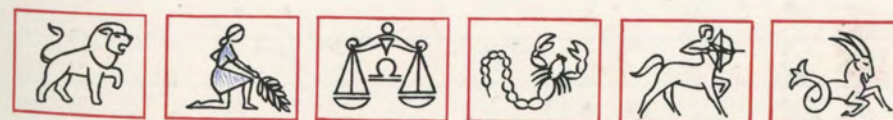

JANUARY

1972 1st day - 365 days follow

New Year's Day

Awake by 8. A glorious day - clear and warm - up to 56°. Worked in dining room, painting, for short time.

Dave came in briefly to retrieve some refrigerated foodstuffs and borrow some oven cleaner. That was all we saw of him all day -- too much TV football, while he watched on small set, borrowed back from Bill Devall.

Bill and I spent an hour or so down on Bakers beach. Quite a few others there, too. I walked back from a 2-mile point - getting home by 4:30. Huge swells were beautiful to watch on return walk.

Early crab salad dinner so we could get to a movie in Arcata. Went in around 8:30 and they had sold out this opening night. This is an old theatre, just renovated and showing "old favorites".

Wrote short letters to Ursula and Ellicott. Ready for bed by 11.

Beautiful, cold, clear moonlight night.

Wished Bill a Happy New Year!

Up around 8:15 after a few ^{Epiphany} moments in upstairs bed! I gave in - decided to start new year on good footing - with joy and happiness and all that stuff.

Worked on another wall in dining room - a tough, long job of cleaning and sanding.

Beautiful day - just had to take a walk. Bill went only as far as Sufferbally, while I serviced along to Trinidad and back.

Then, back to work on more wall "preparing." Dave and Dong were in briefly just before dark.

Early dinner. Went to Minor Theatre in Arcata after 7. Saw "San Francisco" with Jeanette MacDonald and Clark Gable and Spencer Tracy plus the Marx Bros. in "A Night at the Opera." I remembered both vividly from "way back"; Bill was seeing both for first time.

I laughed as loud as ever over the antics of Groucho, Chico and Harpo Marx. Home by 11:15.

32° on kitchen deck at 8 A.M.

1972 3rd day - 363 days follow

Up by 7:45. A glorious day, clear and cold.

Did some ironing and cleaned up some of the mess of papers on dining room floor - cat had scattered.

Bill went into school around 10:30 to start getting things lined up.

After early lunch (11:40) went to Arcata and Eureka. Carol Kubin waited around with me for a while in Arcata, waiting for Vic to get home to answer phone. (She was off work early).

Took Sierra Club news around to various places; newspaper offices, radio and TV stations. Home by 4 o'clock after spending ALL my spending money! Got in on a white sale at J.C. Penney's in Eureka - for long double bed flat sheets.

No walk today. Very windy in Eureka and bay exceedingly rough; choppy, choppy! Howard King here during evening while Jean Hagood at a sewing class.

JANUARY

4

TUESDAY

Coal and clear.

Up by 8. Bill went into his office for awhile. I painted another section of dining room wall.

Went for quick walk to Trinidad and back, stopping briefly at Dave's to give him message from Don Januta. MT walked back with me and Dave waited for us at Moonstone house to take her back - after making some phone calls.

(He and Doug had gone snowshoeing for first time, near Sanger Peak, yesterday.)

Early dinner, so Bill and I could attend Community Concert in Eureka at 8:15.

Tenor Jerry Jennings gave concert - excellent. Chris Butler sat with us after intermission. After concert we met at Stanton's Woodsman's Room for a couple of New Year's drinks together.

Clear and cold at midnight.

WEDNESDAY

5

JANUARY

Cold - fair

1972

5th day - 361 days follow

Bill was up by 7:30. Claws start this day and his first would begin at 9. Worked around house before getting started on small wall section in dining room.

A lovely day. Walked to Dave's place around 2:15-3:00. MT came back with me before 4:30. Bill home right afterwards. I was painting a door out on sun deck in last warmth of sunshine there.

Doug and Dave showed up sometime between 6 and 6:30 and had a beer and then took MT home.

Sam Merryman phoned about talking with Beaches & Parks Land Agent here to look into proposed trailer park on southside Little River. I would meet him tomorrow.

Made some cookies and wrote a long letter to Kay - on the typewriter - between batches of baking.

Bill up and about by 7:30 and 1972 6th day - 360 days follow
I followed suit soon after. Cold, frosty roofs nearby.
Some scattered claudiniers.

Started some washing and froled around a bit in
dining room and cut some weeds in between
wash and rinse demands.

~~Wished~~ Wished desperately to go for walk but had to
remain for Mr. Johnston's visit. He arrived right
at 1:30. At 10 PM. He was still here!
I talked him into remaining for dinner, which
wasn't too difficult.

We lashed over the Larrible proposed trailer
park proposal across from Merrymans - on Clam
Beach - and what steps could be taken to
prevent an access permit through State Beaches
and Parks land from ever being issued.

Received several phone calls regarding
Bill's botanizing outing in Prairie Creek S.P.
on Saturday - and about the meeting Sat. night.

Decided to try sleeping in bed for first
time in 6 weeks!

1972 7th day - 359 days follow

Up at 8:15. Very gray day.
Weather indicated rain, so went for walk early,
leaving at 10:30. Bill left shortly after for
school. Gave message to Dave, then returned
home by 12:45.

Dave showed up (Doug dropped him off) before
I left for town. We both made arrangements for
Monday for our cars to have wiring and other problems
taken care of in Arcata. Left Dave on a corner
as I went on to Eureka. Picked up back copies of
P&E series by John Lead, then went to Chamber of Commerce
Bldg. for 3:30 meeting of Nocona Sketch Plan
committee. Meeting went on until 5:15.

Some light drizzle on way to Mkt. to get a few
groceries.

A quiet evening - even watched Wm. Buckley
on TV for 90 minutes - or, at least listened
while doing kitchen work and making applesauce.
In bed around 12:45.

On my feet by 8:45. It had rained ¹⁹⁷² 8th day - 358 days follow a little during night - everything wet. Cloudy. Bill left to meet outing participants at HSC, then on ^{to} the Divine Trail to Fern Canyon in Prairie Creek Redwoods State Park. I thought I might join them after lunch, but worked around house instead, then walked to Saunders Market in Trinidad to get additions to my fruit salad for potluck dinner. Stopped at Davis' place briefly. M.T. walked home with me. Bathed and dressed for meeting and while making notes Jean Haygood and Howard King showed up.

Bill was quite late returning (5:45) but reported foot O.K. (a little tired from 9 miles total walking) but a good turnout and much interest - 20 people showed up.

Went to meeting place (Unitarian Fellowship on Old Arcata Road) with Jean and Howard. Bill would change, take APT home and bring Dave to meeting as soon as possible.

My first meeting of the year - and pleased with big turnout. Lots of new people. Howard gave "stereo" slide program, "Fungi of the Redwood Region". It was fantastic. People were enchanted with his work.

Took Dave home and stayed awhile over a cup of coffee and a night cap. Very light drizzle off and on.

1972

9th day - 357 days follow

Breakfast around 9. Even the "poor-cat" slept in this gray, cloudy day.

Did some ironing, sewing, etc. Walked to Trinidad for a few groceries. Bill went collecting at Clam Beach Lagoons.

Stopped at Davis'. Took APT. Dave overtook us later near Sufferbalty Beach and snatched APT.

Quiet evening at home. Made some cookies, watched TV briefly, did some newspaper clipping, finished "The White Dawn" (finally!) and wrote a thank you note to Davis' mother - for the Christmas "goodie".

Up at 7:30 so I could get 1972 10th day - 356 days follow
 Ford into a shop for work on lights, etc.
 Met Dave there, with his car ahead of
 me for work. Went to coffee shop - met
 Dean Freeland there. 3 of us consumed
 coffee for meal over an hour. Cars
 ready by 11:30.

Went to Sue Van Kirk's with SC
 material, then to Bev Allen's with booklet
 on Native dyes. Then to McK. for
 groceries. Home by 3:30. Dave
 came in. Together - worked on letters
 regarding Clam Beach development.

He stayed for dinner, then went
 home awhile, then returned before
 10 for an arranged conference call
 with Phil Kay and Charlotte Stephens
 regarding Ken H. as Chapter Conservation
 Chairman. We talked for nearly $\frac{1}{2}$ hr.
 Bill Devall, Dave and Vic on line, too.

1972 11th day - 355 days follow Up at 7:30. All gray and
 drizzly. Apparently rained lightly during night.
 Walked up to Dave's place, leaving at 9:05. Used
 umbrella to ward off mist. Had coffee with Doug and
 Dave, then headed back in heavier mist, using umbrella
 all the way. Home by 11:15.

Left for Anate and Eunice at 1:15. Talked
 with Bill Van Fleet over "clearcutting" program we
 would present to Kiwanis Club at noon tomorrow.
 Dave showed up at Bill's office and gave us
 some ideas to work on and thoughts to get across.
 Light rain all afternoon and evening.
 Wrote note to Kurt M.

Up at 7:30. Everything kind of wet ¹⁹⁷² 12th day - 354 days follow and drippy from light rain during night. Dashed up to Dave's with messages about phone calls and he came down shortly to return calls.

Got ready to leave for Eureka by 10:45 to go over "talk" some more with Bill Van Fleet at his office. At 12 we went to "Branding Iron" for Kiwanis luncheon. As guest speakers we were treated to lunch. The program went well with an attentive audience. I started - about 10 minutes, and Bill carried on and fielded the questions in time remaining.

Then, a couple of friends, and an hour at the Health Dept. making more noise about noise pollution - referring to Mercer-Frederic blasting schedule at end of Old Quarry Rd. in Trinidad.

Dave picked up Dr. Clyde Wahrhaftig from 6:52 plane. Dean Freeland joined us for dinner. The large beef stew I prepared yesterday was merely added to, plus a big tossed green salad - and dinner was no problem.

Clyde showed slides taken on aerial tour over Jan. 1 weekend. He was documenting soil movement in various stream courses - Eel, Mad, Redwood Creek, Klamath.

While Dave drove Clyde to Eureka Inn. I made first typed draft of his statement.

Dave Pesonen phoned regarding SC suit against Resources Agency, dealing with Pt. Arena.

1972 13th day - 353 days follow

Clean and cold. Up at 7:30. Went for walk - to get RT, leaving at 9:15. Had waffle with Doug. Home by 11:15. Beautiful morning for walking.

Did some house cleaning. Picked up John Everingham at airport around 1:30. Did some typing - lots of talking. Beautiful, beautiful day. Re-typed Dave's statement. Bill got home for late dinner. Dave came in, too, after long day touring timberlands with Z'berg's committee, from 8:30 - 7:00 P.M.

After dinner Dave began re-writing. Finally got statement ⁱⁿ finished form at 1:30 A.M. John bedded down in sleeping bag on couch.

Ed Wayburn phoned - might be around area tomorrow with Asst. Sec. of Interior - in connection with suit filed against Sec. about Redwood Park.

up at 7:20. Clear, very cold, 1972 14th day - 352 days follow
and frosty - even on the beach! John and I left
for Eureka Inn at 8:30. Z'berg's Committee started
hearing promptly at 9:30. Comments were restricted
to 7 minutes - mostly. Dave gave his statement
early. It sounded good; contained items touched
on by numerous other speakers during long day. Gathered
a gang together for lunch in coffee shop: Ru-Flo, Dave,
Bob Schneider, Gordon Robinson, Bill Van Fleet,
Ann Weiss and John. Resuming again at 1:45
the Committee remained (4 at end of session) to
take testimony until after 5 o'clock. The Colonnade
Room was well filled most of time. Had a
chance to talk with Assemblyman John Dunlap and
Assemblyman Warren (L.A.).

Lots of good presentations and some that said
nothing - like rep. from Fish & Game. Radi
Backing was splendid - brief, good ideas. Jordan
had chance to answer many questions. John
Callahan (Calif. Forest Protection Assn.) was a time
consumer. Al Merrill (C-P) had to leave on
other business (Redwoods - park, ^{and} Sec. of Int.) so used
fill in. Timber "beats" seemed uneasy.

Took John to 6:25 plane. Dinner at Loggia
with Bill, Dave and Don Januta.

Home by 10:30 - with tired eyeballs!

1972 15th day - 351 days follow up by S. Frank on beach, but
warming breeze brought temp. up to 39° shortly. Beautiful
and clear and ocean unusually calm (-.8 Tide around
8 P.M.)

Bill and I went walking at 10:15. I went ^{on} to Trinidad
when he turned back at Luffenbally Beach.

Called on Senior Devaults awhile. Bill was there,
and when I left he showed me how to get down to
nearby beach. We walked leisurely together down
to the trail that would go up to Jamieson's driveway.

It was so warm and lovely I wanted to stay out
all day!

But, instead, started some washing and
cut some weeds down on the bank on ocean
side. Dave picked up some groceries for us
and stopped briefly to invite us to dinner.

I made a big mixed salad, then left at
5 in order to reach Saundee's market for some
additional grocery items before they closed. It
took me just 45 minutes. Sunset was lovely.
Many people enjoying it.

Bill brought salad and other things up to
Dave's around 6. Don Januta and family
arrived soon after. Danny (his wife), Veltus,
age 2 and Daine, age 6.

Good dinner. Listened to some records.
Home by 11:45.

Up around 8. Scattered clouds. 1972 16th day - 350 days follow

39°. Finished laundry work (left from yesterday), made cookies, pruned ivy.

Rain was forecast so I took walk as soon as I could. Left home 1:45. Foggy along scenic drive - had to keep warm jacket on. Stopped briefly at Saunders Market, then walked old country road to Anthas. Pre-arranged, Bill arrived at Anthas's, too, at 3:30, with some newspapers and a few wood chunks for her.

We stayed until 6:30 since she insisted we try her new method of baking ^{big} squash.

Spent rest of evening typing up Ex Com Agenda and writing notes about Thursday's North Group meeting.

Did $\frac{1}{2}$ hr. of exercises before having good bath and shampoo.

1972 17th day - 349 days follow Woke up to rain and a very drizzly, gray day was apparent. Worked around house and wrote some letters. Dave was in for a short time around mid-day to get messages and make some phone calls.

Much too wet to take a walk. Early trip to Arcata post office and grocery shopping (from 9-10) was only time out of house.

Dave alerted us, before dinner, about a special TV show about George Gershwin. We returned and we all watched an $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours of memorializing - well done.

Worked and read until nearly 1 A.M.

up at 7:30. Rain again - only 1972 18th day - 348 days follow today - much heavier. No clearing at all. Wrote some letters regarding beach property and got news items ready for "Chips".

Talked with "Corky" Allen about tree planting this year at Humboldt Redwoods State Park, upper Bull Creek watershed.

Dave popped in at 12:30 on way to Arcata Sanitary Land fill. We had nothing to add.

At 2 I left for Eureka to sit in an "coastline" discussion at Board of Supervisors meeting. No discussion took place! Agenda item inaccurate on news releases. Had coffee with Dave (who was there ahead of me) and Ray Peart.

Home by 4. Bill home shortly after. Dave in again with AT around 5 - but he did NOT stay for dinner.

Bill went to an 8 o'clock meeting. Dave picked me up and we descended on Ken Lytle to try to work out something on SC conservation. After 2 hrs. we felt it was still a lost cause.

Bill Devall came by, very briefly, to leave some mail.

Bill home by 11 o'clock. In bed by 12:30.

132 1972 19th day - 347 days follow up at 8. Gray clouds hanging around all day, but no rain until evening.

Walked to Dave's place, leaving at 10:10. Found him unloading wood chips and then found myself shoveling more wood chips from side of highway pile near Stone Lagoon. I did not stay to unload them.

