Up at 7:30. Partially cloudy, cool 42°. 1980 2nd day - 364 days follow

Did two loads of washing once Tom got up.

Picked up Govt. Institute Coastal Report (Paul Sabatier) at Westhaven P.O. at 1:30. Left Tom in Trinidad, then came down Scenic Drive so I could investigate vegetation removal off Tremine Road for house construction. This was high above Luffenholty Creek near Hegy residence, which is close to freeway on south side of creek.

Did some ironing, some house cleaning and some privet pruning by leaning out bedroom window as far as I could reach.

Tom returned around 5 with a fresh, live crab. We cooked it for dinner. GOOD! A real treat, from a friend who fishes commercially. Watched TV special film 2 hrs. re. transmission lines across farm lands. Well done.

Greg appeared around 9:30.
Had coffee break before

worked around house until

Delivered things to Becky before
5 o'clock. Raining lightly. Tom
rode to Trinidad with me to check
his P.O. Box.

Iowa - on TV 2 hrs.; late.

Overcast, but warm. 1980 6th day - 360 days follow

Epiphany

Took down X-mas decorations. Straightened up things a bit in attic, did some house cleaning, cleared up tree trimmings, split some firewood, cleaned rain gutters on west side.

Tom returned around 5:30.

Bill Devall returned slide projector and ran through coastal slides. Also, he showed his latest photos of dolphins and people taken from boat on Baja California Christmas trip.

Bill phoned from the Wharton. Still ecstatic over beauty of Virginia - living in a "mini-chalet", small pond nearby - wants ice skates.

1980

7th day - 359 days follow

Low clouds/fog/drizzle - Tom busy on phone re. Shelter Cove rock removal project now coming before Regional Coastal Commission on new permit.

Went to Eureka after lunch - picking up Doug Galatti in M.K. Talked to Sam Ray re. Shelter Cove, then discussed maps on single family residences exactions per AB 643 (Calvo bill).

Oreg arrived around 6 - for dinner and the night. He retired before 9, having to awaken by 5 a.m.

Tom worked on conditions to present to Harbor Commission re Shelter Cove project.

Talked to Norbert this morning about covering State Com. meetings this week.

1980 8th day - 358 days follow

Greg away by 6 a.m.

Got Tom up by 7:30, but he ended up using phone instead of going into Coastel Com. office.

Cloudy and cool - 45°, 8 a.m.

1980

9th day - 357 days follow

Up 7:45 Cloudy + raining at times.

Went to West Haven P.O. and then to Trinidad to fill gas tank after lunch.

Dick Laursen came by around 2:30 with his new "pitch" - AMWAY! All enthused as he explained his new lease on life - and "freedom". He left about 5.

Tom did project work via phone.

35°F 7:30 A.M.

Hail staying on deck 1980 10th day - 356 days follow
after heavy showers, wind, etc.
throughout the night.

Cloudy & cool. Periods of sunshine.
Had hair styled at 10 - in Arcata.
Drove to Chad's restaurant in Fortuna
by 12 for Rotary Club meeting as
guest speaker. From 1-1:30
Sierra Club view points on land
use planning, particularly in Humboldt
County. About 80+ Rotarians
present. Questions & answers went
well. Home by 3 after getting
Bill's mail from campus.

Left Tom at Doug Galati's
home in M.K. at 6:45 - on way to
pick up Susie to attend County
Planning Commission meeting at Court
house. Northcoast Area Plan
(LCP) being heard. Presentations made
by CAL staff, members and Coastal
Comm. Staff (regional).
Home by 10:30.

1980 11th day - 355 days follow

Cloudy. 47°F 8 A.M.
Up 7:45 - still rather dark.
Phone line busy on Shelter Love
and other conservation issues.

Tom and Doug had appet. with Jim
Gast and Jack Alderson at Harbor District
offices at 2 p.m.

Took things to Becky around 4:30.
Drove ~~to~~ up to West Haven P.O. to
get Tom at bus stop at 7. Raining.
We spent much time hashing over
his eventful "negotiations".

