceries. Made a large macaroni salad. Family arrived around 5. Pat back in the dining suit again, back in the ocean again.

Barbequed hamburgers and ate after dark out on deck. Dave stayed for dinner, too.

Bill got pretty wound up and Corinne convinced the family to go home around 11:30.

Had disastrous quarrel with Bill and walked out.

Wednesday, September 2, 1970

245th day - 120 days follow

Spent entire day on living room couch, still in my dirty, torn clothes. Body ached all over, hands swollen and bruised. No food all day or evening. Bill very quiet, undoubtedly remorseful. I would not talk to anyone. Bill cleaned up kitchen.

Dave and Greg were in together a couple of times - once in afternoon, later after dinner. Stayed on couch again all night, still in clothes - feeling miserable. Bill did throw a little blanket over me ^{at} some time.

Thursday, September 3, 1970

246th day - 119 days follow

Heard Bill in kitchen shortly after 8. He spent much of day in his office, staying out of my sight, as I requested. Took off my wedding ring!

Around noon I finally ate a little macaroni salad, then at 2 had cookies and milk. Greg was in for about an hour. Mostly I slept - off and on. Noticed the sun was out part of day.

Had coffee and toast around 8:30. Managed a bath afterwards.

Dave phoned from SF about 9 - wanted to get into Siskiyou Saturday - and wanted us to get AT from Lenoir tomorrow.

Friday, September 4, 1970

247th day - 118 days follow

Saturday, September 5, 1970

248th day - 117 days follow

Beautiful day. Left for Bear Basin area around 9. Dave had Doug Ayres with him and John Sawyer. All piled into jeep after meeting at Jed. Smith park. ~~Saw~~ Had lunch at Bear Butte. Walked over the "Bear" sale (jeep type road), then hiked to Elk Lake and Little Bear Basin. Looked over the proposed Natural area - magnificent forest. Collected ribes (gummy gooseberry) along the way. Drove back to Jed. Smith around 7. Saw Greg for a moment, then headed into Crescent City for dinner. "Harbor View" restaurant jammed with people and more waiting. We waited at least an hour before being seated. Good dinner, but finished so late we missed park's campfire talk - and Greg - who had chosen a beautiful camp for us above (near) Smith River. High fog moved in, but we fell asleep under redwoods and starlight - around midnight.

Sunday, September 6, 1970

249th day - 116 days follow

Awake by 7 in Jed. Smith park. High fog - warm. Cleared camp by 9:30. Headed for Applegate River country in southern Oregon, south of Grants Pass. Made contact with Dave and Doug at small place called Ruch. From there we drove in Forest Service's Cook and Green campground near Butte Fork (of the Applegate), again in Calif. Lunched along side lovely small stream. At 1:30 we all headed up the Butte Fork trail. Dave and Doug would go 10 miles to Azalea Lake; Bill and I would go as far as we could to. Quite warm. Trail good all the 5 miles we covered, mostly at the very edge of the lovely stream. We found a new plant (to us), a pyrrol, saw 2 red breasted sapsuckers, and while resting near a water crossing, saw 3 deer move along a wooded ridge ahead of us. Beautiful forest, huge trees - great de facto wilderness.

Returned to camp around 7. Dave and Doug were back just minutes later.

Cooked steaks for dinner. Had a fire to warm up with and though tired, managed to stay on our feet until about 10:30.

Monday, September 7, 1970

250th day - 115 days follow

Up with first sign of sun ^{above} Dardge tops - about 7:15. Had a good breakfast, then packed up for exploratory trip home. Drove short distance in area to see where roads went - to mining? or logging? Gates closed, no clue.

Drove back to 199 by way of Wilderville. Gas stop at Cave Junction. Waited for Dave & Doug at turn off to Happy Camp. Lovely drive to summit. Ate lunch with view of roadless area. Explored new ^{logging} road near Boland Lake, going toward Tannen Lake instead and following road to end. Dropped down into Happy Camp. Quite warm.

Stopped in Willow Creek for a milkshake, about 6 M.

Tuesday, September 8, 1970

251st day - 114 days follow

Wednesday, September 9, 1970

252nd day - 113 days follow

Up at 5:30 to go to Redding with Dave. I had breakfast at Big Bar Cafe at 9. Met with Forest Service's George Liddicote (?) from 11-12. Went to lunch at Elks Club, then returned to FS building and resumed talk and wilderness mapping ideas until 3:30. Redding turned hot. Milkshake first thing before leaving town. Still hot when Dave made phone call stop in Junction City. Arrived in Astoria around 7. Picked up a pizza at the Key after phoning Bill.

John Sawyer came out at 8:30. We talked plants and natural areas and timber sales and wilderness until after 11.

Thursday, September 10, 1970

253rd day - 112 days follow

Worked around house and garden all day, plus doing large washing.

Dave in and out, back & forth. Fell asleep early - without dinner. Bill Deuell dropped by (I learned later).

Had phone call about Senator Cranston's conservation com. meeting tomorrow. He would be at Wayburns around noon.

Friday, September 11, 1970

254th day - 111 days follow

Dave appeared at 5 a.m. but I couldn't go to S.F. with him. Felt lousy. Phoned Peggy later - would miss seeing the Senators. Dave flew down instead at 9:30.

After lunch I packed things, went to Cresta to have new tire put on Falcon and headed for Santa Rosa at 2:30. Very warm, especially near Piercy at highway construction location in blazing hot sun.

Milkshake and gas stop in Willits. Waited at Vertz rent a car place from 7:10 until 8:00 for Dave. Without dinner we attended the Redwood Chapter Exec. Com. meeting - held in new Coddling Museum.

Had late pizza dinner, then went to John Tutten's in Napa for the night. A hill top ranch, rather isolated & lovely. Threw sleeping bags on couch.

Saturday, September 12, 1970

255th day - 110 days follow

Fog drifting up the hills, against the house. Awake at 7:30 to squeaking scrub-jump and prancing, playful horses just outside the house area. Met Ike at breakfast.

John, Dave and I attended all day session of NCRCC, held at a Cal State Hayward building.

Another meeting, wilderness subcommittee was held briefly over dinner at the Hickory Pit.

Recovering my car, and the long, long, way home for John, we went to S.F. to get some negatives of W.Daves. A long, pleasant day, we got John back at 9. Clear, bright moonlight.

Headed home, getting to Santa Rosa over some unsigned route. Stopped for gas first, then a hot fudge Sundae later.

Sunday, September 13, 1970

256th day - 109 days follow

Clear bright day. Got back to Moonstone around 12:30. I drove most of way.

Spent lazy day, catching up on mail.

Made plans to go to Trinity area tomorrow.

Monday, September 14, 1970

257th day - 108 days follow

Up at 5:30. Dave appeared at 6:30. Put things on bus in Arcata for John Tuttle, ate breakfast at Sims, headed out (in Dave's car) for Trinity area. Clear and cold - frosty roofs in Blue Lake. Shopped in Willow Creek for lunch things. Left 299 on road to Dunsmuir. Found one forest road closed for oiling. Took route by 12010 to Grizzly Camp. Stopped along way for photographs of Trinity Alps and the Thurston Peaks. Gorgeous, clear, long views. Great deep canyons, heavily forested, untouched by roads.

Drove to near end of travelled road (jeep road continued up mountain) and had lunch before starting exploring hike. Very warm in open country, perfect in forests. Went as far as Trinity Summit guard station, (6280') now abandoned. Picked up an old griddle and a horseshoe there. Looked north to Preston Pk. Shasta loomed above everything else to the east. Left at 4:20, high-tailed it down the trail at fast pace. Dave had a bear encounter ahead of us - it whined and took to the woods about 10 feet in front of him. Back at the car around 7. Drove to Happy Camp (forest camp) to cook hot dogs for dinner. Had a good fire, too. Full moon rose thru trees, flooding the area with light. We had the place all to ourselves.

Got home about 11. All tired, but happy. Bathed and got to bed before 1. Dave + M.T. on couch.

Tuesday, September 15, 1970

258th day - 107 days follow

Did washing. Cleaned house.

Dave Lee for dinner - and the night,
because his power had been shut off!

Wednesday, September 16, 1970

259th day - 106 days follow

Did more washing - and some house
cleaning.

Dashed up to see Ken at school around
2. Made copy of CWP report (SC) at Dave's.
Spent 2 hours ironing!

Went to Dave's for dinner at 6. He made
us a special dish.

Thursday, September 17, 1970

260th day - 105 days follow

Lovely day - even got quite warm.

Went out to Baywood at 12:30 to pick up washing powder from Lynn Lanson.

Back to garden clean up and house work. Combined dinner materials with Dave after he and Bill had been to the college together.

Bill Devall here briefly, early afternoon.

Chuck Kennedy dropped by around 5-6.

Planned trip into Warner Mts. for next week.

Friday, September 18, 1970

261st day - 104 days follow

Heard rain during night. Up at 8:30. Cleaned out gutters on rooftop with cat helping.