Instead, thinking rain imminent, headed for home at fast clip. AT with me. Picked up a mess of beer cans on the way - all tossed since Sunday's walk.

Dave showed up later to fix the car seat which was ripping out. I was taping and sewing - and washing a wall in the dining room to keep away from food stuffs.

Dave stayed on after Bill came home and had dinner here, but left around 7:30.

We did something different! We watched TV. Carol Burnett's program was fun - we hadn't watched her for years.

Had lengthy phone conversation with John Hennings.

(58° in Eureka)

up by 7:30. Intermittent showers 1972 20th day - 346 days follow all day. Rather warm. Went to meeting of Underground Utilities Committee to hear progress on Moonstone to Sufferbally Creek district.

Elizabeth Hegy and I represented area residents.

Did numerous errands and some shopping. Home by 2. Dave showed up with letters for ExCom members. I had worked on agenda and gathered things together earlier, so had time to prepare a casseroles dinner for Bill. He had a late seminar.

Dave and I grabbed a hamburger in Create. Executive session, called for 7 PM got underway at 7:10. Ken + wife showed up shortly after regular meeting was under way.

Frank, open discussion with Ken regarding his current position. Ended up with unanimous decision that he must resign since there was no confidence in him. He would not assume a co-Chairmanship to make it workable within the chapter without any fuss. Meeting lasted until after 10.

Raining harder at 10:30. Dave Anderson joined us for a quick refresher at a place on the Plaza. I drove Dave and AT straight home. Raine so heavy around 11:30 that driving from Trinidad to Moonstone on scenic drive was nerve wrecking - and very slow!

1972

21st day - 345 days follow

Early start! Awake at 4 A.M. Cold! Power off. First by candlelight, then flashlight, found blanket, protected floors and rugs from leads in dining room and our bedroom - then back to bed. Daylight woke me next. Cat snuggled in with us to keep warm. Must have rained heavily all ~~the~~ night. Power on again after 2 1/4 hrs. so breakfast was no problem.

Dave showed up around 9 to start work on Newsletter material. By 11 I was ready to start typing his stuff, then writing and typing my contributions. It rained all day and all evening. Bill went into school, then to Eureka and returned around 4:30. At 6 we wound up the last page. Bill Deval came by with additional material to be incorporated in Eureka Newsletter.

Dave stayed for dinner, then busied himself typing a letter to Charlotte Stephens. I began drafting a letter to her regarding events of ExCom meeting last night. Dave went home around 10:15.

up at 8. Rain and more rain ¹⁹⁷² 22nd day - 344 days follow
all day long - all evening.

Typed up letter to Charlotte Stephens. Dave came by before noon and took it into Arcata to mail for me. Made big batch of cookies. At 3:30 Bill and I drove out North Bank Rd. to see rising Mad River. Meanwhile Little River was flooding low areas. Cannell Road flooded.

Warnings on all rivers went out in mid evening newscasts and special reports on highways were frequent. Jean Hagood said ~~the~~ bridge at Redwood Creek was log jammed.

Dave was in at dinner time to take a shower. His water heater bad. He did not stay for dinner.

Wrote 2 Christmas Thank you letters. Then the power went off - at 11:40. We went to bed to read by gasoline lantern.

Brief hail storm, lightning and thunder around midnight.

¹⁹⁷² 23rd day - 343 days follow

Awake around 8. Power had been off only 1 hr. Still raining - off and on. Dave & MT showed up at 8:30 after jogging down. I walked back with them, leaving around 9:05. Went to Saunders Mkt. then returned to Dave's for coffee before heading back home. Road crews were busily repairing pavement slumps and clearing large slides. Road completely blocked in two places. We had to walk up, over, and through fallen trees, limbs, mud, ferns, goo, etc near Ruffenbath/Beach area. Ocean was magnificently rough - and dirty close to shore. Blue skies showed frequently and great piled up, wind blown clouds were all around.

Painted another wall in dining room - began at 2 PM, finished at 5. Dave and Doug came down - primarily so Doug could shower, since their bathroom was undergoing repairs and remodeling.

Had quick bath and shampoo before starting dinner. Dave & Doug accepted dinner invitation.

Bill, Doug, and I went to an Audubon film in Eureka - Buzz More's "Mule Deer Country." It was beautiful! Photos of animals I had never seen before in movies, like baby skunks and deer playing, and a coyote plaguing a black bear.

Went to Dave's for coffee and to take Doug home. Stars and moon out awhile.

In bed by 1 A.M.

1972 - Jan. 6 mtg w/ Sam Merryman re. Stanson's proposed
RV park near Little River. (Johnston - DPR)

Jan. '72 Dave Peterson phoned about SC lawsuit against
Resources Agency dealing with Pt. Arena plans for
nuclear power plant.

Jan. - Bill Van Fleet and I gave "clearcutting" talk to
Eureka Kiwanis Club.

Jan. 13 Ed Wapburn in area with Asst. Secty. of Interior
re. suit filed against Sec. over Redwood Park.

Jan. 14 - ^{Z'berg's Committee} ~~Sen. Murphy~~ hearing, Eureka -

Gen- ~~Alt~~ ^{Alto} Howard King "Fungi of Redwoods"
at Unitarian Fellowship - 70 present

up before 7:30. Some cloudiness with a soft pink sky here and there. Dave and MT showed up before 8:30 - having jogged down. Walked back with them, leaving at 9 or so, arriving there just 40 min. later. Had coffee and talked briefly with Les Titus who was back working on bathroom. Returned home in ~~to~~ 37 min., having jogged on the down-hill portions. Dave was here ahead of me - taking a shower - before going to Eureka.

I typed up a page about tree planting - took it in to Zeros, then distributed to Girl Scouts, Campfire Girls and Boy Scout offices.

Home around 5. Bill here ahead of me.

Dave confirmed appointment with Barry Fisher & Beatrice Laws in S.F. tomorrow at 10. We planned to leave 5 A.M.!

1972

25th day - 341 days follow

up at 3:45. Away from home at 4:05. Rain, then snow - beautiful HUE flakes around Miranda. Practically no traffic. Snow on redwoods - in headlights - a real "post card." Breakfast at small cafe in Garberville, leaving there at 6:15. Highway slushy or icy or both. Near Cummings we noticed car tracks leaving roadway. Found pickup perched precariously 60 ft. below highway and above fast-moving stream. Women in front seat O.K.; husband gone for help. We alerted others that stopped and stayed on until woman and car were hauled back to solid ground. It took 2 hours. We Dave aided by having rope to bring heavy set woman up steep bank and helping to pull and push and guide, along with husband and wrecker operator. Bitterly cold. Too late to go on to S.F. Phoned Beatrice Laws from Laytonville.

Went to Bank of America in Garberville and had lunch there. Snow nearly all gone as we came north. Ran into rain below Eureka. Home by 2:30. Washed Dave's muddy clothes.

At 8 we 3 went to Arcata to hear Bob Rowen, ex PGE nuclear power plant technician, tell his story. Sponsored by Northcoast Environmental Center, the presentation took place at Arcata City Council Chambers. It lasted until nearly 11 - a long question and answer period. I could hardly keep my eyes open.

Dave stayed overnight. Snowing off and on. Very cold.

Dave had come down early, had breakfast, of sorts, then went back home to work on a letter to Beatrice Laws - a re-type job. He returned at 11:30 to go to Eureka with me. As we left Barry after lunch in the coffee shop it began snowing again - rather heavy and very wet. We drove straight to Dave's place so he could finish his letter and get it ready for mailing.

We stopped at beginning of High Prairie Rd. 13½ miles from Ketchikan. No plow had cleared it; no one had tried to drive over it; so we decided this would be our "place".

Very calm sea - practically NO white water anywhere. Close to shore water now cleared up and from roadway looked like beautiful green pools. The cloud cover was just heavy enough to allow some shimmering rays of light to make lovely sights, - always changing. It was warm and very comfortable without jacket.

Spent an hour with Glenn and Chet. We discussed sending/sounding of utilities, the Little River situation, etc. etc.

Jon Krupp came out around 8:30. I made an apple pie as a late birthday gift for Dave. In bed by 12:30.

Up at 7:15. Cloudy. Finished 1972 34th day - 332 days follow
kitchen work in order to have time to move furniture
around in dining room so as to get last wall
washed down before painting.

Dave came in before 10 - to receive his phone

"underling".

We planned to go to Acata at 1 - he to get his
"turtle shell" put back on the pick-up and I for

Then back to wall macking. Dave showed up

Bill and Vic went collecting around the Lagoons from 2:30 - 4:30. Vic had coffee/tea with us.

Up at 7:30. Partially cloudy. 1972 38th day - 328 days follow

Did some washing. Did some weed pulling, and did some house cleaning.

Around 1:30 I headed for Trinidad, walking, and to check in on Dave. Found him up and cheered and some improvement in his general well being and attitude. Doug came home around 3:30, which is about the time I headed home.

Jean Hagood showed up around 6 o'clock, on her way to a meeting at the Court House in Eureka. Bill was also scheduled to attend ^{at} another meeting there. Jean had tea with us and "sat with us through a quick dinner."

Had a number of phone calls during evening which interrupted my cookie making - Bill was back early.

Read awhile, then decided to go to bed early.

1972 39th day - 327 days follow

Up by 7:45. Variable cloudiness and warmer. Prepared dining room for painting and got the job done by 12:30 - south wall only, and window trim only. Took care of some phone calls before getting mail, which included wonderful letters from Greg, and heading for Trinidad. Half-way - near Baker's Ranch Road. Dave came by in his car. We talked about 15 minutes before he headed back home. I asked for MT to walk with me, which she did, gladly, and when we reached Dave's place, she wanted to return with me - and did. I invited Dave down for dinner. Obviously, he was recovering from his flu bout - and accepted.

Beautiful clouds - an increasing "mackerel sky" - and quite warm. Comfortable in light shirt with sleeves rolled up. Home by 4. Bill already home. Dave showed up at 4:30. Sunset was engaging.

Dinner at 7. Bill off to some meeting in Eureka scheduled for 8.

Dave and I watched figure skating, winter Olympics, from Sapporo, Japan from 8:30-9:30. Then he napped so he could watch ice hockey - Russian vs U.S. teams - but instead giant slalom and cross country (women) and speed (women) skating was on.

1972 43rd day - 323 days follow Awakened late - 7:30. Hit the

Lincoln's Birthday road by 8. Grabbed some bakery goods as we went through Willits. Arrived Santa Rosa about 20 minutes late, but meeting had just gotten underway around 10:45. Beautiful weather in S.R.

We harried over Ken being Conservation Chairman, then after deciding to go one more month with him as interim appt. we broke for lunch around 1:30. Walked a few blocks for a cheeseburger and milkshake. Meeting continued until 4. We gave Al Whitney a ride to Lodi to meet Ailan, then we headed out with Pt Arena our ultimate destination sometime tomorrow morning.

Ignition problems kept us in Cloverdale, after dark, for about an hour. Underway again, we went route 128 through Boonville and stopped for the night in a Mendocino County park on the winding road to Manchester - Faulkner Redwoods - very nice - and we had it to ourselves. Managed to get a small fire going, using fairly dry wind-thrown limbs. Had very simple dinner after a "redwood" cocktail. Turkey, salad, bread + butter, coffee. Quite adequate.

Got going on the breakfast list by ¹⁹⁷² 8 o'clock. Foggy, but no wind, and really not too cold. Just damp. Good breakfast - bacon, eggs, toast and coffee.

Got into Pt. Arena around 10:30. Waited for a general store to open so we could get some salami or other meat, cookies and thermos of coffee filled. After taking some photos of fisherman along the Garcia River, and some swampy lands nearby, we went to Arena Cove. With tide going down we walked the rocky, exciting shoreline, lugging nearly sheer sandstone ~~the~~ bluffs on seaweed covered, wave-served shelves, with lovely tide pools and all the goodies to examine. After about one mile we tried to scale the bluff, which would have put us on P.C. & E. nuclear power plant site. The last 8 feet - straight up on crumbling, no hand hold sandstone stopped us. We could not risk it, not and come back alive. The wild waters of a beautiful ^{night} cove below made us think twice.

We ducked at foot of bluff and finally walked back to car - around 3. Drove to Coast Guard's Loren Station on bluff north of town of Pt. Arena, but not much doing there and our contact gone for weekend.

The coast drive was magnificent. Back on 101 we stopped to work dinner at the Garden Club grove near Founders Tree.

Home by 9:30.

Bil at concert until about 11:30 home coming.

Jack Falk, who wants to run in state senatorial race, came in at 5 to talk to me. Bill Devall dropped in. Bill got home around 7:30. Dave came in. We three had dinner together after celebrating news of Bill's pending promotion - also time for Bill Devall and Kay Chaffey, whom Bill phoned - after I had alerted Jean Hagood.

Misty morning - cloudy all day.

up by 8. Finished up work for SC bulk mailing. Bill went to school just ahead of my leaving - around 11:15. Went straight down to South Fortuna Elementary School to pick up film for SC program. Grabbed a hamburger and coffee passing back through Fortuna. Eel line right around flood warning stage (14') at Fernbridge. Very wide, fast flowing and BROWN. Processed film back through School Dept.

Attended "geology" workshop, Butte Valley dam, at City Hall Council Chambers from 1:40 - 4:00. Dave was also there part of time. Had long talk with Mayor Trood - in hallway, as I was heading out - about growing opposition to proposed dam, and about the coastline and wild and scenic rivers.

Home by 5:45. Bill here - his trip to Shasta changed to ^{del} weather conditions and highways closed, etc. So - an unplanned dinner at home.

Dave came in briefly around 9:30 - 10:00.

Back to Angelo's pizza parlor in Alhambra for late dinner - home by 8:40.

Dave spent night here.

Very warm for this time of year.

6:45 phone call woke me up, first time. ¹⁹⁷² 80th day - 286 days follow

Viv would be out to retrieve Carol's forgotten purse. Next, at 7:30 a gentle knocking - Dave and MT, here to make urgent phone call. I snuggled with our snuggle-bum, bed-loving poaty cat, then got up before 8.

Shortly after 9 Marie Devall arrived to get some plants. We both dug for over an hour - getting Vinca, rosemary, leus + chickens, Ajuga, ivy, etc.

Up by 8. Cloudy. Worked around Laine and managed to finish typing up my talk about Sierra Club. It began raining in late afternoon.

TF close to me. She was slightly tense, but behaved well.
She got antibiotic ^{shot} into hole which Dr. thought was bite, then
a shot to lower her 103 temperature. (Got worm tablets, too)

Left Dave in Arcata to get his car from repair shop.
Back to the washing, cleaning of rugs, changing of
bed pad, etc. Nice sunny afternoon with clouds
appearing in late afternoon. Bill and I and MT went
for walk at 4:30. Looked over the site where home is
planned adjacent to Sufferbally Creek, north side. The place
was a riot of flowering *dicentra* (bleeding hearts). Bill
returned home; MT and I went on and were met by
Dave near Baker's beach. We walked to Trinidad beach
to see about the situation a SC member had phoned
about earlier - 2 "cats" were removing huge rocks
from beach. C of Eng. told them to stop.

Dave here for dinner, then off to Bill D's to
watch a game on TV.

Made cookies, applesauce, and finished
laundry work - and did exercises - and had
bath and shampoo before midnight.

1972 84th day - 282 days follow

up at 7:45. Rain. Raining nearly all day. Left at 8:40 to get Falcon into Ed's for tune-up and other work. Rain heavy as I drove into Arcata. Bill came in at 9:20 to get me home again - and have his delayed breakfast.

Dick Reinert phoned at 12:30, just as I was getting ready to leave for Eureka - wanted me to be part of KEET-TV Coastline program in April. Bill left me at City Hall at 1:10 to take in the 6th of the Butte Valley dam workshop series, this one on the recreational aspects of the proposed project.

