Home before 12 after picking up some freeway reading materials from Dave's place. Raining extremely hard by midnight.

1971 15th day - 350 days follow

Raining.

16th day - 349 days follow

Dave flew to S.F.

Bill Newell came out and we put together a statement and a short press release regarding the Eureka freeway.

1971

17th day - 348 days follow

Rain. Up by 9. Anthea phoned 9:30 - Walt wanted leave on 11:35 plane. Dropped Walt at airport at 11, then went to Areate post office and dropped "freeway" material off at the C'Sullivan's.

Mary and Gene Kojan and Linda Young, who live on Moonstone Heights arrived in heavy rain at 2 PM to discuss Sam Herryman (Sp.'s) activities with fill dirt near his Beach home. We had some coffee and cookies, then walked down to the beach to investigate. We didn't like what we saw. Meanwhile Dave arrived and joined us on the trek. We phoned Guy Kulstad (Director of Public Works) to see if he couldn't find some other location to get rid of slide clean-ups. We all met him at the beach to discuss the problem further.

Dave went home early after a few cocktails. I got angry with Bill and went to bed at 7:30.

~~Rise~~ up early. Ready to 1971 18th day - 347 days follow
have for town by 9:30. Had Xerox copies
made of press release and statement. Delivered
the press releases personally to TV and radio
stations + newspaper. It got extremely warm
in Arcata around noon (71°) so I did a
few errands.

Back home before 1. Bathed around
4 - preparing for early dinner and getting
to freeway heading early.

Dave came in when Bill did
and stayed to work on map all evening.
Raining by evening.

Eureka High School Auditorium was
packed - (estimated 300+). Hearing began
fairly promptly - around 7:30 and lasted
until 12:30 A.M. I presented the Sierra
Club statement fairly early in the evening -
supporting the concept of the "red route."

Home by 1. In bed by 2.

1971 19th day - 346 days follow Cloudy all day. Dave arrived
by 9 to start on map work again. I helped
him with the lettering of creeks after he located
some neat pressure sensitive letters to use.

Had dinner alone, early, due to
Ex Com meeting of North group at Bill
Devall's place at 7:30. Raining by now,
so took the jeep. Picked up Vic Aubin
on the way and left some stuff at
Jannie Kirby's place.

Meeting was over by 10. Back to
work on map with Dave, after getting
home and having some coffee, until
2 A.M.

Dave slept on couch for what
was left of his short night.

Did some typing for No. Group Newsletter and
prepared some things for the meeting - when
not engaged in map work.

up at 5 to see that Dave ¹⁹⁷¹ 20th day - 345 days follow
got up in time to take 6 A.M. flight to S.F.
The plane was delayed until 10 - due
to fog cover at SF airport.

At 10:30 I took the map to Burns
Engraving in Eureka, but did not leave it.

Clear, but windy and cool. Did some
grocery shopping on way home.

Did some washing after lunch,
plus some sewing, plus some rug
pivceping - MT with us for day. Dave
phoned around 2 to see what happened
with map.

He returned on evening plane - in
time for dinner - then stayed for
night after attempting some more
additions to the map. We were up
until 2 A.M.

¹⁹⁷¹ 21st day - 344 days follow

Beautiful day. Dave
took the completed map (and legend)
into Burns engraving before noon.

I returned with finished product
before dinner - then began writing the
text, working until 1 or 2 A.M. I
was tired and went to bed by
midnight.

Up by 7:30 to make phone calls. ¹⁹⁷¹ 22nd day - 343 days follow
 Typed text as Dave wrote it and Bill edited it. All through before 3. Got it to the printers in Eureka as quickly as possible.

Bill picked up pizza for dinner. Called a "folding" party together at Dave's around 9:30. Things ready at printers by 7:30.

Total of 12 worked 2 hours and folded 5000 brochures by midnight.

¹⁹⁷¹ 23rd day - 342 days follow

Up by 8:30. Went up to Davis at 9:15. Vic Aubin and I Genie Dunbar arrived shortly. We folded brochures until finished - about 11:30. Dave took a load of 1500 to Eureka to put on Greyhound bus at 11 for distribution through Redwood Chips.

Al Whitney arrived at 12:45. At 1:15 we all left for SC outing - tour of PG & E Nuclear power plant - south of Eureka. Foggy and cool there.

About 55 people were present. 3 PG & E men were on hand to present their story and answer questions and guide groups through the plant. We were there from 2-5.

Bill, Dave and I had a Mexican dinner at The Red Pepper in Arcata. Home by 7:30. We read and talked until 11:30.

Up at 9. Fair - after light rain during night. Picked up folded brochures from Jeannie Kirby at 10:30; delivered them to Dave's before 11:30.

Did some house cleaning before people arrived around 2 o'clock for pesticides and wilderness sub-committee meetings. 9 on pesticides + pollution - 5 on wilderness, plus Bill V., Bill Devall & my self. Dave Van de Mark showed up around 5 - just as most were preparing to leave.

Dave and Bill Devall stayed for dinner and were gone by 9 or 9:30. Cleaned up kitchen, then did some washing. In bed by 1 A.M.

Long Ayers showed up this afternoon.

1971 25th day - 340 days follow

Up by 8:30. Lovely day, but kinda' cold. Did some ironing. Went to Sue Van Kirk's in Arcata around 2:30.

Dave came in around dinner time, but did not stay. I wasn't speaking to anyone. Instead - was reading and then napped until I got hungry at 9:30.

Bathed late and read some more in bed.

Kay MacDonald phoned in early evening.

up before 8:30. Fair, but cool. 1971 26th day - 339 days follow

Kept appt. with Dr. Gaylord at 10:30. (Toe doing nicely - will go back for check in 2 mos.)
Did some errands in Alsea. Home shortly after 12.

Typed some letters regarding tree planting.
Dave came in for awhile - noticed heavy work on beach - started phoning people about disturbance to beach by Sam Merryman, Jr.

Bill DeWall, George Sessions and Kay? arrived around 4:30 - then went for walk on beach. Extremely low tide. They returned about dark with some large mussels, wondering if they were safe to eat. I checked with Fred Telonicher. The answer was yes, this is the safest time of year. Dave returned later after giving MT a good run on the beach. He had a cocktail, made some phone calls, then dashed off to give a Trinity Alps push at the Boat in Blister meeting.

Vic Aubin came in late - after being up at Doug Ayus' place, when both found Dave wasn't home.

1971 27th day - 338 days follow

up by 8:15. Extremely foggy. Cool, too - all day. Kept appt. at Vision Center in Eureka at 10:30 for eye examination - first in 2 years. Will have magnifying glasses for close-up work - otherwise little change.

Went down to Moonstone Beach at 3 PM to meet with Kajans, Guy Rusher, Chuck Selden, Ray Plant and Dave. Discussed problems arising from Merryman's fill activities.

Spent most of quiet evening reading and/or napping.

Ready for bed by midnight.

up and about by 8:30. Very foggy close to ocean.

1971 28th day - 337 days follow

Went to Eureka after lunch. Dropped into Court House. Saw Guy Rucker, Ray Peart and Ray Schneider. Then called on Harvey Higgins at County Planning Commission for an hour or more. Home before 5.

Went up to Dave's after dinner and helped him fold some more Trinity Alps material.

1971 29th day - 336 days follow

Up by 8:30. Very foggy and cool. Couldn't raise Dave by phone, so had to drive up there with message. People in Weaverly area wanted more Trinity Alps brochures. More were ordered from printers. Stayed from 9:30 - 10:50 helping Dave stuff envelopes. Had to get jeep back to Bill, who was planning on doing some library work.

Dave came down here later and we stuffed and stamped more envelopes - then drove to Eureka to get stuff from printers and give some to waiting COR students. Spent another hour in main Post Office folding, stuffing, stamping, sorting, several hundred more -- and mailing them before closing time. Back home by 6:15 -- greeted by Bill, M.T. and the cat. Dave feeling lousy, so he went home when we started dinner. Ate quickly, bathed quickly and drove to Eureka High School for most of the community concert, which was "Balliet Brio". 3 men, 3 women, simple scenery, good costumes, and MARVELOUS performers. Concert over by 10 o'clock. Drove up to Dave's for late coffee and record listening - balliet, of course - the Nutcracker Suite - Home again by 11:30. Very foggy again after some clearing around sunset.

Breakfast at 9. Foggy again. 1971 30th day - 335 days follow

Went to Eureka before 11 to get my new reading glasses.

Went up to Daves for an hour or so to fold more material for mailing. Meanwhile Bill did some shopping.

Dave came in for a cocktail -- not feeling too hot -- and he didn't want any dinner. His voice sounded awful!

Picked him up after 7, dropped materials off at Van Kiehn, then headed for campus. Heard John Sawyer's program on Trinity Alps presented to Native Plant Society.

Headed back to Daves by 9:30 - Had coffee and listened to a couple of records. Home before 11. Terribly low fog again on coast.

Had some calls concerning Trinity Alps.

1971

31st day - 334 days follow

Social Security Tax Return Due

Up around 8:30. Beautifully clear and sunny for a short while - then the low, cool fog blanketed us most of the day. Some partial clearing in late afternoon. A few (4) surfers were out, though ocean was very calm.

Worked on filing for SC. Bill went up to Anthas around 4. Jeanne Sollen arrived to look over, and talk over wilderness books, ideas, etc. -- preparing for this week's meetings.

Roger Willmuth, Mary Overlock and Richard Smith came out later.

Dave and Doug appeared about 6 - and stayed for dinner. Others left around 7:30.

Finished the washing and drying by 1 A.M.

Dave's 28th birthday.

Awakened by phone at 8 AM 1971 32nd day - 333 days follow
a fellow from Santa Rosa -- about Trinity Alps
meetings. Breakfast by 9. Lots of phone calls --
city councilman about harbor district; PA & E about
nuclear plant at Pt. Arena; a fellow from Montana
about campaign strategy in a conservation battle such
as for a Redwood Natl. Park.

Went up to Dave's before lunch to get more
brochures -- then in to Arcata to mail them; then
back home for phone calls; then back to Dave's
to report findings.

Dave still not feeling too good -- so I
asked him to come down for dinner. He did,
and remained until 10:15. Meanwhile, Bill
attended a brief meeting of the EDA at the
Court House. I dashed up to Dave's (in
his car) to get some Trinity Alps brochures for
Ken Lytle.

Had long conversation with Jeanne Kirby.
A Boy Scout phoned for details on tree
planting project. Bill Duvall and John
Hennings and Merrill Hugo (from Redding)
phoned.

Before 5 PM I reached the Senior
Land Agent, State Lands Commission, in
Sacramento -- regarding Merryman's field
operation at Moonstone Beach.

In bed by 11:15. (A grey, cloudy day)

1971 33rd day - 332 days follow

Awake by 7:30. Up by 8. A
beautiful, clear, bright sunny day. Wind kept
it cool. Went up to Dave's around 9:30 to pick up
Trinity Alps material for Bill to take to John
Hennings and to take Dave's temperature. O.K.

Received 2 phone calls for Dave. Had to go
back up around 11:30 to give him messages.
He came down here at 12:30 and stayed for
remainder of day and evening to make and receive
phone calls.

Listened to Eureka City Council in session
on freeway -- over radio -- from 9:30 to 11:30.
They voted to accept the Planning Commission's
recommendation and adapt the "red route"
into the Transportation plan of the General Plan.

Dave went home around 11; beginning to
tire out again, though cold better.

Awake by 8. "Putty cat" trucked around ¹⁹⁷¹ 34th day - 331 days follow
me for a few minutes under the covers, both happy
to stretch out and snooze a few moments longer.

Frost everywhere! White, white! Even on drift
wood on beach. Very clear, very cold.

Started some washing at 9:30 and
finished by 2. Dave came in around
10:15-- just before Bill left-- and
remained-- very unhealthy-- until I
slept him home at 4. He spent most of
time on phone and between talking and
coughing he almost lost his voice.

Hal Wiedman phoned at 4:30 from
McKinleyville. He tried to find fresh crab,
but none was available. (The crab fishermen
are being scratchy about prices-- and are not
going out). I made a large stew for us
instead. With Hal was grad. student Dave
Stewart. They arrived around 5. I had
Dave & come down for dinner, which he
did (and remained until near collapse
around 10).

Made several phone calls during day
and received several-- all Sierra Club
business.

In bed by 12:20.

1971

35th day - 330 days follow

A grey morning. Didn't wake
up until 8:15. High clouds; rain in the
forecast.

Dave arrived before 10 to make pre-arranged
phone calls regarding Trinity Alps meetings and
a Sierra Club position.

I dashed to the post office in Arcata
before noon and did a couple of other
errands, too.

Dave spent afternoon writing and I spent
most of afternoon typing. Rain began
around 4 PM. Decided not to go to
Willow Creek meetings-- Dave still feeling
pretty rough, besides wanting to get statement ready.

He went home shortly after dinner.
I worked on my statement for tomorrow's
meeting in Eureka-- just a rough draft.

A grey, drizzly day along the immediate coast. Typed my statement; Bill worked on his; Dave showed up to work on his. Bathed and packed by 1:30 in order to get to City Hall by 2 o'clock for meeting. Took Falcon in, left it for Bill to pick up in late evening.

Gave my statement almost immediately after the slide show - in fact I was second person called. Meeting over by 4:15. Most people (15 or 16 best) were all for wilderness, about 5 (timber beards) for status quo or against-large area.

Ken showed up around 5. We headed out for Ex Com meeting in Ukiah. Stopped briefly in Garberville for to pick up a hamburger. Light rain until Laytonville.

Arrived County Library, down town Ukiah at 8:10. Meeting lasted until just after midnight. Ken went on to Santa Rosa. I went out to Al Whitney's home for the night. Phil Kay, Maurice Woods, Jerry Fitch, Bruce Macpherson & wife also spending night there.

In bed, after watching moon on moon hit, by 2:15 AM.

1971 37th day - 328 days follow

Alarm went off at 7:30. Al fixed Finnish pancakes (baked) for breakfast. Aileen got up to join us. Worked on conservation problems until Ken arrived at 11:30.

Beautiful - warm - clear. Stopped briefly in Willits for gas and Ken grabbed a hamburger. Home by 3. Very foggy from just south of Eureka to - all the way home. Dave at home with Bill.

Went to Sierra Club meeting at 6:30 after fixing a big macaroni salad. Ran the meeting in place of chairman Bill Devall, who was in San Francisco for other meetings.

Stan Harris gave the program. All about Alaska - people, bird research, etc. - in 1962, '63 at mouth of Kuskokwim River, around Bethel and other small villages. (The beaver who nest in Humboldt Bay dug up on the coast of Alaska).

Home by 11.

Fell asleep on couch.

Foggy - grey day, though ¹⁹⁷¹ 38th day - 327 days follow
~~Sun~~ came out brightly, briefly
 around noon.

Cut limbs off a neighbor's acacia tree, which was hanging in our power and telephone lines. Worked all afternoon cutting down, sawing, and cleaning up the mess in the driveway.

Dave and I came in and out all afternoon and even here for drink and to bake rolls in our oven, which we ate long after dinner.

¹⁹⁷¹ 39th day - 326 days follow

Woke up with miserable headache so stayed in bed rather late, even after Bill brought me coffee and toast.

Hung around the house most of day expecting to hear from State Lands agent. Meanwhile Dave was in and out and back again for dinner.

Would meet at Moonstone Beach with Jim Schenk and Chuck Seldon in morning.

Had to make a wild dash to get Bill to school - in the Ford. The Jeep didn't want to start.

Dave went in around 4 to pick up Bill.

We went up to Dave's place before 10 to get some Kings Range material. Doug Ayers was there, too.
 Home again before 12.

Janis Hagood phoned for a "chat."

up at 8:15 after making a phone call to the editor of the Times-Standard about one thing -- and learning another -- the big earthquake in the Los Angeles area!

1971

40th day - 325 days follow

at 10 A.M. Chuck Selden, Jim Schenk (from State Lands office) Eleanor Watkins, Gene Kojan and I, plus Dave Van de Mark, met at Moonstone Beach to survey the fire situation and plan a strategy to halt further disruption of the natural beach.

Dave went to Eureka by 11:30 for appt. with Ray Rutz concerning his health. I went to Arcata to get Sierra Club mail and returned by 12. Dave arrived around 1:30, with pills, and promptly fell asleep on couch.

I made a salad and bathed, ready to go to tennis by 4:30. I insisted that Dave NOT go and he agreed without too much static.

Everyone arrived by 6:30 (except Kurt, who couldn't be there). John Lang discussed with us many of our ideas and Blot's ideas on future management plans for the Kings Range Conservation Area. He showed slides after an excellent buffet (pot luck) dinner. Bill showed up but was not able to stay too long.

Viewed eclipse of the moon around 11. Absolutely clear night for the actual eclipse maximum. Home shortly after 11. In bed by 12.

1971

41st day - 324 days follow

Beautiful morning. Up by 8:30. Able to leave doors open while mopping kitchen floor. Phoned T-S to get tree planting story straightened out.

Dave came in around noon, feeling only slightly better. Beautiful afternoon, so decided to top an alder outside dining room window while Dave was on hand to steady the extension ladder.

Dave came in around dinner time but did not stay.

Doug Ayers was here for a couple of hours after we finished dinner.

After a bath I propped myself up comfortably in bed and finished a letter to Kay.

up by 8:30. Beautiful, extremely ¹⁹⁷¹ 42nd day - 323 days follow warm (for this time of year) day with a few scattered high clouds.

Dave dropped MT off here for a long afternoon -- from around noon until nearly 5 -- and then he stayed until we started dinner.

At 7:30 I was at Manila School on Samoa Peninsula attending a public meeting in regard to zoning. Harvey Higgins, County Planning Commissioner was explaining the whole concept of zoning to a very skeptical bunch of residents.

I put in a pitch for open space and perhaps a county park if the area is not zoned heavy industrial.

A clear, bright, and very warm moonlight night. Almost weird.

In bed before 12.

¹⁹⁷¹ 43rd day - 322 days follow

Lincoln's Birthday

Another beautiful morning. Up by 8 - anxious to get outside to work. Dave showed up around 8:30 on way to airport to get ticket, but then later cancelled it. Still having troubles - likes sudden drizzles.

Started some weeding. Pruned trees and did some grubbing about in the garden - keeping music Temple amused with branches. Cleaned rain gutters after clouds suddenly appeared in mid-afternoon on the heels of a very brief, gusty wind.

Quite a few people enjoying the beach and at least a half-dozen surfers enjoying the water.

Finished the laundry work by 5. Dave came by to ^{use} phone and pick up MT.

Fell from top of ladder while pruning an acacia tree branch, skinned down the tree trunk when ladder gave way - Got quite a few bruises, but none serious.

Went back and finished the job later.

Dave had fried chicken and fresh asparagus dinner with us.

Bill went up to Dunes around 9:30.

I packed the car for overnight camping, then had good bath and shampoo.

Had a wonderful hide and seek game with goofy cat - outside.

Warm enough to have doors open all day.

1971

44th day - 321 days follow

Up at 7:30. Gathered up some lunch material to eat to load in car and headed out for Bull Creek at 9 o'clock. Terribly foggy all the way -- taking a full 2 hours to get to the planting site on Pole Line Rd. Many people already out.

Corky Allen, Resource Mgr. gave a campfire program with slides centered on the erosion problems in Bull Creek watershed.

Before the crowd (about 200) dispersed I gave a brief pitch on Salmon-Trinity Wilderness and gave out all the brochures I had taken down.

A friend of Howard's, Wynn Whit, walked me back to my campsite and we talked at length about numerous environmental problems.

In my sleeping bag, under a starry sky and feathery redwoods by 9:30.

Bill and Dave enjoyed Seattle Symphony in Eureka.

1971

45th day - 320 days follow

Valentine's Day

Awoke to overcast sky at 7:00. Drove to Myers Flat to join Howard for breakfast at 7:30, then afterwards I left my car at park head quarters and rode with Howard to the planting site. Fog drifted in and out of valleys. We decided to experiment in carefully selected spots under tan oaks and scums thus with our planting after carefully checking some areas we remembered personally planting last year. The survival rate was low, but we noted where the seedlings were placed that did survive the dry weather and the nibblings of deer.

After planting another bundle (50 or more) of seedlings we took off for Grasshopper Peak. The key for the gate did not work, however, and we turned back. The other planting site was on Preacher Gulch Rd, farther up Bull Creek. We explored and found the area really ravaged. We nibbled lunch in the car, then explored other roads. It began raining around 2.

Ran across Tony Look and his party at the planting sites.

Drove home in heavy rain, leaving parking area just at dark, around 6.

Bill was pupping sweet and some pork when I got home. We had dinner late. Dave here, too.

It rained all evening.

Up by 8:30. Storm clouds clearing. ¹⁹⁷¹ 46th day - 319 days follow Washington's Birthday. Bill off to school by 10.

(In District of Columbia and some States)

Tony and Gary stopped briefly on way to Prairie Creek. A Peter Meyers phoned to contact Dave and would stop by to wait. Dave pointed out various coastal problems which Peter and friend would be photographing for the next 10 days. They were here more than 2 hours.

Managed to squeeze in a bath - between phone calls and packed an overnight bag so Dave and I could leave for Yreka meeting (following a.m.) right after dinner.

Dave ended up being quite late for dinner and we didn't get away until about 8:40.

Tried to locate Bob Morris' place in Weaver Mills, but ended up leaving a pile of brochures with a neighbor.

Drove on to Dunnsmuir for the night - too late to bother Merrill Hugo in Redding. (We had pile of brochures for him, too.)

Stopped driving at 1:30.

¹⁹⁷¹ 47th day - 318 days follow A cold, grey, "snow feeling" sky. Breakfast around 8:30 in Yreka. At U.S.F.S. offices shortly after 9. A heavy of personnel were on hand in Dan Abraham's office and we had a session that lasted until 12:30 or so. We covered all kinds of problems concerning wilderness - the plans for Crocker Creek in the Marbles; the timber holding in Gannys Valley in the Siskiyou, the Trinity-Salmon, de facto in Applegate River area, highway plans along the Salmon, etc., etc. plus a bit of philosophy.

Dave here for dinner and evening-

Up by 8:30. Beautiful day. Did a bit of house cleaning with all doors open for short while. Otherwise, cool!