Dave back & forth, getting ready to leave for SF & other places.

Drove to Carol Johnsons near Patricia Pt. at 1:45 - info about congressman for Jean Patton.

Phoned Jean earlier. We plan to see her Sunday.

Did some ironing and packing of camp gear.

In bed fairly early, after good hot bath, to read George M. Sutton article in latest Audubon magazine.

Saturday, September 19, 1970

262nd day - 103 days follow

Up by 8:30 at demand of "putty-cat" and "M.T."

Did some washing and garden work before noon. Nice day. Warm. High, scattered clouds.

Got haircut at 12:30. Bill went shopping at 2 - back before 4:30 so we could take cat to boarding kennel before 5. Retrieved Davis car from airport.

While beginning packing of Jeep before dinner we got acquainted with new neighbors (Colvins) by way of their 2 huge St. Bernards. They frightened M.T.!

Did most of the packing after dinner. Also finished up some ironing.

Phone call from Jean late afternoon. No rush for us to get to Red Bluff tomorrow. Lawyer fishing friend could not be there this weekend.

In bed shortly after 11 to read.

Sunday, September 20, 1970

263rd day - 102 days follow

Beautiful morning. Up at reasonable hour to get packing done and get away before 12. Drive pleasant - never too warm. Stopped for lunch in Weiland Creek. Stopped again in Weaverville to spend a little time in the new Museum.

Arrived at the Bonanza around 5. Kay and Ray Gerber had waited for us to arrive before returning to their home in Fremont. Jean and Lub both busy - off and on - and we "held down the fort" with them, in the wine tasting room, until closing time at 9:30. Part time policeman and local chapter head of Trout Unlimited John Spencer sat with us awhile. Talked mostly about the Patton's lawsuit against Kimberly Clark - and water pollution in general. Had dinner at the house and talked until nearly 1:30. Played with new Siamese, Tasha, while M.T. got her exercise with Charlie Brown - outside.

Threw sleeping bags out on deck. Clear moonlight and stary night - not too cold.

Monday, September 21, 1970

264th day - 101 days follow

Awake by 8:30. All clear and beautiful with lots of bird song filling the air. John took Lue into town to doctor at 9:30. Lue had had coughing spell during early morning hours. We cooked our own breakfast and they had theirs when they returned at 11:30.

John went back to town by 2. We read, then took Lue in with us, somewhere after 3. Arose to the Red Bluff diversion dam, downstream from the Bonanza a mile or so, to watch the huge fish being moved through the "locks" to the newly created artificial spawning beds.

Dave arrived at the Bonanza around 6, having driven from Lake Berryessa area in a rent-car.

We had dinner, got rid of the car at the Red Bluff airport and headed out for Modoc County on 299 highway.

Spent night - clear, cold moonlight - at Ash Creek campground, a few miles out of Alvin.

Tuesday, September 22, 1970

265th day - 100 days follow

Awake by 7:30. Found ice on buckets and at water pipe. Cleared camp by 10. Stopped in Alturas for maps, groceries, etc, then headed for Ft. Bidwell.

Lunch at Lily Lake. Bill made algae collections. Went on forest road to near top of Bidwell Mt., after a collecting stop at a "swamp" area, where cattle had grazed and a revegetation experiment had taken place in 1934. Beautiful day, beautiful sweeping views in all directions.

Found an isolated campsite in timber, for protection from wind. A few clouds appeared at sunset.

Had a good campfire - lots of wood at hand - and sat around it until rather late.

Lily Lake - approx 6720' elevation.

Wednesday, September 23, 1970

266th day - 99 days follow

Awake as the sun hit the tree tops. Made hotcakes for breakfast. Rather cold with frost on top of sleeping bags and visible on short grass.

Leisurely about leaving, waiting for things to dry out. Packed car, then drove on jeep trail to Bidwell Mt. More great views - overlooking forested ridges as well as farmlands and Mt. Shasta loomed high to the west.

While Bill and Dave photographed, M.T. and ~~high~~ I walked farther ahead on jeep trail and looked for birds. Sited 2 flickers, one towhee, a gray headed junco and many black-capped chickadees.

Then we took a road (cow trail) on to Ft. Bidwell - one hour to travel 2 miles! Dave out scouting the route ahead.

Finally dropped down off the mountain and reached the road to Cedarville. It was 3 PM when we grabbed a hamburger and milk shake and filled the gas tank. Southward beyond Eagleville to turn off to Patterson Ranger Station. Looked over the conditions at Patterson Meadows (horses on one side, cows on other) and decided to drive on past ~~Blaine~~ Lake, Jess Meadows, and ended up at Mill Creek campground. Had it all to ourselves!! After dinner we walked to Mill Creek falls - at least Dave & I did - Bill returned to camp ahead of us.

Thursday, September 24, 1970

267th day - 98 days follow

Lovely morning, though ice was in pans and faucets were slow. After breakfast we packed the car, then walked to the falls and on a short distance to Clear Lake. Had the entire area to ourselves. Bill made collections of algae from a floating mat - Dave and I assisted. Returned to our campsite around 10'clock and traded out for Alturas, Adin, Fall River - then to McCloud. Mt. Shasta was dominant and glorious in late afternoon when we got gasoline - and a milk shake - in McCloud.

Took little used (almost abandoned) road over Scott Mt., hoping to reach camp ground near Tangle Blue Lake. Road washed out nearly in many places. Tough, slow going. Getting dark. Road got worse. Darkness encompassed us. Little sense to go on, though we were close to goal. Managed to get jeep turned around - over great mass of large boulders and came back out onto highway 3 and made camp at Eagle Creek campground on the Trinity. Dave scavenged up some fire wood with help from neighboring camper. Had a very late dinner and piled into bed around 11 - Hoping for early morning get-away. Clear, cold and starry.

Friday, September 25, 1970

268th day - 97 days follow

Up before anyone else at 6:15. Built fire, made coffee, filled thermos. Left camp before 7:30. Clear & bright, but brisk. At 9 we stopped for breakfast at Big Bear Cafe. Home before 12.

Bill went in to school after getting cleaned up. ~~I~~ Went into boarding kennel for "Penny cat" after dropping Bill off.

Saturday, September 26, 1970

269th day - 96 days follow

Beautiful, warm, sunny day.

Sunday, September 27, 1970

270th day - 95 days follow

Beautiful, warm day. Had to drive into boarding kennel by 8:30 to get drops for "putty cat's" eye. Did some writing - moved sprinklers around garden - kind of a lazy day. Lots of people on the beach.

Monday, September 28, 1970

271st day - 94 days follow

Tuesday, September 29, 1970

272nd day - 93 days follow

Up by 7:30. Pink sky and fairly clear, but fog moved in for greater part of morning. Began typing stencils right after breakfast. Dave and Bill left together around 10:15. Had troubles with mimeo - put it out in sun on table on deck, then into kitchen with lights and heater on, trying anything to get the summer cold, unused, ink to flow again.

Stayed with it all afternoon - 5 pages, 300 copies of each -- it was a long battle.

Two interesting phone calls -- one from Eureka's Mayor Trood (a friendly hello again) and Bill Landis, concerning Bill Kortum's Congressional campaign.

Dave and Bill home again after 5. Dave fixed "special-burgers" for dinner.

Vic Aubin came out to help us awhile, addressing, folding, stapling S.C. Newsletters.

Evening ended on rather sour note when Bill got argumentative.

Wednesday, September 30, 1970

273rd day - 92 days follow

Thursday, October 1, 1970

274th day - 91 days follow

Rosh Hashanah - First Day of Jewish New Year

Early dinner at Davis, then we dashed to Eureka by 7 for showing of Bill Kortum's slide show - Redwood Acres. After Bill's talk, Don Engdahl spoke about his coastline walk from the Oregon border to the Mexican border, which took $4\frac{1}{2}$ months.

Friday, October 2, 1970

275th day - 90 days follow

Rosh Hashanah - Second Day of Jewish New Year

Appt. with Dr. Frank cancelled by him.
Had "farewell" dinner with Greg at Davis, then listened to records and talked until midnight or later.

Saturday, October 3, 1970

276th day - 89 days follow

Shopped after lunch. Fixed food
and got ready for evening meeting.

Went into church at 6 ready for the
Sinner Club potluck 6:30.

Good turnout - about 70. Chuck Kennedy
presented his fine slide show - with sound -
the same one he did for Earth Day.

Returned to Dave's place around 11. Bill
Sevall also came out for awhile.

Sunday, October 4, 1970

277th day - 88 days follow

Lovely day after fog lifted. Went up to Dave's for
another sour dough pancake breakfast^{at 10}. Home
again around 12.

Did a couple of loads of washing; ended up
with agitator chipped. It hit the cement floor by
accident when cleaning machine!

Greg and Dave here for dinner. Dave
barbecued steaks.

Both spent the night here - in sleeping
bags - on couches in living room.