Phoned the CE's ~~DE~~ district office in SE in regard to permit issuing to man who pulled large rocks off Trinidad Bay beach. Talked with a very nice sounding Mr. Hamm, with delightful accent - perhaps German.

Bill got in on last hour of question period. Took Sigurd Allen home, up on Fickle Hill.

Picked up Falcon before 6, while Bill got the groceries.

Dinner at 7:30. Quiet evening. Poo-ty Cat in racy spirits - almost like old, sweet, silly self again.

In bed around midnight.

31° 8 A.M. 1972 85th day - 281 days follow

Storm clouds clearing. A few light showers. Up by 8. Started some washing. Dave came in. He, also, wanted to do some laundry, but had to wait until I was through. He went to Arcata meanwhile and was able to save us a trip to the grocery store.

Bob Kirby dropped in and waited over an hour for Phil to arrive so they could hike in the Bigagoon area. I managed to squeeze in a tiny bit of weeding and raking in garden. Air crisp and cool even with bright sun at times.

Bill worked on his report for NPS nearly all day. Howard King phoned from Hagood's in Orick - around 5 and I enticed him down for "Goop" dinner. Dave also here for this favorite "Goop".

Dave went home before 9. Howard returned to Orick, leaving before 10. I went up to Davis to cut stenils for news letter. Clear, cold (36°) and temp. dropping, moonlight.

Back home before midnight. 34° at bedtime, 12:25.

MARCH

26

SUNDAY

31° at 7 A.M.

Some clouds.

Beautiful morning. Up early ^{Palm Sunday} 1972 86th day - 280 days follow to get ready to go someplace. Dave showed up around 9:30. We looked at maps. Bill decided to head south, though Dave wanted to go to Red Mt. area. We got gas in Fiskeville and drove to Shelter Cove. Shocked by changes in (over) 12 years' time since going there with Uncle and Lue when living at Phillipsville. Huge, sprawling mess of subdivision, airport, small golf course, houses scattered - the once nearly unspoiled, beautiful headland destroyed! Wind was strong - ocean rough. Looking north to the King Range, over turquoise-colored water, the mountains deep, velvety blue, was a beautiful scene - as long as your back was turned against the developed area. We had a snack-type lunch off the tail gate of the Jeep. Walking to edge of cliff we noted lovely arch on beach - so decided to explore. Great network of roads, all paved and named, but we found a way to get close. Dune buggies and motor bikes headed off across the sands - north to edge of King Range. Bill took a few photographs. We saw a few deer - away from people places - and then we headed back, driving a dirt road toward Kings Pk. - 7 miles to Horse Mt. - turned off on county road and went home by way of Bull Creek Rd. to 101.

Didn't feel too good - napped on couch all evening. Dave and Bill got their own dinner. Ed Wayburn phoned - Bill talked with him. Went upstairs to bed after 1 A.M.

Dave + MT had gone home much earlier.

MARCH

36° at 7 A.M.

Variable cloudiness.

1972

87th day - 279 days follow

Worked around house. Dave arrived fairly early to remove radiator from his Datsun and used Jeep to take radiator into a shop. Bill went into school once Dave got back.

I went to Arcata around 1:30. Ran into Olga Simons at Barney's Drug Store and had long talk session. Chris B. joined us briefly. Found Dave at Env. Center, waiting for me to show up with more mimeo paper. We got the 2-page Newsletter printed and counted by 4. Did some shopping - home by 5.

Left at 7 for NorCoa Env. Health Meeting at St. Joseph's Hospital "Blue Room". Stopped by Van Kirk's on way through Arcata to leave Newsletter. Meeting was held by seven members only, but it was a good, lively, informative session. Home before 10:30.

Made "new" oatmeal cookies - in bed by 1.

Clear moonlight.

(^{1st} gave worm tablet to poo-ty, the cat!)

up by 8. Not feeling too

sharp, so took it easy most of day - even napped briefly a couple of times.

1972

88th day - 278 days follow

Nice day - would like to have spent it outside.

Dave was in awhile; first feeling pretty good; then later in day got into one of his "horrible" moods, as I call them - feeling sorry for himself. He managed to pull himself together enough to take newsletters from Sue's to the post office.

Left after early dinner for 7 PM Ex Com meeting at Env. Center. Dave showed up just in time to ride in with me - but he was low again - wouldn't talk, acted sulky and irritable, and wouldn't have a hamburger when I offered to buy one; but settled for coffee. Everyone showed up for the meeting, though Vic arrived just as we adjourned at 9:30. Dave barely spoke, just sat off by himself and participated very reluctantly.

Afterwards, we had coffee with Vic - and Dave had a hamburger - and at least acted a bit more pleasant than earlier.

(Clams started at HSL.)

1972

89th day - 277 days follow

up by 7:40. Beautiful day.

Worked around house and did some ironing around mid-day, when the bedroom was nice and warm. Dave was here briefly a couple of times - then back for dinner at 7.

Spent much of afternoon working in garden - cutting grass and clearing the bank above the beach road of a miserable, creepy vine, often called "Scotch Broom".

Ocean very calm before sunset - more like a lake.

Dave went to a meeting in Aicata for about an hour after dinner. He tried to sleep on the couch, but couldn't, so at 11 PM (!) he headed out for Redding - to go part of the way, at least.

Beautiful, clear, cool, moonlight.

I had planned on going with him in early morning (4:30), but he chose to leave tonight.

Had a "talk session" with Dave when he was in during morning - his problems never seem to let up - or slow down. I showed little sympathy and did some prodding and pushing to get him thinking rationally about his situation - and his work in conservation.

Howard Barnes (from Trinidad) phoned early A.M. regarding moving of rocks from foot of cliff below his house. Same situation, just another complaint, as last week coming late.

Up at 7:30. Sun plus fog all day, ¹⁹⁷² 90th day - 276 days follow. After cleaning up kitchen I worked outside the ^{First Day of Passover} ^{Maundy Thursday} entire day - with the exception of part of an hour when Bill Deval was here around noon-time. Weeding, clipping, pitching, mowing, hauling dirt and debris was a full time job. I stopped at 6 - just as Bill was getting home.

Made a new casserole (tuna & noodle concoction - different) for dinner - which was ready by 7:30.

At 8:30 Dave arrived. We were just going to head out for a beach walk in what appeared to be a full-moon. Dave & MT joined us. Luffenhotly became our goal after finding great mass of log debris and little beach (sand) at Moonstone.

Dave, MT & I crossed Luffenhotly Creek on a narrow log. Bill headed back while we went a little farther up the beach and went up to the roadway by a steep trail. Bill got home just moments before us.

Had a cup of coffee, then headed for the tub. Really grubby from all the garden work.

Dave piled up on couch for night. In bed around midnight.

1972 91st day - 275 days follow

Good Friday

Up by 7:45 after having a smuggle session with party-act. A grey day - all overcast everywhere, but sun few were out below us at 8:00 A.M. A few small, good waves for good rides. Spent all day inside, typing SC stuff. Dave worked on some FS maps. Bill went into school around 11. Gary Williams came down for awhile and stayed after Dave left around noon to meet with a student about wilderness; then on to the FS to work on more maps. Bill got home around 5. Dave returned around 6. Dinner was unhurried - about 8.

I rested on couch awhile. Dave and Bill & MT took short walk to Luffenhotly beach and back around 10:30 - returning as light sprinkles began - just as predicted.

In bed by midnight. Dave here again for night.

Up by 8. A drizzly day.

1972 92nd day - 274 days follow

Did some ^{Hot Saturday} house cleaning. Gathered things together for Sierra Club meeting.

Dave went to F.S. office in Eureka to return maps, then before 5 PM we worked on things for a "display" at the meeting; small signs, etc.

Opened church by 6. People arrived early, including Shelma & Gene Kinman. Helped Dave put up maps after getting big coffee pot going. Others helped so we could begin the potluck at 7 - with approx. 40 people.

at 8 we began the program. Bill Devall introduced Dick Harrell, from Six Rivers N.F. who spoke on wilderness study areas, roadless area inventory, areas submitted to regional foresters, etc. - and reactions to public involvement. A crowd of about 100 on hand. The Kinmans bekkled awhile, then noisily left room around 9 - thank heavens!

Didn't get home until 11:15. Bill had helped clean up and had gone home, alone, much earlier.

The three of us "leaked over" the evening - finally going to bed before 2.

1972 93rd day - 273 days follow

Easter Sunday

Up by 8. Overcast. Did some vacuuming and ironing before noon. Bill did some work with algae slides.

Around 1:30 Dave, MT and I went back exploring north of Trini dad. I got permission to go to Forbes' beach. Going was rough at times. Fog played hide and peek with shoreline all afternoon. We fought brush, over, under, and around ravines and "blue goo" slipouts. Finally got up to top of cliff again near Pundletons, but only went through pasture to find some kind of trail. The trail went 2 ways. First try just plunged us into deep, rich spruce-type forest. We rested awhile in the sunshine after circling around to where we first came upon the small cow pasture. Other route ended up in some one's back yard - dog barking; sheep scattering. We backtracked a bit, then headed a little southerly. This took us into and through and over almost impenetrable thickets of Salal, huckleberry, elderberry, rabbit brush, small trees, small streams, dark, wet places and thick, thick stuff that we had to crawl under - until, finally, we came out to old stage coach Rd. Exhausted, dirty, bruised, scratched from berry bushes we headed home for refreshment and much needed bath. Bill Devall came in for awhile. up by 8. Variable cloudiness - 1972 94th day - 272 days follow

Son Janette phoned for Dave, not only once, but
twice during mid-day.

Around 2:30 we drove to Eureka, after a quick
stop at the college so I could get my wallet out of the
jeep - and Dave did some copying. I did some
shopping while Dave went to FS offices. I met him
there and talked briefly with Dick Hannell & Dave Stang.
Got Dave back in time to get his pick up and make a
trip to Vern Korb's by 5 o'clock.

At 5:30 Bill, MT and I took a good walk
to Luffenholty Beach. Ocean fairly calm. Back by
6:30. Watched Ray Beart and Janet Adams and
Nancy Hilfiker (LWV) on $\frac{1}{2}$ hr. "Coastline" show on TV-3.
Read a letter from Duke & Sandy Cairns - from Neja -
read by Art Smith. Dinner was late.

Dave came in around 10 and was in
bed as soon as possible - an early morning
appt. to go crab fishing - for photo purposes -
with Vern Korb and his movie camera.

In bed to read by 11:45.

Gave CAT a worm tablet - on third try!

1972 95th day - 271 days follow up by 7:30. A lovely, very warm day.
Temp. rose to 74° in Eureka. Gusty winds and clouds began to
make themselves felt by noon time.

Did some washing - and enjoyed the ocean scene from
the laundry room. Did some housecleaning, too. Dave,
who had left at 4:30, phoned from Eureka at 2:30, just in
from the crab fishing day - would we like some fresh,
live crabs? At 4 I went shopping in St. K.
Bill and Dave were both at home when I returned
after 5.

Immediately started camp stove up to boil a
bucket of water for 3 crabs. Wind was too finicky
near garage door opening, so set up in laundry
room. Light rain began.

Ate big crab salad around 7:30. At 8
Gary Williams dropped in. We all decided
to go for a walk up the road before heavy
rain began. Found it extremely warm, and
beautifully windy still - about 62°. Trees had
slipped down the cliff north of McGlynn's curve,
completely blocking the road. We walked through
the horizontal alder top branches and went on to Luffen-
holty Creek. When we came back "road closed" signs
had been placed on south side of slide.

Gary stayed until after 10. Dave went to
sleep out in his camper in driveway.

Wind and rain heavy when we went to
bed some time around 11:30.

up at 7:40 - after awakening to a ¹⁹⁷² 96th day - 270 days follow
phone earlier - Vern Kork saying "no sea trips" for Dave today - raining - rough seas - stormy.

Found a large lower branch of neighboring Douglas fir had broken - some fallen into garden, heavy part still dangling, though winds continued strong all morning.

Dave all excited about possible trip - in better spirits.

Beautiful day. Dick Reinert phoned about doing video tape at 3 for Coastline program. Dave was in awhile.

~~Shampooed hair~~ Did some ironing.
^{FRIDAY} Left for Eureka after 2. Went to KEET-TV just before 3 - finished the ^{10 min.} session with Dick and Sam Stanson (who would develop beach property south of Little River). I appeared as ~~Sierra~~ conservationist. (Sam) Stanson and I went to the Red Barn for coffee - ended up spending 1½ hrs. in discussion of his proposed development.

Dave here for dinner.
Around 9:30 Dick Burr and John Lawrin appeared out of the blue, having "birded" from Logan, Utah to north west coast.

We talked an hour or so, then everyone was ready to "fold up" early - by 11, anyway. Dick and John threw sleeping bags out in living room.

Had done a lot of dirty housework in early afternoon. Enjoyed bath and Shampoo before dinner. Had planned on attending a highway report meeting in Eureka, but did not go - then Dick arrived.

1972 98th day - 268 days follow

Dick and John were up and outside before 7. We raced around. Before and after breakfast looking at birds. They had gotten Doug and Dave out of bed at 7:10, before returning here for breakfast. Dave came down a bit later. Left Big thrill came when we saw a yellow bellied sapsucker (red var.) in Doug's fir and neighbor's acacia tree; also saw orange crowned warbler and 1 bright yellow (m.) lesser greenfinch. After saying goodbye to Bill they went with Doug (using Dave's spotting scope) to College Cove area, then to oxidation ponds, then back here for lunch. Then they left for Utah - committed in advance to get back by certain time.

Did the TV thing at 3 P.M. in Eureka. (See back one day.)

1972 99th day - 267 days follow

We looked for driftwood and picked up junk and just plain enjoyed being out. Jacket weather - very nice. Thin clouds. Back before 5. Found Bill Sewall - AND - Wally LaForsie at the house.

Dave got "captured" at 6 for a session with 3 fellows from Environmental Center in St. Louis - traveling all over the nation - who came to the house for a couple of hours.

Late dinner - chicken, salad, etc.

In bed around 1:00 A.M. Dave and Wally had verbal battle. Dave left - and MT was left behind.

Before the sun went down Wally and I and MT took a short walk along scenic drive. We plunged through thick spring growth to a spot above a small beach south of Sufferholty Beach and watched the sun set into a far out bank of clouds.

Dave prepared to leave for Washington, D.C. on mid-morning plane. Wally went into Arcata for film, then phoned around 5 to say he would be out in the morning, instead of later.

Dave was busy on phone much of the evening, getting clued in to the situation by Brock Evans, and the Idaho delegation people, including Paul Fritz, who would be on hand at hearings for NPS. Dave headed home before 11.

up by 8. Cloudy. Dave appeared 1972 102nd day - 264 days follow
around 9 to make some last minute arrangements by phone, then at 9:30 I went with him to clear airline ticket and pick up Butler Valley dam material from Don Tuttle's place - a county report. I brought his pickup home when he left at 10:20.

Wally showed up before 11 and spent the day and evening here. We lunched together in McKinleyville - and he went to the beach when Steve Metcalf arrived for interview at 2.

Steve taped my answers to questions regarding interaction of SC member with USFS. We continued talk after taping was completed.

Dinner was late - around 8:30.

Had a good talk session with Wally - until 1 A.M., when I threw a sleeping bag onto the couch for him.

Rain began around dinner time.

MT spent night on her mattress near our bed, while the cat remained on top of the bed - to keep her eye on MT.

Shower - windy - sunny.