At 3 o'clock I had to dash to Eureka to pick up the slides we would show. Dave began the final typing on the (8 minutes long) statement and I finished it. Gene Kojan arrived after 5 to choose the slides he would comment on. Gobbled some frozen food type dinner and was picked up at 6:45 by Eleanor Watkins. Raining.

Dave would be going to Environmental Center meeting and Bill had to go to a Lions Club ^{dinner} meeting.

The affair before the Parks & Rec. Com. was quite lengthy. Moonstone Beach problems were under discussion for nearly 45 minutes. It was a good session.

1971 79th day - 286 days follow

Up by 8. Scattered, high clouds. Worked outside - mowing cotton shorts - until twice to go for walk and do pick-up detail between here and Luffenholty Beach. Ocean beautiful, looking very green. Surfer out, just south of Luffenholty, near big rocks. Walked partway with driftwood collecting, new resident - a music prof. at college. Home again by 12:15. Worked outside all afternoon, pruning, weeding, cleaning up - until my hands and arms gave out. Dave dropped by on way to Arcata.

Bathed around 5. Dave back just before we left (5:45) for dinner with Iris and her. Looked over their new home before dinner. They are enjoying more room and time to make improvements.

Beginnings of head cold noticeable all evening. Home by 12:45. Overcast.

Up and through skimpy breakfast ¹⁹⁷¹ 80th day - 285 days follow

by 8:30. ^{Fourth Sunday of Lent} Very cloudy and much cooler than past few days. Read papers and yesterday's large collection of mail before taking my pre-lunch walk to Luffenbally Beach.

No roadside cleanup today, though I did gather up small cans and broken glass. Met Helen

Weitman and chatted awhile - near McGlynn's place.

Walked briskly - beyond Luffenbally, and got back to house by 12:30 - staved!

Very gray day with slight breeze. Not very many people on the beach - but always some - plus dogs and horseback riders at low tide.

Up by 8. Rain. Rain all day. Jim Gorter phoned from Eureka, where, with parents he was visiting a cousin for a couple of days. At 10:30 he showed up to chat, have coffee and view ocean.

Dave showed up. He and Jim had met several years ago as students at Yellow Bay, Mt. Biol. Station.

Sometime in afternoon, Dave and Bill went shopping together. I typed up letter regarding trans-Alaska pipeline. Later Bill dashed to Mkt. to post it - this was bearing word deadline date!

Napped on couch after dinner, then had bath and shampoo quite late. Wide awake to read awhile.

David (Barthel) phoned - that Gene Van Gorp had been found in a smoke filled room!

up by 8. A very grey, very "messy" rainy day - though not cold. Never heavy rain, never heavy wind - just messy. At 10 - with Dave along - we headed for Eureka. While Dr. Gaylord checked my big toe, they picked up an order of chests of drawers from Montgomery-Wards. Then Bill and I attended the Board of Supervisors meeting to hear what might happen to Moonstone Beach. The resolution of Parks and Recreation Commission was given by Don Lambert. The Board listened, then gave Director of Public Works go ahead to get estimate on cost of tide search and jurisdiction of tidelands.

We all had lunch at Stanton's. Started the washing routine as soon as we got home. Carol Severy was here for a long time. Dave came in once for a short time - long before dinner.

At 9:45 we went to Davis for coffee. In bed by 11:45. Foggy tonight along scenic drive.

1971 82nd day - 283 days follow

up around 8. Rainy - or cloudy - all day - sun tried vainly to break through. Jim Porter and his parents dropped in briefly between 9:30 - 10:00 on their return trip to Portland.

Bill took Jeep into garage to get back window fixed. Did some writing and then typing of material for SC newsletters. Dave came by sometime between noon and 2 o'clock and we had a big, hairy discussion about my wanting to get Bill to give me a divorce! Dave left in huff because I wouldn't give in and be nice to Bill.

Went to see Mike Digges to get details of beach hike - in order to answer an inquiry from a Backpacking Club near Stockton. Heard on car radio that SST had been defeated by Senate vote 51-46.

Went on to Anne Weiss' with material - had coffee and headed home by 5.

Big hunk with Bill after dinner and I went to bed - MAD - angry MAD - at 9:15.

Heard Dave come in to pick up a book, quite late.

1971 83rd day - 282 days follow

Up by 9. Raining and windy.

Everything getting beautiful and green - keeping out
happening fast now.

1971 84th day - 281 days follow

Did 2 large loads of washing. Enjoyed storm.

Had dinner at Dave's place. Doug also there.
Dave and I dashed off to Ex Com. meeting
at Bill Devall's at 7:30. Meeting ended
around 10:30, then Bill, Dave and I went
to a bar in Arcata for a short while.

Got Dave home around midnight. Doug
had brought Bill home and stayed until
nearly 12:30.

1971 85th day - 280 days follow

Up by 8:30. Cloudy. At 10:30
Bill and I took rain gear and walked up to Luffen-
Lally Beach. The tide was high and the ocean was
beautifully angry in the storm. Dave was in
the parking area - in his fancy camper - and offered us
coffee. Road crews were cleaning up the
"perpetual" slide. Home again around 12.

Went to M.K. for groceries and other errands.
Ran across Dave on Murray Road - and he went
with me for groceries, etc. A few showers during
afternoon, but light.

Did odd jobs around house. Invited
Dave to have roast for dinner and tender, young
asparagus.

Got upset with arguments after dinner,
so just kept still, did dishes and went to bed
before 11 - to read awhile.

Bill and Dave read and talked 'til
much, much later.

Up at 7:30. Cloudy.

1971 86th day - 279 days follow

Did 2 loads of washing and cut grass, and swung a golf club and pruned some shrubbery.

At 3:30 we went to Arcata - Bill to the college with a load of stuff, while I helped with the Seix Club Newsletter production at the Presb. Church.

Bill got in on the folding part and then they (325) were delivered to Susie Van Kirk.

Home by 6:45. Dinner by 7:30.

Bath, after dishes were done, and went to read by 10. A few light sprinkles hit in late afternoon and evening and a light wind came up.

4 Hummingbirds came in at the same time to the sugar water - just before dark - Great sight.

Pretty cat brought us another lizard.

1971 87th day - 278 days follow

Passion Sunday Fair. A nice warm day - with scattered clouds and way after dark the fog moved in on the coast.

Worked in garden most of day - grubbing out heavy iron growth and dense Ajuga. Very low tide - 8' and lots of people at beach. Dave was here an hour or so in late afternoon. He picked up the repaired deep-fat fryer for me while Bill took a load of stuff to his office.

Dave had a cocktail with us and was gone before 6.

Did some kitchen clean up after dinner - then had good deep, relaxing bath - garden work made a lot of tired, aching muscles!

In bed - to read awhile - by 10:45.

Up at 7:30. Sunny. Noticed low tide. ¹⁹⁷¹ 88th day - 277 days follow

Put coffee on and headed for beach by 7:45. Many clam diggers visible in early mist along Clam Beach. Comfortable in cotton shorts and flannel shirt - and happy once I got my feet wet.

Saw a lone white-winged scoter in the surf near the cave area.

As I headed back - who should show up but Dave and M.T. - for an early morning beach walk.

I stayed a bit longer watching and playing with M.T.

Dave came by the house later on way home from town. Bill went into the college around 10:15.

Clouds became heavier and some patches of fog became noticeable - and quite changeable.

Did some housecleaning - (bird feathers in bedrooms.)

The film he showed was "For All To Enjoy" produced for the park picnic, showing what happens when a national park reaches capacity.

Home by 10:30. Began work on maps again, while Bill typed first draft of Dave's testimony and while Dave went right on writing. We went this route with innumerable cups of coffee - and a break for ice cream - until 3 A.M.

Dave crept into sleeping bag - on couch - with alarm set for 5:15.

Up by 7:30. Cloudy, with very light rain at times. Prepared to leave for Mad River Ranger Station before 10. Took mapping materials, camera, lunch, etc. and AT for company. Enjoyed seeing Van Duzen River country again, but was distressed by continuing destruction of the slopes from logging and resultant accelerated erosion. Ate quick lunch around 12:40 alongside river beyond Dismores, where I had stopped for gas and made inquiries. Arrived at Ranger Station at 1 o'clock sharp. Spent next 2 hours with District Ranger John Warnock. We went over maps - road plans, timber sales, clear cuts, etc. and did a bit of phipsopping. Left at 3:15, stopping only for a couple of photographs of lovely old arched bridges across the So. Fork Van Duzen River.

Clear on the coast. Home just before 6. Watched President Nixon on TV - about new troop withdrawal.

Got home to find that Dave's car was gone. He phoned later from Doug's place and I invited them both for dinner - providing they could spare up some meat!

coffee pot going. President Lincoln Assassinated 1865

Bill got away by 10. Dave and I took RT for good run on beach. It was overcast, but nice, and a good low tide - so lots of beach to run on. Had beach all to ourselves. After lunch we went to Eureka for errands, then up to Doug's place to retrieve Dave's car. We walked among splashes of trilliums at the place, then whale watched, and I got home before 6. Bill got home around 7. Dave and Doug came down for dinner again.

1971 105th day - 260 days follow

Dave and I did some errands in town, from about 2 to 5 - mainly to get his income tax extension application done and mailed in time.

Very rainy. Up fairly early. 1971 106th day - 259 days follow

Dave and I dashed mostly to City Hall in Eureka by 10 to hear the Environmental Hearing get underway by the State Environmental Quality Study Council - and all day hearing. Dave gave his coverage of problems on the north coast for $\frac{1}{2}$ hour - just before lunch break. Bill Van Fleet, Gene Kajan, Dave and I had light lunch at small cafe, unrecorded compared to Stantons, which had people waiting, many of them Council members. (Sen. Peter Behr and Barry Keene were only ones I knew about previously). Then Dave and I dashed back home to prepare to leave for Sonoma. Bad headache on his part - and heavy rainfall - caused us to cancel Ex Com. So - we dropped by Bella Vista Inn to listen awhile to the Butte Valley Symposium. Found it well attended by environmentalists, so returned to City Hall for the remainder of the environmental hearings.

Wally Lagorio (Sacramento Bee), phoned and showed up for cocktails. Late, late dinner after more cocktails at Dave's. Wally spent night with us - on living ^{room} couch in sleeping bag.

1971 107th day - 258 days follow

Beautiful bright morning. Awake early (6), up early (7:00). Dave up early, too and had coffee brewing.

At low tide (0.0) around 10 - we went to beach - with dog and cameras, but I had run out of film. Quite windy, but we enjoyed having the beach all to ourselves awhile. Tried to wade across mouth of Little River, but current too strong and water too deep. Dave went home before noon.

Awoke early. Low Sunday - First Sunday after Easter. Watched wild ocean for awhile with Wally after putting on coffee pot around 7:30. Dave arrived, just when I was talking on phone with his mother, but I was upstairs. Wally left around 10:30. Dave, Bill and I then went to airport to meet Fred Fisher and Jay Jacobs. We drove them to Don Graham's place near Petaluma. All had lunch there after talking about coastal things and looking at maps. Don showed us the Calif. Gray whale bones she was busily retrieving from the beach - (43' long, he said).

Wended home by 3, detoured to Centerville Beach, arrived home before 6. Still raining - hard at times.

Dave provided a large chuck steak for dinner and Doug brought it down and joined us.

Carol and Dave Garter and "Bugs" (Don) and Jane MacArthur dropped by just as we were finishing dinner - around 8:30.

We had a good gab session over coffee and they stayed a couple of hours.

MONDAY 19 APRIL

1971 109th day - 256 days follow

Awoke at dawn, but didn't get up until 5:45 alarm. Coffee and toast here. Left in Dave's car for Eureka bus dept at 6:15. Bought tickets, but found out bus to Willits left, not at 6:55, but 7:55 - so --- we parked near the waterfront and sipped our one thermos of coffee. Beautiful trip down, on the "milk-run", hitting all small towns and some of route on Avenue of the Giants. Tried to sleep, but scenery too good to miss. Dogwoods in flower - glorious day. Arrived Willits train station 11:20. Checked camera gear in locker. Got take-out lunch and then hiked just out of town along "Skunk" line tracks. Found grassy knoll loaded with wild flowers. Checked hiking time out so we would surely get back by 1:30 loading time for Budd ^{2:00} car. Ended up having to run at last minute because we had gone farther than we realized!

The trip was fantastic. The Eel River canyon was a whole new experience. The water was well silted, looking like wet cement, but the hills were lush green, red bud was flowering alongside track, river banks and even steep hillsides. Loads of deer, even lion cubs (others in car saw two mountain "kitties"). Train loaded to capacity - jolly passengers, many snapping pictures as Dave and I did - constantly, almost.

Dave puttered around with cameras before going to town after 1. Bill Kortum phoned about coastline "things".

Wally returned sometime in mid-afternoon, had a bit of lunch, photographed beach scenes from our deck and received a phone call around 4.

Dave returned as we were sunning, talking and having cup of tea on deck. Wally was on his way to Petrolia - before dark - for photos.

Dinner at home. Dave here, then gone quickly in case of after 8 PM phone calls answering his ads in SF paper. Did dishes, then popped into bed early to read awhile.

¹⁹⁷¹ 111th day - 254 days follow Lovely day. Up by 7:30.

Bill off for school before 10:30. Dave showed up. I spent morning doing washing. Went to Arcata with Dave to do errands. Feeling rough, so rode in camp while he did his errands after doing his washing. Picked up telegram from S-L. regarding need to get Republican assemblyman to override Gov. Reagan's veto of bill that would allow another SF bay crossing.

1971

112th day - 253 days follow

A gray day. Feet rough, so remained in bed. Bill brought me breakfast. Dave was here at noon to bring me soup and crackers - and later, tea. Did some phoning during afternoon on conservation things. Got on my feet by five o'clock, knowing I had to meet George Reichel at the 6:43 plane, which Bill and I did. Meanwhile, after a few plans were made, Dave was fixing dinner for all of us at his house. Phoned Bill to tell that I wouldn't be attending the local ExCom meeting at his home.

Long Agnes joined us for dinner and none of us got away from Dave's place until after 11. George stayed with us at Moonstone Beach.

1971

113th day - 252 days follow

Up by 7:30. Drove George to Eureka by 8:30. He was taking the NWP Budd car to Willits at 9 and work his way back down the coast, looking at some of the problems. George is a member of the Coastal Commission.

Dave and I made plans to leave after dinner to drive to Davis for the wilderness workshop. He had dinner with Doug then showed up around 9. We got away by 9:20 or 9:30, but only got 5 miles down the freeway when the radiator boiled dry. Dave spotted the temp. rising just in time to pull off at the Vista Point. Fortunately he had extra water aboard. After filling the radiator I spotted a leak. The hose was cracked. We managed to get to the new Shell station on Guimoli Lane before it closed. New hose did the trick. We drove through several rain showers, but by the time we were ready to pull off the road for the night off the way 20 and then 16 (Capay Valley route), it was clear and extremely cold.

At first we were blocked by a blocked door. The ice box had slid out away from its inset, resting against the door knob, thereby locking it. After some clever maneuvering, jerky driving, etc. Dave was able to get the ice box to slip back enough to free the knob. It was nearly 3 a.m. when we finally climbed into our sleeping bags.

Awake around 6:30. Cold, but clear. ¹⁹⁷¹ 114th day - 251 days follow
Fixed simple breakfast - toast, coffee, juice, bacon + eggs.
Many wild flowers out near ^a Bear Creek Bridge pullout spot, which we had slipped into.

I drove $\frac{1}{2}$ to $\frac{3}{4}$ hrs. to start while Dave rode inside the "turtle shell" to bone up on his wilderness act remarks, which would set the stage for the workshop activities. Then Dave drove the few remaining miles to Davis campus. Quite windy, but nice. Discussion groups formed after lunch on the lawn - and we remained outdoors until nearly 4:30 - it got cool enough to want to finish up inside Wellman Hall.

A gang of us had Mexican dinner together - Boyd Norton, Doug Scott, Bruce Kennedy, Luis Ireland, Steve Jett and others. Went to Steve's home for a short time before returning to campus for evening session.

When it was all over I talked Dave into having an ice cream sundae before we found a place out of town to spend the night. We drove and drove and drove without luck on many country roads, then came back onto highway 16 near Capay and tried that until a wide spot was located. Clear and starry; not so cold as last night. Exhausted from a short night and long day, we folded quickly, once stopped.

1971

115th day - 250 days follow

Second Sunday after Easter

Up around 6:30. A beautiful, clear morning. Very little traffic as we prepared breakfast outside near the camper. Houses close by, but not in sight. Everything lush in heavy spring growth. Headed back for Davis, arriving in time to hear Gordon Robinson's pitch on good forestry and comments by Boyd Norton. The session ended around 1:30 or so after a long discussion period on organizing. We grabbed hamburgers and headed out toward Orland, after considering the possibility of going over Mendocino Pass. The countryside was beautiful. Questioned several people along way, until we finally got positive word that the pass was unpassable now with 8-10 ft. of snow. Had to backtrack to Interstate 5. Getting late. I drove awhile - from somewhere near Pasadena to Redding.

We picked up hamburgers and hot dogs in Weaverville, stopped at Oregon Mt. summit to eat and make fresh coffee in the camper. Dave drove home. I fell asleep along the way. Arrived at Moonstone at 11:45. Talked with Bill for nearly an hour, then we all folded up - Dave on the couch.

APRIL

26

MONDAY

Kind of a gray day. Up by 1971 116th day - 249 days follow
 Dr. Dave slept until nearly 10. Did some
 washing. Received lots of phone calls.

Wally Lagoris showed up around 4,
as did Bill. We fooled around outside,
after the sun appeared, hitting gay balls.
I finished with a 100.

Fixed fried chicken & salad. We ate dinner on our laps in the living room. Wally had to lead south around 9.

Have remained longer. Bill showed slides of the Eel River train trip.

climbed into tub late - had the
crazy "pussy-cat" in bath with me.

But finally had to drag her out and
dry her off. In bed by midnight.

117th day – 248 days follow

1971 117th day - 248 days follow Feet lousy. Stayed in bed ALL DAY! Dave showed up around 11 or so and did the dishes when he found me down, he fixed lunch for me. He disappeared to do errands, returning later, just before Bill came home - which was very early.

Bill fixed me a bacon, egg, toast dinner
I read awhile and then napped.

Dave and Doug came by some time in mid evening, but did not remain long.

Hal Wickman phoned about next 2 weekends up here with his classes. I would try to order seat for him.

1971 118th day - 247 days follow

A gray, overcast morning.

Sun decided to pop through briefly in late afternoon. Up by 8:30 - and dressed! Dave appeared before 9 - then left, then was back again to use the typewriter around 1.

I went to Coast House in Eureka, the Environmental Center in Arcata and the crab stand in Ukiahville sometime between 1:30 and 3:30. Dave was gone when I returned, but appeared again for dinner - not deliberately, but we were eating early so Bill could get to a meeting - and we had enough to share.

Doug and Dave took MT for run on beach while I stayed in to take phone calls.

Bill was back by 9:30. At 10:15 we went up to Dave's for a night cap.

Made a lot of phone calls relating to Calif. Coastal Alliance.

Norm Allen phoned that he would be going on P.G. & E. tour of Diablo Canyon instead of Bill Devall.

1971 119th day - 246 days follow

Up around 7:30. Nice day - sun shining and some occasional high cloudiness. Around 9:30 - Dave and I headed for the Div. of Highways, where we talked about surveys being used and then about road standards and some procedures adapted relating to freeways in general.

(Home again for lunch, then a brief (20 min.) back to the beach at low tide. Dave worked on possible routes for proposed freeway around lagoons to the north and coming into Orick. I wrote letters and read.

Bill was home around 4.

Doug and Dave here for dinner. Phone calls from Peggy Wayburn, then Wally Lagoirs, then Ed Wayburn.

Earlier (before Bill arrived) Joe Morgenstern, writer for Newsweek, phoned about coming up from SF area to do story on new Redwood National Park movement toward additions.

APRIL

30

FRIDAY

1971

120th day - 245 days follow

Up at 7. Roused Dave, which took some effort, and we got away around 7:30 - in his car - headed for BLM meeting in Ukiah. Stopped in Eureka for breakfast. Lovely day. Nice drive. Picked up hamburgers in Willits, then pulled off highway to make pot of coffee for lunch. ORVAC - off road vehicle council advisory members met at 1 P.M. Dave represented Greiner Club and "outdoor recreation" interests. Others present spoke for 4 wheel drive clubs, rockhounds, motorcycle members, fish and game, timber land interests, Hopland range experiment station, etc. etc. We finally got away around 6:30 after a private meeting with District Manager John Long and Jim Munnaman.

Picked up hamburgers again in Willits and drove off highway to make a pot of coffee.

Got home before midnight. In bed before 1. Dave spent night here.

1971

121st day - 244 days follow

Up at 7. Phoned Samala Shun to see if Joe Morgenstern had arrived. Arranged 9:15 breakfast with him, there, and with Dave we met them (Joe's wife along) as scheduled. Later they came out to our house to talk and plan their interviewing, "look-see" visit. We planned a raft trip for Sunday down Redwood Creek. During the afternoon Joe and Lois went off on their own - Bald Hills Road, Crescent City park headquarters, and returned here for dinner - around 9. Dave and Doug also here.

During the afternoon the rafts were checked, groceries purchased, supplies gathered and rafts tied to pack frames and all that. Dave spent night here.

MAY

2

SUNDAY

Up at 7. Ready to go by 8 - 1971 122nd day - 243 days follow
 Had to wait for Doug and the Morgensterns a short while. Cars were packed and we headed for "airplane" prairie on Bald Hills Rd. Fog on coast, clear inland. Prairie was beautiful, but disturbed by cat tracks. Just inside forest the trees were cut - chainsaws left leaning against next victim of Area's desire to mutilate prairie additions.

Slid on steep slopes, the heavy pack pushing me, an oar used for a brake. Reached the put in spot on Redwood Creek around 1, having struggled over debris and rocky, steep, loose slopes. Calypso's were profuse. Heard grouse drumming, saw several birds, chipmunks, deer sign - and trilliums, too. Warm as we ate lunch - lots of blue sky. Dogwoods flowering all around. Stream looking like wet cement - flowing fairly fast. Had not been on stream very long when Doug and I got into trouble, ran into debris, almost lost raft, did lose some objects which floated away. Dave helped us dump out water once we got the raft free and onto bank. Patch job necessary. Rest of trip beautiful - even in some light rainfall. Reached parking area at dark - now cold because of wet clothes.