Prepared things in advance in
order to leave at 7 A.M. ~~ing~~ for
Exlom meeting at 11:30 at Lark's in
Healdsburg area.

Watched some TV programs -
Shelter Love project on local news.

Rain - all day. Left 1980 12th day - 354 days follow
7:05. Stopped in Eureka to fill gas tank.
Arrived at Stanley's precisely 11:30.

Creeks, waterfalls, rivers, all running
fast and swiftly. Many slides -
no delays.

Meeting ended by 5. Quorum lost
then. Heavy rain, poor visibility
caused me to stop in Ukiah for
the night. Filled gas tank (-many
pumps empty at Standard station), so
a line-up for unleaded mostly.
Had light dinner at nearby Denny's
and headed for a motel.

Watched TV for weather news.
Santa Cruz county taking a
beating - on beaches and in the
mountains; also high winds, 100 mph
or so. Lake Tahoe and 6" rain -
flooding in many areas.

Heavy, heavy rain all
night long. Up early since left foot
was remaining numb. Had gotten up
to "walk floor" at 5 a.m. to get cir-
culation back in foot.

Breakfast nearby - as it got
daylight. Kept headlights on for en-
tire 200 mile trip home. No let up
in rain. Rivers back full. Creeks
back full. Run off causing debris
to dance across highway. Waterfalls
wherever one looked. Small trees
slumping down cut banks. Home by
11 o'clock. Flooding predicted by
evening on Eel and Van Duzen
and Smith River & Klamath.

Took Tom to Trinidad by 1 to
catch Southbound Greyhound to Garber-
ville. He will hope to get to Shelter Cove
tomorrow for on site meeting with others.

Dinner alone. Greg and Jim Tucker
came in about 9.

All went to bed early -
Still raining hard. Rivers reaching
flood stage - Smith, Eel, Van Duzen.

up 7:30. Raining still! 1980 14th day - 352 days follow
 Greg & Jim left for a busy day in
 Eureka at 9.

Worked around house and read Coastal
 permit applications after attending a 2
 hr. meeting re. Stanislaus River with
 people at Tim McKay's home in Westhaven.
 Barbara "Shortest" Shipperly here to spearhead
 grass roots support for wild river action
 in Congress.

Met Greg and Jim after 6 at Art's
 Gallery in Eureka - for a good
 steak dinner.

Went to Van Kirk's in Arcata around
 7:30 for No. Group Ex Com. meeting.

New members David Oyler and Ernie
 Wason there, but Larry Moss in Sacra-
 mento.

Home by 10:40.

1980 15th day - 351 days follow

Martin Luther King's Birthday

Variable cloudiness - Some
 respite from rain. Up by
 7:30.

Took laundry to Arcata after
 lunch. Also took some to Iris
 to be picked up in evening.

CAC meeting 7:30 at County Court-
 house. Adjourned 11:30. Rain began
 again - and went on through the
 night.

Rain gauge overflowed — 5" plus.

Greg left about 9:30 for his errands regarding the So. America trip. Tom back before noon.

1980

17th day — 349 days follow

Cloudy. Tom and I left for Coastal Com. meeting at 8:20, stopping in Arcata briefly for copies of surfers' revised findings — to be presented at hearing. Meeting began at 9. Shelter Cove project took one hour. Tom and Doug G. made splendid presentations — covered by TV. Sierra Club commented. Urged ban of motorized vehicles on beach.

Left before 12. Had hamburger + coffee in Eureka, then stopped briefly again in Arcata for more copy work and a few groceries + quick stop at Jim Gasto's home.

Relaxed the rest of the day and evening. Tom did a lot of phone calls re the project hearing and the good results.

Light dinner. One cribbage game. Tom fell asleep during a TV program we both were viewing — so I covered him and left him on the couch for the night.

Hal Wiedman phoned. Would be here for crab feast Friday or Saturday.

Good letter from Bill.