105th day - 261 days follow

President Lincoln Assassinated 1865

Beautiful morning! Up by 7:15. During day wind came up, making ocean rough up. Low tide early. Crab boat out beyond breaker line (or, in close to); also a whale! Gary Williams dropped in around noon - with a paper to fill out for Peace Corps.

Met Murray Alderman in Trinidad after 1:30. Darrel "Pat" Hootler and Mrs. McCovey from the Dept. Human Resources (in State car) provided not only a driver, but most interesting company. We stopped at Lady Bird dedication site, drove on up Bald Hills Rd., then walked short distance on old Geneva Rd. up Lost Man Creek. Little time to do much more. Stopped for pie and coffee in Orisk. Home by 5:45.

Quiet evening - one phone call from Jeannie Kirby.

(Murray Alderman, Scripps-Howard Syndicate, out of New York - "covering" (supra) problems - and Redwoods) (on very quick trip).

Brisk breeze along coast in afternoon - a few clouds over mountains - but no rain - as was ^{earlier} ~~once~~ forecast as possibility.

15

SATURDAY

after a "snuggle-in" with "poopy-cat" ¹⁹⁷² 106th day - 260 days follow

I got up at 7:10. Foggy clouds, rather than rain clouds were hanging low all around us. Good minus (clamming) tide around 7 A.M. Prepared for beach hike. Bob Kirby appeared around 9 and went on down to meeting place at Moonstone Beach to read and wait for others. At 9:45 I drove down. Two other cars arrived. At 10:15 we took 2 of the 4 cars and went to the beach trail I had scouted out at the northern end of Ocean Drive in McK. Our "troops" included 5 adults and 4 young girls. Slowly the sun broke through as we explored piles of driftwood, ponds, dunes area, seashore, etc. and picked up litter along the way. Around 12:15 we sought a sheltered from wind (light all day) spot among dunes to have our "sack" lunch. At this point we were joined by Phil Kirby.

1972 108th day - 258 days follow

up by 7. Lovely, low tide around breakfast time. Wind came up later, like yesterday. Finished typing stuff for newsletters, then drove to NCEC to leave it for the new "editors" by noon. Went to Court House in Eureka, picked up newly framed old Chinese embroidery, went to USFS for maps (of areas picked to receive 2-4-5-T), then to A+W root beer place on Myrtle Ave. for a hamburger and coffee, around 2:15. Got to Jimmie Clarke's lovely home on Harvard Heights (on road to Klamath airport) to talk over new possible study of a "green" route freeway in or around Eureka. I ended up staying until 5 o'clock.

Bill went into Arcata airport for Dave at 6:45. We had dinner around 8. Went for a cool, windy walk to Baker's beach. Bill only went part way and took MT back with him.

Dave and I got back sometime after 11.

He & MT spent night here.

Awake at 6. Smuggled the sweet cat; got up at 7. Took MT and headed for Moonstone Beach. Low (-1.0) tide around 9. Wind cool; water cold! We crossed mouth of Little River just where it joined ocean - about 1 ft. deep and flowing fast. Clammers were visible along Clam Beach. Only one person on Moonstone. Both Bill and Dave were gone when we got back to house, having returned to get warm! Dave came back around 11. Gary Williams brought USFS road system maps back to Dave around 11:30.

Had a nice warming bath before lunch, then worked on SC ExCom material for tonight's meeting. Dave went home at some time, then returned and ended up providing nothing toward the agenda I began typing up. Again, he left, in a kind of weird mood - no goodbye - no nothing! Bill ended up having dinner alone, though I washed it. No time to eat any more than a bowl of salad. Gerry Bartlett (twin-type) phoned from Santa Cruz about some horrible coastal development on West Cliff Drive. She wanted to know where to get her letters published.

Dave appeared again at 6:30, just as I was preparing to leave for meeting. He was sulky and wouldn't even help me put things in car. He didn't talk all the way in, either. The meeting lasted until 9. Dave participated, but not very enthusiastically. He wanted a snack at Bin's before we left Arcata. We got home at 10:15, but Dave just got into his car and headed out. He left by 11:00.

up by 7:10 after a brief "love-in" ¹⁹⁷² 110th day - 256 days follow
with the "pooty-cat." Bill was awake early, too.

A beautiful day. Low temp to start but I warmed up to near 60°. Wind not as heavy as yesterday or the day before. Made large batch of chocolate chip cookies so Bill could take some in his lunch. Cleaned windows in bedroom and did other housework.

Spent a brief time out of doors clipping some ivy and pulling a few weeds.

Received an invitation to join a dinner group with visiting Garrett De Bell from Berkeley. (He edited The Environmental Handbook among other things) - here to lecture at HSC.

Bill got home by 4:20. I had phoned him about going out. Meanwhile, I had bathed and dressed.

We left at 5, headed for Manora home.

Dinner was Thai cooking - excellent!

Bill stopped by the Science Bldg. to see if a staff meeting was in progress; it wasn't - some other night, he guessed.

In bed early - 10-ish - to read.

No sign of Dave all day.

¹⁹⁷² 111th day - 255 days follow Awake at 6. Up at 7. Foggy for awhile. Phoned Holly Gibson - planned a walk in woods (mostly G-P land) at 10:30.

Wrote a couple of letters - grabbed a small box of raisins, field glasses, etc. and took off for the old Quarry near Trinidad. We headed right out through the now quiet quarry, along the quieted pole line right-of-way route, across the G-P "A line" road, and then we dove into the woods (cut over, but coming back in thick underbrush mostly, like salal, huckleberry, ceanothus and such - all lush and beautiful, but so thick!) Obviously aerial seeded Doug. fir, Monterey pine and Bishop pine were coming into the once predominantly redwood forest. We climbed old logging roads for ocean views - Trinidad, Big Lagoon, Clam Beach; found a lovely dark pond; saw fresh bear scratchings on small pine trees; saw fresh elk sign - and noted heavy animal odors near us on two occasions, inspected animal droppings, noted spring flowers and beautiful growth, watched birds, listened to birds - and sat down to just look around, rest, and listen.

It was a great walk. The fog began showing up in little drifts above the tree tops and by the time we returned to Holly's place, the sky was completely overcast - and it turned cool.

Home by 5:45 after coffee and cookies.
No sign of Dave all day. Strange behavior!

1972

112th day - 254 days follow

up before 7. A grey morning.

A diversified day! Did some garden work, did some washing, clipped a pile of newspapers and noted that we had a little rain at one point. Otherwise, it was a lovely day - the sun came out - the birds were singing all over the place - the ocean was beautiful at low tide - children played on the wide beach (school bus load) and scrambled all over the rocks.

Bill went into school around 11. Dave phoned from the NCEC a couple of times regarding newsletters. He sounded glum.

At 3:30, shortly after Bill got home, I went to the Land-use seminar, held at the Ramada Inn. It began at 4 with Ray Bent the first of several panelists. 5:30 break; cocktails and dinner.

Sat with Dave Stang. Wm. Penn Mott, Jr., Dwight May and Fred Smith (G-P) had their say. Then questions and discussion, moderated by Nancy Hilfiker until 9:30. Had a couple of chances to talk with Mott - not only about Stanson dealings here at Little River, but what might occur on west cliff drive in Santa Cruz.

Home by 10:45. Bill Devall - and earlier, Dave, were reportedly here during evening. Clear and cold.

1972

113th day - 253 days follow

up by 7. A lovely day! Left at 8:45 for Land Use Seminar session at 9. Richard Wilson, Don Peterson (Co. Sup.) and Dr. Stu. Feller (DVM) were today's panelists - also a Dr. Robert Bailey, hydrologist now with USFS, who presented a sand capability map worked out for the troubled Tahoe Basin. Bill Van Fleet was the morning moderator, City Planner Jack Segal acted as moderator for long afternoon session which went until 5 p.m. Had lunch in the coffee

shop with Glenda Richter and Pollyanna McKnight. Got home at 5:45 - feeling too low to fix dinner. Nibbled a bit, then napped all evening on couch.

Went to bed at 12:30.

up by 7. A lovely morning. A few ¹⁹⁷² clouds in sight over the hills - and a bit of breeze.

Dave came down sometime mid-morning. Together we cranked out a brief statement in regard to zoning north of Trinidad - for an afternoon hearing before the Board of Supervisors.

We left home before 1 - had some copies made in town - got to Court House before 1:45 - only to find other left over agenda items were still being discussed. Finally, after a long session on Humboldt Hill proposed undergrounding of utilities hearing, the zoning came up. Everyone who favored R1, B5 - 2 acre minimum spoke first. Then those opposed had their chance - and still others had comments. We asked for postponement until open space became part of county general plan, etc. etc. At 4:40 we left town - 4-1 for proposed ordinance!

Barely had clothes changed when we decided to go back to Eureka Inn at 7:30 for an informal session of the North Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board and staff - and many observers, such as the timber forces and their lobbyists. Dr. David Joseph, Exec. Officer, ran the show almost. One drink at Inn, then we headed home at 10:30. Clear, cold moonlight. Dave slept on couch, since we would be attending hearing together at 9:30 A.M.

We had pizza for dinner in McKinleyville.

1972

117th day - 249 days follow

up by 7. A beautiful morning. Dave and I attended the NCRWC Board meeting in City Hall Council Chambers - from 9 until after 12. Then scooted home to get ready to leave for map session at Klamath NF office in Yreka. Dave drove home to leave AT and gather up food, clothes, etc.

I worked around house awhile.

Very warm - very beautiful.

Called to Dave's around 3:30 - only didn't quite get there - he picked me up on the curve just south of his place. Bill was home when we returned for some last minute things, so we could say goodbye - again. Drove to Crescent City, where we stopped for groceries before heading out toward Cave Junction. Found a place to car camp about 2 miles off main highway, alongside Knapiti Creek. Lovely moonlight night. Found sufficient wood for fire. Had good dinner, listening to rushing nearby water. Level spot apparently an old barnstead - if old apple tree could be used as indicator.

Slept inside camper.

Awake at daylight. A shining ¹⁹⁷² 118th day - 248 days follow bright, sparsely gray, clear kind of morning. Took a peak over the edge of the bank, where we had listened to water tumbling, and found the gorge narrow, steep sided, and the water in clear, deep pools between rock strewn drops. It was mild, but a small fire felt good. Breakfast was simple and good - toast, egg, oatmeal, coffee, bacon, juice. Flowering dogwoods help take the curve ~~over~~ off logged over land - now coming back, slowly. This was once privately owned - and may still be.

Pulled away around 8. Stopped along the stream as we drove out, to fill radiator and water container. Went into Oregon, then went O'Brien rd. to a forest service road (Wally Rd.), 40503 to snow patches that halted us. Explored area by map and field glasses. Sorted out peaks like Little Sanger, Bear Cub, Haystack, etc. Beautiful, warm and clear.

In Cave Junction we visited the District Ranger's office. Talked with one Ted Lewis, who provided us with a Siskiyou NF fireman's map and other materials. Went on to Medford, stopping for lunch at a rest area before reaching Ashland. Got to Yreka around 2:30.

Spent much time with Harry Taylor, Klamath NF (land resources) and other personnel, lining up our work for tomorrow. Left Yreka for high country for night. After being very warm (72°) it turned cool and cloudy. Camped on old spur road in upper Humboldt Creek area, about 13 miles from town. Had good fire, good dinner and beautiful clouds and moonlight.

Awake to sugar coating of snow at daylight - with ice in pans - VERY, VERY cold. Got up when sun crept down the slope to the road. Dave up early to get fire started and heat water, etc. Got to Yreka around 9 o'clock. Worked diligently on maps all day - cut over area, and 5 year proposed timber sales. Brief time out for lunch at nearby cafe. Supervisor Don Abraham located me and we talked at length; then before leaving we spent some time with Harry Taylor, picking up additional information and material. Left Yreka at 5:40, after pie & coffee stop, gas stop & post office, ~~which~~ drove 96 along Klamath River. Arrived at dark at Happy Camp. A few snow flakes bounced off windshield as we passed in and out of showers before dark, then it was clear moonlight most of way home. Arrived at 11:45. Corinne here with Bill. We sat up, talking, until 1:45. Corinne slept on couch (AT with her); Dave in his camper.

 loafed around until Autha called that we
 could come pick up the Franklin stove she had
 for us. Corinne, Bill & I drove up, leaving
 Dave here to help with unloading later.

Bill worked most of afternoon scraping and
 cleaning and de-rusting the little stove -
 out in driveway.

At 6 we went to the Starkeys for the
 long planned 50th birthday dinner for Corinne
 and Bill. Helen & Jewel were down from
 Springfield, Oregon, for the occasion - Alan
 was home most of evening - first time I had
 seen him since he had returned from army
 service, most recently in Denver area, after a
 stint in Vietnam.

We had a fine dinner and lots of
 fun, and headed home around 11:30.

Seems everyone had lost sleep last night
 so it was not a "long" evening tonight.

Dave was still here - ~~and called up~~
~~staying overnight again~~ - in his.

Wind came up in afternoon when Tom
 & Sennett from EPA was here and we
 tried sitting out on deck.

Corinne here another night.

1972 121st day - 245 days follow

Fourth Sunday after Easter

Social Security Tax Return Due

Up by 8. Clear & beautiful.
 We had leisurely breakfast,
 read paper, wandered outside,
 and started thinking about rearranging the living
 room to accommodate the stove.

Helen and Jewel arrived mid-afternoon. Bill
 took them all up to Autha's. Iris arrived.
 Dave was here, helping me prepare dinner;
 in fact he did our shopping for us. We
 took advantage of good weather and barbecued
 hamburgers on the deck, but ate in the living
 room, since a breeze was ^{too} cool to stay outside.
 Iris only "nibbled" with cocktails, since she had to
 leave earlier than the others to prepare dinner for Lee
 at 9 P.M. Before she left Bill showed slides
 of family - the Vinyards, young and old and in-
 between.

Up by 7. Clear and cool. 1972 122nd day - 244 days follow

Dave here during morning, briefly, then back in afternoon.

Han Brant phoned about my being "Sierra Club" on a panel for students at the innovative Chester College tomorrow night. I had to say no.

Dave, RT and I took a quick walk to Luffenbury Beach around 5:30. Bill not feeling too sharp - a tooth was hurting and his jaw was swollen.

Dave worked on maps all evening.

1972 123rd day - 243 days follow

Up by 7. Lovely morning. Breezy in afternoon. Dave took off for Forest Service offices. I typed up brief meeting notice, cutting a stencil. Took it to Environmental Center around 2. Dave showed up there and ran it off on mimeo. Then, together, we helped Sue Van Kirk, at her home, by folding, stamping, etc. She would do mailing in morning.

Dave rounded up (by phone) Chuck Kennedy and Anne Weier to give the Sierra Club's statement regarding Butler Valley Dam at a public meeting before the Citizens Advisory Committee. Tom Sennett phoned. I invited him out for dinner. He stayed all night. Dave got slightly upset because his map work was interrupted. Tom put sleeping bag on deck. Dave either went home or slept in car -

Bill got emergency appointment with dentist at 10 A.M.

I phoned him at school around 2. His troublesome tooth - or what remained - was removed for good.

Up at 7:30. Foggy. Each of us ¹⁹⁷² 124th day - 242 days follow
had a different breakfast, mostly at different times.

Dave chanced off to Forest Service offices. Tom prepared his film for mailing. Bill did some typing.

An appliance repair man showed up to fix a broken wire in one surface unit of electric stove.

Bathed hurriedly before fixing dinner. Left for Nollia Exp. Health Meeting at 7:30 - all the way in to St. Joseph's hospital. Good meeting - over at 10 after viewing out 3rd draft of goals, etc.

Home, after a drifty, foggy drive, at 10:45. Read awhile. In bed by 12.

Dave had worked on maps all evening and ended up on couch - for night.