Had late (10:30) chicken dinner at home. Raining harder as evening wore on. Once more dry, warm, and fed, everyone felt better. The Morgensterns finally got away around midnight. Dave stayed here for night.

Wally Lagaris showed up around 6 - and stayed for dinner. An appointment took him to Arcata around 8:30. Dave was in awhile before dinner, then again later - with Doug - feeling no pain!

MAY **4** TUESDAY

Up by 8:15. Legs (thighs mostly) 1971 124th day - 241 days follow
still sore, but I managed to move around and
do some housecleaning. Dave came in before
lunch - on way to College of the Redwoods to talk
to David Anderson about hike into Trinity areas.

Phoned Jim Chaffee, at State Parks & Recreation,
for information on freeway routing through Dry
Lagoon State Park. (Dave made several calls
while here).

Bill home by 5:30. Many phone calls
before and after dinner, including Bill
Devall and Dan Ruggles - and Dave -
who came in for messages at 10:30.

WEDNESDAY **5** MAY

1971 125th day - 240 days follow Up around 8:45. Still feeling
effects of downhill hike. Did some washing - and
some garden work - and some letter writing.

Bill Devall phoned with prepared statement for
release to news media about junior councilman
Ray Mast's resignation from Lions Club. Bill
had caustic comments from the North Group.
Mrs. Coleman phoned. So did Jean Hagood.
So did Times - Standard.

Dave stopped by on way to do program
at Arcata High School - on redwoods.

He came by again - for cocktails - on
way home, arriving same time as Bill.

Quiet evening. Bill napped. "Putty-cat"
brought in live gopher and pursued it all
around bedroom and under my desk. Finally
"herded" it into box and put it outside,
but only after much running around from
room to room - cat in hot pursuit.

Up at 7:30. Lovely day but very, 1971 126th day - 239 days follow
very windy. Small craft warnings were issued for
all North coast.

Did some ironing. Dave was in to make phone
calls and arrange photo flight over Redwood Creek.
Ate early lunch. Went to Eureka-Casco by 12. Ray
Pearl joined us after just coming in from a county
business photo flight - Vern Roth taking movies
for a documentary for pilot project on waste
disposal, regarding county dump sites in
particular.

Bumpy ride. Good pilot. In air about
one hour. Loggers busy in McArthur Creek.
Sight of trees logging below Bald Hill Road
was sickening. Our park being slowly
squeezed down in front of our eyes.

Did a couple of errands in Eureka, had
coffee and returned home by 3.

Very warm rest of afternoon. Read mail
and magazines and answered many, many
varied phone calls - including Sergei and Phil.

Dave and Doug came in around 10 to
look at most recently returned color slides
of Eel River, Van Duzen, Moonstone, Yellow Bay
and Bob Marshall wilderness - all the shots
in camera since last August!

In bed by 11:15.

1971 127th day - 238 days follow

"Pussy-cat" walked across my

reactions. Interestingly, however, Vic's big
dog showed a completely negative response
to the howls and barking.

Went up to Dave's around 9:30 so he and
Doug could hear it, too. In bed by 11:15.

Up by 8. A grey day - 1971 128th day - 237 days follow
all day, but little wind - actually
very nice. Did some ironing and
prepared a few things for a big
macaroni salad for the potluck dinner.

Dave showed up before noon with
photos he was preparing to ship off to
Ed Wayburn and another set to Washington
office as a safety measure.

Bill not feeling too hot today - very
quiet and not too active.

Left for Arcata around 6.

Good turn out at meeting in spite of
Lumberjack days at HSC and the Ferndale
Art Festival. Roger Smith showed
slides of his Micronesia trip in early spring
as assistant leader on SC trips.

Ted Roberts, from Berkeley and Eric
Caruthers, Santa Clara Co. planner, were
guests at the meeting.

Neither Bill nor Dave showed up.
Home again shortly after 11.

1971 129th day - 236 days follow Awake early, but didn't get
Fourth Sunday after Easter up until 9:30. Beautiful day.

Mother's Day Started some washing. Did some pruning,
weeding and grasscutting in the garden. Able to go with-
out a shirt - it was so delightfully warm.

Planted by Japanese umbrella pine - finally,
after 1½ years on sun deck!

Stayed outdoors as much as possible, taking
all the sun possible while it lasted.

Ate a cold chicken, macaroni salad
dinner early so I could get to Bill Dorell's
place for Ex Com meeting at 7:30.

Dave's mother phoned earlier. She was
concerned because no word in 3 weeks.

Six Ex Com members at meeting. Covered
strategy for getting to all the meetings and
hearings scheduled locally this week & next.
Home by 10:45. Clear, bright moonlight.

Bill reported that Dave dropped by.

Bill up very early - leaving to do 1971 130th day - 235 days follow
 guest lecturer hit for Gen. Botany class at 8.

Went to Forest Service office to keep appointment with Ted Robertson. While there, also talked with Charlie Brown, Dave Stang and Austin Thompson.

Grabbed a hamburger at Deb's dine-in in Eureka and ate it at the Environmental Center, where a meeting was in session. Meeting lasted until after 3 P.M.

Knock on door around 4:30 turned out to be previous visitor, who had left note under door - Rhodes Johnston - up here for Coastal Alliance. Invited him to remain for dinner and the night.

Susie Van Kirk came out around 8 to go over mailing list. Dave was here awhile, too, working on statement.

Typed up first draft of statement around 1:30 A.M.

1971 131st day - 234 days follow

Up early to make many phone calls before 8. Dave came down before 9. With Rhodes along he headed for the Supervisor's meeting - to be on hand with a statement in regard to public access to coastal areas. It was 10:30 before the Agenda got zipped in on coastal access and county policy thereon. The subject got hashed over for about $\frac{1}{2}$ hour. Gene Kojan joined us for lunch at Stanton's. Dave drafted a brief statement for the afternoon session of the public hearing by the North Coast ^{Regional} Water Quality Control Board. Held in City Council Chambers, it was packed. I presented our statement around 2:30. Shortly before the hearing was adjourned.

Rhodes, with pack on back, left us at the car, leading to Bill Van Fleet's office.

Dave in terrible mood. We had big blow up (starting over harsh treatment of MT) and I told him to get out until he straightened up. Many tears on my part. Beautiful day. Up by 8:30. Dave showed up sometime during mid-morning to get messages and use phone. We went to Encke together after lunch - he to apply for unemployment insurance, and I would take care of his monstrous phone bill.

He was in foul mood on way home. I left him at his place - little said - because now he had me terribly upset.

Bill Sevall came by before noon to get "The Redwoods" film to take to Rudi Becking for use during the ZPG program (seminar, sort of) at 8 P.M. Steve Clark would not be on program (due to all our ^{personal} problems) along with S-R-L and John Davis, Supt., Redwood National Park - and others.

In bed before 11 - to read awhile.

MAY

14

FRIDAY

Beautiful day. Didn't get 1971 134th day - 231 days follow up, because alarm didn't go off, because power was off. Cooked breakfast on camp stove. Power remained off for 2 hours.

Meanwhile, I pruned a huge, broken, loaded-with-flowers, broom (tree) at top of our driveway. Glorious outdoors, so stayed out-cutting grass, pulling weeds, etc. until Dave phoned up and I was reminded of time to get prepared to go to Ukiah.

Dave in calmer mood, thank goodness. He still would not go to Ukiah meetings with me - would work on his income tax instead.

Left at 1:30. The drive was absolutely beautiful! Ceanothus was profuse. Everything lush and green. Ed River (So. Fk.) like a string of jade pools put together. Lots of buzzards playing games on the light winds throughout the redwood region.

Wildflowers just north of Willits were as spectacular and splashy as we saw them last year.

Met Alan Buggles, Jr. and a friend at Lenny's, just off freeway in Ukiah. Ate while discussing wilderness strategy. Went to Ex Com meeting at 7:30 at a lovely Presbyterian church. Charlotte Stephens conducted meeting, which lasted until midnight. Clear but windy, in Ukiah.

Arrived Moonstone 3 hrs. 20-min later. (3:20) Fall into bed!

SATURDAY

15

MAY

1971

135th day - 230 days follow

Armed Forces Day

Woke up at 8:30 to sound of rain! And it rained heavily all morning! Stayed in bed until 10, until a phone call from Cathy Lueich got me up to check again on the weather here.

Did some ironing after lunch. Ray Peart dropped in awhile.

Dave arrived around cocktail time and stayed for dinner. Doug showed up around 8:30, having returned from a jaunt (overnight) at Canyon Creek. He returned my snow shoes - unused!

In bed by 11.

Cathy Lueich phoned at 10:00 a.m. to inquire about weather at home - for quilt scouts

Up by 9:30. Raining again! 1971 136th day - 229 days follow

Did some ^{more} ironing and finally finished up all the things that had been piling up for the past 2 weeks.

Made some phone calls, then went to Dave's with a message that useful information on Mammoth highway proposal would have to be delayed awhile longer. Trying to reach persons in Audubon Society with specifics - to comment to Div. of Highways environmental impact statement.

Dave had been in here for coffee early in the day - we got into hassles over finances on both occasions. Doug moving in to Dave's now.

Worked outside awhile - after rains stopped. Beautiful - a bit breezy at times, but I couldn't resist pulling a few weeds and turning over a little earth.

Bill Devall came in as I was preparing dinner. He joined us. Dave showed up around 10:15 - just as Bill was ready to leave.

"Pussy cat" brought big gopher in this evening, then slept and slept and slept!

1971 137th day - 228 days follow

Lovely day.

Worked on some conservation reports after working outside. Dave here part of afternoon.

Bill Devall dropped in briefly on way home for dinner.

Dave rounded up Gene Kojan to attend County Parks and Recreation meeting at 7:30 - then stayed here awhile. I felt low - had headache - went to bed before 11.

Beautiful day. Up and about ¹⁹⁷¹ 138th day - 227 days follow fairly early. Left for Arcata, Eureka & Eureka by 10. Took care of Dave's long overdue bills at a few places, dropped into USFS offices; had lunch - quite late - 3:30 - in Arcata, then went to Dr. Haagen-Smit's lecture on campus at 4 o'clock. Bill got in on the very last 10 minutes of what was a fascinating lecture by a cool, talented, amusing man.

Tried Dave's phone at dinner time. It worked, but he was most unhappy to learn what I had done for him.

Went to City Council meeting - 7:45 - 9:45.

Lots of phone calls - in and out, whenever I was home.

In bed by 11 - exhausted! but I managed some eggs, toast and coffee. first - for a later, late, dinner.

High fog - some light drizzle - warm, windy - ¹⁹⁷¹ 139th day - 226 days follow

Phone & call from writer Nancy Wood at 8 A.M. - "where is Dave?" Bill brought me coffee while I held a "love-in" with "putty-cat" - after which we both bawled out. I was on my way to Eureka for the Air Resources Board all day meeting - and leaving - at 9:10. Didn't return home until nearly 6:10!!!

The meeting was most interesting. Persons from auto industry, petroleum companies, etc. on deck. Place (City Hall, Eureka) was jammed with strange brief-case-types. Dr. Haagen-Smit chaired the meeting and kept it lively and interesting and amusing (when needed) with his well timed questions and comments.

Local people were last to be heard - from 5 - 5:30 - and then only about time for $\frac{1}{2}$ doz., including self with statement for Redwood Chapter - Sierra Club - as prepared by Anne Weiss.

Had lunch with Pri. 76 at Stanton's from 1:45 - 2:30.

A long day.

Bill headed out at 7 for a Lions Club dinner somewhere in McKinleyville, but, failing to locate place, returned home for a bacon and eggs dinner at 8.

Did some washing, then went to Eureka after lunch. Picked up "Redwoods" film from Franklin School first. On to Court House to get into Arneson's office for maps of Moonstone Beach and Little River State Park and other ownership. Had talk with county clerk Fred Moore over coffee - about yesterday's LAFCO hearing regarding Humboldt Bay District encompassing watershed only and being dumped - for good?

Remembered wedding anniversary so left note on Bill's office door. He phoned later and we decided to go out for dinner.

Bill Sewall stopped by to pick up film to take to Davis to show to Nancy Wood later in evening.

Talked with her on phone - she needed pair of tennis shoes for float trip down Redwood Creek tomorrow. On way to Logias for dinner I bought a pair of sneakers at Value Giant.

Logias quite crowded. Got a table after 8 PM. Enjoyed dinner.

Went to bed soon after getting home.

1971

141st day - 224 days follow

Got up about 8:45. Lovely morning - windy again, however. Very windy. Took film back to Franklin School again around 11 o'clock - Cruised the Eureka waterfront - for changes - and activity - and got home again around 12.

Worked in garden all afternoon. One break or two for phone calls to Linn Club office about Monday's Wild & Scenic River bid coming up at a Natural Resources hearing.

Fog rolled in around 5. Bill spent most of day at school.

4 quail (2 pairs) wandered around the garden this morning - until "putty-cat" discovered them and got too close.

Up at 7:30. Quick breakfast. ¹⁹⁷¹ 42nd day - 223 days follow

Made a quick lunch and left at 8:30 for Burlington Headquarters of Humboldt Redwoods State Park. Foggy in Humboldt Bay area, clearing farther south. Arrived 10 A.M. Tony Look (with Mildred and sister from San Diego) and Howard King already on hand to talk over the But Creek watershed - tree planting project with park Superintendent Weibel Davis.

After discussion in office we had sack lunch in sunshine near Davis' residence. Then, Wendell, Tony, Howard and I drove into the tree planting areas of Pole Line Road and Preacher's Gulch Road to see what had been accomplished and what yet was needed. *Ceanothus* in full bloom - beautiful blues and whites all over the logged, burned over, destroyed slopes of the upper watershed area.

Saw a snoozing young rattlesnake neatly tucked in next to a burned out stump - high on the slope. Also spotted a quite out of place *Cone columbine*, red and yellow. Windy, but warm - all day.

Back home by 6. Howard King here for cocktails, dinner - and the night.

¹⁹⁷¹ 143rd day - 222 days follow

A foggy, grey day - up until 5 PM when skies finally cleared and sun broke through. Surfing out at Moonstone all day long in spite of coastal fog. Howard went out. Orick around 10:30.

Cleaned up neglected kitchen and took care of neglected conservation correspondence during afternoon.

All quiet otherwise. No word from Dave - or anyone, although I enjoyed a long phone conversation with Julie San Kirk regarding conservation issues.

Worked late on Sierra Club special letter. Dave
did the writing; I started the typing. Bill went to
bed early - we worked until we couldn't see
straight anymore - probably 1:30 - 2:00.

1971 148th day - 217 days follow

Burns engraving could do printing on Tuesday - last.
Went up to Davis to type the letter on his carbon ribbon.

Decided to go on Trinity Alps ^{area} hike with Dave so got pack in order by 3 P.M. A few complications, like meeting Eugene Blacketer at 5 kept us from actually leaving town until about 5:20. Muriel Temple remained with Bill - who would take her on weekend plant collecting short trips.

We turned off Hwy. 299 beyond Burnt Ranch and headed for Danny. Caught glimpses of lovely New River before leaving it and climbing toward the road head for the Jim Jam Ridge trail.

The Datum suffered severe cases of vapor lock at times, causing many delays and time problems as we tried to clear the narrow road of rocks, limbs, etc. for the other cars expected to join the hike in the morning. It was well after dark when we finally stopped - not far from road head - and decided it was as far as we could go.

Foggy drizzle settled in as we cooked small steaks for dinner - around 10 P.M. Gled to have camper for good, dry sleeping.

1971 149th day - 216 days follow

Woke by 7. Up around 8. Got a good, small fire going in our foggy woods and enjoyed a big breakfast. Bill DeWall and a friend, Rich, from S.F. were on the scene at 9. They had coffee and then others (2 cars) showed up - and went on to the roadhead. The Datum couldn't make the last steep hill so we left it and back backed from close by our night-stopping spot.

Beautiful trail, straight up, it seemed - few switchbacks. We got started late - about 11 - but ran into Rich on Jim Jam ridge. We had lunch at trellis, *Erythronium* stream Jim Jam spring. Bill DeWall showed up as we milled nuts and raisins before attempting the last 2 miles. Dave planned for us two to camp on the ridge near Jake's Upper camp. Bill and Rich declined to join us - trail too steep!?! 2 miles farther on - through manzanita and other flowering shrubs we pitched our tent on the edge of a huge snow bank clinging to the edge of the ridge. Our view was superb. Shasta was sighted once and photographed before clouds and fog covered the area. Cocktails at 5.

Dinner was simple - beef stroganoff & tea. Tied into our fairly well secured tent around 8:30 - pretty well exhausted.

up by 8. Very foggy, very cool. 1971 150th day - 215 days follow
 Got a fire going without too much trouble and ate a simple breakfast while watching the changing scenery - fog and clouds playing hide and seek with all the near ridges, far ridges, peaks and mountain ranges.

Around 9:30 we headed out over the snow covered forested ridge and worked our way all the way to the top of Pony Peak. Our camp at 6500; Pk. at 7500. Portions of trail under heavy snow still. We rock scrambled and then had to dig toe holds with sharp rocks to gain the top. Needed an ice axe, but we managed our way. One slip those last 50 feet would have been mighty bad!

The sun poked through fast moving storm clouds while we rested and ate our light lunch stuff and checked the maps - and photographed the high Trenches, nearby Thurston Peaks, etc.

Getting down the icy mountain was slow and tricky, but only the first 100 ft. of descent worried us. After that we cruised right along the trail - snow softer than before noon in many places. Going through the deep snowy woods to get water at Jake's Hunting Camp was beautiful - down hill all the way.

By dinner time it was snowing crazily, after we had watched other others getting socked in all around. No let up in sight after dinner, so we left our fire and crept into the dryness of the tent - so early! - only 7 P.M. Wind blew gustily - great fun to hear.

1971 151st day - 214 days follow

Memorial Day

(In District of Columbia and some States)

Awake to a gray world with fog in the valleys below us and a light snow covering on all the trees and manzanita bushes around us - and the ground plants had trapped some, too. Ice in our two pans and water bag. Very cold all the time we fixed breakfast and began breaking camp. At 9:30 we hit the trail and I was the pace setter except for the very last mile. We collected some flower specimens. Our only stops were at the trail junction to Jake's lower camp (I dug up an erythronium there) and at Jim Jan Spring - for sip of lemonade^{or} and good spring water. Downhill most of the way - under dull gray sky. Arrived roadhead 7-miles, 3 hrs. later. Had lunch at Dave's pickup, parked in oak woods. No one around. We had not seen a dove for 2 days! Left around 2:30 or so.

Milk shake and gas stop in Willow Creek. Cloudy, some rain, scattered, heavy traffic all the way home. Very sleepy, beautifully tired and very sunburned, glowing face.

Bill Devall at home, going over coastal slides with Bill U. He stayed for light dinner. Had harsh words with Dave. Evening ended badly, but I had a good, hot bath before bedtime.

Awake before 7. Up before 7:30. 1971 152nd day - 213 days follow

A grey morning, but blue skies emerged in afternoon. Clouds everywhere. Drove to Eureka to Burns Engraving to leave material for printing by 8:30. Stopped briefly in Arcata for Sierra Club mail.

Dave showed up in mid morning and planned to go to Eureka with me later when I picked up the print job.

Started some washing before lunch. Finished it before dinner - in spurts.

In Eureka only a short line, but it still took nearly 2 hours to do a few errands and get back.

Several phone calls regarding Eureka City Council meeting tonight and whether SC should have observer there for Indian Island items on agenda.

1971 153rd day - 212 days follow

Took package to United Parcel Service in Eureka. Picked up order (chair lounge cushion) at Montgomery Wards and stopped briefly at the Environmental Centre in Arcata.

Dave was here part of evening. I fell asleep on couch before he left. Had severe pain in back and had to sleep with heating pad. He worked on a letter for the North Group in behalf of Mike McCloskey's endangered position with the Sierra Club.

Stayed in bed until quite late around 11 or so. 1971 154th day - 211 days follow

Had bath and shampoo after cleaning up kitchen.

Dave showed up. In his car we went to the college to get copies of letters made and then left some in faculty (Hennings, Weiss, Devall) mailboxes.

Saw Bill very briefly in a late afternoon lab. He had retrieved the original of the letter left in the Xerox machine in the library!

Phoned Jean, would see her tomorrow!

Dave ended up spending night here.

Everyone up by 7 o'clock.

Dave went home to get cleaned up before leaving for bedding. He prepared some writing material to take to Marys before we left town, writing as I drove to her home. Very much overcast. Drove to Willow Creek; Dave took over from there. Stopped briefly in Big Bear for quick bite to eat, around 11:30. Had to drive fast to reach bedding by 1. Dave had appt. with KCRA news team from Sacramento. They met him at the USFS office. Warm in bedding.

Headed for Red Bluff at 1:30. (MT with me.) Spent 2 fast hours with Jean, Lutz, Gerry B. and "K.C." even showed up briefly. Warm in Red Bluff, too, but not unpleasant. Returned for Dave at FS offices around 4:45. Talked with George Liddicotte while Dave finished some map marking.

Had slight headache. Talked little on way home as Dave drove. Stopped for hot dog and milkshake in Weaverville, then a cup of coffee in Willow Creek. Back into the fog as we came down the mountain - Home by 8:30.

Dave here all night.

Very grey day. Stayed in bed 1971 156th day - 209 days follow until 9:30.

Bob & Margie Kirby were here about one hour.

Dave and Bill went to Mkt. for groceries. I made a large bowl of macaroni salad for the 5C potluck.

Dave finally went home - sometime.

Bill and I left at 5:20 for Arcata, so I could attend Ex Com meeting at 5:30.

The meeting lasted until 7 - then we joined others in next room for the potluck dinner. Not too many people on hand for dinner, but the place was well filled for the "Coastline" program which Bill Denvel presented - with good collection of color slides.

Went to Dave's place after the meeting broke up. Doug was back from his hike on Jim Jaw Ridge. Ray Peart was there. Bill Denvel joined us later.

It turned out to be a very long evening.