Monday, October 5, 1970

278th day - 87 days follow

Nice day, but neck hurting terribly. Dave drove me to Arcata by 2 to keep appt. with Dr. Frank. Two hours of waiting! X-rays recommended and a load of pills.

Chatted with Chris Butler in Barnes Drug Store while waiting for prescriptions to be filled. Home by 5:15.

Fixed dinner, took pills, then went up to Dave's for short while - listened to records. Shoulder hurting, neck hurting, head hurting, tummy hurting, so came home by 11:30.

Greg left around 9:30 A.M. - driving homeward to Altadena.

Tuesday, October 6, 1970

279th day - 86 days follow

Lonely day with gusty winds in afternoon. Dave drove me in to Trinity Hospital for neck X-rays at 11. Picked up some fresh glazed donuts and returned to his place. Feeling pretty low. He fixed soup and coffee for me and then I just wanted to sleep awhile before driving home. He let me nap for $1\frac{1}{2}$ hrs.

He came down for dinner - in fact, fixed dinner for us - "special burgers". I spent most of evening on couch - and ended up sleeping there all night. I had been terribly nauseated all day - from mixture of various pills. Once comfortable, I chose to stay put on couch.

Jeane Hagood dropped in around 5.

Wednesday, October 7, 1970

280th day - 85 days follow

Lovely morning, but didn't get up until after 9. Dave appeared for a short while. Made some phone calls to Guy Rucker concerning today's hearing on Shelter Cove. Received call from Orleans District Ranger about meeting there. Set date for Nov. 1.

Phoned Dave for help on statement for hearing, which he wrote and typed for me, but I didn't feel good enough to carry it further.

Vic Aubin and Bill went collecting at Big Lagoon bog. Sue Shipley dropped in awhile, returned for cocktails and then we all went to the Seascap for dinner around 7:30.

X-rays showed nothing really bad - only arthritis! Back to the pills again after dropping them during the day and cutting out one completely.

Spent short time at Dave's before returning home. after dinner.

Thursday, October 8, 1970

281st day - 84 days follow

Lovely, warm day.

Went to Dave's around 9 to type statement.

Presented statement re Shelter Cove agreement settlement with County - on behalf of N.S. Group Red Ch. Sierra Club - to Board of Supervisors before noon recess. Did a few errands with Dave, then returned home for lunch. Later, Dave dropped me at Baywood to help with scoring of women's day's play. Worked with Edith Friedenbach from 2:30 - 4:30.

Mixed dinner with Dave at his place.

Friday, October 9, 1970

282nd day - 83 days follow

Saturday, October 10, 1970

283rd day - 82 days follow

Lovely day - ^{Yom Kippur - Day of Atonement} after fog lifted. Worked around house.

Left at 4 for North Trinity mt. Dave and M.T. with us in jeep. Stopped in Willow Creek for a few items, then headed up Bill Hill Rd, then turned to Mill Creek jeep trail. Found lovely camp site in meadow, near timber, along tiny Dot Creek.

Had moonlight to help us get set up to cook dinner. No wind, quite balmy. so had just a small campfire - and ~~ba~~ grilled our steaks. Had the area all to ourselves, though we had passed a few hunting camps on the road in.

Enjoyed our little campfire awhile before pulling into the sleeping bags - all tucked away in a lovely clump of scattered firs.

Sunday, October 11, 1970

284th day - 81 days follow

Finally railed out of sleeping bag around 8:30 - feeling a bit low, but perked up after breakfast. Glorious day. Bright and warm. View area and photographed before breaking camp and parking car. Went on to Water Day lakes, where Bill made algae collections.

Nearly one o'clock when we headed on down to Mill Creek Lake, a very short distance from the jeep road. More collections and a lot of clean up of trash, which we carted back home in boxes, bags, and buckets.

Had a quick tuna sandwich before heading home. Milkshake stop in Willow Creek. Found we had a badly bent exhaust pipe, which took some doing to get straightened out. (Odors had been getting into front seat somehow).

Home by 6. No "putty-cat"!!!!

Went to bed worried and heartbroken.

Monday, October 12, 1970

285th day - 80 days follow

Lovely day, but ^{Columbus Day} loss of sleep over missing cat took much joy out of it. Searched immediate area - talked to neighbors.

~~Drove down into Dr. Frank's office by 1:30, but had to wait 2 hrs before~~

Read in paper about hearing before Board of Supervisors on Calif. Water Plan policy to be adopted. Could not get a report - county office holiday!

Drove to County pound to look for cat - no one around - Holiday!! Beginning to panic. Placed ad in paper. Phoned a few neighbors.

Went up to Davis to get some slides for Science Club space at Faculty Wives Activities Fair Wed. night.

Tuesday, October 13, 1970

286th day - 79 days follow

Little sleep, worrying about "putty-cat". Went up to Dave's to work on statement for 2 P.M. hearing.

Couldn't even eat lunch. Home quickly after finishing typing and copying of statement, changed clothes and dashed to Enuka. Presented brief statement in behalf of North Group asking that policy decision be postponed until additional state reports were available on water needs.

Hearing lasted until 3:30.

Feeling miserable, but went to Dave's for dinner. Bill Slevall there also.

Returned home shortly after 10 P.M. Phoned Steele Watkins concerning Congressional campaign. Went visiting until 12. Suddenly Dave appeared as we were leaving. He had worried about us, having tried to reach us by phone earlier.

Wednesday, October 14, 1970

287th day - 78 days follow

Foggy A.M. Fair later. Did some washing before noon. Went into Arcata by 1:30 for doctors appointment. Had to sit for 2 hours! Hank referred me to a physical therapist for further treatment. Made appointment, then picked Bill up at college because jeep was being worked on - overnight.

Returned home to find Putty Cat had returned -- a joyous moment! Celebrated early! Dave cooked a quick bacon and eggs dinner for me, while I prepared materials and loaded the car in order to get to the College Commons by 7. Ken dropped by just as I was leaving. Bill and Dave would have dinner at Dave's place.

Had good response at the fair. ~~Home~~ Returned to Dave's to pick up Bill around 11.

We had a happy, happy cat!

Thursday, October 15, 1970

288th day - 77 days follow

Succoth

Friday, October 16, 1970

289th day - 76 days follow

Foggy all day - cool. Worked around house, then worked 1 hour for Dave - indexing. Sue Shipley dropped in around 1:30 as we were leaving for Arcata. I had physical therapy treatment from 2 - 3. Meanwhile, Dave (with M.T.) did errands. Home by 4:30, after coffee and donuts.

Quick dinner, then off to program by John Sawyer - the Native Plant Society - at the college. Dave with us. Returned to his place for coffee. Brought ART home with us - as Dave was going to lead Trinity Alps overnight Sierra Club outing.

Phoned David this morning about coming to Santa Cruz. Talked to Jerry in evening. Will fly down for sure.

Bill called Jean Patton regarding "gunk" in Sacramento River.

Saturday, October 17, 1970

290th day - 75 days follow

Warm - some low cloudiness. Shopped before noon and picked up plane ticket. Bill drove me to airport for 1:45 flight to S.F. Arrived 1 hr. later after beautiful flight in Air West jet (DC9) following the coast line. David, Jeanette, Terry, Gerry and Randy all on hand to meet me. Drove down through smog ridden valley to Santa Cruz, arriving before 4 o'clock.

Around 5 Gerry B. arrived, then Leland Vandiver. I had a wonderful talk session. About 6:30 Leland drove us to Facelli's, where the reunion dinner was held. Great fun to see people 35 years later. About 125 there. Honored guests were C.E. "Doc" Feliciano^(B) and Miss Helen Calkins (our P.E. teacher) now 75.

Stayed on to talk with old class-mates until nearly 12, then back to David's place to talk some more.

In bed sometime before 2.

Sunday, October 18, 1970

291st day - 74 days follow

Woke up at 9 to light drizzles. Jeanette and girls went to church. Later -- David, Gerry and I took an extensive tour of the U.C.S.C. campus (beautifully done), then out on west cliff drive to watch a few surfers and look at sea lions -- one large albino among them. Toured some more -- out to Yacht Harbor at Twin Lakes, then home for lunch.

Talked some more, then left for S.F. airport before 4 to catch 5:50 Jet back to Aiea. Discovered ticket missing. I had to purchase another to get home. Flew over clouds most of way. Seatmate was Japanese girl from Hawaii, a student now at Humboldt.

Fog low to ground on arrival. Bill met me. Went to David's place to check it out.

Dave and Steele Watkins, returned from Trinity outing, had cocktails with us before going to Merryman's for dinner. Around 11:45 they returned to tell us all about the trip, then encounter with Sam Merryman.

Ready for bed around 1:30.

Bill reported rain here in early A.M. Dave slept on couch in sleeping bag.

Monday, October 19, 1970

292nd day - 73 days follow

Up at nine. Few sprinkles - warm. Did two loads of washing. Sue Shipley said goodbye. Went into Aresta before 2. Dave + A.T. along. Had physical therapy for 1 hour. Home by 4.