1972 125th day - 241 days follow

Up at 7:30. Very foggy. Tom arrived around 9 and he and Dave took off for the Redwood Creek area - prepared to hike. Bill did a lot of typing while I cleaned house. Gary W. was in briefly before Bill left for school.

127th day - 239 days follow

Up by 8. Foggy, but not
windy or cold. We all did our separate breakfast
thing. Prepared a large macaroni salad for the
SC potluck dinner while Bob Kirby stood about
talking awhile - after lunch. Dave worked on
maps for presentation at meeting - both wilderness
proposal (Liskigans) and "roadless" or undeveloped
areas.

Bill made brief trip to town around 3.
Got ready for meeting and left at 6:20.

2 USFS personnel on tap to add comments
when Dave gave current status of candidate study
areas and public meetings - one to be held in Eureka on 26.
Good program by Gretchen and Pete Peterson on the
wildlife and threats to the Everglades.

About 40 people for dinner - close to 80 for
program.

Home by 10:45. Cleaned up kitchen, then
played 2 lines of Yahtzee.

Prepared for water shut-off in morning.

Awake, first at 7:15; then at ¹⁹⁷² 7:40 I jumped out after falling asleep with the cat snuggled in my arms. Dave got up when he heard me rustling in the kitchen - and moved cars out of driveway. Light rain falling. No ditchdigger showed up. At 10:45, Dave, MT and I headed north for exploration of Red Mt. No luck - a locked gate by Simpson Timber Co. not very far out of Klamath Glen. Back through, and a stop for lunch at Prairie Creek State Park. Then to the beach at Stone Lagoon. We climbed a high, scary, rocky point, ran with MT, collected driftwood.

Good afternoon after all - since it was great disappointment not to be able to get to Red Mt. (Learned from woman at trailer at gate that road was badly washed out, 2 bridges missing and heavy equipment in area to try to open road for "tourist" use by June or July. Home by 5 - just as ditchdigger was pulling out. New water line in all the way to the house. Had bath & shampoos before dinner.

Got Dave to work on big map awhile after viewing a lengthy basketball game on TV. Gary Williams came down for a brief time to relate what he saw in the China Pk. Boundary Mt. Green Mt. area - logging (fresh) and more roads and no trails, etc. - different from that shown on map. He was furious with the US Forest Service.

Played 2 times of govtze before heading to bed. Some light drizzle all evening.

1972

129th day - 237 days follow

Lip around 7. Variable cloudiness. Dave went home briefly after breakfast before our planned visit to Six Rivers NF and other grounds in Eureka pertinent to our map making efforts. We returned around 12:30. Bill was already gone - in fact we spotted his car near Little River bridge - where he was collecting specimens for class.

There were many phone calls from outside - and inside, regarding wilderness, forest practices, etc. Tom Sennitt phoned earlier that she would mail Dave's keep from Grayscomb.

We worked on our big map up until 5:30. Went for walk to Luffenbalty before dinner. Dean Freeland encountered us en route.

Went back to map making after dinner - and at midnight - gave up for a couple of lines of govtze. In bed by 1.

Breakfast around 8. Partially cloudy. 1972 130th day - 236 days follow
 Bill slept until 9. Dave worked on map most of morning. Lovely in sun out in garden - pulled a few weeds just to stay out after dumping coffee grounds around.

At 12:30 Dave and I left for Encke. Did errands after leaving him at Forest Service offices - then joined him for a couple of hours of map tracing - doing five year timber sales plan. Had a chance to get a few words in with Bob Allison and Dave Stang.

Bill and I took MT for walk before dinner. Bill only went 3/4 of way to Luffenbottz. MT and I went down onto the rocks and I threw sticks for her on the sand near the mouth of the creek. Back before 7.

Bill and Dave prepared sweet and sour pork for dinner. I munches a little cottage cheese and had coffee later. Bill Devael came by to look at our big map.

In bed by 12 - Dave and Bill both folded up before 10.

1972

131st day - 235 days follow

Up around 7. A nice day with some clouds and some wind. Had to take Bill's forgotten office keys to him around 11, so did a few errands while in Acreta area.

Dave devoted the day to his map making, with only a lunch break and a walk break after Bill got home.

I spent much time between laundry, typing, telephone and grass cutting. MT and I went all the way to Luffenbottz, while Bill + Dave returned sooner to watch TV-news program.

Bill Devael - and Jon Krupp were both after dinner arrivals.

Dave and I continued map work. Bill D. went home; Jon remained until after 1.

up by 7:30. Low clouds on 1972 132nd day - 234 days follow
fog, after Ascension Day sunshine.

Dave continued map work. I typed out No. Group Ex Com. meeting agenda and got ready to mail it out while in Eureka + Arcata. Bill went in to school around noon.

At 1:30 I left to do errands. Back at 4. at 4:45 Dave, MT and I headed out on 2 mile walk, arranging time for Bill to reach Luffenholty so we could walk the mile back together. Breezy, but warm and beautiful.

Dave cooked short ribs on grill on deck. We ate on enclosed deck.

Then Dave, MT and I headed out for a brisk 2-miles (Luffenholty Cr. + return) to bring the day's total walk up to 6 miles.

Typed a 2 page letter to Mike Moore. We played 2 lines of Yahtzee when Dave finished some map checking. In bed by 12:40.

up by 7:30. A lovely day. Dave, MT and I took a quick run on Moonstone Beach at low tide around 8. When Bill finished breakfast he began preparing for his field trip to Clear Lake. Dave worked diligently on the maps to take to Santa Rosa meeting. After lunch I made preparations for our (Dave's + mine) trip to the Ex Com. meeting - gathering information together. Bill phoned from school around 4:30 that he and gang were on their way and would be spending night at a place in Kelseyville.

I pitched in on map work. Dave and I decided to eat bacon and eggs here and after getting all dishes washed and all pertinent materials together for presentation at meeting, we finally got away around 9:30 or so. Going through Eureka I dropped off some Wild Lines material for a high school student. On our way through Red Bluff Dave left some maps with Kent R. We managed to sneak under the wire on a gas station's closing at 11 o'clock - and then were on our way.

Near Leggett, off Highway 1 turnoff, we found a quiet place to sleep off the road - too sleepy to drive any farther.

The night was clear, starry and mild.

On our feet by 7:30. Clear, 1972 134th day - 232 days follow
warm and beautiful. In daylight we could see
our surroundings. Redwoods, firs, masses of wild
iris and brilliant yellow corn poppies. Drove all
the way to Ukiah before getting any breakfast.

Got to meeting at Santa Rosa Jr. College about 1/2 hr.
late, but Charlotte was still waiting for a guarantee.
We sat in a small patio, under large umbrellas.
b: The sun was too hot to work under, so
after a lunch break we moved indoors - in the
cool faculty lounge.

Our maps were received most favorably.

The meeting broke up at 5. We drove Al Whitney,
over to Coddington Shopping area to meet his wife,
and then headed north. It was extremely warm.
We decided to shop for cook out type groceries in
Cloverdale and hoped to get near the Yolla Bolly
for the night. However, we got frustrated over
the lack of camping areas, the driving time,
and the fact that the Datsun kept boiling. So,
after a late coffee stop in Garberville, we
spent another off-highway night in the
Franklin K. Lane Grove near Phillipsville. It
was near midnight when we collapsed - too
sleepy to have gone another mile.

Up by 7:30. High fog. Lots of
birdsong - pileated woodpeckers went
clattering overhead and a mob of ravens must have
been having a convention nearby. Breakfast was

Home by 5. Bill got back at 5:30. Dave went home after dropping me off, and returned at 6:15. Meanwhile Don Janita phoned and would call back for Dave.

Tom Sennett phoned from SF around noon. He planned to return end of week probably.

137th day - 229 days follow

up by 7:45. Raining. Spent most of day working on map or answering phone calls - or gathering material for tonight's ExCom meeting.

Picked up finished product, then dashed to Van Kirk's place to start folding job on 3000 in 3 sections. I had phoned Bill that dinner was a "loner" for him. Anne Weiss, Barbara Burgess, Bob V. Susie. Dave and I got through a huge pile by 9. Dave and I res. ate with Susie and Bob until near 10:45 - talking and folding, and stapling.

On home we relaxed over coffee and a game of Gabyze.

Bill said Bill D. and Gary Williams had both been in during evening. Gary brought Bill some freshly baked cookies.

139th day - 227 days follow

Up at 7:30. Flowery-

Worked at Susie's home from noon until nearly 5. Dave came by and took the first mailing to the P.O.

Took some stuff to Jeanie Kirby to work on. Home by 6. Dave, Tom Sennett and Biel all ahead of me - on cocktails, already!

Tom took us to dinner at Mullymans - rather late - 9 - back by 10:30 - and Tom flaked out on couch early. Dave and I continued to work on the roadless area big map until 2 A.M.

MAY

19

FRIDAY

Up at 7:30. Dave and Tom had 1972 140th day - 226 days follow
left by 6:30 First Day of Pentecost (Jewish) to fly over the area
to the north. Scattered clouds. Temp. up to 62° in mid-
afternoon. Finished map work and headed for town at
11:15. Stopped at Janie Kiship to pick up large box
of "things" ready for mailing, getting to Sue's at
noon. Put map up in Environmental Center.

Finished work on mailing just in time to get it
to PO before 5 PM. Dave showed up at
3:30 to help. Bob Van Kirk also helped.

Dave and I shopped for outing type
groceries. Tom had his car to get to Prairie
Creek State Park; Dave had Doug's car.

Dinner at 8 - in the living room
to take the view before dark. Light
rain falling. Dave went home around
9:30. Tom fell asleep on couch. In bed
by 12:15, after getting pack readied for SC
outing tomorrow.

Vic telephoned - upset over SC cuts

Raining.

1972 141st day - 225 days follow

Armed Forces Day

Alarm went off at 6. Dave
showed up at 6:15. Mary MacArthur phoned
at 6:30 - I urged her to hurry along - the outing was still "go."
Dave and I left at 6:50. Tom was up to say good bye.
(Bill would get him to airport by 9). Reached meeting
place near Snow Camp at 8:30. Found David Anderson and
young friend Paul Smith already there - having come up
last night. Mary's car wouldn't take one steep, muddy
hill, so she walked to our meeting place. We all hit the trail
for Bug Creek Buttes (and wherever?) by 10. It was coal,
with zero visibility. We reached our camp area (which
Dave and I scouted out last Sunday) at 12:40, after once going
in a complete circle on ridge - in heavy fog! We
spent the entire afternoon trying to keep a campfire
going - and trying to keep ourselves warm. When it
began snowing a few snowball fights began also.
We all hit the sack around 8 - too cold to
stay up any longer.

Dave and I used his tent - Mary, Paul & David
had well arranged tarps and a tube tent put to
end to end, using same center rope between
two huge Cedars.

Woke up around 6 to find **1972** 142nd day - 224 days follow

Whitsunday - Pentecost (Christian)

a few inches of ~~fresh~~ snow on the ground, not enough to cling to tree trunks and branches. A lovely night -- but very cold. Everything was soaking wet to pack when snow turned to rain. On the trail by 8:30 - straight up, it seemed, and through scrub oak awhile. Visibility still zero! The 2 Daves took off on what they thought would be a short route to camp, leaving us to find our way to the road by (hopefully) following Boulder Creek and old logging roads. For hours we hiked up and down, up and down, up and down, crossing creeks, going over cut over land with unstable debris and creating hazards for us and moving up water courses and roads, with gullying occurring where trucks wheels had made ruts - long ago perhaps. It was very cold, but only a light misty rain falling occasionally. We didn't know exactly where we were, but by deliberating with a map, managed to come out on main road.

At 10 PM Doug Ayres' VW was burned off after being wrecked in the mud & sec near Sr. Maryman's house. On exciting evening.
Doug O.K. - at home

1972 143rd day - 223 days follow

Up by 7:15 - Low clouds or fog - later in day some clearing - clouds and sunshine. Dave came down with Doug, then gave Doug the use of his car all day. I began a great pile of washing that took all day to finish. Dave put his gear in order, then began work on a Siskiyous wilderness proposal mapping effort. Gary Williams and then Bill Devel dropped by briefly. Bill got home from school before 5. We drove Dave home, & it MT with us, and went up highway 6 to Big Lagoon. Bill collected a few aquatic plants while MT ran around.

Dave and Doug here for dinner and most of evening.

Up by 7:15. Worked around 1972 144th day - 222 days follow

house until 11 - time for bath and to get ready to leave for Eureka Inn by 12. Bill Devall came by - and Dave had shown up earlier - and we lamented realization that bulk mailing had been delayed in Arista post office for lack of a few dollars. I stormed into the postmaster on my way to Eureka.

Luncheon workshop in Simpson Room of the Inn was to learn about the National Trust (Historic Preservation Foundation, Historic sites, Landmarks, Federal Register, etc. (related subjects) and how they could provide guidelines and a means to move Humboldt County into some activity to realize the values of historic preservation. An interesting session, attended by 30 or more persons of different backgrounds, but all with historic interest as meeting point.

Did numerous errands and got home before 5. Sun was out. Dave & MT were back. We drove to Strawberry Creek at 6 and walked a sample of miles north on beach.

Dinner was late - 8:30. Dave went home around 9:30.

Made cookies by midnight.

1972

145th day - 221 days follow

Up before 7:30. A lovely day. Went to Trinidad school at 10 to go with Mr. Bettencourt's class to Trinidad Head. Split up into 2 groups of 12 with at least 3 adults (parents and non-parents - male & female) with each group, we walked to the cross, then to the lighthouse. The view was superb - and I had neglected to bring a camera! We got back to the school shortly before 12. It had been a "new" experience for me, and first time ever to go to the sight site of the 1775 cross - and 2nd time (in 12 years gone by) to go to lighthouse. Worked in garden a couple of hours after lunch, then decided to get some ironing out of the way.

Bill arrived around 6 - with a new file cabinet (damaged, so price reduced). Dave had showed up shortly before, so he helped with necessary moving.

At 6:40 Dave and I left for a land use ethic discussion meeting with Bill Van Fleet, Anne Weiss & Bob Van Kirk - at the Env. Center. We finished at 8:30 - and were back home before 9. Took a very short walk up the road with MT. Bill Devall & Gary Williams came in while dinner was cooked - and eaten.

Before 12 we played Yatzee awhile - then folded.

Up at 7 in order to get Dave 1972 146th day - 220 days follow
up - in order to get Doug and get him to school.
Bill went in before noon. Dave showed up -
made phone calls, ate lunch, borrowed my car
and took off to do a "thing" for FM-KVGO
on roadless areas for broadcast tonight.

Beautiful day. Did a lot of house
cleaning and some filing and
letter writing.

Dave and Doug here for dinner.
Holly Gibson here briefly around 7.

Worked on statement after doing
dinner dishes. In bed by 11:30.

Up by 7. Typed statements
for Forest Service's afternoon session on "unroaded"
news. Dave and I presented ours (he was called in
no. 2 spot-cards shuffled-called randomly) during the
1:30-5:00 P.M. time of public meeting at Eureka High
School Auditorium. Bill arrived before I was called and
I later went home with him. Dave used my car and got
some foods for our weekend of backpacking. A quick
dinner, clothes change and packing session between
6 and 7:20. Bill did not attend evening session.
Dave and I, all dressed for backpacking, left
Eureka at near close of meeting. The presentations
were numerous in favor of more time for study and
more wilderness. 121 people attended in P.M.
107 had attended in afternoon. Over 60 oral
statements were presented.

At 10 P.M. we indulged in a hot fudge sundae
at Union Town coffee shop, then gassed up and
headed out for Willow Creek, Hawkins Bar
turn off to Debby and from the turn off to Grizzly
Camp, 11 miles of bumpy, narrow, wet road.
At 1 we stopped near David Anderson's parked
car at a washout on Horse Linto Creek, about
2 miles short of Grizzly Camp. There we
spent the night - Sleepy - exhausted!