JANUARY

18

FRIDAY

Clear, cool, 33° F at 8 a.m. 1980 18th day - 348 days follow

Put in some kindling and other fire wood - with Tom's help - before 11. Phone call from Lois Stone (HWR) re. of Coastal Com. hearing on wetlands guidelines, and re-location of the Little Red School House at Stone Lagoon.

Cleaned house a bit, preparing for Hal & Co. Lovely afternoon, if cool.

Took things to Becky around 4. Tom rode to Trinidad with me. Shoreline crisp & clear and beautiful. Stopped to look at new clearing for house near Parker Creek.

Hal & Co. on beach, having arrived early. Had marvelous fresh crab, salad and french bread and wine or beer dinner. Sat around fire until after 11. (Bill phoned around 6.)

They were all in a hotel & town near Acreta. Tom planned to join them in morning for Big Lagoon & maybe Fern Canyon field trip for gathering plants, cones, etc.

SATURDAY

19

JANUARY

1980 19th day - 347 days follow 45° F 8 a.m. Breezy.

The "Gang" stopped for Tom before 9. Worked around house and garden most of day. Lovely outside in sun. Lots of activity on Moonstone Beach. People running around in shorts! Did a LOT of sheathy pruning.

Went to Mck. around 3 for a few groceries, since gang would have dinner here again, bringing makings for hamburgers. They arrived just after sunset, at 5:17. We sat on deck for long time enjoying lovely sky, first stars and crescent moon. No wind.

Fun dinner. Everyone pitching in. Sat around fire until nearly 11. Everyone then left.

A friend of Tom's showed up to whisk him off to Shelter Cone early tomorrow morning.

39°F, 8 A.M. Lovely day. 1980 20th day - 346 days follow

Worked around Lorie, then did a lot of pruning around the driveway and garden. Warm, working in sun.

Continued working until 3 p.m. Had shower and shampoo, then relaxed by reading - until - Bill Devall showed up with some coastal material. We talked while keeping an eye and an ear toward the Superbowl game in the last quarter.

Watched a beautifully filmed TV movie about a "wolf dog" in Alaska. Tom showed up around 9:30 - dog-tired from sun and surf - and he fell asleep in the chair near the fire. We both took to our beds around 11 - after trying to keep awake for a portion of another movie.

Walked to mouth of Little River

1980

21st day - 345 days follow

37°F. 7:30 A.M. Variable cloudiness. Heavy fog in Eureka area, morning. Spent from 10 - 11 A.M. with Eureka's Mayor Fred J. Moore in regard to an endorsement (perhaps) of a bill to protect the Stanislaus River from further flooding back beyond Parrot's Ferry. Did a few errands. Home by 1:15.

1980 22nd day - 344 days follow

Nice day - cool.

Went to Caltrans Bldg. by 10:30.
Smith River bridge project development
team meeting. Sierra Club concerns for
design of replacement over Myrtle
Creek to be further considered.

~~Picked up Bill's campus mail
and then~~

Took mail to Iris.

Bill phoned from his newly in-
stalled residence phone.

Chair Speegle (LA Times) dropped
in (unannounced) to interview me
on Coastal issues - for a feature
later. She was here nearly
2 hrs. Tom & I had a late dinner.

1980

23rd day - 343 days follow

Road into Eureka
(where fog was on ground) to leave
letters in Mayor's office. Did
some shopping, then home for lunch.

Did some reading on Coastal material
prior to attending a CAC sub-committee
meeting at 3 p.m. in the LLP offices.

Task is to comment on North Coast Area
Plan ^{draft} recommendations in response to
State Coastal Comm. concerns.

Home for dinner. Tom busy
working on Shelter Cove material.

~~Tom~~ Picked up Bill's campus mail.
His book is out.

Foggy. Attended Water Quality 1980 24th day - 342 days follow
Control Board (A/o. Coast Reg.) meeting re. "208", best
management practices to prevent water pollution -
Anata City Hall (an all day meeting). Stayed
from 9-9:40, then went to Courthouse in
Eureka to attend County Advisory Com. on OLS
Lease Sale 53. from 10-12.

Home for lunch, then returned from
2-5:30 to water quality hearing. Much
good testimony from environmentalists, in
contrast to timber interests.