1971 157th day - 208 days follow

Trinity Sunday

Awake at 9:30. On couch at 3:30. Bill went home, rather than staying.

Some fog - and some blue sky - back & forth. Coffee by 11, then all of us descended on Bill who had planned some dough hotcakes for breakfast.

Nice view of wind-swept ocean from the living room so we leisurely ate in there. Dave helped Bill cook and serve bacon, eggs, coffee, hotcakes, etc.

For a short time we sat and sunned on the deck - particularly Ray, who was in no big rush to move very hurriedly, yet!

Then everyone left - and I did the dishes.

Bill left at 6:45 to go to a party for Vic Arlin. I relaxed and read, not feeling much like any more partying.

Fell asleep with lights on. Bill did not get to bed until 20 to 6 - A.M.! And I was ready to get up almost - with lots of daylight and birds singing and traffic moving on the freeway.

1971 158th day - 207 days follow

Stayed in bed until 7:30.

Tried to be quiet, so started some washing. Fog moving in and out - promising nice day.

Dave showed up around 10, then again around noon and then phoned from town at 2 to ask about mail, then came in on way home. I was clipping ivy and removing dirt and old, rotten, retaining wall. Dave moved a few wheelbarrow loads of debris for me.

Bird phoned at 5 that I wouldn't talk to him. Went on working in the garden with thine out for a little. quick dinner snack, like an egg and an orange and cookies and milk.

Had a most welcome hot bath that helped relieve some very tired arms and hands - and hips - and legs.

Slept in sleeping bag - on living room couch.

Beautiful, full moon tonight. Saw it a little while from kitchen windows.

1971 159th day - 206 days follow

Up around 8. Foggy and sunny both - all day. Took to the garden immediately after breakfast. Clipped ivy and anything else going out of control. Dave came in a couple of times, but I had little to say to anyone.

Worked with shirt off all day and by 6 PM I had a good, red, warm back.

Ate a soup + ice cream dinner - alone. Dave and Doug dropped by briefly on way to Environmental Center meeting. Ken Lytle phoned about Ex Com meeting Friday in Santa Rosa.

Sacked out early after deep, hot bath.

up by 7. Light drizzle, but 1971 160th day - 205 days follow
started working in garden by 8. Pruned,
raked, shovelled, clipped, pulled, hauled,
etc. all day long, finally stopping when
rain began at 6:30. Had even cleaned
out rain gutters while up on roof talking
down ivy, clipping tree branches, etc.

Put Dave to work with long pruning
shears on Doug. fir branches touching
south wall and windows of house. He
earned his toasted cheese sandwich and
cookies & milk.

He was in and out a couple of
times during late afternoon. Leaving some
small weeds for me.

Solitary dinner again tonight. Then, jamp-
let bath and shampoo!

Light rain most of evening.

Bill Devall came by around 10 - with
some SC material - and to see if we
had some grass clippers.

1971 161st day - 204 days follow

Met

Got to meeting just before 8. It lasted until 12:45. With Bill Devall I snacked at Dennis's before heading back home. Phila and Cynthia Ray & Maurine Woods sat with us.

Stopped for gas in Healdsburg. Moon over my shoulder part way. Got nearly to Cummings before overtaken by need of sleep. Pulled into rest stop at 4 - slept until 5:20. Daylight then. Stopped to nap again just short of the old Jewel Box place. Light breakfast in Myers Flat - home by 8:40. A.M. Back into fog - or low clouds.

1971 163rd day - 202 days follow

Stayed in sleeping bag on couch until 10:30 or so - then just had to get up and go to work. Started tearing the living room apart. Sanded a corner of the floor and tried to arrange to have couch cushions fixed. Phone calls revealed Sat. afternoon had time.

up by 9. Foggy. Bill left ¹⁹⁷¹ 164th day - 201 days follow
by 9:30 for ^{Corvus Christi} Prairie Creek State Park. I
managed to get a small potato salad made for
the Lions Club picnic but didn't feel like going
until 1 o'clock after doing SOME housework
and having a good bath.

Picked up Jean Hagood and got to the park
around 2:30. Dedication of the "Revelation
Trail" (for the blind) was at 3 o'clock at
the campfire circle. We sat with
Tom Grieg and Newton Drury. It was a nice
and rather brief ceremony and the sun broke
through as it closed. We walked the short
trail, then returned to Hagoods. Bill was there,
talking with Lowell. He had done his stint at
the picnic and did not stay for the formal dedication.

Invited Doug and Dave down for dinner,
which was partly barbecued chicken from the
big Lions picnic and partly from Jean Hagood.
Luis Deland phoned while Bill, Doug and
Dave were on beach after dinner, then talked
with Dave for $1\frac{1}{2}$ hrs. after we finished our
conversation.

up before 8. Beautiful and

Worked around house almost all day after
typing up conservation items for Redwood Chips.

At 2 I took a mattress into a shop in
Eureka to see if it was worth while renovating. The
answer was no. The mattress will be used again
until it wears out. Stopped in Arcata first
to go to bank, cleaners, Env. Center and Post
Office. Dave WAS going in with me, but changed
his mind after I got to his home to pick him up.

Meanwhile a couple came by and decided to
rent the house - come the 25th!

Phoned Dave around 5 to see if he
would have dinner with us. Bill went up the
road for him (no gas in his car) and came back
for cocktail time.

The Kirbys (Bob + Margie) dropped in on way
back to Klamath. Bob had breezed in earlier
in the day on way to Phil's and Jeannie's in H.C.K.

Bill took Dave home around 10.

from? Fog in area, but ~~quite~~ calm at field.

Took Ed to Eureka Inn first to make contact
with Jerry Verkle, Sen. Jackson's legis. counsel. Tried

doorway and we went to Broadway Sea Food Gratto instead.

At Redwood Park office we learned the "four" had left early - up on Bald Hills Road briefly. We could wait for them and/or meet them at Miller-Kellin lodge at 12. We drove on north. Still raining, but we didn't miss the glorious show of flowering rhododendrons all along the way. Jackson's party arrived about 15 minutes after we did. Sack lunches were brought in. Miller-Kellin supplied coffee, cake, and Pastos. Park personnel were on hand to greet people.

Senator Jackson answered questions after making a very brief presentation - after lunch. It sparked some controversy between Park Service and Sierra Club. A set of photos of B-P and Arata Redwood's clear cutting near buffer zone of park were used as evidence. About 30 people were on hand - Timber, locals, news men, conservationists. No flight possible due to continuing rain - The Senator had to get away for Portland by 7:30.

Fair - some fog.

Father's Day

Bill Futrell phoned after arriving at Hagood in
Orick, having driven up from SF with wife and 2
small children in rent car. A trek on Redwood
Creek was planned for Tuesday.

Some indecisive fog along coast. ¹⁹⁷¹ 172nd day - 193 days follow
Decided to fly over Redwood Creek around 1:30.
Missed Bill Devall, but snagged, by chance, Dwayne Blacketer, in Arcata, when we hesitated at post office. Excellent flight - stayed up $1\frac{1}{2}$ hrs. and just sneaked back into airport in time as fog closed in.

Logging going on at rapid pace on both east and west slopes above park boundary. ARCO really hauling "big sticks" out fast; G.P. messing up the Elam - MacArthur ridge for good; Simpson moving into upper reaches - beyond present park southern boundary. The watershed is being destroyed right before our eyes. On one of Arco's roads I could count 5 log trucks moving out of one newly cut area and the stream seemed to be continuous all the time we were over the area.

Bill V. spent sometime cleaning out his office at school.

Talked with Dave, then Bill Futrell - or vice versa. Arrangements included 8:30 coffee talk in Orick. Bill Devall would join us.

1971 173rd day - 192 days follow

Awake fairly early, but did not feel like going hiking. Had big pain in area of left hip. Took lunch things up to Dave's. Foggy. He and Bill didn't leave Trinidad area until 9.

Bill V. went into school again. I spent almost entire day pruning pinet hedge, using long handled pruners. Terrific job - hard on hands and arm muscles. Hauled stuff away before dark and just as a light drizzle began.

Dave came by to report on day's events.

Fell asleep on couch - exhausted.

Fair. Worked around house. 1971 174th day - 191 days follow

Made some phone calls on conservation issues.

Painted shelves in living room - part of them.

1971 175th day - 190 days follow

Fair. Picked up Dave at 9 to go to Orick for meeting with Jack Davis and other park personnel at Park Headquarters. Davis, ~~Harold~~ Lash, and Ted Hatziminolis arrived late from Crescent City. Larry Rose and another ranger sat in on our meeting when they could get away from front desk. Dave and I went 'round & 'round over the so called "buffer zone" cutting, carefully looked over aerial photos - theirs, and ours - and tossed park policy and forestry practices about until after 12 o'clock.

At 5:15, with Dave aboard, we met the Funtrells for early dinner at Colonial Inn. Their two very young children were somewhat of a trial for everyone, but dinner was excellent. Then we all went to Eel Head area of Trinidad State Park for some shorebird watching. Stiff, cold wind blowing. Bill Devall & Pete Simpson joined us awhile. It couldn't be a late evening because of the small children, but we all stopped at Davis' for a coffee and/or brandy.

Fair. Made arrangements to ¹⁹⁷¹ store Falcon in Arcata with Arnold Nielsen. Dave took me in to get car from Service Station then take it to 11th & K bldg. Had a big blow-up with Dave on way back home - over something simple, I recall, but I was full of pills and hurting terribly and didn't want any arguments with anyone.

Spent most of day that was left vacuuming the dining room and living room. Bill still concentrated on getting stuff out of his office and into the cleared garage.

Dave ended up helping pack the jeep and fooling around with the camp trailer.

Long talk with Anthea on phone. After dinner at Dave's we went up there for a short time to say goodbye.

1971 179th day - 186 days follow

FAIR - BEAUTIFUL WHEN FOG CLEARED. Up early to get things cleaned up. Dave showed up to help Bill. Renters showed up before I was through in kitchen. After showing them around they left to go shopping while we grabbed the last of our things out of the house. They unloaded their stuff and a friend joined them to help - and to stay awhile - at least he threw his sleeping bag on the little studio couch that we moved into the "office".

We worked until 7 o'clock, then went up to Davis for the night - leaving the final, final things until morning.

Had to leave a jeep tire to be repaired.

Both of us happy to bathe and get out of grubby, grubby work clothes.

I slept in front of the fire; Bill slept in Davis bed upstairs.

Beautiful, beautiful day. 1971 180th day - 185 days follow

Dave helped us with the very last, last minute packing and we finally cleared Trinidad at 12:30. Very warm driving 299 to Rending. Stopped in Willow Creek for a quick shake. Flat tire (actually, the rubber peeled off) near Whiskeytown Reservoir. Extremely hot.

Arrived at Bonanza around 5. Lard and Jean both there. We sipped iced tea first then changed to wine tasting project later and had some nittles.

Around 10-10:30 we had dinner at the river house. Had delay over opening last gate. Warm evening. Slept in trailer, near house, with all sides up.

1971 181st day - 184 days follow

Awake to quail calls, bird song, deer snorts and clews, warm air. Took field glasses to go birding. Saw, close to tracks, one spike buck and one doe, also big jack rabbit, many acorn woodpeckers, jays, etc.

Went into Bonanza around 10 for breakfast.

After getting another trailer tire we left Red Bluff around 1:30. Getting warmer every minute. Full of pills I did a lot of napping all the way to Lahaview, where we stopped for dinner.

I ate very little. Feeling pretty rough.

Drove out into sagebrush country east of Burns to pull off highway and spend the night. Quite calm, even close to midnight.

1971

182nd day - 183 days follow

Clear and warm. Open sage brush country carpeted with pinkish-lavender bradiosa. Brief stop in Vale where Bill got bite to eat. I made coffee in car; did not feel like getting out of car. Headed for Craters of the Moon - arrived there around 5 P.M. Paul Fitch out in northern area of Monument - would return soon. We waited at his house and he showed up - with a couple from Pocatello - around 6. We had a cool drink, then Paul took us into Arco in his new Porsche to have a big, good steak dinner.

On the return trip to CRO he put the car up to 110 mph. Fantastic control!

Threw my sleeping bag out on the patio; Bill slept in bed inside after Paul serviced around and made up fresh beds, after being away several days.

Beautiful, clear, starry sky.

1971

183rd day - 182 days follow

Woke up at dawn to pounding horses and a dog barking. Apparently a deer got too close to the residential area to suit one porch.

Paul discovered power was off, so instead of fixing our own breakfast he took a Park Service vehicle and drove into town for breakfast. Already getting warmer in Arco.

After packing up (first a shower) we snagged Paul from his office and he showed us over some trails and flower areas he wanted us to see, particularly the new handling of bird identification, done with good, clear recordings at various stops.

Left the Craters about 1 P.M. Clouds over mountains now. Went east out of Arco on 93 - to 22 - to 28, a lovely route. Wind and scattered showers. Passing motorist flagged us down after going about 35 miles. Turned out to be Otto Tiller - on way to Hamilton. Our trailer door was open and we had lost Bill's field boots! We drove all the way back to one highway junction at Home. No sign of a boot, but found little plastic truck!

Took pain pills; did a lot of snoozing.

Stopped in Salmon for dinner, around 7 P.M. I did not feel like stopping in Hamilton to see Brandborgs, so we drove right on to the station, a gas stop at 11 P.M. in Pocatello first.

John Tilbs was still up so we learned we could throw our sleeping bags in our same old cabin - leaving the car and trailer near the botany lab.

Cool - Scattered clouds.

1971 184th day - 181 days follow

No heaters in st cabins, yet. Unpacked car, after having coffee with Marie in botany lab. Her son Bill and grandson Mike came out with her from Mike. Spent most of day unpacking stuff in cabin.

Went to Blue Bay for dinner with Marie. No one enthused about commissary food this summer.

After talking to Sally & John Tishers outside their house, and having a look at 8 mos. old Amy, I finally ended up inside - talking all evening. John even fetched Bill out of the lab, after 10, to join us - and it was almost midnight when we finally got up to the cabin.

Put sleeping bag on Navajo rug in other room. Bill had freshly made bed to himself - and his snoring!

1971 185th day - 180 days follow

Independence Day

No reason to get up early. Stayed in until nearly 10. Very quiet in area. Not even much activity at State Park until after lunch. A few fire crackers and a few boots out. Cloudy weather, with scattered showers probably a deterrent.

Put more things away in cabin. Marie went to dinner at Wooden Bay around 7. It was loud and unpleasantly noisy in the adjacent bar. To keep warm I read in the botany lab for awhile then went up to cabin to start reading "Bury My Heart at Wounded Knee".

The Solbergs came by in afternoon - Brought me an interesting new book by a young California girl "The Living Earth" - and how to enjoy it.

up by 10. Cool, with showers. 1971 186th day - 179 days follow

Did ^{some} washing around 3 o'clock. It was dry by evening when we left for Bigfork for dinner at the Lake Cafe.

Marie had gone to Missoula, taking son Bill down to get plane home next day.

Went to cabin to read.

Spent about an hour with Tess Prescott, between 2 and 3 - while waiting to use washing machine.

An extremely noisy boat made some birds miserable at Yellow Bay during afternoon - as lone diver roared around.

1971 187th day - 178 days follow

No rush to get up. Took and coffee around 10:30 in botany lab.

Many heavy showers and much big wind. The boats going out. Fresh snow on mountains. Played some Yakutze with Mike - and Marie on occasion - Russ Kullberg dropped in. He would be doing some work in botany lab during summer.

Roy Hamberg had coffee and chatted with us.

Decided to go out for dinner at 5:30. Mike went, too. Drove to The Ranch in Polson. Had fun of watching storm clouds and big winds move across mountains and rough up the lake.

On way home we helped Marie look for possible houses to buy.

Went to cabin around 10 to read.

Wrote a few letters today: Jim Foster, Dave, Mr. Nielsen, Gladys Folmer.

Ben Forte and 2 grad. students came down to lab in evening to talk north country - they were leaving for Alaska in a couple of days.

Clear, but still cool. Marie ¹⁹⁷¹ and Mike had already headed out when we got to botany lab for coffee around 10.

Finally ran into Mary Kurlberg along trail - had good talk. Had a wonderful shower and shampoo in mid-afternoon.

Went to Bigfork for dinner around 6:30, then to school gym for a Forest Service listening session on land management in the Flathead National Forest. Very few people showed up, but what was said was interesting - many good points were brought out. It was a very informal session with such a small

(30 perhaps) crowd, but everything was taped and otherwise noted by stenographers.

After the local people were heard I had an opportunity to either concur or disagree with their statements and have a chance to make my own input about mismanagement of our public lands.

Had coffee back at lab, then sorted slides of Bush train trip until my eyes gave out.

Read a very short while after getting into sleeping bag.

¹⁹⁷¹ 189th day - 176 days follow

Beautiful, clear morning. Up before 10. Spent most of rest of morning and early afternoon reading and/or writing notes in botany lab.

Began 2 large loads of washing around 2 - finished by 4. Walked to Yellow Bay store for

Went to cabins something to eat for dinner. Bill ate at commissary for first time. I had ice cream bar and a $\frac{1}{2}$ cantaloupe and coffee - then went to cabin to read. Fell asleep, waking up at nearly midnight to get rest of nearly dried clothes off nearby line, having noted increased cloudiness.

Before I fell asleep I heard it begin raining.

Wrote to Gletzy, Jean Hagood & Patton

1971 190th day - 175 days follow

Rain during night.

Up by 10 - slight headache.

After breakfast in botany lab (about 11) went to Big fork with Marie on errands and house hunting. We all (Bill + Mike, too) had lunch at the Lake Cafe.

Spent afternoon reading papers (T-S and CSM) that finally arrived.

Showers, thunder, etc in late afternoon.

Marie fixed bacon + egg type dinner in her new van.

Mike and I played a lot of Yahtzee - waiting for rain to let up. Marie joined us for a few games.

Went to cabin around 10 to read awhile. Lots of thunder and lightning.

1971 191st day - 174 days follow

Awake by 9:30. Cloudy still - and cool.

Wrote a few letters and read papers and played some Yahtzee with Mike off and on.

~~At 4:30~~ Marie, Bill and I had cocktails at 4:30 with Tess and Jerry, then with Mike along, we four went to Woods Bay for early dinner.

A quiet evening in the lab, then went up to cabin to read. Gave up sleeping bag for this night to see if bed would relieve hip pains.

Up by 9. Cloudy & cool, with ¹⁹⁷¹ 192nd day - 173 days follow showers predicted. Margaret Hamburg spent a few minutes in the lab with us all. Played a few Y-games with Mike & Marie before doing some letters.

At 5:30 we decided to go out for dinner - Marie and Mike, too. Had a good meal at Price's in Palom.

Went up for shower around 10:30.

Saw, for second evening in row, rabbit feeding on clover in front of big lab. Could walk up to it slowly and talk in low tones. Only when within about 4 feet would it hop away, but not too hurriedly.

Beautiful day. Never too warm by any means; just clear and beautiful. Late breakfast - about 10:30. Drove to Bigfork to get some material copied, using new bank's copy machine. Did some little shopping, then had lunch at Lake Cafe.

Ray Hamburg came into lab to fix faulty light switch and we had a long, long talk about people and things around the Flathead.

Got out a raft of letters regarding Simpson Liv. clear cutting plans in N. Calif.

At 7:30, as we headed out for dinner, Bill found flat tire on Jeep. Took 15 minutes only to change the tire, but 45 frustrating minutes trying to secure a touching bolt on the spare tire holder. Blue Bay closed on Mondays so we went to Palom. Found South Shore Inn closed, too, so we ended up at The Ranch. Had a pleasant, leisurely dinner while enjoying darkness setting in over the lake and surrounding mountains.

Headed for cabin as soon as we got back. It was 11 o'clock! Read awhile.

Evening grasshoppers are friendly in area around Elrod Lab. Beautiful flashes of yellow as they dash from ground to limb or from limb to limb in their amazingly friendly fashion.

Clear - beautiful. Up by 9. ¹⁹⁷¹ 194th day - 171 days follow
 Walked to mail box with handful of letters at 10:30.
 Spent a very lazy day, although a few letters
 got written and some papers were read.

Marie and Mike returned in mid-evening
 after being away up on the Yak River - and in
 the Purcell Mts.

Had dinner at Lake Cafe.

Lovely, sunny, warm morning.
 Up by 8:30. Started some washing at 9, but
 didn't start hanging it out until 12.

Mike and I spent a little time sweeping and
 dusting in the museum and had a few visitors
 there. Then played some Yahtzee before going
 to botany lab. Sometime after 4 o'clock we
 went to Big fork with Marie on a house hunting
 run, then had early dinner at Lake Cafe.

Spent much of very warm evening in botany lab.
 Went up to cabin around 10:30 - still light
 enough to see to take in clothes from lines
 near wash house as well as near cabin.

Bill spent much of evening helping Marie
 repair a faulty cabinet in her van.

Bill had lunch with GWP and Jon Krupp at
 Blue Bar.

Up at 7:15 in order to go with Marie¹⁹⁷¹ 196th day - 169 days follow and Mike to Strawberry Lake (north of alt. uenars in the Swan Range). Beautiful morning - not a cloud in the sky. Got to trail head around 9:30. Krause Basin trail 5 wanted take us 2.5 miles to Strawberry Lake.

The trail was a steady climb mostly with only about 3 switchbacks in the lovely, shaded forest before we broke out in the open. Below and to the west was the first sweep of the northern Flathead Valley and the lake and the very distant mountains to the south - probably the Coeur d'Alene's or the Bitterroots. Some haze overall. Reached the small, very lovely lake around 12. Ate some oranges and raisins, after shedding light packs and knapsacks. Took a couple of pictures, then Marie began collecting and Mike tried fly casting. I tried it too, but neither of us had a nibble in mid-day, though we saw a few rising. Marie and I left Mike fishing awhile and went a short distance up toward Alpine Trail 7 and checked plants along small stream.

Headed back down at 2:20. Met a young couple from Kalispell with very small child, who was hiking right along. Marie collected from trail side. We saw dead fawn - with big spots still, below trail, not too far from Strawberry Lake. Fast going - downhill. Reached car in 1 hr. 20 min. Stopped in Bigfork to leave films for developing. Were joined by Maria Hawley, Caroline Sears and her 3 children at the Lake Cafe, where we indulged in a milk shake.