Bill home by 5:30. Barbequed spare-ribs for dinner. Dave with us.

Showered late. Raining hard around midnight.

Put in claim at Aresta Airport (Air West) for lost plane ticket.

Tuesday, October 20, 1970

293rd day - 72 days follow

Worked around home all morning - made many phone calls. Went to P.O., Trinidad for Greg's mail. Stopped by Davis. Frank Kilmer there.

After dinner, (Dave showed up) we went to the Art Smith's place for a get-together with Congressional candidate Bill Kortum. Home around midnight.

Wednesday, October 21, 1970

294th day - 71 days follow

Raining! Good, hard rain -- beautiful! Went into Arcata before 2 - then had an hour or more of physical therapy. Mostly diathermy today, but some "sons" and massage. Dave did some shopping for me, plus some errands of his own. Car would not start - in Safeway parking lot! Finally got it going, then went to Red Barn for ~~my~~ early dinner. Raining quite hard all afternoon. Home at 5:30. Car died again! Phoned Rose Stebbins to see if Mathews March for Ray Pearl was still on -- it was -- so Dave drove me into headquarters in Eureka by 6 - in the jeep, returning here to remain for evening.

Sue Hallem and I covered a few blocks on D Street from 6:30-7:20, when it got dark. Returned to Ray's home to have coffee and cookies with other "marchers" (and Ray). Got ride home with neighbor Betty Smith, once a neighbor of the Pedits.

Talked from 10-12 - then to bed. Dave flaked out on couch in sleeping bag.

Mailed painting of Yellow Bay to Mike Moran - for his 13th birthday.

Thursday, October 22, 1970

295th day - 70 days follow

Some light rain. Did some housecleaning and ironing. Dave took my car for the day, apparently running all right again.

Worked around house most of day.

Dave had us come up to his place for dinner around 6, having tried out another new recipe. Bill had to leave after 7 for a tenure com. meeting at the college.

I pored over maps and material pertaining to Siskiyou Wilderness, while Dave filed material. Bill returned before 11 and we remained until about 11:30.

Friday, October 23, 1970

296th day - 69 days follow

Up around 9, after Bill brought me a cup of coffee. Raining. Worked around house, then went to Arcata by 1. Saw Hank Frank around 2 - he said my neck X-rays looked "lousy". Took insurance form to Daniel Schmitt, the physical therapist. Made S.C. bank deposit and did other errands. Dave also did errands - both in Arcata and Eureka. Checked out tile for kitchen floor and ordered same. Took Dave home. Found his car battery was dead so ~~did not~~ ~~some~~ used jumper cables.

He came in later and stayed for dinner. Together we went to Arcata for Exec. Com. meeting of North Group. Meeting got underway at 8:15 and lasted until 10:30.

Once home we sat around - just talking until nearly 1:30. Dave and N.T. slept on couch here, even though his car was here.

Saturday, October 24, 1970

297th day - 68 days follow

Up at 7:30. Hasty breakfast. Fixed a lunch and left for Ukiah at 8:40. Stopped only in Eureka for gasoline. Beautiful drive - some clouds, some river fog, and then some sunshine. Fall coloring beautiful everywhere. Traffic light. Reached Ukiah on time for noon meeting of Redwood Chapter Conservation Committee. John Tuttle presided. 13-14 present, including Ray Hudson of newly formed Environmental Quality Coalition. Good meeting -- lasting until 4:30.

Made only a gas stop in Willits on way home. Got dark as I reached Garberville. Had light rain from Miranda on. Home by 8:15. Located Bill - up at Dave's place, where they had had dinner together. Cooked some bacon and eggs for myself. Bill and Dave drove back here sometime after 9. Looked at slides of our Modoc trip.

Ready for bed early - 10:30. Dave "flaked" out on couch for night - not unusual.

Sunday, October 25, 1970

298th day - 67 days follow

End of daylight savings time.

Up at 7:15. Did several loads of washing - first our things, then some of Dave's. Dave spent much of day going through papers for news clippings regarding Shelter Cove while watching TV football games.

Bill left ~~at~~ for 2 o'clock meeting at college, returning at 5:30.

Worked outside awhile. Located 2 of the small redwood trees I had planted on the south bank. Both thriving, as were 2 firs I had transplanted in spring.

Dave went home for dinner. About 9:30 we went up to his place - for work, music and coffee until 11:30.

Had late shower and shampoo - much needed after scrambling and pruning on the bank. Still raining - lightly, but stars beginning to appear here and there.

Monday, October 26, 1970

299th day - 66 days follow

Magnificent, clear morning. Awake before 8. Up by 8:30. Cleaned rain gutters after breakfast.

Bill off for school by 10:15. Spent almost entire day cleaning house and ironing. Dave popped in around 1 to leave AT while he went to Eureka. Putty-cat brought in two birds; one right after the other!

Dave returned around 5:30 - followed by Bill before 6. Had early dinner so Bill could get back to college for tenure com. meeting - and Dave went home.

Bill returned before 10:30.

Tuesday, October 27, 1970

300th day - 65 days follow

Beautiful, clear morning. Up by 7. Worked indoors until nearly noon. Dave showed up and stayed to have a sandwich while I read newspapers.

Worked outside most of afternoon - pruning, pulling weeds, pulling out blackberries, etc.

Pleasantly warm, but still crisp bite to air.

Worked until arms and hands gave out.

Phoned Dave that I was going to Arcata to deliver Duke and Sandy's cake to Chuck Kennedy's place. He joined me, then we both did shopping at McK. Safeway. Home again by 5.

Beautiful sunset with brilliant reds and streaks of purple. Ocean calm. One surfer out until dark - waves very small.

Dave stayed for dinner. Duke & Sandy arrived at airport at 8 - but we couldn't go get them - just eating dinner.

Dave went home around 8:30. Read awhile after good, relaxing hot bath. Ready for bed by midnight.

Wednesday, October 28, 1970

301st day - 64 days follow

(63°)

Another magnificent day. Up by 7:30. The cat brought in a not quite-dead fox sparrow right after I finished breakfast. Threw her, and it, outside -- then proceeded to vacuum up scattered feathers in hallway and both rooms upstairs! Ended up doing a bit more housecleaning than anticipated.

Dave came down around 11:30. Decided to go to town with him. Did errands in Arcata, had lunch at Bimo, went to the college, then to Eureka for saws (hand) which had been left for sharpening.

Home again before 3. Put one saw to work immediately - cutting older log to fire place size. Beautiful afternoon to work in garden.

Dave showed up again before 5 - Lapping mad because his phone service had been cut off - and he let personnel in Eureka office know about it!

Bill arrived from late staff meeting - around 6:30. Talked Dave into staying for dinner -- not difficult to do.

He went back to his place after dinner, then returned later for a short time.

Saw Duke and Sandy at the Art Smith's place - on way home from Arcata. We happened to be following their car as we headed for Safeway.

Thursday, October 29, 1970

302nd day - 63 days follow

BEAUTIFUL DAY!!! Up by 7:15 Dave showed up at 8 - on way to Arcata. Made golf arrangements for game at 9:30. Left at 9. Foursome made up of Mitzi Marchi, Ruth Elliott and Mabel Swanson. Quite warm on front nine - comfortable on back nine. Shot 30-50 with 4 penalty strokes on back nine. Handicap (on electronics system, now stands at 18). Home briefly at 3:30, then back in to Jamie Kirkys and on to Anne Weiss' with Science Club material.

Returned to dark house at 5:45 - found Dave and OTT napping on couch. Bill got back around 7 after Vic Aubin's orals were over.

David Barthelphoned. Duke phoned. Card from Greg about trip to Washington, D.C. for Peace Corps press conference before going to South America.

Napped after dinner.

Bill went up to Dave's around 11 - Vic to be there as well as Duke & Sandy.

Dave stayed here for the night.

Friday, October 30, 1970

303rd day - 62 days follow

Up by 7:30. Beginning to cloud up, gradually. Dave drove me to Eureka to keep appt. with Dr. Gaylord at 10. Did some errands there - and in Arcata - getting home again (stayed!) at 1:30.

After eating I lay down for awhile - not feeling too well - and voice giving out.

Prepared a stew for dinner, then typed address labels for SC Newsletter.

Turned very warm - with high wind - just at dusk. Rain began after dark.

Dave stayed for dinner, then went back home. (Duke & Sandy apparently had left the scene).

Saturday, October 31, 1970

304th day - 61 days follow

Last Day for employers to file quarterly Social Security Tax Return and Wage Report, covering three previous calendar months.

Up by 7:30. Bill went ^{Halloween} field tripping at ^{Reformation Day} nearby Clam Beach lagoons at 10.

Dave brought down some washing and remained most of day.

Gave up going to Cleaton - Keene luncheon, having lost my voice.

Bill back by 12:30, with ~~the~~ 3 students in tow. They sat out on deck - lovely and warm - and guzzled beer and munched crackers and cheese.