Returned to Eureka once more
when Tom needed ride to Harbor
District meeting. I chose not to
attend.

Instead, watched TV and relaxed.
Tom would stay in Anata for night.

1980 25th day - 341 days follow

Beautiful, clear morning
at Moonstone. Patchy fog elsewhere.

Worked in garden - pruning, cutting
grass. Also, split some firewood for
Tom to carry in when he returned.

Worked without a shirt in warm
sunshine until breeze came up.

Tom arrived about 3:30.

Took things to Becky before 5.

Bill Devall here awhile before 6.

Light dinner, then watched some
TV.

Shelter Cove project O.K. now.

Locked myself out of house - so
walked to mouth of Little River
(mid-morning) hoping Tom would
be back at house soon.

Managed to climb in one
window left unlocked; using table,
benches, and a lot of caution!

Cool 37°F. Some frost. 1980 26th day - 340 days follow

Found it too cool to work outside, so kept busy indoors - filing, writing to Bill, and reading coastal material.

Tom took off on bicycle in afternoon to play ball in Trinidad.

At 6 p.m. I drove to ~~the~~ Eureka for a CAC dinner honoring former staff person Dave Gibbs. Good fun. Fine dinner.

Prime rib at \$12.25. Ten CAC members and several spouses, plus some staff on hand.

Home by 11.

Tom came in shortly after.

We were unaware of the earthquake at 6:30 in SF bay area.

1980 27th day - 339 days follow Cool 38°F. Some

cloudiness + light breeze.

To work outside you had to keep moving. Dry cold wind came up.

Tom did some high shrub pruning for me as I steadied ladder.

When sun moved around to hit laundry room, I did a few loads of washing.

Light dinner. Watched TV. Had to keep fire going all evening, plus heater - as temp. dropped.

Another shock in bay area reported - much damage, no injuries.

Bill phoned - cold there, too. He is comfortable - expecting Bob for weekend. All is well.

Frost on Little River dunes! 1980 28th day - 338 days follow
Clear; COLD. 31°F at 7:30. 23° in Eneba
slough area (KINS).

Worked around (inside) house
until about 2 p.m. Went to Acreta
via Trinidad (left Tom there to do his
laundry + visit friends). Mostly grocery
shopping -

Tom returned for dinner.
Read and watched TV.

Though clouds had appeared
before noon, all dispersed by
evening.

1980 29th day - 337 days follow 28°F, 7:30 A.M. Frost

lighter than yesterday - less moisture in air. Ice
on inside west bedroom windows!

Many robins in berry bushes. Also,
2 Rufous-sided Towhees were scratching
around. The berries are almost gone.

Between phone calls - managed to
type up in final form the minutes
of Redwood Chapter ExCom. meeting.

Did some reading, hugging heat.
Made clam chowder for dinner.

Attended (and participated vocally as
a sub-committee member on the NAP) the
CAC meeting, 7:30 p.m. - Co. Courthouse.
Had to wait for a quorum - 8:00 p.m.
Meeting ended 11:00. Lonely on the
highway driving home - Very few cars.
Clear and cold.

Brought the hanging fuchsia
indoors for night.

Tom slept in living room to
insure warmth.

32°F 7:30 A.M. Variable 1980 30th day - 336 days follow

cloudiness. - - Still cool, however.

Did some phoning re. Crescent City Harbor projects.

Went to Arcata after lunch. Picked up Bill's campus mail, including a copy of his new book. Dropped mail at Iris', did some copying and headed home.

Greg showed up (a day early) around 9 and went right to bed. Tom and I watched a TV show.

1980 31st day - 335 days follow Warmer today. Cloudy.

Social Security and Withholding Tax Return Due 42°F 7:30.

Left at 9:20 for Eureka. Quick stop at Wingle & Kelly's Engr. - offices for Crescent City Harbor EIR's.

10 A.M. project development team meeting re. Redwood park by-pass proposals at Caltrans Bldg.

11:45 - spent some time with Coastal Com. Staff, same bldg. Home by 1:30.