Bill got commissary tickets for us tonight. Dinner at podarofne town of 5:30. Showered later. Very warm here today. (28° in Missoula). 92° at Yellow B.

Clear and warm again. By 2 PM Marie, Mike & I were in Polson. Did some errands and had cherry pie at Pries. Stopped at place Marie is interested in on south shore - beautiful view of mountains and a cool house on a very hot afternoon. Went out around 5 to Bigfork. Dinner at Pine Cone Inn. Had flat tire very near turnoff to Swan Valley road. Took tire back into Bigfork for repairs. Killed time at Bigfork ~~State~~ Inn cocktail lounge - waiting for 2 tires.

No ill effects from yesterday's short hike.

JULY **17** SATURDAY

1971 198th day - 167 days follow

Clear and very warm. While others went to lunch I drove to Bigfork P.O. for postage due collection of magazines and papers.

~~At~~ At high noon a large red doe crossed the highway immediately in front of me a few miles south of Bigfork.

Read - and played Yatzy with Mike. At 1:30, after very brief visit with Leray & Maria / Harvey - in the lab - Bill, Marie & I headed for the 7 lethead Lakers Annual meeting at the VFW hall in Polson. Good meeting - lasting until 4:30.

Tried to cool off at South Shore Inn later - and ended up staying for dinner. Returned to station around 8. Still very, very warm.

Went to cabin around 10:30 to read. Big wind came up - branches and cones hit new tin roofs - very noisy and disturbing to sleep.

SUNDAY **18** JULY

1971 199th day - 166 days follow

Awake by 7:15. Clear & warm. Wind died down. Very, very slight breeze on station grounds all day. Did some jogging and walking before breakfast. First one in lab.

Did a lot of reading - magazines and played some games with Mike.

Bill ate at commissary at noon & in evening. I snatched lightly in the lab.

Went to Blue Bay to cool off with a long, cool drink around 9:30. Mike & Marie with us.

Went to bed to read around 11:30. Warm wind blowing.

JULY

19

MONDAY

Up early in order to go with Marie and Mike to Cold and Frigid Lakes in the Mission Mts. ¹⁹⁷¹ 200th day - 165 days follow

Primitive Area. Left station around 8. Hit trail at 9:30. 2 miles of beautiful forest, tumbling creek, cascades all around, loads of flowers to collect, lots of varied bird song. Pigeonized tanager, varied thrush, solitaires, robins, Swainson's thrush, crossbills, chickadees, etc.

Saw one Steller's jay at camp spot at Cold Lake. We munched light lunch there, then changed over to new trail to Frigid Lake, went until trail gave out around edge of lake, so scrambled through the brush straight up the mountain, following a small, fast running water course.

When back at Cold Lake Mike did some fishing. Saw several large and small cutthroat, but he didn't have a real chance to catch any. A few nibbles. We left at 4:30, reached car at 5:30 (very warm, even in beautiful virgin forest) and were in Bigfork for dinner at the Lake Cafe by 6:30.

Very dirty, sticky, and covered with mosquito bites. Showered and shampooed, then went back to lab to read papers until nearly midnight.

Read very short time in cabin - just fell asleep!

JULY

¹⁹⁷¹ 201st day - 164 days follow

Up around 8. At 10:30 we left with Marie to do shopping in Kalispell. Some scattered clouds around the lake - a bit cooler than expected. Ran into Ruth Smith while shopping after lunch.

Returned to station by 3:30.

Bill had dinner at station - I nibbled in lab. Started washing at 7. Finished 3 hours later. Cloudiness increased, but it turned extremely warm and sultry.

Went back to lab to sew, write & read, and have a cup of tea.

Back to cabin by 11:30 to read.

JULY

21

WEDNESDAY

Up by 7:30. Cloudy - showers threatened. Worked fast to get dry things off clothesline. Did some ironing before going to Palson with Bill at 12. Our income tax refund arrived. Did some shopping after lunch and it got quite warm by the time we finished around 3.

Went to Prescotts at "4:21 for high tea". Counted calories for no dinner to speak of while Bill ate at commissary.

Jogged, raved, walked, looked around old dump with Mike - after playing Yachtzee outside where it was fairly cool. Buzz and Jane Mac Arter here for a couple of days - saw them as they were dining out.

Wrote to Pattons - then went to cabin around 10:30.

1971

202nd day - 163 days follow

THURSDAY

22

JULY

(Very warm)

1971

203rd day - 162 days follow

Up at 7:40 with ^{load} knocking on our door -- Mike Mooser announcing power was off -- we would eat in Bigfork. Dressed hurriedly for hiking and a warm day. Breakfast at Lake Cafe at 8:30 -- Drove the Swan Valley to Fatty Creek Road. Drove in 8.9 miles to trail head for trek to Cedar Lake. Stopped for lunch at 12:15 at a lovely unnamed lake. A packer with 4 empty stock animals going out passed us there. We got into many snow patches and gobs of glacier lilies at the trail ascended. We only went to the ridge above the lake, about 3 1/2 miles. Quite warm. Trail badly washed in snow areas and deeply rutted in places by pack animals. Many beautiful flowers; many beautiful bird songs filling the air and yet not a sign of any wildlife except for one golden mantled squirrel. Several good coal springs feeding Fatty Creek. Lots of mosquitoes, but not as bad as the hike to Frigid & Cold Lakes. Some beautiful fluffy clouds hung over the Swan Range, a few over us in the Mission Mt. Wild Area, some thunder, but no rain.

Saw the packer again as he returned with a load. Also were passed by 7 people on horses who had been into the lake for fishing.

Phoned Dave at 9:30 (Pacific Time) and had long talk. He moved water garden - since renters were leaving; not to be there in August at all.

Went up to cabin around 11:30. Read until 12:30.

1971

205th day - 160 days follow

Up by 7:30. Seemed cooler, and there were clouds somewhere in area throughout day, but it was very nice. (Tried a run to mailbox.)

Cleaned museum out (spiderwebs, etc.) preparing for Open House tomorrow. Bill got old lantern slide together for overhead projection.

Walked to Yellow Bay store for lunch materials. Bill ate at Commissary.

Spent much of afternoon cleaning ^{table} and filing conversation material - to make lab look less messy. Light "dinner", counting calories, in lab.

When dinner settled Mike & I jumped and ran and kicked high kicks ^Y along the road to the old dump. Then, with Marie, we played a few lines of Yahtzee before going up to our respective cabins.

up before 8. A lovely day - not too hot, nor too cool. A few clouds and very light breeze.

Did some last minute cleaning and dusting in museum while Bill worked on his lantern slide presentation. Dressed for the occasion. Spent almost entire afternoon talking with the great horde of visitors that showed up.

Closed the museum at 5. Relaxed in lab until 6:30 or so when we left with Polly and Billie Turner for dinner at the Terrace. We were out until nearly 11. Had excellent dinner.

Most interesting visitors showed up. Frank Left Hand was able to identify someone in Elrod's collection of Indian friends in photos.

A man who used to ride the "Helena", and who still lives near Somers gave me some information.

Dr. Jessie Bierman was also here with friends.

1971

207th day - 158 days follow

Up by 7:30. Spent morning in botany lab. Marie and Mike left for Miraville and some collecting in the Bitterroots.

Tried jogging to mail box, but had a sore or strained leg muscle stop me short -- came limping back -- and it bothered me all day.

Did some washing after lunch, working from 1 to 3:30. Nice, warm afternoon.

Tipped up long letters about redwoods. Turners popped in around 9 P.M. and with Bob Fisher (mammalogist) along, we all went to Blue Bay for a little while. In bed by 11.

Nice warm day. Went to 1971 208th day - 157 days follow
Big Fork to get a letter copied at the bank.
Had lunch at Lake Cafe.

Went swimming from 3:20 to 4:20.
Bill came in for a brief dip. Water
was very nice, even though "ruffled" on
surface.

Wrote letters most of evening. Went to
cabin to read around 10:30.

After dinner Bill and I walked out to
old dump to check the raspberry bushes -
found a few - others not yet ripe.

1971 209th day - 156 days follow Cool as the storm cleared
away. It was mild with thunder, wind, and

Went to Kalispell around 4. Did shopping,
rented a sewing machine and had pizza for
dinner out on "The Strip". Back around 8.

Went to cabin fairly early to get acquainted
with the fancy new Touch and Sew model.

Had first look inside Hochaday
Art Center. Very nice.

JULY **29** THURSDAY

Cooler in morning, warmer during afternoon and evening. Up at 8. Bill was up at 7 because he would be teaching Jerry's algae class at 8 and field tripping to Mission Wells over lunch.

Had (first Mike) Anderson Miller show me how to thread the sewing machine.

Got a number of things hemmed before dinner. Went to Bigfork with Marie before post office closed. Stayed for dinner.

Back to cabin to sew. Mike wanted to mend some of his jeans, but we ran into breaking thread problems and gave up.

Tried to work out machine threading problems for 2 solid hours, from 10-12, then after much frustration, gave up again.

1971 210th day - 155 days follow

FRIDAY **30** JULY

1971 211th day - 154 days follow Warm again. Finished some letter writing. Left for Kalispell at 12:30 with sewing machine -- needed expert advice! Turned out bobbin parts were not working properly - too finely machined - and some oil was needed. Very warm in town. Did some shopping.

Lots of slow traffic along lake shore -- both directions.

Low calorie dinner, alone.

Billed algae lab most of evening.

Went to cabin at 10, hopefully to do some sewing, but had more difficulties -- so went to bed to read awhile.

JULY

31

SATURDAY

Warm - very warm.

1971

212th day - 153 days follow

Social Security Tax Return Due

Walked to Yellow Bay store before noon with Marie. We picked - and ate - along the way, black-ripe "June" berries (*Amelanchier*).

Mike and I got the sewing machine working properly again and I finished some pillow cases. Ruth Smith appeared for visit.

We went swimming around 3. Water was calm and surprisingly warm. Mike and I swam, and fooled around until really sweating ourselves out by 4:30.

Changed clothes in order to go to dinner in Bigfork - Ruth Smith with us.

Very warm in Bigfork. Had one cool drink after dinner at Bigfork Hotel lounge. Ruth left us around 8.

We all walked out to check the raspberry crop near the old dump. Picked a handful. That was 9 o'clock - light and still warm. Moon about half full when I went to cabin around 10:30.

Too warm for blankets!

Bought 3# luscious Bing cherries and earlier had bought 1# of Lamberts.

AUGUST

(95° in Kalispell)

1971

213th day - 152 days follow

Up by 7:45. Sun high - and warm. Mike insisted he help me do some more sewing!

Marie + ~~that~~ Mike left (for 3 days) after lunch. At 2 PM Bill and I went to the museum where we had arranged to meet and talk with one Mr. Ficken from Lomax. He told us of his exciting Dec. 17, 1925 (or 26) blizzard experience aboard the *Helena*, from Polson to overnight refuge in Yellow Bay.

Took the acrylies over to Kullberg's trailer to show them some basic moves - and needs.

Two drops of rain fell from a suddenly cloudy sky. Walked to Yellow Bay store at noon. Very warm and the highway was jammed - so was the store.

Went back to sewing from about 2-3 - then had to stop when needle broke while mending heavy levis.

Went swimming from 3:15 - 5:00. Water was wonderful. Sun was hot - hot! Bill, Russ and Mary showed up, too.

Beautiful clouds appeared again - plus the lightest of breezes - just enough to ruffle the water.

Went to Bob Fisher's seminar at 7.

He told of his work in New York state and Pennsylvania on the red backed vole.

1971 217th day - 148 days follow Clear - warm.

Left for Kalispell at 9:45. Returned sewing machine and did some shopping. Back at station before 2. Had a "pick up" lunch in lab.

Went swimming from 3:15 - 5:15. Marie and Mike had returned from their Bitterroot collecting trip.

up before 8. A grey day. ¹⁹⁷¹ 218th day - 147 days follow

Went swimming from 1:30 - 2:30 with Mike, but the sun never broke through. Water was wonderful; we weren't inclined to lie on beach however under cloudy skies.

Went berry picking - ended up with 2 quarts!

Clear and warm - very warm! Put on jeans and field boots to go berry picking out along highway before lunch. Found beautiful "black caps" and ate dozens of "June berries", all dark blue and plump and sweet.

Went swimming from 1:30 - 4:30 - Mike and a couple of other youngsters were around - and Brenda (secretary) was at "our" spot ahead of us, but stayed to sun and swim with us.

Bill came down and even Marie showed up to see whether the lakeshore was any cooler than the botany lab. It wasn't, not unless you were in the water.

We drove (I, with Marie, to ~~the~~ Woods Bay for Pizza - only I got sick and had to lie down in Marie's van.

I stayed in the van even when we got back to the station. Tried to eat some soda crackers, but didn't feel like putting anything into my stomach.

Either too much sun - or too many "June berries" or a combination of both.

Got into bed by 8:30. Too warm to get under covers.

Bill went to Prescotts to play poker.

Alarm - with a few widely scattered ¹⁹⁷¹ clouds. 220th day - 145 days follow
 up before 8 - feeling empty and had a slight headache for awhile. Light breakfast helped.

Cleaned up cabin and did some ironing and a little mending. Had pizza for lunch.

Went swimming from 2 until 4:30. Lake was ruffled by wind, but water was wonderful.

Mike, 2 Turners and 1 Foote with me. Had masks and a matthew to play with.

Bill came down around 4. We collected a few flat rocks for painting upon.

Tried the painting, down at lab. with acrylics - Mike and Karl Turner tried it, too.

Very warm evening.

A woodwind quintet from Missoula campus gave us delightful concert for about an hour - outside Elrod Lab. The evening was perfect and the group ~~was~~ was relaxed and informal.

1971 221st day - 144 days follow

Up at 6:30. Clear and warm. A quick breakfast in botany lab with Marie and Mike shortly after 7. Left for Glacier Park around 7:40. Coffee stop at West Glacier. Left Marie's van in parking area near McDonald Lodge and hit the trail to Sperry Chalet about 9:30. [Traffic in park very heavy.] Trail wide and heavily used by both horses and people. Quite warm. Trail gently climbing at first, then after leaving wooded area it was mostly open, with several switchbacks and very few places to get water. Spotted the chalet when still a mile or so away and it seemed forever reaching it, but we finally made it around 3:15. We had, of course, had a good lunch stop, many botanizing stops, and many water stops. Once we reached trailside ~~Sources~~ sources were upper reaches of Spargue Creek. Beaman Medicine Falls were last long before the lovely drop was sighted.

Rested awhile after getting settled in our room at the Chalet - the sleeping quarters in separate building from dining room and kitchen facilities. Went out scouting for plants in vicinity of chalet, but away from people. Scrambled on beautiful, big rocks, laced with running water and glorious vari-colored flower gardens. Dinner at 6 - and we were "starved." Sleeping quarters came alive around 1971 6:30. 222nd day - 143 days follow

[Found extra blankets were all in use before night was over.]
 Breakfast at 7. On the trail by 8:30 or so with only collecting pack, cameras and sack lunches (provided by Chalet). Fantastically beautiful 4 miles to snowfield near Sperry Glacier proper. We were in no hurry - and we looked at every flower, it seemed, drank out of every waterfall, admired masses of five finger ferns, watched birds, marmots, squirrels and one pika - and we photographed - and we just plain looked. Small, tall lakes still frozen over mostly. We crossed long snowfields to view the glacier from its very edge - and that's where we ate lunch. Other hikers had left, so we had the place to ourselves. The views of other park peaks was spectacular - however, a heavy mass of smoke kept us from photographing panoramic views. Returning, we were close to, and able to photograph 5 goats various sizes. One was within 20 ft of me. Mike got even closer to small ones. Later on we watched them bounding down the rocky ledges from our lower trail position. It was beautiful to watch. Seemed that trail hikers were everywhere, but they were all very nice and fairly well scattered out. We were back at the Chalet around 3.

Had coffee, put on our packs and headed down at 3:50. Reached the car at 6:45 with hat, pretty tired, feet.

Dinner at Apgar Village - then back to station, arriving around 9:30. The sun was aflame as it set - from the heavy smoke cover originating from Canadian forest fires.

Showered by 10:30. Very, very warm night.

Up around 7:30. Sun broke over the mountain around 7:45. Clear and warm. Legs fairly well recovered - in fact I felt very good and really "muscle tired". Did the washing before noon. Put out 2 large loads.

Went swimming from 2 until 5. Bill came down around 4. Mike came down, after getting a haircut in Bigfork, for a quick swim before dinner. Water was wonderful. Did a lot of baking in the hot sun.

Washed to Yellow Bay store around 7. Matt Turner + Mike with me. Bill went to seminar - given by Phil Wright - on marmots.

Took clothes off line while still light enough to see.

Most station personnel went to Bigfork Hotel for evening - 2 free drinks and buffet supper "on the house". Bill went up, alone, around 10 and came in with most of the others between 1:30 + 2:15. Much noise and laughter and swimming went on until 4 - 4:30.

A very warm night. Read awhile after doing exercises - but no covers needed.

Saw Ben Frote when he arrived around 11, just returned from 5 weeks in Alaska trip, with 2 grad. students and ^{small} daughter Sheri.

Awake before 7 o'clock, but 1971 224th day - 141 days follow
no signs this morning! Too much partying!
Breakfast calls one hour late!

First one in botany lab -- had coffee made
by 7:45.

Another very warm day. Went swimming
from 3 to 4:30 and nearly baked.
Bill came down ^{around 4} and remained longer
than I did.

Mike & Marie in Arizona all day -
returning around 7 with load of herbarium
specimens.

Went to Prescotts for an hour or so
after boxes were unloaded into hallway
of Elrod Lab.

S.S. Hodge put into our bay for the
night after working on a dock south
of Holiday Hotel all afternoon.

Very warm evening.

1971

225th day - 140 days follow

Clear and very warm again. Left by
7:30. Went to Palom around 9:30 with Marie. Did
some small errands while Mike got a shot at Dr. Deal's
office and Marie checked on bank loans, etc. in her
efforts to get a house.

Had light lunch at Price's, then came right back
to station.

Mike and I went swimming from 2-5. Bill
joined us around 4. Water was calm, warm,
and wonderful - spent much time in water -
diving, racing, etc.

Went to South Shore Inn for dinner. Afterwards -
Marie stopped to talk to the people she may buy
a place from on the south shore.

Went up to cabin around 11:30 to read - but
not until after a good shower and shampoo.

Up by 7:10. Clear and warm with increasing cloudiness in mid-morning.

Still ironing before it got too hot. Mike used acrylics to paint on wood chunks found along lakeshore.

Ruth's daughter Shirley, her children, and 3 of her friends and their children were there for the day. Went swimming before the clouds blotted out the sun.

Left around 5. Driving toward Polson we passed a small forest fire, still smoking, but planes had been seen earlier, so we assumed retardant had been dumped already.

Dinner at Prices. Very warm. Lots of people. Back at station early.

Went to cabin early to read. Very warm. Fell asleep on top of bed. All clouds gone. No breeze.

Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Up by 7:30. Clear + warm again. Mike and I got started on paintings on wood chunks and rocks and didn't stop until noon. Went swimming from 2-4. Bill came down to get me out of the water in order to attend a faculty picnic at Bear Dance picnic grounds. Barbecued steaks + salad, etc, plus everyone's own choice of drinking mixes. Food provided by kitchen. Washed home (4+ miles) in 1 hr. 20 min. Jon Knapp drove Bill (in Jeep) back to station by 9. Bill very obstinate and uncooperative. Went up to cabin and left him in Jon's care.

Very hot night. Fell asleep on top of bed while reading.

Bill stumbled into bed sometime after 2 a.m.

AUGUST

16

MONDAY

Up by 7:20. ~~Clear~~ Somewhat cloudy and quite a bit cooler. ¹⁹⁷¹ 228th day - 137 days follow

~~Went~~ Went to Palson before 10.

Did some shopping. Found a shirt, a sweater and a shirt on sale at Shenemans. Mike went with me and we were back before noon.

Went swimming from 1:30 to 4:30.

Seminar, scheduled for 7, was postponed.

Read papers and played Yachtz.

TUESDAY

AUGUST

1971

229th day - 136 days follow

Up by 7:30. Clear & warm.

Did two loads of washing before noon. Walked to Yellow Bay store for a few things.

Went swimming from 1:30 to 3:30 with Mike.

Went to Olson Miller's seminar on Alaska Pipe Line and problems at 7.

Went to lab awhile, then up to cabin to do exercises and to read awhile.

Very warm night.

Up before 7:30. Cooler today, ¹⁹⁷¹ but warm at night. ^{230th day - 135 days follow}

Walked to Yellow Bay store around 10:30. Barbara Tweto spotted me on trail and we talked about memberships to Flathead Lakes - which she was working on from Yellow Bay to Blue Bay.

Did some packing in cabin - and had some mild "help" from Mike.

We went to Bigfork by 6 so Maie could get car wheels balanced and have dinner away from station.

Returned by 8 o'clock after spending short time in Flathead Galleries. Saw Dennis Jones there and talked awhile.

Went to cabin to read - after a shower - around 10:30. Quite warm.

1971

231st day - 134 days follow

Up before 8. Clear & warm. (Early morning crispy air). Did washing before and after lunch hour. Mike's family arrived.

Went swimming from 3 to 4:30. Water calm and wonderfully clear and fairly warm.

Brought packed up clothes and other things from cabin to botany lab.

Took clothes in just at dark. Did more

up around 7. Dressed for hike ¹⁹⁷¹ 232nd day - 133 days follow
to Upper Holland Lake with Marie + Mike. We
all had a quick breakfast in lab and pulled out at 7:40. Clear
Some cloudiness - more over Swan Range than the Mission.
70 miles to trail head at Holland Lake. Left car at 9:20. Trail
badly rutted, very dusty, and overrun with people -
horses and people - and people - and more people!
Forest extremely dry. Lunch stop around 12 way up
Holland Creek Canyon - marvelous view - looking way
down to Holland Lake and way across to the rugged part
of the Mission. 5 miles and we reached upper Holland.
Mike waded out at edge of lake for some plants while
Marie scouted the edge. I just looked and took pictures
- and then we all rested while making a decision whether
to go on to Pendant Lake. We saw one young couple again (plus

Up by 7:30. Clear, warm.

lone lunch bits.