Walked up to Westhaven P.O. before 2 to purchase rolls of stamps.

Went to M.C. Safeway around 3.

At 6:30 we went up to Davis for dinner. Duke & Sandy returned for dinner - and the night there. Home by 11.

Dave came down for the night.

Sunday, November 1, 1970

305th day - 60 days follow

Up at 6:45. ^{All Saints Day} Beautiful day. Left at 8 - in Jeep - for Orleans Ranger Station. Dave and AT with us. Vic, Carol, baby and dog went in their car. Drove to Klamath River by way of Bald Hills Road was lovely. Fall coloring showy.

Met with District Ranger Lee Bunnell from 10:30 - 1:30. Had picnic lunch at their nearby home. Vic & Carol returned home after lunch.

We stayed on - in the office - until 4:30 - talking about roads, trails, wilderness, timber, etc.

Had dinner in M.C. around 7. Home by 8 to start typing material for SC Newsletter. Dave worked on a critique for mailing in morning.

Jean phoned at 9 about our getting to Red Bluff soon.

Monday, November 2, 1970

306th day - 59 days follow

All Souls Day

Tuesday, November 3, 1970

307th day - 58 days follow

Election Day

Cloudy all day.
voting - on way to town.

Went to Arcata around 1 to get Sierra Club
bulk-mailing permit taken care of - and did
other errands - returning home by 2:00.

Dave here for dinner so we could
watch election returns on TV.

Ray Peet won 4th Supervisorial District by
large margin.

Heavy rain during evening.

Wednesday, November 4, 1970

308th day - 57 days follow

Cloudy. Got haircut at 9:30. Dave came in around noon.

Shed two large loads of washing.
Donna Hankins (teacher at Maple Creek school) came in after 4 to get background material on Butler Valley dam project.

Went to dinner at Daves after 6:30. Vic, Carol and baby and dog also there.

Home by 11:15. In tub when flares began dropping over ocean. Learned by radio that small plane was down between Arcata Airport and Trinidad. Phoned Dave. Three of us spent next two hours searching with field glasses over ^{flares} lighted ocean. Planes and boats and ground observers busy from 7-1.

Wreckage sighted near end of runway, in ~~just~~ brush off freeway, at 12:45. Occupants of Piper Comanche killed in crash.

Thursday, November 5, 1970

309th day - 56 days follow

Rain. Up at 9. Dave went home after breakfast, then returned with pictures to look at. Voice bad today. Worked on statement for Water Policy hearing. Bill breezed in at lunch time to grab some food. Dave returned again to help me edit statement.

Went to hearing at City Hall ^{Council} Chambers at 7:30 with Eleanor Watkyns. Had enough voice to read Sieve Clark's brief statement - for Redwood Chapter. Lightning and thunder very heavy about 5 PM - continuing off and on with heavy downpours throughout evening.

Home again before 9:15. Had late dinner of bacon and eggs.

At 10:30 we went up to Daves to pick up Music Temple while Dave was in Los Angeles over weekend, leaving early tomorrow morning.

Friday, November 6, 1970

310th day - 55 days follow

Rain - off and on all day. Began work on Wildlerness Workshop posters in afternoon.

Voice had today - and yet I had to use it.

Long phone conversations with Shirley Beiffus, Roberta Allen, Claire Courtney and Rose Stebbins.

Went shopping from 1-3:30. (Saw plane wreckage being hauled onto highway - near Clam Beach - on way home - in driving range.

MT got into something ~~that~~ left her coat oil covered. Bill bathed her in tub before dinner, then I bathed her again later, while Bill went to Anne Weiss' for a nominations committee meeting.

MT very quiet all evening - Bill home by 11:30.

Saturday, November 7, 1970

311th day - 54 days follow

Up by 8. Cloudy with showers. Bill went collecting - in the Clam Beach Lagoons with Vic Aubin and Tom de Caw - from 10:30 - 1:30.

Worked on Wildlerness Workshop posters awhile. Bob Kirby stopped by briefly. Made a large macaroni salad for the S.C. potluck dinner.

Bill took ^{car-less} Duke and Art Smith into meeting in Jeep - and came home ahead of me. I finally got back around 11. Had coffee and ice cream before bedtime.

Sunday, November 8, 1970

312th day - 53 days follow

Up by 8. Rain, steady, nearly all day.
Worked on 3 more posters during day.

Went to Trinidad in early afternoon.
Checked Greg's mail box, got a few groceries,
and checked Dave's place on way home.

MT apparently O.K. - playful.

Dave came in around 7:30 - in time for
dinner. (Plane was quite late).

Vic Antin came in around 9:30 and
remained late.

Monday, November 9, 1970

313th day - 52 days follow

Scattered clouds all day as rain storm decreases.

Quite nice in afternoon here - mostly blue sky.

Had breakfast in bed, thanks to Bill. Then had
lunch, still in bed, thanks to Dave, on one of his several
trips back and forth. Did some reading and then
addressed SC mailing labels.

Talked with Anita briefly. She was expecting
Peter in tonight.

Got up to fix dinner. Dave here for cocktails,
then gone by 7 to meet Bill Deval.

Went back to bed immediately after dinner - feeling
very weak still. Fell asleep reading. Woke up
to Anita's phone call at 11:30 that Pete had
indeed arrived.

Tuesday, November 10, 1970

314th day - 51 days follow

Mostly cloudy all day with rain beginning in late, late afternoon.

Had breakfast in bed, then got up by 10. Have here on way to town, then back again before lunch.

Vic and Tom came in for the boat around 3 - returning it by 5.

Have brought MT home in late afternoon from her overnight stay at the animal clinic - and ended up staying for dinner.

Did a lot of picking up and putting away in search of our skill saw - in the garage and the attic.

Did some filing after finishing dinner dishes.

Have spent evening with Ray Peart and returned around 11 for MT.

Wednesday, November 11, 1970

315th day - 50 days follow

Veterans Day

Thursday, November 12, 1970

316th day - 49 days follow

Friday, November 13, 1970

317th day - 48 days follow

Closely. Spent most of day - and most of evening working with Dave in preparation for tomorrow's Wilderness Workshop. In mid-afternoon we dropped map work, chased into the college book store for paints, brushes, etc., then to Eureka for more materials.

Around 9:15 (A.M.) I phoned Peggy Wayburn that I would not be attending the Cranston Conservation Committee meeting.

Bill came up to Dave's around 11 P.M. to see how things were shaping up and get me headed home before my eyes gave out.

Saturday, November 14, 1970

318th day - 47 days follow

Overcast - warm.

Up by 7:30. Quick trip to Dave's place at 8:30 to load car and get to Areta by 9 to open church facilities. Ran around town getting last minute materials to set up displays.

After slow start people began arriving and the workshop was in full swing by 11. Took a $\frac{1}{2}$ hr. break for lunch. More people arrived after lunch - total count - 26. Bill arrived around 3 to show color slides of various wilderness areas of interest to scientists.

Chased the late ^{timber type} map-painters out by 5:30, and headed home to relax.

Bill had turned his ankle in the morning while making collections in the "pea soup" lagoon. Spent much of evening giving him foot soaking routine.

Sunday, November 15, 1970

319th day - 46 days follow

Cloudy, threatening rain. Slept late, then got some work done so we could leave by 12:40 to meet anyone going on Seiea Club "mushroom" outing, which Bill was leading. Combined carloads at HSC library parking lot. Drove to Lanpheu's place north of Samoa Peninsula. About 20 people, including many young children, participated. Light drizzles hit us off and on, but we didn't slow down in our search for the fungi. A number of good specimens were located, both toxic and edible varieties.

As we returned to cars around 3 PM the rain began in earnest, falling steadily.

Monday, November 16, 1970

320th day - 45 days follow

Raining. Left Falcon at Union Station in Arcata and Dave brought me back home.

Had dinner at Shanghai Low - early - then went to Audubon sponsored film "North to Alaska" at 7 PM at Eureka High Auditorium. The place was jam-packed. Enjoyed film, though editing was jumpy. Close-ups of wildlife were superb. Dave was with us.

Once home again we had ice cream and coffee.

Tuesday, November 17, 1970

321st day - 44 days follow

Cloudy - some rain.

Sergei S. came in at 10:30, just as Bill was getting ready to leave, but they had a few minutes to talk about the "pea soup" pond at Clam Beach lagoons. Sergei remained about one hour, discussing Redwood Chapter activities.

Wednesday, November 18, 1970

322nd day - 43 days follow

Dave took me to Eureka to pick up floor tile from Montgomery Ward in mid-afternoon.

Thursday, November 19, 1970

323rd day - 42 days follow

Lovely day - cool in A.M. Left for golf course at 8:45. Got tee off time around 9:30. Course was very wet underfoot, but quite playable, though my over 100 score didn't show it. Home, after getting some groceries before 4.

Bill had late staff meeting - which made dinner quite late.

Friday, November 20, 1970

324th day - 41 days follow

Cloudy.

worked on agenda for North Group Exec. Com. meeting.