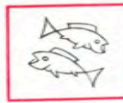
Did some reading - and phoning - re. Crescent City Harbor.

Did some reading and TV

enough for dinner.

1980 35th day - 331 days follow

Lincoln's Birthday (Monday observance)

Variable cloudiness.
Welcome sunshine.

Phoned Norbert Dall re. Wetlands
Guidelines in Coastal Zone.

Did a lot of reading, staying
inside entire day.

Prepared a meat loaf and
other items, expecting Greg for
dinner. He arrived about 5.

After dinner Tom and I kept
reading until some special TV
shows at 9 and 10.

Greg took to the typewriter and
then early to bed.

Variable cloudiness. 1980 36th day - 330 days follow

Greg left at 8:30. I left at 11 for Eureka - shopping and lunch.

Bought a lightweight traveling outfit for prospective spring trip to Virginia.

Met John Corbett and Cindy? at Tomasai in Old Town for lunch. Raining before 2.

Picked up Greg's spare brace at "patient aids" place.

Built a fire and spent afternoon reading conservation material.

1980

37th day - 329 days follow

Lovely, mild day. Did some housework, then some laundry work. Also, did some grass cutting on terraces. Went to Iris' around 4:30 with Bill's mail.

Picked up groceries in Arcata. Home about 6 - just turning dark.

Had left Tom in Trinidad earlier. He returned around 10:15.

We watched some TV, then played one game of cribbage.

Fair. Wind came up after lunch. Ocean "bumpy" in surfers lingo.

Did some ironing, then spent some time reading coastal material.

Lovely afternoon as wind died down. Rec'd letter from Bill V.

Attended County Planning Com. meeting 6:30 - 10:15. Started - or - continued public hearing on North coast Area plan. Long discussions on minimum parcel sizes around Orick; and, use of Freshwater Spit for overnight parking. Some planning commissioners obviously incapable of planning.

Home by 11. Clear, cool.

Played one game of cribbage with Tom.

Feel a cold coming on.

44°F 7:00 A.M.

1980 39th day - 327 days follow Beautiful pink sky. Lovely morning. Early phone call from Julie Vennan re. Redwood Chapter affairs.

Did some work in garden; mostly pruning - and clean up. Wild currant now in flower.

Took things to Becky by 5. John Corbett came by to talk to Tom around 6-7.

Watched a good TV movie 9-11.

Variable cloudiness. 1980 40th day - 326 days follow

Trinidad - Claw Beach runners (1350 at start) started coming through around Noon.

Watched for about an hour from neighbor's (LANE) deck. Other young neighbors joined Tom and me.

Worked in garden for several hours. Got groceries in A.K.

Tom took off on bicycle up Scenic Drive - returning around 5. Watched some surfing (live from Hawaii) on TV sports program.

Tom then hitchhiked into Arcata for a surfing film - and would return to Trinidad with friends.

Watched TV - and read. Talked about outings with Merna Guthrie.

1980 41st day - 325 days follow

Variable cloudiness.

45°F. 7:05 A.M.

Greg phoned 9:30. Planned dinner together in Arcata.

Worked around house awhile. Then left about 10:15 to walk along Scenic Drive. Cool air. Saw baby birds along way. A young fox sparrow and a Steller's jay. Also saw kinglets and chestnut backed chickadees. Earlier, a young hawk was in our garden. Possibly a rough-legged.

1980 109th day - 257 days follow

Up 5:10. Left for Aneta airport before 6. First, signed SC "comments" to Current City Post/Land Use plan, prepared and typed by Tom Pratte. (Tom had finished final draft for my review by 1:00 A.M., when I went to bed; then worked on final product through the night). Left car in parking lot for Lee and/or Luis to drive to their place in Aneta. Beautiful morning. Clear overcast. Fog pockets inland. Hughes Air West on time - off the field at 6:40. In S.F. International airport in 40 minutes. Had a cup of coffee and sweet roll after checking into United Airlines new facility - and loading area, gates 89-90. Loading began for flight to Pittsburgh at 9:30. Away - "into the wild blue yonder" at 9:45. Not a full passenger load. We drove Bob home and had a quick, quiet (not to awaken Matt) cup of coffee.