Mike's mother and little sisters came over
for a swim, but first I had to do

Went to Prescott for a final goodbye and one

Did the Rim Drive just as the sun was disappearing. Very cool. Had most of the overlooks entirely to ourselves. Took a few pictures - but mostly enjoyed the splendid silhouettes of approaching darkness. Drove on to close to the Diamond Lake highway junction. Stopped around 10:30. Extremely cool.

1971 235th day - 130 days follow

Clear and darned near frosty! Up and going by 8:20. Breakfast at Union Creek camp and resort area. Bright and beautiful. Passed by the Lost Creek dam project - now well under construction - on way to Gold Hill. Sickening to know the once lovely, free flowing stream would become a sterile reservoir.

Lunch in Crescent City at The Blue Roof. Went right by Moonstone and picked up "putty-cat" from the boarding penell around 2:30.

1971 239th day - 126 days follow

Up around 7:30. Clear and warm. Worked around house all morning. Went to Arcata and Eureka after 1 to do a number of errands. Stopped at Environmental Center, got silver from safe deposit box, went to Post office.

Eleanor Watkins phoned as I was ready to leave the house about new fences near beach shutting off some parking area and access. I went to court house hoping to talk to Supervisors or counsel but no one around. Did manage to get some good information from secretaries.

Home by 6. Dave came in later from his session on Salmon River road with Forest Service at Sommers Bar.

Up at 7:30. Foggy, but warm. ¹⁹⁷¹ 240th day - 125 days follow

Worked around the house until Dave phoned up to write - or revise a statement about Salmon-Trinity wilderness. I typed for a few hours on it, finishing at dinner time.

Jean Hagood had come in after lunch. We had a good talk over cups of tea and she left at 2:30.

Dave fixed our meat for dinner on the barbecue grill. After dinner, almost dark, we went down to Moonstone Beach. Bill saw the barbed wire fence for the first time.

Dave and M.T. had also gone for run on beach. Dave went home around 10 and I began trying to reach by phone either Don Harris or Fred Fisher. Managed to leave message for Fred.

In bed to read around midnight.

¹⁹⁷¹ 241st day - 124 days follow

Beautiful, sunny and clear when I got up at 7:45 - but before 9 the fog bank moved in. All day long it was sunny, foggy or sunny cloudy and very nice without wind.

At 9:50 I began walking the scenic drive - a fast walk - and arrived at Dave's place just 45 minutes later. I had phoned him earlier that I would appreciate a ride back. Doug was home for the weekend. After coffee and talk they brought me down the road before 12 - on their way to Orata and McK. for errands and to do their laundry.

Around 1:30, after I had phoned Fred Fisher about Moonstone Beach blocked access, we went up to Anthes - primarily to deliver the phonograph needle I had picked up for her in town Friday - for her stereo.

1971 243rd day - 122 days follow up at 7:30. Cloudy - fair.

Bill and I got to Supervisors meeting by 9:20. Eleanor and
Heidi showed up, as did Dave - and Jack Coburn - to
hear the discussion on public access policy - to beaches
and other recreation areas. Dave, Jack and I - and
Sam Merryman, Jr. had a chance to comment. The
discussion was rather lengthy, and finally the Board
adopted the revised policy statement that will have
procedures added to it by next month.

The Wothys, Van de Mark and Vinyards had coffee upstairs
after the session. Frances Simuk, now working in the
County Counsel's office stopped by our table and later
I saw her again when I went to Chuck Selden's office.

Bill and I had a hamburger at Stanton's. It turned
very sweet as we did some shopping at Henderson
center. Home by 2 o'clock.

Spray painted a wall decoration - read

Lonely day. Prepared to go to ¹⁹⁷¹ Trinity Mts. Dave and I did some shopping in Arata and M.K. while Bill started packing the jeep.

We left in late afternoon and arrived at Trail Creek camp ground just at dark. Cooked dinner under huge ponderosa pines and had the place to ourselves until eleven o'clock, when Lloyd Anderson and a carload of Sierra Clubbers arrived. They had coffee with us, then everyone piled into sleeping bags. A cool place.

Trinity Mountains

1971

247th day - 118 days follow

Up by 7. Got to trail head (just a few miles) by 9:15. The other group started out ahead while Dave and I waited until 9:30, the scheduled time, in case of late comers. "Music Temple" went with Bill. They would explore lakes, ponds, etc. at their leisure and see us again Monday afternoon on the Trail Garden Gulch trail - 7 miles from Cecilville.

It was very warm hiking up to the summit on old jeep road (still used by hunters) and then trail. David Anderson's group decided to camp at the edge of Trail Gulch Lake: Dave (V. & A.) and I continued on another mile - over the ridge - and camped at a small, shallow pond below Reckman Peak. Before picking our campsite we shed our packs and explored the rocky and timbered slopes - Dave in one direction; I in another.

D. Anderson and others passed by in later afternoon.

Dave V. and I reached a low saddle about the same time (coming from opposite directions) and together we dropped down the slope to Poison Lake, which he had spotted from the ridge. We tried the water. It was icy cold. Nice spot, small grassy meadow with flowers + warm sunshine to boot. Then, back to campsite to get set up for a couple of days. Light dinner, with cocktails ahead of time (with nibbles), a small warming fire - and then the moon rose. It was a lonely, bright, not-too-cold, evening.

Trinity Mountains

1971

248th day - 117 days follow

Beautiful, warm, clear morning.

Awoke shortly before 7 - before the sun got all the way down the rocky slope to the lovely little pond. With day packs for lunch and cameras we started a long loop trip, wearing shorts and short sleeved, light-colored shirts. We went down Deadmen Gulch, along the south fork of Coffee Creek, up through gorgeous Steeple Meadows - and near the ridge stopped for lunch. Many Steller's jays in meadows - and some quail.

We met David Anderson and his sister Susan going in opposite direction loop hike from their camp at Trail Gulch Lake. We had magnificent panoramas from any high vantage point - the Trinity Alps high country (Thompson Pk. Sawtooth, etc.) Mt. Shasta floated above all in the easterly views, and Mt. McLaughlin showed hazily from the north in Oregon. Then climbed the ridge above Trail Gulch Lake, then continued on the rocky, spiny ridge until we could view Small Buck Lake way below us.

The trail down to Trail Gulch Lake was steep and switch-backed as we were closing our loop back to camp. Stopped briefly at the other's lakeside camp. Had a small fire and enjoyed our own pits before and after dinner. David A. came along to share pre-dinner "cheer" and had to borrow a flashlight as a safety measure for his near-one-mile hike back to the lake.

Clouds appeared, nearly covering the moon. We put up a fly - just in case.

249th day - 116 days follow

Labor Day

Foggy, drizzly, damp and eerily beautiful when I woke up around 7. We repacked our loads as soon as we ate, hoping the sun would break through before we hit the long trail out. But the mistiness remained -- no help to be in a "white-out" when searching for the trail. We had to cross country a great deal - steep, densely wooded slopes, slick, wet slopes with lots of down timber. Tough going. Early lunch on the ridge, somewhere above Rush Creek Lake or Onion Meadow - or something -- we had no way to determine our exact location. The sun shone briefly. Wearily we trudged on downward until the trail ran along Rush Creek, which was lovely. Bill and MT met us about one mile from the car - at 4 P.M. We were an hour later than previously figuring.

We drove home by way of Cecilville and Forks of Salmon - lovely, lovely! Bill and I had a hamburger in Willow Creek, but Dave was too tired to eat anything.

We dropped Dave at home, then hurried home ourselves to get cleaned up and read mail.

TUESDAY

Clear & warm. Up at 7. Dave and ¹⁹⁷¹ 250th day - 115 days follow
MT arrived about 7:15 -- after walking 3 miles in 30 minutes! Talked Dave into light breakfast after figuring out calories.

At 9:15 I walked back home with them, taking 45 minutes. Had coffee and read magazines, then at 11 started back to Moonstone, alone. Dorothy Fuller drove alongside me for quite a distance until Dave came along to pick me up -- about $\frac{1}{2}$ of the way home.

At noon we headed for Arcata and Eureka. This time I dropped Dave near Court House, where he would continue some work on timber types on Simpson lands in the timber dept. of the assessors office. I shopped for a new Singer sewing machine. After one hour of decision making and lessons a ten year old portable was loaded in the car. Then I drove out to Sears - on the Mall - and ordered bathroom scales. We were home, at Moonstone, again by 4. Warm enough to enjoy light dinner out on the deck.

Dave left before 8 and then in came Bill Devall for our planned talk session of Sierra Club activities. Bill borrowed some books for his mother's reading and left around 9:30. I looked with the "new" sewing machine a little while before exercising and bathing.

WEDNESDAY

8

SEPTEMBER

1971 251st day - 114 days follow

Clear and warm.
Gathered things together for back packing trip.

Saw Freeland, Dave, "M.T." and I left for a wilderness backpack trip in the Marble Mts. around 5 P.M. Stopped for quick hamburger-type dinner in Weaverville. On FH 3 we went to Kidder Creek Rd. out of Greenville. Moonlight. Drove over every old spur and logging road in the area, (except the right one) searching for trail head to Kidder Lake. At 1 A.M. we gave up (the Datum nearly gave up a couple of times, too) and threw our sleeping bags right out in the middle of one seemingly unused road.

Heard deer rustling around, snorting, & bounding away when they had sniffed us out.

SEPTEMBER

9

THURSDAY

Marble Mts. Wilderness

Awake at daylight. Pleasant weather. 1971 252nd day - 113 days follow

Admission Day (California)

Tried the last possible road we hadn't noted in the dark - and it was right on! Drove car as far as possible up steep, rocky road; stopped short of trail head about 1 mile. Had applejuice, raisins and chocolate chunks for breakfast before shouldering our packs. Warmed up fast. Good hiking into Kidder Lake - 4 miles - where we stopped for lunch. A local family appeared, 2 on horses, 2 on foot. We talked briefly, then struck out for a campsite in the general vicinity of Man Eaten Lake. It was our luck to find out no well used trail was evident so we cross-countryed - and following Dave it was really rugged! He led us nearly straight up a few dry water courses - each footstep precious with 30# pack. Then across endless (or so it seemed) talus slopes - huge rocks, some teetering. Wildflowers gorgeous. Spotted a beautiful, primitive camp site near a snow bank, lovely meadow backed by small timber, tumbling stream from remnant snow bank - a beautiful place.

We pitched camp, did a little nearby exploring, then after campstyle dinner with small campfire we piled into our sleeping bags. Sean and I chose the open meadow but Dave + MT used the alpine tent.

Gorgeous, clear, starry night.

Marble Mts. Wilderness

1971 253rd day - 112 days follow

Sean was an early bird to meditate on the nearby rocky rise at sunrise. Around 9:30 we headed out - up the slope to hit the trail to Man Eaten Lake - "just through the notch" over the ridge. With day packs, lunch materials and camera gear we negotiated the very steep trail down to the beautiful little lake and waited for Doug Ayers to appear - which he didn't.

Then we decided to try going over the ridge at another point and it was a hairy, spine tingling, rock scrambling affair as we went around the cirque. All beautiful. Snow patches, small runoff streams everywhere and gorgeous wildflowers everywhere. Sean decided enough hair raising had already taken place so he returned to camp by a far easier route than the one Dave and I chose to try. MT was a real problem in a few places, but we managed to coax, drag or carry her in the terribly scary, drop off spots. We viewed Pleated Lake, Blueberry Lake, Spray Lake and others from the knife-like ridge. Getting back to camp by cross country, talus riding, sit-downs, rocky routes (rock chutes) was also hair raising - but every rocky step was beautiful. We rock-hopped back into camp at just about dark - exhausted, and slightly foot weary, but exhilarated after the ~~the~~ panoramas we had indulged in.

A good dinner - cocktails beforehand - and FLOP - into bed early.

Up at sunrise. Ready to leave camp ¹⁹⁷¹ 254th day - 111 days follow by 9:30. Already warm. Again, cross country, up the rocky, flower strewn slopes to reach the trail. Today our goal was Marble Mt. We had viewed it from Man Eaten Lake yesterday. This would be about 10 miles at roughly 6000' elev. Barely underway on the trail, above Campbell and Cliff lakes, we met members of the F+6 advisory council and FS personnel. Dave Abraham (S-T N.F.), then "Ike" Livermore, and many others. We talked unhurriedly to each small group we met. The trail showed heavy summer use, but the scenery told why the heavy use. Open country, then woods, with views of lakes and far off mountains and virgin watersheds, like Woolly Creek. Only 1 spring along trail. No time to hike onto Marble Mt. itself, but we were right there viewing its marble white beauty at close range.

We returned to camp just at sunset - rather tired. Again, a good dinner with some light, rationed(!) refreshment beforehand.

Dave had to do some foot doctoring since his hiking shoes were showing too much wear ^{today's} after yesterday's rocky scramble any feet should hurt!

A small campfire again and early to bed.

Marble Mountains

¹⁹⁷¹ 255th day - 110 days follow Up at seven. Clear, cool, and frosty on top of sleeping bags! Packed up immediately after breakfast. Sun already showing its strength when we headed up the slope at 9:30 - to take the ridge trail to Hayes cabin and out. Lost the trail completely and plunged down slopes of manzanita, head high and obstinate, then through cool, dense cedar and pine woods. Had lunch snack in same cool, cool woods before heading on to a lovely, large meadow where trail was easily followed from there on out to road. A few cows near old, unoccupied Hayes cabin.

Trail seemed long, dusty and hot, but we finally reached Dave's pickup at 2. All 3 of us extremely footsore by this time from so much rocky terrain. Even MT was hesitant to move at times.

Quick dinner (hamburger, coffee) in a Weaverville drive in. Over 90° there at 4:30. Home by 7:30. Bill had gotten "pooty-cat" from the kennel on Friday - a nice surprise for me.

Dave showered here and stayed around until about 10.

Had brief talk with Ray Peart when encountered at Sears. Grabbed quick lunch in Mck. and met 1 PM flight from Fresno. Bill ecstatic over his high Sierra experience. We spent the entire afternoon listening to his helicopter, weather, people, lakes, deserts, mountains, hiking, tidbits.

Dave walked home (in his new "jogging" shoes) and I went shopping at Mck - around 5:30. Didn't get back until nearly 6:30 because I ran into Jamie Kirby and we talked - and talked - and talked! Dave had returned (afoot, to complete his 6 mi.) and we had dinner around 7.

Alarm went off at 7:15. [Foggy in Rosh Hashanah - First Day of Jewish New Year A.M. - clearing in afternoon.]

Bill headed out for the college at 8:30 - General Faculty meeting today.

Dave & MT showed up around 9. MT stayed with me while he went to Eureka to finish timber work for Gordon. Meanwhile Gordon phoned about redwood negatives.

Made numerous phone calls between floor scrubbing, vacuuming, filing and news clipping.

Bill returned around 3:30. Dave returned around 4:30. Dinner at 7. Dave sent ~~sent~~ negatives by Greyhound.

Many phone calls - in and out - all day -- Parks & Rec. meeting, but I phoned members of committee concerning developments in regard to county policy on public access to beaches.

Around 8:30 we walked the scenic drive - to Dave's place and back, only Bill went to Luffenbally Beach only and returned to get some busy work done. Dinner was later than usual. Dave and I walked to his place and back, while Bill went as far as Luffenholty with us.

Foggy, then starry as we got closer to Moonstone. Dave here for the night.

¹⁹⁷¹ 265th day - 100 days follow Foggy in a.m. Up by 7:30.

Did some washing. Bill went into school. I did some shopping and looked for a table for the sewing machine—only in Arcata--no luck. Received another phone call from Washington, D.C. regarding message to Clamen on Alaska Native Claims bill—this time from George Marshall. Did some local phoning and sent a telegram.

At 7:10 I drove to Eureka for a "strategy" meeting at Peat's. Dropped Dave off ~~to work~~ at the Environmental Center in Arcata and picked him up again around 10:30.

At 11 we all walked to Luffenholty Beach and back. Drizzly fog this evening.

Dave spent night on living room couch.

up by 7:30. Foggy - mostly. 1971 266th day - 99 days follow

Some brief clearing here in afternoon. Bill went into school around 9:30. I worked around house all day. Wrote some letters and did some filing of Sierra Club material.

Dave was in and out all day, but showed up for dinner. Together we attended the Exec. Com. meeting of SC North Group at Humboldt Fed. bank in Arcata. We didn't get home until 11:15 -- after taking extra time to paste labels on Ecornevoletters to go out.

Too late to go for walk. Instead, we tacked until nearly 10'clock.

Ed Wayburn phoned in regard to new ^{club} move on Redwood National Park.

1971 267th day - 98 days follow

Foggy. Up by 7:30 & wake Dave to make call to Ed Wayburn in Washington. We never reached him regarding news release. Worked around house. Bill slept late. Dave had early appt. in Eureka.

Did some ironing after lunch. Dave showed up briefly around noon. Bill went into school -- and ^{also} got an appt. for 7:30 with Dr. Gaylord -- to look at his troublesome toe.

At 5:30 I walked to Dave's place -- made it in 42 minutes. Bill drove up to keep our dinner "engagement."

Good dinner, rather latish. We (Dave + I) walked back to Aloustone by 11:15. Bill drove back earlier and had fresh pot of coffee ready.

In bed by 12:30 a.m. to read awhile. Dave stayed for the night.

Awake at 8:30, but only briefly.

Carol Severy dropped in briefly, having just endured the long drive from her home in Los Angeles area.

At 10 we all walked to Dave's - all except Bill, who turned back at Sufferholty Beach. He later came up to Dave's to bring me home.

Light rain all evening.

1971

269th day - 96 days follow

Wake up to rain at 8:00. It had been a wild night with one violent hail storm that brought Bill, the cat and me upright in the early morning hours.

Worked around house. Dave walked down around 2:30. Carol S. came in for awhile, too, and when we left to walk over to Glen's + Chet's, Dave had left, but Carol remained, reading.

About 24 property owners + utilities rep's. met to discuss further the undergrounding possibilities from Moonstone to Sufferholty Creek and whether to form a utilities district. The meeting went on from 3 to 6.

We "phoned" dinner materials at Dave's place. At 9:15 Dave, MT and I walked back. Bill came home a bit later, parking us across Weithamer Drive. A brisk walk - 45 minutes. Stars out.

Dave slept here.

Awake at 7:30 - up at 7:40.

1971 270th day - 95 days follow

"Poopy-cat" came in all wet. Remembered hearing heavy rain during night.

Dave and I walked to his place 9:15-10:00. Storm clouds clearing. Ocean beautiful.

Bill needed ride to school - his arm - or shoulder - giving him bad time. Dave, to save time, drove me down to Sufferholty Beach and I walked at least another mile.

Worked outside after lunch, cleaning up the mess of cuttings from Sunday's job.

Went into Arcata after 4. Did an errand or two for Dave before picking up Bill at school. Home by 5:30 after shopping for groceries.

Carol Severy came in after dinner, still searching for a place to live.

Dave and AT showed up about 8:30 and Dave began re-writing his 1000 word piece on "Whose Logging our Redwoods".

1971 271st day - 94 days follow

Cloudy and showery. Up by 7:20. Bill went into school around 10, after leaving Jeep for "tune-up". Dave spent morning working on redwoods article. I did two loads of washing. After lunch Dave took my car to go home to get cleaned up before going to Board of Super. meeting by 3. Ray Peart phoned meanwhile that subject of coauthors (AB 1471) would have to be postponed a week because man to make presentation (B. Murley from Santa Cruz) could not be there. I had to phone the phone chain all over again!

up by 7:30. Rain most of ¹⁹⁷¹ day. 272nd day - 93 days follow

Yom Kippur—Day of Atonement

Dave finished writing his redwood article and I began typing it. 3 rough drafts later, about 3 P.M., it was ready to mail to Golden Gate North. He took my car to go to Arcata post office. Heavy, heavy rain at times - so good to see.

After dinner Dave and I walked to his place and back. Light rain at times, then when we reached Luffenholtz on the way back, it really rained. We got well soaked the last miles, but it was fun - warm - no bother.

Storm clearing.

1971 273rd day - 92 days follow

Beautiful morning! Bill up at 6:45 for 8 o'clock class.

Dave and I walked to his place, then found his car wouldn't start, so we made a cup of coffee and waited, then he tried the car again. No luck. No choice but to walk back. Walked to West Haven P.O. at 1:45, then went up Scenic Drive to overtake Dave, who was walking home again. He got 2 miles - the Baker Ranch Rd.

Back home again for lunch - finally - at 2:30. Changed clothes and headed for Arcata at 3:15. Dave showered and headed for Eureka at same time. (His car FINALLY started!)

Left car to Dave new tire put on. Went to Atty. Larry Truitt's office at 3:30 -- waited for him until 3:55, then had to leave to meet Dwight May at post office at 4. (Truitt got tied up at court house.)

Dwight, his wife and I went to the Minner Bell to talk over a project (proposed) over many cups of coffee. Dave found us there and we discussed timber taxes - mostly.

Home again by 6. Dinner by 7. Walked to Baker Ranch and back - 4 miles - with 3/4 moon. Beautiful evening! Bill went as far as Luffenholtz Beach.

OCTOBER

1

FRIDAY

Up at 7:10. Beautiful morning! 1971 274th day - 91 days follow

Bill went into school for a meeting, about 10. We dropped Dave, MT and me near the mouth of the Mad River, as we planned to walk home via the beach. Had to get Rhea (Hannah) to help us, by way of a friendly neighbor, find access to river edge at high tide. Walked through the beautiful sand dunes, then the rest of the way along the water's edge. Warm enough to take my shirt off to get the sun for a few miles. Wading Little River turned out to be a surprise. Dave went into a channel that reached his armpits. I went downstream and managed to crawl in water to mid-thigh. Very hungry by the time we got to house, around 12:30.

Dave spent night here.

SATURDAY

2

OCTOBER

FLCOW
1971 275th day - 90 days follow

Up by 8. Worked around kitchen, then went for quick walk on such a beautiful day. Bob Kirby breezed in for a few minutes in mid-day. Fixed up materials for a big salad to take to Seaside Club pot-luck and then all of us got busy getting our camping gear and food lined up - then packed into car. We planned to leave right from meeting place in Arcata and drive to an overnight camp site on the Big Mountain road - near Del Loma on Hwy. 299 - Bright Fair number (about 50-60) in attendance at meeting. Ron Eber, Campus rep. was guest speaker. Dave presented northward problems, such as Redwoods, Salmon-Trinity Wilderness, Siskiyou Wilderness, Wild Rivers. I talked briefly about Butte Valley, coastlines, and nuclear plants and proposed developments in Mendocino and Del Norte Counties.