Dave here for dinner, then he took me to Anne Weis' place for 7:30 meeting - picking up Marlys Maher on the way.
Meeting lasted until 12.

Saturday, November 21, 1970

325th day - 40 days follow

Woke up with what appeared to be flu symptoms.

Did not join in on Sierra Club outing of Crown-Simpson pulp mill for fear of getting too far away from facilities.

Spent entire day at home.

Sunday, November 22, 1970

326th day - 39 days follow

Rain.

President Kennedy's Assassination

Began preparing kitchen floor for tile job, then actually began laying tile around 1 P.M.

The "Pesticides and Pollution" sub-committee met here from 1:15 - 4:00 with Bill and Vic. (2 others were here.)

Finished $\frac{1}{3}$ rd of floor in $2\frac{1}{2}$ hrs. of steady work.

Monday, November 23, 1970

327th day - 38 days follow

Bill took the Falcon back to the Union Station for more work.

Spent much time working on floor, then at finishing a long 3 ft. ^{wide} stretch.
~~Done here for dinner~~ ~~Done~~

Tuesday, November 24, 1970

328th day - 37 days follow

Rain. Worked on more floor tiling. Finished around 4, then went to M.K. to get groceries for Thanksgiving. Took 1 hour to complete shopping and spent \$30! (Including 15# turkey and "spirits".)

Dave popped in at 7 on way to Environmental Council meeting in Arcata at 7:30. I managed to get there at 8:30. About 20 persons present, discussing Northcoast Environmental Council re-activation and an Ecology Center.

Wednesday, November 25, 1970

329th day - 36 days follow

Rain. Did some time consuming tile work around doorways. Planned to go with Dave to Mrs. Coleman's (on old Quarry Road) at 1 PM. Rain delayed us until nearly 3, but we managed to get some photos for her between squalls.

Around 4:30 Dick Burr and young friend John Savin arrived - unexpectedly early! (We thought they would arrive in early A.M. Thursday).

Had to quickly plan a dinner - fortunately had a pork roast in freezer, but it was a long delayed dinner - and Dave remained all evening.

Dick, Bill and I played a few games of Yahtzee before going to bed.

Had long talk with Jean around 11:30 - after letting her know we would NOT be driving to Red Bluff for "turkey day".

Thursday, November 26, 1970

330th day - 35 days follow

Cloudy. Up by 8:30. ^{Thanksgiving Day} after late breakfast and doing dishes, finally got started making pies and fixing dressing for turkey. Bill took Dick and John on a bird scouting trip to Humboldt Bay and up to Big Lagoon.

Dave dropped in - and ended up helping me chop things up for the dressing - and would come back later for cocktails and dinner.

It was after dark when the gang returned. The turkey went in the oven at 3:30 and would be ready to serve by 8:30.

I set a fancy table, but we were all in most informal dress (me in slacks!).

Wonderful dinner - relaxed evening - in fact everyone napped while I cleaned up the kitchen.

Played one game of Yahtzee before folding up around 12:30.

Friday, November 27, 1970

331st day - 34 days follow

Rain - hard rain - all day long. After breakfast we all piled into the jeep and drove north, leaving around 11:30. Drove up the Bald Hills Road, then around Prairie Creek park headquarters looking for elk. Saw only one. Took east ridge road. Dick and John took off on a trail in search of salamanders.

Bill and I stayed in car after finding we didn't have adequate rain gear on. Road was blocked by park truck while men removed a fallen tree which had crashed across road.

Drove on north to Klamath River and returned by old road on coast (now part of Redwood National Park). Prairie herd of elk was crossing edge of highway when we returned. Getting dark and still steady, heavy rain.

Warmed up all the "goodies" for dinner. Dave here for dinner and a showing of movies and slides.

Robin Trench dropped by around 9 - and remained until 11:30. "Pussy cat" brought us a small mouse, which Robin identified as a harvest mouse. We were able to set it free after a tick was removed from its little head. Dave went home early because he had to fly out at 6 A.M. tomorrow.

Saturday, November 28, 1970

332nd day - 33 days follow

Cloudy - some sun on occasion. Beil made sourdough pancakes for breakfast.

Taking John's car, he, Dick and I loaded cameras, glasses and spotting scopes aboard and headed north. First stop was above College Cove (Trinidad Beach State Park addition).

Added 2 new ones to my life list - the Black Oystercatcher and black turnstone. (MT with us.)

Then on to Patrick's Pt. Agate beach trail closed due to slide, but we got to Palmer Pt. lookout.

Then on to Big Lagoon. There John went wild with the wild, wild ocean and managed, happily, to get thoroughly soaked while trying to outrun the pounding waves.

Dick joined him, while I stayed dry, holding glasses, cameras, wallets and car keys.

We returned home - so they could dry out - at 2:30 or so - and had cold turkey type lunch.

We spotted a beached sea lion in late afternoon so down to the beach went Dick and John. Just as Beil got ready to leave to take photos the critter headed out to the water and was soon out of sight.

Played Yahtzee while having cocktails and John had to give up both.

Dave returned late, but left OT here for night. Played some Yahtzee...

(Beil took them up to Outhos before dark to find small redwoods.)

Sunday, November 29, 1970

333rd day - 32 days follow

Cloudy. Up at 5 to get breakfast started for Dick and John's early departure. They left at 6:20, and we went back to bed for a few more hours.

Worked on Hemlock material after straightening up house. Rain got heavy by 3 PM. Dave was here awhile watching football game on TV, after making sourdough waffles.

At 4:30 we drove to Weiss' to deliver written material and even back by 6:30.

Dave came down for part of the evening and we three played Yahtzee - "just like the old days"!

Monday, November 30, 1970

334th day - 31 days follow

Heavy rain, gusty winds - even hail in late evening. Dashed to M.C. at 10:30 to go to bank, post office, and pick up cards and address labels from Carol Aubin.

Dave came in around 11:15. Cleaned up mimeo machine and tried it out. Not too good so phoned Bill to pick up new pad for it. Expected to hear from Anne all day about getting the Newsletter out, but learned after dinner she had been asked to substitute. Worked on other SC things meanwhile.

Dave here for cocktails, then off to a meeting of the Ecological Society. MT remained with us.

Had miserable headache all day and ached all over (arthritis?) so was happy to have good bath and shampoo and get to bed early.

Dave reported back on the meeting and took MT home - around 12:30.

Tuesday, December 1, 1970

335th day - 30 days follow

Rain - 100% ^{chance of} rain - all day except for slight break between 12 and 1 P.M. Went to Arcata around 11:30 after cleaning up kitchen. [Had breakfast tray in bed at 9:15 - headache and all-over joint aches made it difficult to get up earlier. Took aspirin throughout day.]

Picked up Newsletter stamps from Roger Weirs at the college, dropping in on Bill, too.

Cranked out 4 pages on the often "moody" mimeo machine. Dave appeared in late afternoon and helped me with the machine.

Bill Sewall, then Anne Weirs came out after dinner to help stamp and label, etc. 300 copies of Newsletter.

Bill drove me up to Ken's place to pick up his SC conservation files - about 8:30. Bill Sewall drove Anne home at 10 - mailing things in Arcata on their way home.

Rain continued all evening - heavy at times. In bed by 12:45.

Wednesday, December 2, 1970

336th day - 29 days follow

Rain, heavy hail, wind, lightning and thunder.
Up at 8:30 after having breakfast tray in bed. (Cakes
all over again).

Did some cleaning in kitchen, then Dave showed
up. We prepared a paste-up job - for Zeeving - of the
U. of Mont. study report on Bitterroot Natl. Forest.
Cleaned over - AFTER power outage of one hour.
MT stayed here until Dave returned around 4
with the copies for distribution.

Made an apple pie before preparing dinner.
Lots of phone calls to make regarding people
getting to Butte Valley report to be given to Bd. of
Supervisors, and others, at 8 PM. Dinner late.

Phoned "Brandy" and Ruth in Hamilton to con-
gratulate them on good job - urging the study report.

Dave appeared again at 10:30 - just in time
for hot apple pie.

His phoned around midnight. Still
raining and still windy.

In bed by 12:15 - cat happy to stay in
all evening.

Mrs. Coleman related strike provoked bomb scare
on her road one night. Thrown from passing car
at a neighbors house, the bomb fizzled!
Investigations underway by Sheriff's dept.

Thursday, December 3, 1970

337th day - 28 days follow

Rain. All day - rain. One "gully washer"
cloud burst hit before noon - causing water to
be driven inside bedroom and living room
windows.

Got up around 9:30 after breakfast in bed.
Both hands refused to work upon waking up.

Did some ironing. Dave appeared sometime
before noon on way to Arcata. Power off in
Trinidad area, but not here. On way back Dave
had bite of lunch with me.

Started washing at 2. Doug Ayers appeared -
then went to Arcata, and returned at 5 - to
stay for dinner. Dave in and out, in and out.
Ate for dinner, after doing grocery shopping
for me.