Beautiful morning. Up by 7:15. Cooked breakfast alongside car with creek rushing just below us. Steve Mader was with Daniel Anderson. They started hiking ahead of us. We backtracked to FS Happy Camp, looking for Bill Devall - no luck. Meanwhile Gary Alves and wife Joyce showed up to join the outing. Dave and I hit the road at 12. We found the Alves at the summit, one long hair's tick over the steep road. Lunch for us there at 1. Very warm. Giving careful directions to the Alves', we went on ahead. At Lipps Camp we found David and Steve. From there on to our destination many long, hot, tired hours later we four were together. Soldier Creek was running high where trail crossed. Lots of water crossings, some tricky with a heavy pack. Got into camp around 6. During our "Happy Hour" the Alves' showed up.

We had a good campfire after dinner - after the breeze died down and even toasted marshmallows before heading for bed. Full moon this night, but none of us could stay awake to enjoy - we only saw it begin to rise. A warm night. Ants bothered us - great big black ants, but we managed to get to sleep.

1972 149th day - 217 days follow Birdsong everywhere at dawn. The

Trinity Sunday Camp came alive by 7 with throwing of fire

cones at the unsuspecting. Lovely, warm morning. The Alves broke camp and prepared to head back leisurely and stay the night at Lipps Camp. David, Steve, Dave and I, with light day packs headed toward 8-mile camp and Salmon River at 8:30. It got steep (trail wise) and hot. Scenery was great, however and birding was fun. Snow patches were welcome before reaching 8-mile creek, where we lunched and rested at 12:30. All of us soaked our hot, tired feet in the icy cold small stream. Around 1 we headed on, straight up through the forest, still in heavy snow patches. In the ridge top timber we had running snow-ball fights. We reached a sheer drop off point (snow covered) and looked down on Red Cop Lake and up to Summit of Salmon Mt. (about 1 trail mile more). Time and energy gave out - so we headed back around 3. Took a few photographs - starting with scene from meadow on ridge at 8-mile camp. David and Steve, ahead of us, reached camp by 6. We got in at 6:30 - and found Collette & Bill Van Fleet there, also newly arrived - and very weary.

We had a "Happy Hour" after Steve and I went down to spring for water. (Dave's feet were hurting).

Collette had dinner as she lay in her sleeping bag! We had a lovely fire - roasted marshmallows, then headed for the pack around 9.

Full moon rose at our bedtime, but no one remained awake long.

We had hiked approximately 17 miles over very up and down type - the Devil's Backbone!

Awake by 6. Up by 7.

1972 150th day - 216 days follow

Memorial Day (In District of Columbia and most States)

Everyone busy packing as soon as breakfast was over. Just a bit cooler today - very comfortable. (Large black ants had given some of us a restless night).

Around 8:30 we had all left camp site; David and Steve out ahead. Dave and I paced the Van Fleet before crossing Soldier Creek. Heard a grouse (or 2) drumming (or whatever grouse do). Stopped at several of the streams for delicious, cool water.

Found woods full of lovely flowers. Dave took a few photos en route. Caught up to David and Steve at Lipps Camp. We snacked there, briefly, then went on. It was breezy in places, but still hot in others. Arrived at cars around 3:30. Gary + Joyce had not been gone long.

Dave and I dragged in, both with some foot or leg ailment, but felt better after lunch and cleaning up a bit.

1972 151st day - 215 days follow

Foggy - only a spot or two of sun in late afternoon. Dave showed up with Doug, who would ride to school with Bill. Did a couple of loads of washing and worked in garden. Dave was on the phone a great deal of the time. Went for walk right after dinner with MT. Bill David encountered us $\frac{1}{2}$ way to Luffenholty Beach, so parked car and walked to beach with us. We rode back home with him - and he stayed while we watched the McGovern-Humphrey second TV debate, which lasted one hour.

Dave's feet and legs were bothering him today. Mine were O.K. (proven by brick walk).

Dave, Bill and I played some late Yahtzee - Bill had painfully good luck with 3 Yahtzees in 1 line. Dave spent night on couch.

Dave was first up - around 7. 1972 152nd day - 214 days follow

I was up and about by 7:15. Foggy. Dave went home to get ready to make an assault on Six Rivers NF's photos (aerial). Bill left around 9:30. I spent an hour or so ironing, then bathed, dined, ate lunch and gathered Sierra Club materials together for talk at COP at 10 o'clock. The Conservation class of Mr. Wilson Kales Natural Resource course heard all I could tell them in 1½ hrs. about the Sierra Club. Sun shone brightly when I did a few errands in Eureka, but the wind was brisk. Had a long talk with Funa Black when we encountered each other in Montgomery Ward store, where I was gathering up some replacement backpacking type foods. Home by 6.

Bill + Dave ahead of me. Cocktails on the deck.

Fell asleep after dinner - felt a sore throat discomfort. Bill + Dave went for brief walk - then Dave went home for the night.

I cleaned up kitchen and tried new cookie recipe - finishing at 12:30.

1972 153rd day - 213 days follow

Up at 6 to get ready to leave for Big Bar, Weaveride and Coffee Creek Ranger District offices. Warm and lonely, having left fog on coast. A brief stop after Willow Creek, before reaching Big Bar, where we talked with Chuck Macfadin. We worked over some maps, mainly on transportation systems and/or new roads until 12:30. Back to Big Bar Cafe for lunch, then on to Weaveride. It was much warmer there. We had a rough go of it to get any help at the district level, but finally Dave got the timber atlas and some road information. Then I went to the SP Land office, where I talked road and timber sales information out of one Mike Graves for nearly 2 hrs. District Ranger Russ Engel talked with us before we all left at 5.

Dave and I shopped for dinner and breakfast things, then headed toward Trinity Center. We tried some roads; the Datum heated up; lost power on steep pitches; etc., etc., so we explored where ~~for~~ safe and found a good camp spot near trail head to Lake Anna on E. Th. Strait Creek. The stream was bridged at that point, but still it was lonely, plunging ~~over~~ ^{down} in small cascades, flowing and swirling in deep and shallow pools as it dropped. Lots of firewood, so we had a small one to cook our steaks over coals.

Slept in camper, since Chuck Macfadin had earlier mentioned confronting a rattler near Big Bar.

up before 7. Sunny and warm. ¹⁹⁷² 154th day - 212 days follow

Loggers began coming by around 6:30. After about the 5th car I felt safe in getting clean at streamside, near the dam, beautiful pool beneath the new looking cement bridge.

Around 9 or so, after cleaning up breakfast things, we drove on to the Coffee Creek Ranger Station. There we were received cool-ly, but finally were given a room to look at aerial photos and some maps of road systems. Had hamburgers for lunch at small nearby cafe, then right back to work until nearly 5. Earlier in day we had stopped at Preacher Meadow Campground to get the great pile of maps in order and discuss the next moves. At Wytstov's we got a cool drink, then went road looking, remaining on the go until nearly dark.

Thunderheads in afternoon made sky darker than usual so we had to stop our road check at 8:30. Small stores closed at 6 - no alternative but to eat in cafe (dine-in) in Weaverville. Phoned Bill around 10 to say we would camp out near Big Bar and get home early tomorrow - both of us too tired and sleepy to allow for safe driving.

I tried to go up Manzanita Ridge road, but the Nations balked on a steep pitch. I guided Dave with a flashlight as he backed down to a fairly level clearing where we could park for the night.

Both slept late -- for being out in the hills - 7:20 when quail calls finally made me stir. Immediately, after firing radiator, we tried to get up the ridge, but failed -- just not enough power. So, then we decided to save time and rather than cook breakfast at Big Bar campground right near Hwy 299 - at the very foot of the ridge road - we chose to eat at Big Bee Station cafe. Brilliant sunshine until we reached Lord Elch's summit; rest of way home in fog - with headlights on.

After getting things straightened away and checking food stuffs - or lack of - I went grocery shopping in McK - also, took large load of recyclable materials to Env. Center - and while there, got large roadless area map - to use at tonight's Sierra Club meeting.

After bathing I prepared a large mixed green salad. Meanwhile Dave went home to get cleaned up and gather SC materials.

Between a woman (member) in Eureka and Dave Anderson (coming in from Ferndale) we had a long teleph. from Mike McC. (SC) regarding public lands - feel to inform our members.

Small group for potluck, but room full for program. John Harper and Scott Kruse gave us a fine presentation - with slides - on the Mineral King project and the situation today.

Home by 11 - so we 3 relaxed by playing a few lines of Yahtzee.

Dave remained here overnight.

Up by 7. High fog. Went to ^{Corpus Christi} 1972 156th day - 210 days follows
work in garden right after breakfast - and
worked outside most of day. Bill Devall
brought in SC mail. He, MT and I went for
quick run along Moonstone Beach.

Bill awaited a PME fellow - but he never
showed. Dave prepared material for long
phone conversation with Luis Ireland
regarding roadless areas.

Dinner late - watched a little TV -
played a few lines of Yahtzee - then we
all folded up around 12.

Cut Dave's hair before he got away.

Up by 7:30. High fog.
Worked outside most of morning. Did some
housecleaning. Dave talked with Don Janitor,
who arrived on evening plane and came here for
dinner. Dave spent most of day at FS office
getting more information for Luis Ireland. Their
phone conversation was less long tonight - less
than an hour - yesterday's "chat" was 2 hrs!!!
Don and Dave prepared a resume, about
Dave, for the Atty. General. I ended up typing
the final ~~the~~ product after Don did the rough
draft.

After everyone left I baked cookies and
cleaned up the kitchen - and finally got to
bed at 1:20 - but thought it to be only 12:20!
Felt a sore throat coming on - at dinner time.

TUESDAY

Awake early, but fell asleep again - 1972 158th day - 208 days follow
and it was nearly 8:30 before I really came to.
Sore throat very rough - stayed in bed. Bill
brought me breakfast.

Dave had dropped RT off here on his way to
7 o'clock breakfast at Eureka Inn (on Simpson).
Fooled around house - took a lot of phone calls -
had a young couple in - trying to locate a place to
live while doing 2 years of graduate work. Carol
Severy came out to go over ballot and propositions
before voting. Bill returned early and went over ballot,
too, then we went "up the hill" to vote.

Dave phoned that he would be here for dinner, but it
turned out he would have dinner with Don Janette and
others at the Bella Vista Inn.

Bill and I watched early election returns -
until Sec. of State declared no counting (results) could be made
public until SF polls closed at 11 P.M.

Dave returned around 10:30 and promptly fell
asleep on couch. He reported a successful day in
the field on the Atty. General's tour of forest practices,
but an exhausting one.

Bill and I managed to stay awake just
long enough to learn that McGovern had lost
in Hampshire.

159th day - 207 days follow

Dave slipped out at 7. Bill
was up early, too; since he had to give test at 8 o'clock.

small errands. Got membership files from Susie, who
would be vacationing in east until August 1. Had tea and
talk with Janice Kirby as I dropped off some coastal
alliance petitions - on way to grocery store.

Home by 5. Dave back; flopped on couch.
Bill Sevall came by - as we were having dinner -
and sat with us for coffee and strawberries.

My head and nose and throat acted up - so
I went to bed at 9:30.

Dave went home - for a change.

JUNE

8

THURSDAY

Foggy - low clouds - with drizzle

Bill up at 8. I remained in bed - for breakfast - when throat could take food. Fred Fisher showed early about Dave's photographs. Got up around 10, dressed and started cleaning up messy kitchen.

Dave arrived and promptly began tearing the engine to pieces to get the head gasket off. He borrowed my car to have it looked over at an Arcata repair shop.

Spent afternoon doing 3 loads of washing and some grass cutting and tree pruning in garden.

Bill returned early. Dave returned and continued sweeping, cleaning, putting grease up to his elbows - until cocktail time.

Dinner at 7:30. Dave and Bill took NT for short walk while I bathed. Bill Sewall and Dong came in around 9. Bill (D.) had just completed moving his things from rental near Trinidad to small house he bought in Arcata. Dong had recently returned from Bay Area with new (used) 1968 Datsun pickup, just like Dave's.

Left them talking and because I was having trouble breathing, went to bed at 10:30.

JUNE

Very low tide - 2:00? 7 AM

1972 161st day - 205 days follow

Feast of the Sacred Heart

A very grey day. Had to get up during night to take care of a bothersome rain drip at one of our western windows, where wind was causing big push. Had some confirming phone talks with WBZ-TV (Boston) and Jack Davis (RNP), Crescent City. Got a few things in headlines for evening's ExCom Meeting. Bill went into college for brief time, but did not feel well enough (cold, sore throat, etc.) to attend 10 AM graduation ceremony.

Dave went into town (to check on car parts) with Dong. At 2:30 I left for Ukiah, stopping briefly in Eureka to pick up some "nibbles" for the road and a top map for the weekend outing.

Beautiful clouds - no rain - as I went southward. Cool driving. Arrived in Ukiah in good time for leisurely dinner at a "Denny's" place, then on to the meeting at a church near down town area.

The Trinity Alps boundaries proposals was a major discussion item and the ExCom endorsed the present lines with modifications to be considered by NCRCC. Luis Seelund (Subcommittee, wilderness) was present and took map with Kurt H's ideas pencilled in. Unfortunately, Dave was not there to defend some of our ideas of "lines."

Meeting ended around 11:30. Went back to Denny's to have thermos filled with coffee to help get me home.

Surprising amount of traffic on road between 12 and 3:30.

Some light rain Ukiah north.

1972

162nd day - 204 days follow

Up at 6 a.m. after slipping into bed shortly after 3:30. Dave arrived at 6:30 and had some breakfast while I finished mine and gathered things together for backpacking weekend. Raining lightly all the way to Crescent City and beyond - out the Big Flat Rd., along So. 7th. Smith Pkwy. Went on to Cedar Spring camp, where we found Bill Devel waiting. We got into snow as we proceeded on up the horrendously high standard GO road. There was evidence of winter damage to road. Only snow conditions and lack of visibility kept us from going to end of road in search of trail to Doctor Rock and Peak 8. We retreated to Cedar Spring and tried to get a fire going. It took over an hour to get re-sets, but finally were able to warm "frozen" toes and hands. Had snack lunch between showers.

Around 2:30 we tried going up again, but conditions only worse by added gusty, cold winds. Bill decided to go on to Ashland in search of sun. Dave and I decided to take much needed nap, in hopes that late afternoon would bring change in weather. No luck. We left the higher elevation for rain only and for warmer conditions at Big Flat Campground. Managed to get good campfire going - in spite of dampness - and after some warming cocktails we had light (pack-type) dinner. Rain got more serious so we piled into the camper at 10. Time around 10.

1972

163rd day - 203 days follow

If rain, apparently, rather steadily during night, but we awakened to the sight of patches of blue sky, big white clouds, and spots of sun. Breakfast was simple and unhurried. It turned warm enough to forgo a fire. We prepared day packs for exploring Summit Valley and Peak 8 areas. The car had some heating problems - so water stops were a necessity. We found a 4 wheel drive ranch, left the car, and went onto the trail to Summit Valley Lookout. A short hike, about 2 miles. Dave photographed a beautiful, extensive meadow, covered with carpet of dodecaedrons. We could not locate trail to Summit, but fairly easy going through open woods. Found 5 snow plants popping through and brought back one Boschniakia, coming up in ridge trail. Ate lunch with superb views of Preston Peak and others, as well as newly snow mantled Trinity Alps. Pleasant hiking, but clouds getting grayer and lower all the time. Back to car to explore jeep road to Peak 8. Could ~~try~~ drive almost to top. Very short trail.