We left the meeting sometime after nine and drove in clear, bright moonlight all the way - until we found a suitable place to throw out sleeping bags - roughly 23 miles of Forest Service road. Nearly one o'clock before we bedded down.

OCTOBER

3

SUNDAY

Near China Peak - Trinity Natl. Forest.

Woke up around 7. Warmer than ¹⁹⁷¹ 276th day - 89 days follow expected as we prepared simple breakfast and enjoyed view of lightly "sugar-coated" mountains. A few deer hunters drove by us in early, early morning.

By 9:30 we were ready to hit the trail. Bill's foot began bothering him so he returned to jeep and change of shoes, and plans for day. Dave, AT and I struck out for China Peak, Brushy Mt. and Green Mt. We walked entirely on logging roads or jeep trails - up and down - quite steep in places. Snow at higher places, some melting off fast in afternoon sun. We were within a mile or so of Green Mt. when we decided it was time to turn back.

All day we met just one deer hunter - in a jeep pickup and met him again on our return near Brushy Mt. trail junction.

Bill had moved the jeep - pre-arranged - to the end of an old logging road. We reached the jeep at 6:45. We must have covered better than 15 miles.

We had an excellent dinner, prepared on camp stove (on tailgate): steak, zucchini, mixed salad, and coffee. Moonlight again.

Headed home at 8 - home by 11:30 after quick gas and coffee stop in Willow Creek. Some fog near home.

MONDAY

4

OCTOBER

1971

277th day - 88 days follow

Succoth

Foggy. Up before 8. Bill left for school around 9:30. Dave and I cleaned up camp gear - and made phone calls - and received phone calls - Otto Teller, Gary Eister (who would come by), writing on redwoods for Friends of Earth; Gordon Robinson - others. Went walking in moonlight - but only as far as Luffenbally Beach and back. Gorgeous, almost balmy evening.

OCTOBER

5

TUESDAY

Foggy until nearly noon. 1971 278th day - 87 days follow
Up at 6:45 - An 8 o'clock day for Bill.

WEDNESDAY

6

OCTOBER

1971 279th day - 86 days follow

Up by 7:30. Foggy much of day. ~~Had a lot~~ Many phone calls regarding the HSC Women's Club fair. Long talk, too, with Elizabeth Hegy about undergrounding of utilities and conservation in general. Dashed up to Dave's for wilderness photos, then into Arcata by 3:15 to talk to attorney Larry Truitt about happenings at Moonstone Beach. Went then to the Environmental Center on an errand, then home. Grabbed a bite of dinner, leaving Dave and Bill to cope with things later while I spent evening at the HSC Women's Club activities fair.

Campus torn up for construction of new student union building, so had to make several trips from library parking lot up to old cafeteria with all the display materials for Audubon and Science Club. Very foggy driving in to town.

Fair lasted until after 10. Took some time to get everything back to car, but had some help.

Drove up to Dave's for coffee. He and Bill drove up, too. Bill went home around 11:30. I left my car and Dave and I walked to Moonstone, arriving at 1:20.

Up at 8 o'clock. Bill gone by 1971 280th day - 85 days follow
7:40. Foggy right to shoreline nearly all day -
and fog very low at times. At 9:45 Dave & I walked fast
to his place so I could retrieve my car. We hurried into
Eureka to pick up a sharpened chainsaw which had to be de-
livered to a gal at HSC. Home for lunch.

Dave not feeling too good (headache) so he rested on
couch. I took him home around 3:30.

Managed to get two loads of washing done - between
phone calls.

Talked with Otto Teeler and Gladwyn Hill (of the
New York Times staff), who was driving north.

Dave here for dinner and then he went home
awhile -- only to return ^{again} around 9:20.

Bill went to a meeting at the college at 7:15.
We worked on resolutions for Ex Com. meeting, then
walked to Baker's Ranch rd. and back - 4 miles.

Up by 8. Foggy again, but only
after greeting a clear, bright morning - up until 9.
Dave & I drove to Trinidad at 9:30 to have breakfast
and talk with Gladwyn Hill and wife Ellacita. (They
had already had breakfast in Eureka).

Dave traded cars, at school, with Bill - in order to
drive into the Siskiyou area. I typed resolutions and
prepared to go to Santa Rosa. Meanwhile, Bill Devall
phoned to report he was to remain "down" with hepatitis.
I phoned Dr. Frank's office about getting gamma globulin.
Dusty Rhodes came by for Audubon material. Mr. Devall (Sr.)
brought material from Bill.

Bill V. got home about time I was leaving - 2:30.
2 brief stops in Eureka, one for gas in Rio Dell, one
for gas and dinner in Ukiah, then managed to be only
 $\frac{1}{2}$ hr. late for meeting at Western Savings Bank in
Coddingtontown. Foggy until Southern Humboldt, then
clear & warm. Lots of traffic - a 3 day weekend!
Meeting lasted until 12:30.

Wilderness & legal action resolutions were
approved.

Stopped in Ukiah for late snack - and
gasoline - from 2 - 2:30.

Still foggy! Stopped twice ¹⁹⁷¹ for brief naps - once near a Laytonville rest stop and once, until daylight at 7, near Sylvan Dale. Arrived home 8:30. Dave and Bill still asleep.

After breakfast and a phone call we all went to Frank's office for our gamma globulin shot - which Elaine arranged for in advance.

Dave and I managed to get in 9 miles of hiking and he ended up spending the night with us.

At 2:30 P.M. Roland Wentzel arrived to discuss a proposed fisheries experiment for Widow White Creek in McKinleyville. He was here at least 2 hours.

1971 283rd day - 82 days follow

All of us slept late - 9:40 or so. Dave went home around 12. Bill and I took some lunch snacks and ~~camping~~ ^{collecting} equipment and headed for Butte Valley at 1. Fog extended way inland. Mad River was lovely, running fast and clear (though low) where we drove onto a large privately owned gravel bar at a spot where a small creek entered. Lovely arched bridges provided passage over small stream and the river. Brilliant red poison oak clumps, on rocky banks, reflected in any still water, while sparkling bright yellow maples brought colorful relief from the grey skies.

Bill collected from the stream's edge, while I walked along the gravel bar. A few other people had parked on the gravel bar, also - mostly fishermen.

We were homeward bound again around 3:30. Bill dropped me off at Bill Devalls place - near Trinidad, where we found the place by locating Dave's pickup.

Dave and I walked to Moonstone. Bill and I quickly prepared to eat, dress, etc. and got to the Audubon Wildlife film presentation by Wilf Grey - "British Columbia - Mountains to the Sea". Beautiful film. Home by 9 o'clock.

Dave, who had had dinner here and then gone home, returned briefly around 9:30-10:30. Then went I finished home again - for the night.

Still foggy. (55°) Bill and I ¹⁹⁷¹ were up around 8. 284th day - 81 days follow
 Columbus Day
 Dave and I arrived on foot around 8:30 or so.

(In District of Columbia and some States)

Dave declared himself the winner of the weight reduction competition. This morning he hit his desired goal of 160 before I hit my goal of 130. Bill was off to school by 9:30. At 11 Dave and I hiked to Trinidad. I took some S.C. material to Ken at the school, then Dave drove me back home.

Quick lunch and a few phone calls, then we were off to Eureka on errands. Home again by 4.

Made a large beef stew for dinner. Dave was here, but left at 7:15 to attend a program by Donna (Hankins) about Butte Valley - presented to Environmental Center type audience - and others - at the CES Auditorium. He was back by 9 and went home around 10.

I finished a long (5 page, typed) letter to Mike.

Some sunshine broke through for a short time around noon.

1971 285th day - 80 days follow Low fog, but clearing
 Columbus Day Briefly around noon.

An 8 o'clock day for Bill, though I didn't get up until about 8 since he had brought the cat back in for me to snuggle. Worked around house all morning. Several phone calls - some for Dave.

Slid errands in town, then drove home to leave groceries and proceeded to Dave's place to leave the car. We walked to Moonstone before dinner, then I walked back very late so I could bring the car back home.

Dave came barreling down to the house before I even got my shoes off. We all drove back to his place to see what had "un-nerved" him. No problem, but it was a late night. In bed around 1:30.

Dave and I attended a brief session on the Redwood Park master plan "preview" by Supt. Jack Davis. It Sponsored by Eureka Jaycees in the City Council Chambers.

We had coffee later at Stanton's - in time for Dave to return a phone call to Bob Curry in Minors.

Foggy. We all slept late - 9:30. 1971 286th day - 79 days follow

Went to Eureka on errands, around 3, after Glenn Berry, Elizabeth Hegy and I had spent a couple of hours cruising the scenic drive in order to plan our strategy for setting boundary lines for an underground utilities district.

Home by 6 to put some potatoes in oven, drive to Davis' place, leave car, and walk home for dinner - which was ~~late~~ because of a string of phone calls.

We got in our return walk, under cool, crisp, starry skies around 10:30 - 11:15 and I brought the car back home.

1971 287th day - 78 days follow

Up by 7:45. Beautiful day - though afternoon got breezy. Left for Eureka at 9:30 to attend a meeting with the Public Works Director and the "undergrounding of utilities" committee. We (3 property owners) presented our boundaries for consideration. Attending were reps. from P.T.T.Co.; P.G.E. a PR telephone man from Sacramento and several other people including the C.A.O. and the County Counsel.

Went to assessors office later to get copies of maps showing ownership of parcels south of Little River along beach. Had lunch with Frances Sinnott of Stanton. Did a lot of shopping in Eureka and Arcata, including a new shirt & blouse. Home by 4.

Dave spent entire day on Simpson Timber Co. sponsored field trip - as they considered a new version of an alternate clear cut plan. He arrived for dinner exhausted and dozed out on the couch at 9:30.

Bill, also, went to bed before 10.

Many phone calls regarding ^{weekend} outing and other conservation issues.

Fair - to start - on coast.

Up by 8. Bill went into his office ¹⁹⁷¹ 288th day - 77 days follow around 9:30. Dave and I prepared to leave for Yreka by one o'clock. Made a quick dash to Tumidex for last minute foods for backpack trip. Quick dash also to Weckharen P.O. to meet UPS truck with huge carton of stationery from Kroll Engraving. MT stayed home - to be with Bill all weekend. Made gas stop first as leaving town, then a quick snack stop in Willow Creek as we decided to go 96 - the Klamath River Highway.

Beautiful drive - new to me from Happy Camp to junction 8 miles above Yreka. Snow on mountains, 3000'.

Changed clothes in camper, parked outside Shamrock Inn. Helped Dave sort slides of Trinity Alps Wilderness. We sat at head table with Tom Lewis (FS-Yreka) chairman of Shasta Chapter, Soc. of Amer. Foresters, and Gary Morgan (FS-Yreka), program chairman. Dave was "the program" after opening remarks about Redwood Chapter and the Sierra Club in General, which I was called on to do.

Dave was detained later by many, including Forest Supervisor (Klamath) Dan Abraham. We didn't get away until after midnight. Very cold - B-R-R!!

We drove north to Medford, then to Jacksonville, then to Luck and, in a heavy ground fog, finally pulled off the road at 2:45 to sleep - about 10 miles short of Cooke + Green Campground.

mailed paints and brushes to Mike Moran for his birthday - the 22nd.

¹⁹⁷¹ 289th day - 76 days follow

Still very foggy - and cool - when we got rolling around 8 o'clock. Traffic, while still very early - and dark - has been disturbing - probably deer hunters. Also, turkey farms began their "gobble-gobble". Fixed breakfast and packed packs at the Campground. Roger Willenrath + Steve Cole already there. Others arrived and everyone was on the trail by 10:30. The sun was breaking through to provide good hiking weather, even though fingers and toes were numb for the first $\frac{1}{2}$ mile.

Most of us made a lunch stop at the "Tool Shed" after 5 beautiful miles along the Butte Fork. Brilliant yellow maples and deeply colored dogwood splashed against all the greenery. Many of us photographed one particularly choice grouping, complete with deep, rich blue sky in background - somewhere around Hell's Canyon.

Dave raced ahead and even I passed all the others to where I was alone, going slowly and enjoying every lovely mile of trail through cedar and pine forest. Arrived at Agella Lake around 3:45 -- a small (about 2 acres), pretty lake that others found good for fishing in evening.

We set up camps before sundown and got small fires started. Snow was patchy at 5400 ft. and as it was now clear and windy at times the temperature dropped fast as darkness came on. It was a 10 mile hike to the lake. Fish caught by some of the Medford group were Eastern Brook Trout, 8-9" in length.

We had a "cocktail hour", then a very simple dinner followed by campfire chatter concerning wilderness "strategy"... Bruce Kennedy from Sacramento, John Hennings, North Group, the Meyers from Ashland and others. In the tent by 9:30.

OCTOBER

17

SUNDAY

22° at 7:15, according to Bruce's thermometer.

Clear and cold (32°) at 8. 1971 290th day - 75 days follow

I waited until the sun hit the tent before getting up. Bruce headed home right after breakfast. Dave and I went up on the ridge then to near Pyramid Peak and almost to Fir Glade, a distance of $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles one way. Much smoke in air - no good for photographing.

Some good views, but too many ridges have been logged already.

Light lunch back at lake, then we headed back down the trail around 2 o'clock. It was a beautiful hike out. We arrived at the car before 6 - a whole hour ahead of the rest. It was dark when the last ones reached their cars.

We drove to Medford, had a hamburger, then stopped at the F.S. Tree of Heaven campground on the Klamath River Highway, folding up rather early.

MONDAY

18

OCTOBER

1971

291st day - 74 days follow

Awoke by 7:30 - a busy, popular camping area for fishermen. We had a good breakfast and were underway by 9:45. At Horse Creek we took a F.S. road that went along the East Fk. Seiad Creek up to the summit near Red Butte. We hiked from the end of the road, above Lily Pad Lake, up into the snow on the ridge for a better view. Had lunch after I had collected a vial of algae from the shallow, Lily pad covered, water-dog "Heaven" small lake. Evidence of cattle in area. Went back to a junction where trail took us to Copper Butte. We hiked to nearly the top. Watched road building equipment working below us after spotting a smoke plume in area much earlier. Wind got fiercer and sky looked threatening so we headed down off the mountain. Phoned Bill from Orleans.

Light dinner in Willow Creek - home by 8:30 or so. Dave spent the night on couch. I was back in bed after a bath and shampoo.

The drive back along the Klamath was very revealing - it's a terrific river - ever-changing its character.

Total mileage for trip was 550.

OCTOBER

19

TUESDAY

Heavy rain during night.

1971

292nd day - 73 days follow

A grey, rainy, cool day.

Bill up and away by 7:45. Dressed for town, in warm skirt & sweater. Did several errands and some shopping in both Eureka and Arcata. Took groceries home, changed clothes, drove to Dave's place so we could do the Moonstone walk.

Dinner early, then we went to Eureka High for Butte Valley presentation by Northwest Env. Center and Col. Roberts from Corps of Engineers District office. Questions and answers lasted until 10:30.

Walked to Luffenholtz with MT. Dave started, but headache plagued him. Bill drove him home, picking me up on the way.

Very clear tonight.

WEDNESDAY

20

OCTOBER

1971

293rd day - 72 days follow

Up at 8. Foggy. Started some washing. Took all day to finish because the phone was so busy - all conservation, except for Thelma Kivimäki around 6 PM. She disturbed about 50 plants on redwood park. Dinner around 8. Dave here for night.

OCTOBER

21

THURSDAY

Fair

Stayed in bed until 8. 1971 294th day - 71 days follow
 Dave took Bill to school because Jeep was misbehaving - a broken hose or something.

Did more washing.

Dave here much of day typing Eco-news letter material. I managed to do two items before 5 PM.

Falling low at dinner time. Dave went home early -- 8:30

Rested and read awhile on living room couch, then got up to do the dinner dishes.

In bed by 11.

OCTOBER

40° low - 63° high

1971

295th day - 70 days follow

A grey morning, looking like rain when we got up at 8:30 after hearing rattling around in the kitchen -- Dave and MT had washed down. Bill took Dave home as he went to school around 10. I re-typed the news letter material - all four pages - by 12:30. Took rain coat, but didn't need it walking to Dave's place 12:45 - 1:30. The Aubins were driving by near Sufferbottz Beach and stopped for a few minutes talk. The ocean was rough and beautiful. It was pleasantly warm, walking at a fast pace.

Dave gave me 1 oz. cheddar cheese, 1 oz. smoked salmon, an assortment of Vitamin supplements and I headed home again at 1:55, arriving 2:35.

Started ironing at 2:45 after having "pep-up" and a cottage cheese-peas salad. Light rain began at 3. At 4 o'clock I drove up the road to get Dave and do a few errands in Airstar. We were back again, just ahead of Bill, around 5.

Dinner was fairly early - Dave stayed and ended up sleeping on couch. We decided against a rainy "walk-home". In bed by 12 after doing exercises.

At 8:40 Dave & I & MT walked to his place, arriving 9:20 - over usual time, 40 min. Doug home. We had coffee and/or chocolate and listened to a couple of records after Bill came at 9:30.

Home by 10 - did dishes, bathed, and tried on $\frac{1}{2}$ dozen dresses and skirts to see what needed hemming up. Thin enough now to wear many things, long left in closet!

Bob Schneider and Ann Jeffries were here in early afternoon - on way to Owick for work on Redwood Creek problems for Sierra Club.

Up by 7:45. Beautiful, clear, crisp cold morning. Weighed in at 130#. Nav - for 125? Hemmed up a new skirt before noon.

Bill walked almost to Sufferbatty Beach with me before turning back. Jim & Phyllis Koplin pulled up soon after I had departed from Bill. We talked about Lake Texoma and Yellow Bay, etc. etc. for nearly $\frac{1}{2}$ hr. Got to Dave's at 1:25. Had a fresca, delivered some wood to Bill Devall's place, then he & I walked back to Moonstone. He watched football on TV until 4, then I drove him home and went on to Saunders Mkt. in Trinidad - needed some eggs.

Bill and I got busy cooking our Chinese style dinner to take up to Bill Devall around 6. All we had to do was warm things up a bit - up there - before indulging in sweet & sour pork (Bill's specialty), "choo choo fried rice" (from Joyce Chen's book) and green beans with almond slivers, which I prepared.

Dave & Doug had dinner with us. Back home - to sterilize dishes - by 8 o'clock. Anthea phoned to "chat" awhile - as I continued doing dishes. Bill busy typing.

Walked to Dave's doorstep and back in just $1\frac{1}{2}$ hrs - between 2:10 and 3:40. Warm walking. Ocean pretty calm today - colors: blue streak and green streak - lovely, lovely. Saw $\frac{1}{2}$ doz. pelicans at Baker's beach.

Dave came in around 5. Bill had a late committee meeting and didn't get home until 6:30 or so.

Dave and I left at 9:30 or thereabouts to leave his car at his place and walk back. One half moon made for fairly nice walking. Quite a bit warmer than the clear sky indicated.

Up before 8. Light rain. Cool. Bill gone by 7:45. Took Dave home around 9. Made phone calls and received several calls. Did not get to Supervisors meeting until 2:45 - though I had wanted to go in much earlier. Hemmed up dark blue faille coat due to wear to the symphony tonight.

Board chambers packed with supporters of SB1471, the coastal protection bill, which was being discussed by the board. They decided, after many, (most) pro-statements, to prepare amendments to be written into the bill. One would exclude San Boldt Bay; another would place one more local official on the regional commission, if the bill passed into law. Home around 5:40 after doing an errand or two and getting some groceries.

Dave came down for dinner. We quickly changed clothes after dinner and headed for McKinleyville to pick up Jeanie Kirby, who would be going to concert with us.

The San Antonio Symphony Orchestra began promptly at 8:15 at the Eureka High Auditorium. It was a packed house and the group was received with great enthusiasm and gave a splendid program. Vito Alessandro conducted; Ronald Turini was guest pianist. Great evening.

Very cool when I left at 11:25 with Vicki breezes along ocean. 40 min. to Dave's place. Rested 20 min. then returned in about 42 min. Had lunch, read mail, made phone call to Shirley B. and Bill Devall, then got out sewing machine to begin hemming another skirt.

Fixed corned beef and cabbage for dinner. Dave here all evening - too tired to go to meeting.

Went to Ex Corn meeting at 7:30 at Curvion Center. Home by 10:30.

Up by 8 o'clock. Clear, but ¹⁹⁷¹ 302nd day - 63 days follow a few pink wisps out over ocean. Cold, but little, if any, frost here.

Dave and I went flying (12:10 - 1:30) at 15,000' over headwaters of, and part of Redwood Creek watershed. 8° F. - down off for photo flight. We froze!

Lunch in Arcata, then did a few errands. Home by 3:30 to start fixing things for dinner - expecting Howard King.

Made a lemon gelatin molded Waldorf salad - which was delicious.

Dave here for dinner and most of evening.

Bill showed tape Montane "historical" slides, plus his helicopter - High Sierra trip.

Howard slept in his new VW bus - parked in front of our garage.

Sneezed all afternoon and evening and also sniffled my way to bed by midnight.

¹⁹⁷¹ 303rd day - 62 days follow

Cloudy. Up by 8. Howard already had coffee brewing. After breakfast he headed ~~north~~ south for Humboldt Redwoods St. Pa.

Bill not feeling too hot - gave up his "pond" trip with Vic.

Went walking between showers after ~~lunch~~ before dinner, returning just at dark. Howard had returned. We

joined together a very late dinner.

Dave here, too, but he finally went home - late, after we had taken short walk to Sufferbalty Beach.

SUNDAY in morning.

up before 8. Howard and I ¹⁹⁷¹ 304th day - 61 days follow
 left ^{Harlowen} by 9 to go over the east ridge

 everything fresh from rain. Put on chains to

Got up somewhat earlier than usual. Woke up around 7 - hungry! Got two loads of washing done. Slapped in M.K. Went for walk with MT from about 3:30 to 5:00 - up to Dave's place and back. He wrote ^{and delivered} a news release about Eureka City Council's environmentally unanimous vote on the 5 megaton test blast on Amchitka Island, scheduled this week.