Doug went to Davis for the night. Rain let
up for awhile.

Linda Wunner phoned this morning with a good
report of the Butte Valley progress report meeting
attended last night at Supervisor's chambers.

Friday, December 4, 1970

338th day - 27 days follow

Mostly cloudy all day. Light rain in evening. Out of bed - to bright sunshine - at 9:15. Feeling better, but still many "joint" aches.

Prepared another portion of kitchen floor for laying tile. Dave popped in to leave M.T. Received many phone calls as result of SC news letter. Anita & friends came down to pick up new sp. & worked on tile laying job until 5:30 when Bill got home.

Phoned Dave - for him and Doug to come enjoy some Chinese cookery with us. Bill made delicious sweet and sour spare ribs -

Ready for bed by 10:30.

Saturday, December 5, 1970

339th day - 26 days follow

Awake at 8, but didn't get up until 9:30 - after breakfast tray in bed. Cloudy all day.

Went to Acosta and McK. for errands from 12-1:30. Bob Kirby dropped by around 2.

Vic Aubin here briefly. Fixed salad for potluck dinner. Prepared notes for meeting.

Left at 5:45 to open the church (found to be already open).

Good attendance, both for dinner and the meeting.

John Sawyer presented program of slides on Russian Peak study area - proposed wilderness.

Home by 10:30. Had hot buttered rum and read papers and magazines until after midnight.

Sunday, December 6, 1970

340th day - 25 days follow

Raining.

Second Sunday in Advent

Worked on kitchen floor. Doug phoned after dark that Vic's car had suddenly refused to run anymore - at the Salita ^{turn} ~~cut~~ off on way to Munchkin's in Rio Del. I took my 3A card and went with Doug to see that Vic's car would be towed back to a Eureka garage. Doug piled Vic, Anne Weiss and me into his little VW while following the tow truck back.

Finally got home at 11:30. Cooked myself a bacon and eggs dinner. Bill went to bed around 1. I stayed up and finished laying tile where the refrigerator and stove would be placed again. Got to bed at 3.

Monday, December 7, 1970

341st day - 24 days follow

Up late. Worked on kitchen floor as long as my strength held out.

Worked on gas stove while electric stove sat in middle of kitchen while fresh tile was setting.

Doug brought MT down here for the night - and to stay tomorrow while he had his car in garage in Eureka all day.

Tuesday, December 8, 1970

342nd day - 23 days follow

Feast of Immaculate Conception

~~Had~~ breakfast in bed - got up after 10. Did some ironing, then worked on some small tile laying spots.

Bill came home from school without attending a staff meeting - as planned earlier. He was feeling terrible with sore throat and sniffles.

Doug returned in early evening from Eureka - and would pick Dave up at airport. (Dave phoned at 6 from SF airport). Doug helped me replace the stove and refrigerator so we could ~~cook~~ dinner more easily when Dave came back.

Wednesday, December 9, 1970

343rd day - 22 days follow

Home all day. Worked around house. Began feeling strange in afternoon - same symptoms as Bill had yesterday - sore throat, etc. Dave came in before noon and Bill returned home right after he finished his lecture.

I worked on tile laying in closet, while Bill worked at his typewriter most of afternoon.

Made a lot of phone calls in order to cancel Exec. Com. special meeting which I had planned for 7:30 P.M.

Dave showed up again and offered to cook bacon and eggs dinner for us.

In bed by 9:15.

Thursday, December 10, 1970

344th day - 21 days follow

Cloudy most of day. Feeling "rough", so no golf game. Anita phoned before nine - would one of us do an errand in town?

Stayed in bed until about 10:30.

Dave showed up around 11 - left MT for rest of day.

Did some washing and house cleaning and put things away outdoors - in event of rain, which occurred by evening, as predicted.

Late dinner, 8:30. Dave came by for coffee with us and was gone again by 10.

Bill had to work on tests - and I needed a bath and Shampoo. A couple of hat Tom and Jennie helped us through the evening.

Friday, December 11, 1970

345th day - 20 days follow

Sunny and bright with scattered clouds. Bill left before 8 o'clock. Two tests to give today. Feeling terrible, myself, after an uncomfortable night of coughing, but got up for a bite of breakfast and to clean up the kitchen.

Dave came in around 10. I told him I would not drive to Santa Rosa meeting tonight with him. He phoned John Tutens and made some other plans, then dashed off to Arcata.

Took to bed - unable to stay upright with stuffy head and raw throat - coughing and sneezing, etc.

Dave returned around noon and kindly fixed me soup and crackers for lunch - and joined me in lunch. Then he took off again.

Fell asleep reading - awakened by phone call from Dave, just leaving home for Arcata again, ~~he left MT here all afternoon~~ around 3 - returning again right after Bill got home - before 6. Bill feeling awful!

Dave left on 7 PM flight for S.F. Bill fixed us some bacon and eggs after Dave left and soon both of us were ready to fold up for the night.

Made a few phone calls first - one to Sergei.

Beautiful full moon tonight.

Saturday, December 12, 1970

346th day - 19 days follow

Beautiful day - clear and sunny. Air crisp. Tide quite low in afternoon - ocean extremely quiet.

Up at 8:30 to fix coffee - decided to stay up - even got dressed! Bill tried getting up, too - and made it for a 10 o'clock breakfast.

Did some "puttery" work and some vacuuming in our bedroom. Trimmed and tacked up long ivory shorts around porch.

Went to grocery store sometime between 4 and 5. Dark, with moon coming up full as I drove home.

Bill spent much of day ~~off~~ at the typewriter. Both of us sniffing, sneezing and coughing almost continuously. Had a couple of hot buttered rums before light dinner around 8.

Bathed and ready to fall into bed by 9.

Sergei phoned to tell me what happened at the meeting last night. No quorum present! But Dave got there for awhile.

Sunday, December 13, 1970

347th day - 18 days follow

Up late and ~~visibly~~ ^{Third Sunday in Advent} worked around house all day - cleaning, vacuuming etc.

Bill at his typewriter most of the time. Both of us content to be rather quiet.

Fixed a snack for dinner after quick trip to market in Trinidad for supplies.

Ready for bed early - to read awhile. Bill went on typing.

Rain began about night fall.

Lay phoned about our Xmas plans with him.

Monday, December 14, 1970

348th day - 17 days follow

Dave & MT were in while we breakfasted - late.
(MT just out of kennel - Dave flew in from Leding Lake last night).

Feeling a bit better - Bill, too. He went in to college awhile - and I did a lot of ironing.

Had special meeting of No. Group Exec. Com. at Bill Devall's place from 7:30-9:00.

Dave came in around 9:30. We had a couple of warm drinks.

~~Kay McD. phoned about Xmas plans.~~
Make reservation for cat to be boarded over Xmas.

Tuesday, December 15, 1970

349th day - 16 days follow

Cloudy all morning - threatening rain. Bill went into the college. Dave and I went to Eureka to do errands from about 11:30-1:30. Rain and high winds began as we left Eureka, then lashed wildly at our living room and bedroom windows around 2. Moved rugs and spread piles of papers on floor as rain droned inside around windows. Power off, but only momentarily around 2.

Dave went home around 4 - after watching me prepare a couple of Xmas fruit cakes - then returned for cocktails and dinner.

Dave and I attended 3rd organizational meeting of Northcoast Environmental Coordinating Council from 8 until 11. Raining all evening.

Returned to Dave's place - phoned Bill to bring up fruit cake. Listened to Bernstein's recordings of Verdi's Requiem until 1:30. Wind, rain and hail, plus thunder and lightning made it a wild evening.

Old Trinidad road closed again due to slide this side of Luffenholty Beach.

Wednesday, December 16, 1970

350th day - 15 days follow

Up late. Cleaned house after helping Dave get his car started. Vic was here awhile to leave 50 minutes in my hands.

Put up new towel rack in bathroom, which wasn't easy!

Bill took Dave as his guest to a Lion's Club dinner meeting from 6:30-9:00.

Bathed early, then fell asleep on couch after they returned. Had terrible coughing spells throughout the day.

Clipped a large stack of newspapers during late afternoon.

Dave arrived for dinner. Had quite a time with nearly fried up oil in deep fryer - dinner late - house full of enough producing smoke.

Howard King phoned from Chick.

Saturday, December 19, 1970

353rd day - 12 days follow

Up at 7. Beautiful and clear "Butch" (Dang) Mac Carter, wife Robyn and 2 dogs arrived at 8 for some dough pancake breakfast. On their way to Montana for vacation, they would deliver a bunch of "goodies" to our friends there. Dave & AT here also. Dave worked on the "sick" deep-fat fryer and watched football on TV. Bill went off to do grocery shopping and I readied myself to meet Eleanor Watkins at 2 to drive up to a Xmas "coffee" gathering at Sybil Jamiesons. Views of the coast absolutely spectacular! Warm in sun - cool in shade. Home by 4 - Dave long gone.