Dave's throat getting raw and troublesome, so decided to head home. Arrived in time to have dinner with Bill and Doug.

Dave feeling very rough, so spent night on couch.

Prepared self and materials for long day at Arcata High School tomorrow.

1972 164th day - 202 days follow

up at 6:30. A beautiful morning. Very low tide - lovely wide beach. Left at 7:40 to meet first class at 8.

Told the Sierra Club "story" to 6 classes. One coffee break at 10. Lunch at Bini's was quick. Enjoyed walking in sunshine, since fog had been quite low earlier.

Home again by 3:30. Windy over ocean, but did a long rest and sunbathed on deck from 4:30 to 5:45 when I discovered Bill had returned.

Dave came in very shortly, too.

Watched some of TV news then fixed dinner, which I did not choose to eat. I snorped instead in kitchen.

Dave was feeling pretty lousy, so spent most of evening on couch.

Bill took MT for brief walk around 10 o'clock. I went to bed early - still sniffling, but feeling generally better.

1972 165th day - 201 days follow

up at 7 because I just couldn't sleep - and had a sleepless session before dawn, so just snuggled the cat in my arms. (She was sleeping soundly.)

Dave took his car into a shop at 8:30. At 11 I went in to pick him up, since the radiator would be rebuilt. Did his washing and puttered + pruned in garden. Did some rug vacuuming, then when sun decided to shine in latest afternoon I sunbathed on deck for an hour 4:45-5:45.

Bathed + dressed before TV News. Ate snacks alone and left at 7:15 for Kirby's. Jeannie and Linde and I went (in their Ford wagon) to Eureka Sam, where Linde would be interviewed (with 11 others) for WBZ-TV children's show, "Earth Lab". The session was extremely lively; boys and girls very knowledgeable; redwoods, timber cutting, beauty, population; solid waste, urban sprawl, coastline, rivers - all entered in discussion - and all kept on track by one Rex Trailer. It ended after 10. Many parents were on hand.

Had iced tea with talk about the evening's events with Jeannie, then finally got home by 11:30. Did dishes, then played yfhtzue.

Fog burned off by noon. 1972 166th day - 200 days follow
 Had ^{Flag Day} sun bath from 1 until 2 -
 on chair lounge - on deck - stepped down.
 Bill and Dave went to town at 1:30 and ^{Bill} ~~he~~
 turned alone at 5:30. Dave came in - afoot -
 at 6.

Did some ironing and sewing (mending) and
 house straightening before beginning on dinner.
 Ate by 7:15.

Went to Marlys Maher's around 8 to start
 working up next outing schedule; deadline
 June 20. All dumped back on Marlys when
 Dave Anderson flew the coop for summer in
 Idaho - suddenly.

Home by 10:45. Played Yahtzee after
 cleaning up kitchen.
 In bed around 1.

1972 167th day - 199 days follow up by 8. High fog --
 burned off (mostly) by noon. Worked in garden,
 pruning and pulling weeds -- perfect weather for
 doing that sort of thing. Dave made arrangements to
 fly to SF to meet with Legal Committee regarding action
 on Colegrove sale. His car was not ready, so he re-
 turned here with Bill, who had gone into the
 college around 2.

Had some phone conversations with Beatrice
 Lawer (SC). Dave phoned a couple or 3 times, too.
 Did 2 hrs. of sun-bathing, halfway on deck; halfway
 in living room, so I could hear phone between 2-4.
 Read latest SC Bulletin between many calls.

Bill took Dave to airport around 6 for
 6:25 flight.

After dinner, and just at sunset, Bill, MT,
 and I walked to Luffenholtz Beach and back.
 Calm evening, small sliver of moon showing.

Dave phoned around 9:30 for any
 information I might have gotten from
 earlier phone talk with Gary M. regarding
 wildlife in appeals area.

Did some filing of SC materials - in new
 filing cabinet added in dining room.

In bed shortly after 1 o'clock.

1972

168th day - 198 days follow

Awake by 7 - up before 8 -

A beautiful, sunny, 58° morning.

Did a lot of filing and post card writing re: SC.
Another phone - a 20 min. talk! Bill, still coughing
and sniffling, up by 10. Dave phoned around 10:30
with various messages and requests. Bill went into town
around 1:30. I sunbathed and read - and answered the
phone -- for about a 2 hr. stretch. Finally, the clouds
or fog, returned, so at 4 I retreated to feel corner
of living room - and clothes. Dave phoned
again from SF airport - returning within the hour.
Bill picked him up around 6.

Bill prepared turkey -- a la Julia Childs --
and I fixed a salad for dinner. We 3 ate in
living room in fading light around 9:30.

Dave returned with copies of the Legal
Committees brief in the case of SC against
Humboldt Fir and USFS over last of Colapine
sale which would affect wilderness prop road
on western side of Trinity Alps (Grogan
/ Hole, No. Trinity, etc. Horse Linto Creek, etc.)
Played some Yahtzee before doing dishes.

1972

169th day - 197 days follow

Awake by 7:15; rousing, without ¹⁹⁷² 170th day - 196 days follow

breakfast, Father's Day ~~by~~ before 8. Not a place open in
Hoopa to grab a bite, so we just went on -- breakfast-less!

Warm and clear. Charged along Big Hill Rd, then jeep trail road
to Grogan Hole - except we couldn't make it! Same story as last
time in - August 1970. Pushing, fixing stream crossings - trying
again and again, but finally left little (tired!) Datum at safe
place after all our long struggles, cooked breakfast (10:30), put
on hiking boots, and headed out at about 11:30. Rather warm. We
walked the rest of the jeep trail to Grogan Hole, then on to Bear
Hole - and on to a lovely (McKay) meadow. There we
rested, sunned ourselves, watched birds and had a lunch
snack - about 2. Returned in a long "loop", by passing by
an old trail, (we later learned) the jeep trail, until Grogan Hole.

Got back to car, tired, around 7. We figured
we must have covered 6-8 miles. Relaxed briefly
at car with a "mountain Manhattan" (Bourbon and
lemonade).

¹⁹⁷² 171st day - 195 days follow

Up at 6. Foggy. Crossed Golden Gate just before 8 o'clock. Got to Legal Defence Fund offices at 8:20. No one around. Left pile of maps and went ^{to} ^{for} breakfast.

Met the Legal Defence Fund as they came in around 9 - and all the secretaries. Beatrice & Barry worked up to last minute on material to present in Fed. Court at 10. We were whisked by taxi to the Federal Bldg, arriving in Judge Alfonso Zirpoli's court with just 3 minutes to spare.

First brief was presented by Humboldt Fir's counsel, then Barry Fisher did his SC bit. Meanwhile, it appeared that the judge had already written his opinion because suddenly he began reading a prepared piece, denying the TRO we wished. Depressed by the quick decision, we met for lunch at the Golden Eagle and had a pre lunch cocktail to help drown our sorrows and utter disbelief of the judge's decision.

At 2:30 Dave and I taxied to Beatrice Law's home in sunny Twin Peaks area. Had tea and talk, then we 3 drove in to LDF offices for 5:30 meeting to plan next move. John Hoffman (atty) and Ed Weyburn on hand. (Ed brought some medication to Dave, who was feeling low - and lousy).

After goodbyes Dave and I crossed Golden Gate at 8. Stopped near San Rafael for Mexican dinner. Got only as far as Cloverdale, stopping for night around 10:30.

FELL into bed - exhausted! Dave was almost out of it - feeling so miserable - and being so tired and sleepy on top of emotional strain.

1972 173rd day - 193 days follow On the road by 8. Breakfast near which around 1. Went to BLM offices. Dave feeling pretty rough so I drove as far as Eureka. Stopped for lunch at Stanton's; arrived home around 3:30.

Bill home around 5 - not feeling too hot - a hay fever, or asthma - or cold.

Phone rang constantly - arrangements being made by Legal Defence Fund. Finally, the word from John Hoffman that he would be arriving by air at 8:35 - ready to take to the hills!

Dinner was very late - after liquids - and bedtime came all too soon.

up by 7 to get jeep ready; get 1972 174th day - 192 days follow
 lunch stuff ready, etc. Whipped John away from
 airport by 8:50. A clear, beautiful day once
 over Lord Ellis Summit (fog on coast). Stopped
 briefly in Willow Creek for gasoline, beer, soft drinks and
 additional lunch material to be placed in ice box. Went
 into No. Trinity Mtn. area via Big Hill Rd. out of Hoopa
 and then the jeep road to Mill Creek Lakes area. Blocked
 by snow and fallen tree we lunched quickly where we
 left car not far from Waterdog Lakes. We almost raced
 along the trail in order to put John in right places to
 see where cut blocks as planned would be visible
 from wilderness. Dave photographed these views,
 particularly above Grogan Hole and one quick
 glimpse of the "rim" above Bret Hole before we
 had to turn back (plane time 6:40-ish).

Lost nearly $1\frac{1}{2}$ hrs. as we got into mud hole near
 Dot Creek. Had to "construct" a temporary road bed in
 order to get out. Since plane was out of picture now,
 we drove to sites of already logged Calgrove sales
 areas and got more photographs.

Home by 9:30. Bill DeWall here. Had another
 very late dinner. John bedded down on
 couch; Dave in dining room - around 12:30.

Alarm went off at 5:10. Got John to airport
 at 5:40 for 6:00 clock flight to S.F. Went back to bed until
 nearly 8:30. Cleaned out "things" from jeep.

Dave went into town with Bill in mid-afternoon. I took
 advantage of good weather and sunbathed where I could
 hear phone (which seemed to ring constantly).

Doug appeared during evening, but had already
 had his dinner.

Ed Wayburn phoned - late - would arrive 11:43
 by Hughes Air West.

We stayed up rather late, since we knew we
 could sleep in.

Bill came home with new "Scout" 2 man
 kayak. He and Dave wasted no time in
 assembling it and taking turns sitting or resting
 in it.

Up by 8:15. Got things together 1972 176th day - 190 days follow
for trip in No. Trinity Mtn. area with Ed. Dave
feeling lower than ever, but game to go through with plans.
Met 11:43 at 12:43! Came home to wait, meanwhile.

Cool and delightful when we stopped for gas and
"nibbles" in Willow Creek at 2. (Ed changed clothes,
also). Back up the same route as on Thursday, with John,
except that we stopped short of wet meadow near Dot Creek.
Then, after a quick snack, we high-tailed it up the
trail to Trinity Guard Station. Clouds over Shasta
and Trinity Alps at times. Everett Fountain and party
of young riders contacted us before reaching old guard station.
After some views from above Grogan Hole, Ed rode and
is asked - on around to Burt Hole.

Dave and I returned to Jeep. I collected aquatic
plants in meadow, around Dot Creek, and a lovely "wood
anemone" as we Jeeped out to main road. Took side to road
going into Fish Tang Creek drainage to meet horse party at
8:30 where trailer and truck were parked.

Left area by 9. All restaurants closed - no dinner
until 10 P.M. when we dined large pizza at Angelos.
Arrived home after 12.

Put Ed on living room couch. Dave once
more in dining room - in sleeping bag.
In bed by 12:30.

1972 177th day - 189 days follow

Everyone slept late. I
was first up at 8:20. A beautiful day -
Wore shorts. Breakfast for Bill, Ed + Dave
after 9:30.

I drove Jeep (Dave feeling lousy still, but going
along) to get Ed up on Bald Hills Rd. to view recent
ARCO hillside redwood slaughter. A quick (20 min.)
walk into Lady Bird Johnson Grove to view Berry Glen cut (old)
and Skunk Cabbage (new). Quick stop in Birch so
Ed could see fern - and for Jeep to get gassed up.
Ed caught 2:10 plane back to S.F.

After some lunch I got into working shorts and
cleaned up the dusty, muddied Jeep. Dave
took over lighter jobs as he felt like doing things
to help. Bill kept busy packing stuff from office.
Went to Anthea's for dinner - sometime after 6.
Pleasant evening, good dinner, but Bill wanted
to return to finish some work. Dave was just
cooking his dinner when we came in at 10:10.

I fell asleep on couch and didn't
wake up to creep into bed until 1:45.

Got some prescriptions filled for Dave.

Smuggled the pooty-cat awhile, 1972 178th day - 188 days follow then got up at 8. Beautiful morning here; foggy in Eureka.

Did a "slug" of washing while Bill packed. Dave helped as he could, feeling only slightly better.

Bill was ready to leave at 3:30, but I had some things in clothes drier (to be taken) and he couldn't say goodbye until around 4.

Sunbathed and relaxed from 4:30 - 5:30. Various and sundry phone calls right until 10 P.M.

Insisted that Dave stay down (as El ordered), so dinner was served in bed and he fell into sound sleep almost immediately. Cat alongside, dog nearby on floor.

A very quiet evening.

1972 179th day - 187 days follow Up at 8:15. Let Dave sleep as long as he wanted, then fixed light breakfast for him, which he accepted on a tray and seemed to be much improved. I made him remain down until noon.

Around 2:45 - Dave up, dressed, etc., but weak and headache-y - at times - we went to Arcata for a few errands and returned before 5.

Several phone calls - a few for Dave. (RNP Jack Davis phoned mid-morning).

Took outings to Morley Lake while in Arcata. Beautiful, warm, (63°) morning turned into low, heavy, wet fog in afternoon. No sun-bathing.

Dave retreated without dinner - very sleepy, strange behavior. I let him see upstairs bedroom.

M.T. and I slept on couch in living room, after catching up on a week's doings in my journal.

1972 180th day - 186 days follow

Awake at 6:30. Foggy. Up by 7. Dave arose around 8 and cooked his own breakfast while I vacuumed the living room - expecting the Stanford environmental fellows to show at 10 a.m. to talk with Dave - about Cal's Forest Practices. At 11:30 we left for airport to grab John Hoffman and a court reporter type and get them to Eureka Sun. John had lunch with us and Everett and Delphine Fountain, after I had dropped Dave Curtis and "box" at Eureka Sun. By 1:30 we got John H. to Eureka Sun to take deposition from Humboldt Tree Inc. (Sam Owens). We met the Fountains again and talked about case further. Spent a few minutes in 6 Rivers N.E. (Dave had previously requested copies of Colgrove Sales and map). Home by 3:30 - to review affidavit (Dave's) and await phone call from John.

Heard from John at 4:30. Went into Eureka Sun by 5:30 - waited until 6:30 for John & Dave - then rushed them to airport on already delayed flight. Found all flights out cancelled. (Fog) !!!!! They rented a car and drove to S.F. because both had early morning business appointments.

Dinner at home around 8. Phone calls galore - right up until bed-time.

1972 181st day - 185 days follow

Up by 7:45. Extremely low, thick fog. Steve Scharf, Stanford Environmental Law Society, (one of 4 here yesterday to talk with Dave regarding forest practices) returned again at 10 a.m. He joined us, Bill Van Fleet and Anne Weiss for lunch at the Epicurean at 12:30. We met to "finalize" our (SC) thinking and statement on a County Land use ethic, which Bill would present to Board of Supervisors in near future.

Home by 2:30. Bill Revell came by around 4. Vic Aubin came in to go over Sierra Club funds. Lots of phone calls regarding outings, legal stuff, etc.

Phoned Bill at UMB5. He had arrived the evening before after a good trip.

Began putting things out for weekend outing.

1972 182nd day - 184 days follow

Left on SC backpack outing in mid afternoon after putting critters in boarding kennel.

78° in Willow Creek around 3 PM. Drove to Elk Valley - end of regular vehicle road, about 2 hrs. out of Orleans. Spent night in apparently long used camping site at headwaters of Blue Creek - and beginning of trail to Elk Hole, Harrington Lake, etc.

Cooked dinner there - very pleasant. No one else around.