Back to our mountain spot by 11:30.

It was a lovely day - sunny, with clouds, and the flowering dogwoods (pink - and white) and redbud - and apple blossoms - everywhere - were gorgeous. Trees are leafing out fast in the over 70° F. weather.

Very cloudy at times.

1980

116th day - 250 days follow

Arranged a few things for the "big event", then drove to campus, leaving around 10. After Bill took care of some things at the office and an errand at the ABC store, we left the car in a faculty parking area for the remainder of the day.

We joined Bruce Parker and a large table-full at the Center. Jerry Prescott arrived shortly after we had started to eat. (News of Tex was NOT good, but HE looked swell).

Took a tour of labs with a small assemblage, then attended Bruce's seminar on ECOLS (Antarctic surveys 79-80) at 4:00 P.M.

Around 5 we had cocktails in Jerry's room - a little special surprise planned ahead by Bruce and Co. People were arriving to register - rapidly at this time. Dick Zingmark, Norm Andersen, Bill Taylor, Richard Meyer, Herman Foert, and others I knew from other places.

A large gathering for a very fine dinner of ducklings, rice, asparagus, salad, wines, hot rolls, frozen dessert. Maybe 60 or more - followed by a session which included slides.

Each participant introduced himself and expressed concerns or areas of interest.

117th day - 249 days follow

Woke up early - 6:00 AM - to heavy rain. Did some last minute house cleaning, made a lunch, and dressed warmly for the field trip. The vans, 3 of them, came by around 9:20. At that time we moved up the mountain to the Art Studio for an excellent dinner and an evening of algae discussion - and a few slides.

Heavy rain at times. Returned by 10.

add to April 27, 1980

I had continual visitors in the small kitchen area, as people wished to take a break. Dick Zingmark had brought along 2 color slides he had from an April 1964 Saline Valley trip, when he was a student at Humboldt. One was of Bill, the other of me in our desert campsite.

Around 5:30 everyone moved up the hill to the Art Studio, as yesterday, and again sat down to a delightful dinner. Ruth and Miles Horton joined us.

The evening's discussion was lively and informative, lasting from 7-9. Some of the group returned to the Center right away - in one van.

Bill drove to the DB Center to go on field trip scheduled for 9.

Read, mostly, until the gang's arrival here at the lab. One local participant showed up in advance of others, in his own car - Vince Howard of Roanoke. He talked with me about some of the geology of the New Line Valley, the caves, fossils, etc. - for nearly an hour. He was studying algae found on the backs of snails found up on these mountains.

When the van and other cars arrived, they began their lab work - along with their lunch. Bill returned in a van and would have to retrieve his car later.

Awake to close, LOUD, birdsong at 6:00 A.M., A cardinal, I believe, but light too dim to determine. Went back to sleep until 7:30! Cool - very cool. Some scattered clouds.

Lawrence, Mew, and one other showed up around 11 to clean out lab supplies.

Miles (Horton) came down while they were here.

(Saw rufous-sided towhee in bushes just below the "big house". Miles retired early.) Walked down about midnight.

On the way back we noted more spectacular displays of redbud - along 460 - and on our own Mtn. Lake road it was almost a canopy in one place.

Pouring rain when we left the lab. at 4:30.
Stopped on campus, where Bill checked mail, en route to the Parker's home by 5:30 for dinner and the evening.

Home to "our mountain" by 11:30. (38°F.)

Phoned Public Lands Committee in Wash. D.C.
Observed: yellow shafted flicker, a tit-mouse,

Bill and I took lunch, cameras, field glasses and

Some excellent statements in support of state systems being put under Federal protection.

Many opposed, mostly due to lack of accurate information.

Alarm set for 5:10. Took Tam to Big Lagoon by 6. Hit freeway and headed for Fort Bragg, Albion, Navarro Ridge Rd. to Gail Lucas' home. Patchy fog along coast.