Started fixing things for dinner. Howard King arrived, as did Tom de Cew for a very brief visit, at 4:30. (Howard to remain for dinner). Dave came in around 6 and his and Lee arrived about 7:45. Bill and I converted a few special "oriental" dishes for dinner.

Showed a few color slides later. Talked Howard into staying for the night. Ready for bed before 1 A.M.

Sunday, December 20, 1970

354th day - 11 days follow

Woke up to rain! ^{Fourth Sunday in Advent} Bill made up a batch of sourdough pancakes for the three of us. By 11 he was ready to head out for Jed. Smith park - the weather exactly as he likes it - cool and grey and drizzly.

Cleaned up dishes and started some washing - which took much of the afternoon to finish. Bill busy typing.

Dave and Bill Sevell showed up around 6 - Dave with 3 loaves of bread ready to bake in an oven. Ate some hot bread when time was up.

Decided - all of us - to go to Mullymans for dinner. Raining all evening.

Home by 7:30 - in bed by 10:30.

Monday, December 21, 1970

355th day - 10 days follow

Up at 6. Pitch black! Picked up Dave at 6:15, then Chuck Kennedy at 6:30 and arrived at Sam's in Eureka at 7:00 for breakfast meeting to work over by-laws for new Northcoast Environmental Coordinating Council. Others arriving included Steve O'Meara, Ray Pent + Ted Trichilo. We carried on until almost 10. Dumped Dave at home and hurried home myself to get packing done.

Didn't get away from house until 2. Left "putty-cat" at boarding kennel; Bill did several small errands and we finally left a gas station in Eureka at 3. Light rain at times going south, then at Cummings and reaching all the way to Ridgewood Summit we encountered snow down to the highway in many places and covering the hills - a fairly rare sight in the area. We learned it had fallen yesterday and last night. Had dinner at Ridgewood Park.

Drove across Hwy. 20 and down 99 - arriving at 10 P.M. at the Marions. Everybody home, so Bill showed some color slides and we got to bed sometime around 1. Had been clear on arrival, but ground fog materialized.

Tuesday, December 22, 1970

356th day - 9 days follow

Corinne aroused us at 8:30, just before she left for work. After a most informal breakfast we gathered up our stuff and were underway by 10:30. Fog and clouds as we went south on 99. Turned west on Hwy. 152 - Pacheco Pass route to Hallistee.

Stopped briefly to view new San Luis reservoir. Not impressed! Huge body of water covering the once lovely rolling hills. (Lunch in Turlock).

Snow on Santa Lucia range. Lots of green hills showing off in late afternoon light as we drove extent of Salinas Valley in day light. Last gas stop in Paso Robles. Arrived on time, 6:30, at Kai's new home in Santa Ynez Valley.

Toured the house, even before dinner. Floor plan somewhat changed from Tucson house - all very nice and many improvements over previous arrangement.

Talked until 10:30, then all headed for bed.

Wednesday, December 23, 1970

357th day - 8 days follow

Fair. Clouds over Refugio Range to northeast. (Up at 8:30, anxious to see where we were). ^{First Day of Chanukah}

Spent most of morning looking around the place. Air brisk, but clear and beautiful here. Snow lovely on surrounding mountains.

Made a cedarwood wreath after lunch, having brought a large bagfull of boughs along.

We all went shopping in the charming area known as Santa Ynez.

Talked and read after dinner.

Had shower and shampoo before bed time.

Thursday, December 24, 1970

358th day - 7 days follow

30° at 8 am.

Up by 8:30. Fixed our own breakfast. Beautiful day. Hung redwood wreaths over beams in court yard, outside living room entrance while Kay, Paul and Bill went for short ride.

Kay and I drove down for big haul of mail from their mailbox.

After lunch we strung some Xmas lights, then Kay, Bill + I tried to find a grocery store open in the villages at hand. All closed at 3 P.M. except one out in Los Olivos.

Did a lot of reading, then ~~showered~~ went to bed to read some more.

Clean and cold.

Friday, December 25, 1970

359th day - 6 days follow

Santa Ynez Valley

Up by 8:30. Beautiful, ^{Christmas} clear morning. Paul off to mass early. Kay's day to fix breakfast. Ate when Paul returned at 9. Helped Paul arrange tables for 4 o'clock turkey dinner. Paul went riding. Kay, Bill and I went off to explore roads in area. Went by Lake Cachuma, into Los Padres Nat'l Forest, then back to Happy Canyon Rd - going past beautiful horse ranches and as far as the road was safe. Lovely area. Returned by 2 and did more around house - table setting, etc. Ted, Elliott, Chris, Noel and Ted's daughter, Blythe, arrived around 2:30. Lots of "yak-yak". Marcellus dinner.

Bill showed various slides - Montana, Arizona, No. Calif. and miscellaneous from home area.

The Millions returned to Santa Barbara early - Elliott with terrible cold and Chris had to go to work early next day.

Had late piece of pie and hot drink. Ready for bed shortly after 10.

Saturday, December 26, 1970

360th day - 5 days follow

Up by 8:30. Cloudy. Paul, Bill and I went shopping in Sohang before lunch. Got a number of "goodies" and I purchased a pair of fancy blue suede clogs.

Bathed while Kay, Paul and Bill were out riding in late afternoon. Bill sorted slides earlier.

Neighbors, Mr. and Mrs. Pearson (Elmer & Janet), arrived at 8. Pleasant evening of getting acquainted and viewing Bill's slides of Bot Marshall wilderness trip, flowers, the redwoods, etc.

Didn't get to bed until nearly midnight.

Sunday, December (27) 1970

361st day - 4 days follow

Woke up to sounds of rain! ~~after~~ Breakfast at 9 after Paul returned from church.

When they decided to go riding, I walked awhile with glasses & bird book. Then, later, drove to nearest market and "biked" on way back.

Walked over to Pearson's at 1 P.M. Football on TV for those who wished to watch. We were served various drinks and nibbles and remained until game was over. Had to dash as light rain began.

Good dinner - we were all hungry, having missed a "regular" lunch.

Read and talked awhile after dinner. Headed for bed long before 10 o'clock.

Monday, December 28, 1970

362nd day - 3 days follow

Up by 8:15. Breakfast over by 9. Fog in river course and valleys -- otherwise clear. Got packed up and loaded and were under way by 10:45. Decided to stop in Solvang once more - Bill wanted pair of clogs! Also got some buckets of cookies for gifts.

Left 101 after gas stop in San Luis Obispo, going along the coast for the first time in 10 years! Beautiful, clear. Lunch at large lodge at San Simeon - and quite a good lunch. Ocean calm and tide low in more peaceful stretches. Stopped to photograph Bixby Creek bridge. Saw many, many whale spouts all along. Road in rough condition in a few spots - due to slides and slip outs - crews busy with repairs - no delays.

Arrived at David and Janet's in Santa Cruz around 6.

Geery came over after dinner and we all had a "shouting match" - good fun, though I couldn't agree with David and Geery on some of their anti-environment thinking, especially in relation to electric power.

Tuesday, December 29, 1970

363rd day - 2 days follow

Up before 8. Raining lightly. David yelled goodbye to us at 7:30.

Left around 9:30. Foggy in places going over the mountain. Hit new Interstate 280 which headed us right onto Golden Gate Bridge. Through toll plaza at 11:45. Lunch in Santa Rosa at 12:30 or so.

Had flat tire a few miles north of Santa Rosa. Bill got a little damp before getting it changed, but not too bad. It began raining quite hard shortly after we were underway again.

Stopped to get tires patched in Geyserville. Hit heavier rain the farther north we got. Arrived home about 6:45.

Heated up some beans and made coffee. Anxious to get to bed.

Gave up cigarettes!

Wednesday, December 30, 1970

364th day - 1 day follows

Occasional showers. Went to boarding kennel before noon for "putty-cat". (Both of us happy once more.) Bill picked up great pile of mail from Trinidad post office and that kept us busy most of the afternoon.

Tried to raise enough ex.com. members to have a meeting here tonight, but too few at home.

Connie Flatbush phoned about 5 - she up at Dave's place - he not home yet from southern Calif.

Connie came down here later in evening and we talked - and talked - until

2:30 A.M. She stayed for the night on couch.

"Putty-cat" began sneezing and it continued throughout a sleepless night for me - and her.

Thursday, December 31, 1970

365th day - The last day

Phoned vet at 8⁴⁴ A.M. Took "putty-cat" in to small animal clinic to leave her for check. Back by 8:30. Dave on phone to Connie - would fly in this evening. Connie finally went back to her work (at Dave's place) around noon.

Bill and I did some grocery shopping before picking up "putty-cat" around 3:30. However, "putty-cat" was due to remain under their care until Sat. A.M.!!!

Had wonderful leisurely bath before doing anything about dinner.

Read and napped after dinner until Dave and Connie arrived around 10:30 with a bottle of champagne to help bring the new year in.

In bed by 12:30.