He also had his latest negatives from yesterday's photo flight over Redwood Creek. The slopes above the park boundary look pretty barren! Horrible! The shots were taken from 3000 ft.

Did some reading and writing after getting dinner.

Lovely day. Up by 7:45 ¹⁹⁷¹ 308th day - 57 days follow
Went for walk to Trinidad and back
in early afternoon.

1971 309th day - 56 days follow

a lovely morning. Clear and
crisp. Bill went into the college at 11 - just before I
returned from my 6 mile walk to Trinidad and back.
Dene was busy all day with people and photos and
phone calls.

At 2 o'clock I left for Ukiah with stops
en route in Mck., Rio Dell (to see Kurt) and there
had been a quick errand in Eureka.

Lovely afternoon to be travelling. Had dinner
at Denny's at my Ukiah exit from freeway - around
6:30 and got to the meeting place, the county
library just ahead of some other arrivals, around
7:30.

Phil Kay was given my letter, but he didn't get
onto the subject of my called for resignation until
very late - and then he really came uncorked --
it seemed such a difficult task. He called for a
vote of confidence after much discussion about
the conservation chairman's role. Ken nearly blew
his cork, too. It was wild! It was sick!
Kurt came to my defence, loudly and firmly.
The vote by ballot supported Phil.

When all the ruffled feathers were down again
we got on to conservation items and wound up
at 12:30. I went to the Whitneys for a
couple of hours - Cileen had to hear the
whole affair - after munching and drinking
groceries, they fueled my thermos with coffee.
I left at 2:45 but could only drive as far
as Willits due to fog and wipers not working.

Woke up cold at quarter to six. Fog ¹⁹⁷¹ still thick, but after a cup of hot coffee I decided to give it a try. Very slow going - visibility almost zero - until out of the valley. However, heavy patches of fog were encountered all the way until near Fortuna. Stopped to close my eyes again briefly near the Bull Creek Road. Heavy frost between Rio Dell and Fortuna. Fall colors were splendid through the redwood area - dogwood, maples, poison oak. Many, many dead deer on roadway - 2 were small bucks. Ravens were feasting this day!

Home at 9 o'clock. Bill was up, Dave was gone - to airport - and I headed straight to bed.

Slept until after 12. Bill Deval came in around 1:30. We had received a phone call from Kurt Munchheim and got the story of last night's hassle at the meeting and he seemed more determined to go for separate Chapter status.

Bill (V.) and I took a walk. I went all the way to Dave's place; Bill only as far as Sufferbath Beach. Beautiful afternoon - ocean calm. Spent about $\frac{1}{2}$ hr. talking with Doug. Jamie Kirby came by me on the road - and picked up so we could talk while watching the sinking sun. Home about 5:20. It was already chilly and I was glad I had taken a jacket.

Bill went to the S.C. program. We had a large screen to take in, borrowed from HSC audio-visual center.

311th day - 54 days follow

~~Woke~~ rather early up fairly early - for a Sunday - about 7:30. Worked around house and garden. Bill ~~stayed~~.

Walked to Trinidad and back in mid-afternoon. Dave appeared before dinner after putting people on plane. He was exhausted from 2 hectic days - on the ground and in the air with Jim Neovman, Fred Fisher and Gordon Robinson.

Lovely pink sky early morning.

Up around 6:30 - all of us getting an early start today. Some cloudiness.

With topo map in hand and Dave with camera in pack, we hit the trail - all the way to Bridge Creek, a distance of 10.7 miles. A light snack there and then we returned, watching closely for any spoiled views, especially from stream level - which we did from Bond Creek on down, cross crossing the low water.

Went up to Davis place for dinner - at 6 - Bill came home early. I stayed to begin writing newsletter material, then around 11 Dave brought me home and remained the night.

¹⁹⁷¹ 327th day - 38 days follow up around 7 o'clock. A grey, very cloudy, misty morning. As soon as breakfast was over I started typing my contributions for the SC newsletters, then began typing Dave's finished material. By 2 PM we had 5 pages ready for the printer. Dave took them into Arcata to Editor of the Ecorenewsletters Jim Text. It began raining lightly around noon, then picked up around 4. Between 3 and 4:45 Dave, MT and I walked to his place and back. We needed our rain gear. Could smell the pulp-mill odors along scenic drive - coming to us on a warm wind.

A relaxed evening - no pressures - only a few phone calls. Dave made a big batch of chocolate chip cookies while I was doing the dishes.

up by 7. Took Bill into ¹⁹⁷¹ 328th day - 37 days follow

Dr Gaylord's office by 9. Went shopping for an hour while operation took place. Did a couple of errands afterwards and had coffee at DeCamp's before returning home around noon. Did grocery shopping in A.M.

Went walking from 3-5. Ocean beautifully rough.

Dave was in before dinner - and after dinner - and he picked up the redwood "flyer" from Greyhound in A.M. at 9:45.

A dark, grey morning. Didn't wake up until 8:15.

Raining most of day. Up by 7:30, but Bill and "pooty-cat" didn't come downstairs until 10:30.

Wrote some letters and notes to go with park master plan hearing notice.

Jon Krupp came in during afternoon to work on algae "plates" and stayed remainder of evening.

Dave prepared a vegetable and meat dish for dinner - He and Doug here from 6:30 until nearly 11.

Bill stayed up all day.

Put up him on good royal blue Pendleton dress. No walk today - too much rain.

Bill Lathan phoned - passing through area on way home to Orinda.

up before 8. Had rained during night. 1971 332nd day - 33 days follow

First Sunday in Advent

Cloudy and very grey. Left at 9:30 to walk to Trinidad, but didn't get any farther than Luffenholtz Beach parking area for about an hour. I was recognized by a woman coming from trail to car. It was Dolores Dodd from Oakland. She had been on S.C. "Redwood Special" in 1967. Chatted long time and ended up being loaned a book by her friend Ilse Weinberg, also a teacher in an Oakland elementary. The recent book - from London - was about naturalists. We found usable quotes from Baron von Humboldt and others that pertained to forested lands and their needed protection. Stopped briefly at Daves - at 11 - then walked back with OT along. Dave passed us later and was at the house watching TV football.

Did some typing, then some phoning for news letter work party help.

Picked Dave up before 6 and spent next 3 hours folding, stapling, addressing - at the home of Jim Test in Arcata. At least 8 of us got the thing (1000 copies) ready for mailing.

Home by 10. Raining again - or still - after starting around 3 o'clock.

1971 333rd day - 32 days follow

Raining off and on all day.

Left at 9:30 to get Bill to Dr. Gaylord's office at 10. Dave went into town with us to do errands after getting Bill to an 11 o'clock class.

Took kids back to rent-all place, then picked up table leaves at BIX, having been stripped. (The table was not quite ready.)

Home by 2. Dave took phone calls from Don Samuta and Rod Tuttle and typed up some memos to the club office.

Went in for Bill at 5.

Jon Krupp worked on algae drawings all evening.

Dave went to Env. Center meeting.

up before 8. Storm over.

1971 334th day - 31 days follow

Skies clear. Everything sparkling. Bill able to drive himself to school today.

Dave + OTT Showed up mid-morning. MT and I walked to his place at 1:05, arriving 1:45.

At 2:30 the 3 of us walked back so we could get started writing statements for hearing. Bill home well before 5. Took Dave home at 5:30 so he could get some stuff to Bill Devall and try to see Dean Ireland, then get back here for dinner at 7. Lots of phone calls in regard to forest practices hearing + field trip next Monday + Tuesday.

Beautiful full moon - some wind at midnight when he got ready for bed.

1971 335th day - 30 days follow

Fair, but skies clouded during day. Jeanie Kirby joined Dave and me on a scouting trip ^{with} to photograph stream damage by careless logging around McGarvey and Tarup creeks - both tributaries to Klamath River. Many slopes absolutely denuded, then burned - looked worse than battle field. This was Simpson Land and the network of roads, plus tangle of cat roads made it appear that a cat moved each tree out by running right up to it, taking everything else in its path. Great piles of debris left at log landings. Many slides, wash outs and slip-outs occurring on their road system. Operations were active in the vicinity. Equipment parked here and there and one Doug fir loaded truck came down a steep road near us. Some culverts has been washed out - some were ready to be placed at stream crossings. But on small streams there was evidence that cats had used the stream bed as a roadway.

Home by 3:30 after tea and cookies with Jean Hagood in brick and after a very exciting stop near the north end of Big Lagoon. Jeanie spotted the rush of water into the ocean. The Lagoon had broken open! First time for any of us to be on the spot so soon after it happened. Hundreds of water were being swept backwards into the great waves as the water rushed seaward. We hiked down a trail to the beach for a close look.

Dave here for dinner.

Waking by 7:30. Raining. 1971 336th day - 29 days follow

Hard rain during night awakened me. Jean Hagood drove Dave and me to Crescent City, from Quick. Alison Binder with us. Dick Warron (from Morton Arboretum near Chicago) was at Jean's.

A brief stop at Seaside Hospital so Jean and Alison could each see a patient, then a quick hamburger at Denny's before the Master Plan hearings began at 1:30 at Del Norte Co. fairgrounds.

About 10 people presented statements and the feeling was strong against any expansion of the park - and the Master Plan "concept" was generally acceptable by city & county agencies.

Dave was feeling pretty lousy so we decided not to remain for the evening session.

Had problems with windshield wipers on Falcon and had to get them working before driving home from Quick.

Jon Knapp was here to work on algae drawings.

Dave put his sleeping bag on the couch. I put mine on the living room floor, folding up around midnight.

I rained most of the evening.

1971 337th day - 28 days follow

Up by 7 o'clock in order to get to typewriter as fast as Dave got statement started. After 2 rough draft typings, editing, etc. and frustrations over plane arrivals to meet Ed Wayburn and Martin Linton, we managed to get something in final form and get to Eureka by 2 P.M. Showery all day.

Hearings in C. L. Zane Jr. High School Auditorium. Ed & Martin gave marvelous comments and criticisms. I presented a very brief statement in my own behalf. About 22 presentations were made. Jean Hagood observed. Alison was quiet.

We had dinner at Eureka Seaford Gratts following the end of the afternoon session at 5 P.M.

Ed & Martin had a rent car and caught the evening flight back to SF at 7:15.

Dave presented Sierra Club statement early and in 10 minute time limit did exceedingly well, because he had to "cut" here and there.

We got home around 10. Dave "flashed out" on couch almost immediately. Bill had remained at home all evening.

Storm clearing. Did some ¹⁹⁷¹ washing, then headed out to walk to Trinidad around one o'clock. Dave came by as I got mail from box with note from Ursula Holstius that "Memo" (Mrs. Sawyer) had died.

Made cookies while Bill ate dinner, which was rather late - after 8.

Long Angus received call from his father - he would be going home tomorrow.

Pooty-cat brought us a small lizard.

Cold, clear and frosty white. Had an awful headache so didn't accomplish much all day. Bill was gone by 7:45. This was the day for the stitches to be removed from his toe.

Dave came by to make some phone calls. He left N.T. to walk with me to Trinidad P.O. We left at 12:45 - and then left Dave's at 1:20 minus Music Temple. Very brisk walking. Ocean quite calm.

Around 3 I went to Arcata with Dave for some shopping at Whole Earth Foods, got some topo maps and tried on hiking boots at A.T.A., then got some groceries at McK. - after a brief stop - for Dave - on campus.

Beautiful pink sky at dusk - and turning cold.

Dave here for dinner - then he went home around 9.

Up by 7:30. Worked around ¹⁹⁷¹ 324th day - 41 days follow the house ^{Feast of Immaculate Conception} and did some pruning in ocean-side garden. Dave had dropped by briefly - consumed a cup of coffee - and headed for Northwest Regional Water Quality Control Board meeting in Eureka.

It began raining around noon - but only lightly. Went to Arcata for errands and shopping from 3 - 4:30, (when the rain got quite heavy and continued heavy most of evening.) Got 2 big ($2\frac{1}{2}\#$) fresh Crab (Dungeness) for dinner.

Ate early in order to get to ExCom meeting in Arcata at 6:30. Turned out Bill Dwall came by and I rode with him.

Home by 9:10. Jon Knapp here working on drawings until midnight.

Rain quite heavy at times.

1971

343rd day - 22 days follow

Up at 7:45. The sweet, warm, silly cat spent most of the night sleeping with me, sometimes way down in the sleeping bag.

Clear for a short time, then it began clanking up and raining again - often quite heavy showers.

Dave came by for awhile - around 10-10:30 or so.

Worked around house - Wrote long letter to Greg Kroll.

Dave here in late afternoon - up until time we left for Blue Lake to keep dinner engagement with Carol and Dave Garber at 7. Dave G. now with Six Rivers N.F. as wildlife biologist. Mike Rains, also FS, (hydrologist) was other guest. Had good evening - Home by 12.

Rain. Worked around house. 1971 344th day - 21 days follow

Bill went in to school around 10. Dave made a very brief appearance in mid-morning. At 1:40 I headed for town. Did a few errands in Eureka before going to a Norcoa (Health) Area Planning meeting at St. Joseph's Hospital. This was first meeting of committee headed by Supervisor Peart, handled by very capable young man and a young woman of regular staff. Meeting lasted until 5 o'clock.

Population, pollution, land-use were top items that committee decided to set (control) goal for.

Home by six. Dave & Bill here ahead of me.

Dave stayed for dinner, then went home to get things done - only to come back so he could be on tap in a.m. to go to Santa Rosa.

1971 345th day - 20 days follow

Alarm went off at 4:15. Left home at 4:30. Clear and sunny. Dave drove - we had sleep for day. Waited for John Hennings at Dennis's in Eureka. He had over slept his alarm. Cloudy in southern section. Arrived Santa Rosa meeting place (bank in Lodi town) at 10:10. (39°).

Meeting lasted until 5 P.M. !!! Sonoma Group approved by Chapter. Bill Devel not for it, but he couldn't vote. Ken & I remain on Ex Com for next 3 years.

Had nice dinner at Fjord's "Smorgette" in Ukiah. Gasoline & coffee stop at 9 in Garberville. Rain there and all the rest of way home. In at 10:30.

Bill & AT out for evening - (at Iris'.)
Dave and I piled into sleeping bags pretty fast. Did not wait up for Bill.

up around 8. Clearing, then cloudy. ¹⁹⁷¹ 346th day - 19 days follow

Dave, ^{Third Sunday in Advent} and I walked "briskly" to Baker's Ranch road and back between 9 and 10. Dave wanted to get back for football game on TV.

Foiled around house most of day.

Doug showed up. All here for dinner.

Heavy rain and hail most of afternoon and evening.

1971 347th day - 18 days follow

First Day of Chanukah

Fair. Cool. Bill got away early for 8 o'clock test.

Dave showed up, remained short time, then left MT here - so we walked to Davis place and back from 12 to 1:45. Doug was home splitting wood. We saw Sawney woodpecker, ^{a male} at close hand. Cleaned house after having lunch. Bill was home early, ahead of us.

Dave showed up again around 5 - went home, then he and Doug returned to watch Monday night football on TV - from 6-10.

John Krupp came out after dinner to work on decoupled plates (drawings). I clipped newspapers after cleaning up kitchen.

Cloudy and rainy nearly all day. ¹⁹⁷¹ 348th day - 17 days follow

Did some washing and housecleaning. Bill came home right after Jan Krupp arrived, around 4 and stayed all evening. Dave was in and out during entire day.

Carol + Vic Aubin showed up after our late dinner. Vic had some algae to look at under the microscope. John worked on drawings.

Bill got pretty drunk by 1 A.M. - then tried to keep me awake - until after 2 - arguing - and telling me I must leave. I continue to sleep downstairs.

Clear (-mostly) and cold.

Clouds over mountains. Up at 8:15. Went for walk from 1-3, roughly. Dave appeared a couple of times. I worked on old table, starting the re-finishing process. Did not feel like talking to anyone, especially Bill, after his inexcusable behavior last night.

Ate solitary dinner, then napped on couch.

Phoned Kay MacDonald around noon to let him know we couldn't make a Christmas visit in Tucson this year. He sounded terribly disappointed - just as I was.

After 8 when I got up! These 1971 350th day - 15 days follow

Clear and cool. Up at 8. Worked on old table, putting on final coats to legs, leaves, and top. Paul phoned from Arcata airport - would come by. Worked outside, pruning, trimming, etc. until Paul showed up. Talk over coffee, then he and I drove up Scenic Drive to look at land parcels he was eyeing, speculatively.

Went back to work in garden until nearly dark - and hands got cold. Carol + Vic Aubin (and Wade) dropped in. They had been down on Moonstone Beach until last bit of sunlight.

Ate alone. Made some good lemon cookies.

Mostly cloudy - or perhaps ¹⁹⁷¹ it was fog - or a mixture - off shore - and near the mountains. Did some washing while the water was not too discolored and before the next rains.

Walked to Trinidad post office and back. Ocean very calm. Much slippage on scenic drive - repairs needed almost daily. Grader almost went over as earth movement was under way - near Luffenbally Beach. Operator all "shook up" and grader needed repairs.

Made another type of cookie with mint flavored chocolate bits - before bedtime. Had napped after lone, early dinner, so had to get up and do something when my eyes tired from reading.

1971 355th day - 10 days follow

Cloudy. Rain began around noon. Gusty winds all day and until late into evening.

Worked around house much of morning, then decided to go shopping after lunch.

Got a new pair of hiking boots - this time I wore them home! (Fabianas).

Went on working around the house. Bill Devell here awhile.

Long Ayes dropped by around 9:30 - 10:00 P.M. He would be leading to Antioch for family Christmas before joining Dave on the 28th at Death Valley - (they would do some hiking - maybe Telescope Peak - weather permitting).

Rain extremely heavy around 1 A.M. High winds through night - house groaned!

up before 8 - in fact by 7:45 ¹⁹⁷¹ 356th day - 9 days follow

Extremely heavy downpours and very heavy winds (gale force) off and on all day and all evening.

Doug dropped in with foodstuffs from refrigerator - on his way home. Small VW due for buffeting about in high winds.

Chaired dining room while re-arranging it and waxing tile floor.

Bill went in for groceries after 3. I worked until 6. Ate alone again, then made some "new" prize winning - mince meat cookies.

Wrote letter on Redwood Park Master Plan.

Still raining; still windy at midnight.

¹⁹⁷¹ 357th day - 8 days follow Apparently stormed all night.

Gusty winds (up to 60 mph at Kailand) and heavy rains pelted the area all day and all evening.

Up by 8. Worked around house then walked to Dave's place, leaving at 10:40, arriving there 11:30 - then back in rain and against heavy winds, arriving at 12:30. Found new boots had caused one small blister - otherwise O.K.

Went to Trinidad post office at 3:30, then up to Cohamans to wish them a Merry Christmas with small gift - (SC took Redwood Creek parklands).

Back by 5. Ate early dinner. Took nap. Then bathed and did some mending on Christmas (red) dress (now 10 years old and still good).

Read after getting into sleeping bag.

A dark, rainy morning. Didn't ¹⁹⁷¹ wake up until the cat walked all over me - around 8:30.

Bill pittered in his "office" all day. It was very quiet - not even one phone call!

We ate only as we feel like it - separately.

Strangest Christmas Day in my life. Even the one in flood mud up to our hips in 1955 was brighter - at least there was communication with others.

Christmas presents remain on top of piano - unopened! Merry? Bah, Humbug!

10 P.M. Decided to open presents - all very quiet - not much to say to each other. Some nice presents - but no movement over the whole affair.

up by 8 o'clock. Partial cloudiness 1971 360th day - 5 days follow

all day - a little breeze now and then. Went for walk after breakfast - pretty well bundled up for first hour. Left at 9:15. Finally took the time to explore Badens beach - only to find that 3 fishermen had followed me down the trail. But anyway, a lovely beach. Looked into a few tide pools - (low tide) and then headed back up trail to continue on to Dave's place to check it out. All O.K.

Back home again leisurely by 11:30. Second go 'round for new hiking boots - and all was well.

Chopped up fallen limb and raked debris before lunch.

Did some sewing - but had machine problems.

Bill went to Outkas for dinner. I refused to join them. Instead, began reading Alaska Wilderness by Bob Marshall.

Wrote lengthy letter to the Halls.

Bill was back by 7:30 and spent most of his evening in the "office" - away from me - and exceptionally quiet.

1971 361st day - 4 days follow

up by 8:15. Cold, but no frost in sight - here - at least.

Bill worked as far as Sufferbally Beach with me shortly after he had finished his breakfast. I went on to check on Dave's place. It got quite warm walking. Had to shed jacket.

We went to Umeta for errands and Mck. for groceries - between 3 PM and about 4:30.

Cooked dinner for the two of us and we sat down in the fairly clean looking dining room.

Bill sorted records for awhile. I fell asleep reading on couch. Enjoying Bob Marshall's Alaska Wilderness.

up by 8. A lot of pale pink in the sky, but the old saying gave way to the reality of not just a warning, but a good rain by evening.

Got some letters off by noon. Right after dinner, around one, I started my walk to Trinidad. Bill went with me as far as Luffenbathy Beach. Tide very low. Ocean very calm. Checked Dave's place. Picked up some letters going both ways. Home by 2:45.

Began some washing, which didn't get finished until after dinner.

Bill catalogued records, while I spent much of evening filing, sorting, clipping, conservation material.

In bed around 1.

1971 363rd day - 2 days follow

up by 8:30. Bill slept late - again! Worked around Lame all day - up until 3:30; when, finally I couldn't stay in any longer. It was really beautiful. So - we walked. Bill went as far as Luffenbathy Beach. I went on, turning around at 5 o'clock, having gone one more mile. Awoke by 8. Heard 1971 364th day - 1 day follows

PUBLIC HOLIDAYS—1971

In most States when a Holiday falls on Sunday, the Monday following is observed. Holidays in some States are observed only by common consent, or when appointed by the Governor, and not by legislative enactment.

At the time this book went to press the District of Columbia by Act of Congress, and most States by legis-

lative act, changed the observance of Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Columbus Day and Veterans Day to certain Mondays. These changes, where adopted, are given effect in the table below. States where such changes are under legislative consideration are indicated with an asterisk (*).