Slept out on ground under large cedars.

1972 183rd day - 183 days follow

Alarm went off for Dave at 6 so he could eat and leave early to meet SC members in Orleans. I had breakfast in bed, then after Dave left, cleaned up dishes. Bird-watched, flower-looked and sun-bathed awaiting return to outing participants who showed up around 10:45 - all at once. Meanwhile one family in a jeep had passed by; going up jeep trail (60 road) to Chimney Rock.

Packed up and hit the trail around noon - in the lead with two young (high school) boys from Davis. Others (Dave, too - who passed us by) caught up a mile or so up trail as we rested and snacked. It was warm. Dave took up on his own over Sawtooth Mountain. The rest of us found a (steepest) way down into Elk Hole. Rested there, then again on trail for a couple of hours, then fought brush down water course, which should have been a lake at bottom, but only rocky (slides) and marshy and loaded with mosquitoes. Arrived, exhausted, 4 PM.

Camped near another party - Fish & Game and FS. - Gary Monroe, Don La Fone, Dave Rogers, Bob Haper and Dave Garber.

Dave straggled in at nearly dark, as did John Henning and Dick Thompson. John joined us for a soup dinner at Davis and my separate camping site.

"No lake" camp we called it. Good water in stream, however.

Lots of bear sign here.

Folded up rather early. It had been hot and tough going at the last.

up by 7. Light breakfast. Dave + I ¹⁹⁷² were 184th day - 182 days follow ready to hit the trail by 8:30. Went straight up, through brush when trail disappeared around large land slip out. We cross country and picked up trail later. Rest of gang not far behind us, but they had found easier route. Many rest stops. Dave, again, pulled ahead of us, going his own way. We didn't see him again until late afternoon. The trail was elusive, but we managed to keep going and even answered Dave's location calls and yells. Both Dave and Dick + John (and the rest of us) were close to Harrington Lake, but either too high or too low. Finally, however, we reached the lovely, small lake, all of us about ready to drop in our tracks - from frustration, rather than weariness. The meadows were lush and beautiful.

F + G and FS gang in a few hours ahead of us. After getting a campsite set up away from others and having dinner, Dave and I talked with others around their campfire. John + Dick were set up close to us, while Bruce and others were on other side of the biologist's camp.

Lake had 1 rainbow trout (15") and loads of water dogs.

up before the sun. A beautiful place. Dave troubled with leg cramps - decided to remain in camp. Around 10:30 John and I hiked up to the ridge above us (Harrington Mt.) to take in the view and photograph the expansive area. Wildflowers were beautiful. *Darlingtonia* in one wet meadow area. Lots of bear droppings on trail. Heard a grouse. Viewed 3 lakes and 2 pot holes on other side.

Returned to camp by 12:05 as Dick planned to leave then - or close to that time. They actually got on the trail about 12:30.

Lazied around camp. Dave Garber and Gary Houser came over to talk - our cocktail time. I walked up the big rock slide nearby to gather a pan full of snow for our drinks. Returning over the warm, large boulders, I was startled by a large all gray snake. Did not see entire body of snake but Dave Garber thought it might be a rubber boa. He and Gary H. consulted their field books as we sipped a "Mountain Manhattan" together.

After dinner we went over to their campfire again for a brief visit. Two very curious, very friendly black-tail dogs came in close to all of us as we talked and moved about. During the night one "snorted" close to my sleeping site.

Dave's legs were beginning to be less bothersome, so we planned a short walk over the ridge in the morning - if there was marked improvement.

Awake to bird song. Breakfast ¹⁹⁷² was unhurried - before the sun got around to us. ^{Independence Day} 186th day - 180 days follow

Fixed up light day pack - lunch, cameras, field glasses, etc. and headed up the Harrington Mt. trail, as John and I did yesterday, without any delays in finding the start of the trail. We were leisurely, taking in views of Preston Pk., scanning open meadow areas for bears, watching birds, consulting our topo map, enjoying the warmth, the flowers, the remoteness - and all the area presented. Going along the Kelley Ridge trail we broke away, cross-countryed it to locate the lakes seen from the ridge. Open forest, much manzanita, dry looking and no bear sign as on other, more lush side of ridge. Two small unnamed lakes, one with pitcher plants in great patches on edges, were too shallow to swim in, so we went to larger, deeper one. It was lovely. Many water dogs, but not like Harrington. Fairly firm, clean bottom (some rocks) and a glorious, inviting, cool green. We enjoyed a refreshing swim before any lunch, then turned ourselves to burning paint, then another wonderful swim and finally the up hill cross-country bit to pick up ridge trail again.

We were back in camp in mid-afternoon. Before dinner, and after a brief rest, I went bird-watching. Came across 3 of the fellows from biologists' camp and joined them. We saw one black bear feeding happily in lush meadow. Dave had dinner ready when I returned to camp. He went back to next camp after dinner, but I piled into my sleeping bag as it began getting dark - around 9. Dave came back around 10.

¹⁹⁷² 187th day - 179 days follow up at daybreak. Packed after quick breakfast and hit trail at 6:30. Good going all the way until the hard pull out of Elk Vale. It took 40 minutes to reach the ridge in mid-day. Nearly dragging from hunger & warmth, we stopped at Flat Iron Lake for a refreshing swim and delayed lunch stop. Though steep in many places, the net was easy and 9 hrs. later (from A.M. start) we reached the car in Elk Valley (3:30). Had a cool drink and nibbled some peanuts, after getting into Tennis Shoes and Shorts, and left the area around 4. Leaving forest road 15N01 we swung over to 12N01, and got to Hwy. 96 about 4 miles west of Orleans, going through some private lands and back into public lands.

Stopped for milkshake in Willow Creek, then stopped in Mck at Angelo's pizza place - only, I had a sandwich.

Got home to find a note from Jean and Ted, who were in the area, and then a "camper" John Rauschild, emerged from sleeping bag south of house - under big fir. He had been here each night since Saturday. Went to talk to Dave about wilderness survey work.

Awake once before 8, but didn't get up until 8:15. Beautiful morning. Asked John to come in for dinner breakfast, which Dave cooked for him, around 9:30. They planned strategy later. Jean phoned at 10:30. They had stayed in Trinidad. I urged her to come here to fix their breakfast. They arrived before noon - all prepared to move in!

John fixed up his pack for one week, leaving surplus in Dave's care, then we dropped him off at Hwy. 299, before picking up MT and TF at the kennel. We had 2 happy animals to contend with.

Lud immediately planned on taking over the kitchen so there were some changes made in arrangement and animals behavior.

I fixed bedroom for them and took to sleeping on living room couch.

Much time spent watching 2 Siamese cats get acquainted.

1972 189th day - 177 days follow

Up fairly early. Beautiful, warm day. Started washing clothes and did some of Dave's, too. Jean and I did quite a bit of rearranging as they began to settle in.

Doug Ayers showed up in time to have late dinner with us.

Woke up feeling lousy. 1972 190th day - 176 days follow

Spent a lazy day, mostly resting, reading or napping - on couch.

No sign of Dave and Doug until after dinner, when they showed up, having walked down.

After some "bird" talk and ice cream they ~~had~~ wanted a ride home.

Iu bed early - everyone was - around 10:15 - 10:30.

Tasha + TF did a lot of running around - chasing, etc. during day. Beautiful to watch.

1972 191st day - 175 days follow Awake at 7. Up at 7:30.

Beautiful morning - early -- Fog drifted in for short while, then cleared off. Did dishes, then started some washing. Jean + Lnd began stirring around 10:45.

Dave + RT showed up - on foot. Sometime around 12:45 I walked to Dave's place + back, stopping there only long enough to have a quick bite to eat and talk to Doug a few minutes. Ocean was deep blue.

Back to the washing. Jean + Lnd took off for the beach. Lnd hoped to do some clamming but surf too rough. Jean helped me do some house-cleaning before she joined Lnd - at Merryman's!

Dave returned to do his washing and put the ice box back into his camper. Around 8 we decided to go to McK. to have a bite to eat.

Bill phoned from Yellow Bay (Elrod Lab. office) around 3:30 (PST) with list of things to send. Had a chance to give him quick run down on events of last week - and that the two Siamese cats slept - one on top of sleeping bag; one inside (poopy-cat) sleeping bag most of night - neither knowing the other was so close!

Played Yahtzee awhile before bed time.

Up before 8. Beautiful ¹⁹⁷² morning, though fog came around the edges for awhile. Dave + MT arrived around 9, having jogged down. At 10 I made the return walk to Davis place - and back. Talked with Marie + Jim Welch at Luffenbalty Beach parking area. Dave came by after lunch. I took off to get Bill's mail, to mail packages, etc. and do various odds and ends of errands, returning by 4:30. It was clear, warm (62° in Arcata) and beautiful the entire day. Very low (late afternoon) tide. Cut some grass before cocktail time. Dave + Doug showed up - and stayed for dinner.

We watched some of the antics of the Democratic Convention in Miami. Doug went home early. I drove Dave home at 12.

¹⁹⁷² 193rd day - 173 days follow

Up by 8. Worked in garden, mostly cutting down weeds with sickle, for over an hour after breakfast. Beautiful morning. Fog around the edges. ~~Dave showed up, having trotted down with MT, had breakfast and then~~ Did some house cleaning. Dave here awhile around noon. I went shopping in Arcata rather late. Jean + Lue went shopping in Eureka. Dave was back for dinner and to watch to Democratic convention on TV - all evening. Ray Macdonald phoned around 8:30. He wanted to plan Moonstone visit - soon.

At nine o'clock I met and talked with Emily Park at the Eureka Inn, returning home around 11.

Stayed up until 1 A.M. Lue and Dave held out longer. Dave threw sleeping bag on living room floor.

Awoke before 8. Up at 8:30.

1972

194th day - 172 days follow

Another beautiful day with a little fog for a short while.

Jean was stirring by 10, but Lue didn't come downstairs until nearly 1 P.M.

I took care of some ^{SC} correspondence, wrote Bill a long letter, then loaded for town to mail things - around 4:30.

At 6 I dropped by Dave's to bring him down for dinner.

We watched TV (convention in Miami) over leisurely dinner which began around 8 and lasted until nearly 10.

John Rauschold showed up. We fed him, then took him, and Dave, to Dave's place for the night.

1972

195th day - 171 days follow

Up by 8. Dave and John showed up for breakfast around 9 and then launched into their plan for more shrewy work. John got underway, from Dave's place by noon.

Went to Arcata to do errands around 3:30, returning by 5:30. Dave, who had been back & forth many times, was on tap for dinner - and to watch the last night of the convention.

Before bedtime - around 1:30 - he helped me on a brief statement of support for SWAP, and threw a sleeping bag out on the floor. McGovern made it on the first ballot.

65°

Up at 7:30. Had to finish typing statement, get dressed, and into Eureka as fast as possible. State Parks & Rec. Commission held meeting in Eureka City Council Chambers, starting promptly at 9. I missed opportunity to be heard, since Larry and Harriet Gray were first presentation. Colette Van Fleet, with Audubon's support, was even later arriving, but our letters were filed. However, they were not noted in minutes, and would probably NOT be read by Commissioners. Went to the Van Fleet's office, where Walt Berry, rancher from Forks of Salmon, was holding forth — looking for Dave.

Meanwhile Dave was on his way to Forks of Salmon! Did many errands: Howard's orchid photo to be framed; 50 material to Bill Shapeero — at his home; discussion of Stanon beach property proposed developments with John Hallenbeck, county engineering department. Hot in Eureka. 63°

Finally got home — and out of "city" clothes — at 4:30. Jean was doing washing. Lue was up at Trinidad pier. I cut grass, weeded and watered part of garden.

Dinner around 9.

Ready for bed by 11.

64° in Arcata.

1972

197th day — 169 days follow

Beautiful morning. Woke up around 8:15. Worked around house and garden until Jean & Lue stirred — then started some washing.

Jean and I went to Arcata around 2:30. Took cans and bottles to recycling center.

Did more garden work before sunset. Dinner, in living room, around 9. New moon lovely over ocean.

The 2 beautiful cats romped wildly around house and had "games" in garden during day.

Had long phone conversation with Ray Peart — late afternoon.

Watched TV, specifically, for showing of "The Broken Arrow" at 11:00 P.M. It was enjoyable — even in black & white — and with all the damned spot commercials thrown in. In bed around 10'clock.

1972 198th day - 168 days follow

Worked around house and garden all day.
 Did some washing. Cleaned garage
 so electrician could come in tomorrow
 to put outlet in shower room.

Dinner at Merrymans, around 8:30-9:00 with
 Eleanor and Bill Lathan, who had phoned earlier
 from motel north of Trinidad. Good evening - once
 they agreed to join us for dinner.

Found Dave at the house when we returned.
 He & I stayed up talking from 12 to 1; then
 he decided to spend night.

1972 199th day - 167 days follow

Worked around house and garden.

Jane & Lue gone most of afternoon.

Went into Acreata briefly on errands, in
 late afternoon, after Mr. Tompkins had
 finished small electrical job.

Cleaned shower room preparatory to painting
 shower walls.

Should have gone to parks & rec. com. meeting
 at 7:30 P.M. but chose to remain at home.

Phoned Bill, who returned call later after
 getting message.

Up around 8. Foggy most of day, ¹⁹⁷² 200th day - 166 days follow
 but warm enough to enjoy working outside.
 Did putter-y shower del day.

Sun came out late afternoon. Went into
 Arcata around 4-5.

Dave here for cocktails and dinner.

Dave worked on statement for tomorrow's hearing
 while watching TV after dinner. ^{Tipping of} Second draft was
 finished by 1:30 - so Dave stayed overnight.

1972 201st day - 165 days follow

Up by 6. Early breakfast in
 order to get started tipping. Dave left, without much
 food in him, at 9:15. At 10:20 I got into City Hall Council
 Chambers - full house - had to sit on side chairs, extra.
 Excellent statements given by several specialists on detrimental
 effects of excessive road building and other man activities on
 the steep slopes - with riparian habitats, streams, fish and
 wildlife suffered consequences. The timber industry lobbyists
 had weak "excuses" for not going along with stricter amend-
 ments to improve water quality on North coast.

Dave presented Sierra Club statement after lunch
 break. We ate at Stanton's (at the bar, it was so crowded)
 with Dr. Brad Lundborg from Santa Rosa, a member
 of the No. Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board,
 and a mountain hiker & climber. Also, after lunch,
 I changed seats - this time deliberately, when chance

1972 202nd day - 164 days follow

Up at 8:40 Overcast, warm.

Spent most of day in house, taking care of things that would be in the Pattons' way. Got dining room fairly well cleared.

Painted Shower - after Lrd was through - which was after my lunch time.

Dropped my watch! Went to bank in Arcata after receiving reimbursement check from Legal Defense Fund. Too little time for watchmaker to take care of broken stuff or something.

Stopped by Dave's place - found him in dejected mood, but after a few tears we got everything smoothed over and went ahead with plans to leave - tomorrow.

Lrd steamed fresh crabs in vinegar water and sprinkled them with coarse ground pepper. Marvellous flavor - warm.

Got some correspondence and filing taken care of - also had a much needed shampoo.

In bed by 12:30 or 1:00. 2 cats spent night with me - one under covers - one on top of blanket - almost pushed me off couch.

1972 203rd day - 163 days follow

Up by 7:40 to do all the last minute packing and puttering around house. Made phone calls to Anne Weiss, Charlotte Stephens and left a message for Herb people regarding Butte Valley Dam material. Foggy; warm.

By noon I was ready, but Dave didn't show up until 1:40 - and he wasn't quite ready. Meanwhile Jean and Lrd took off for Ferndale and other places south. Called Anthe.

Dave left the pickup for me to throw my things in while he took my car and went home for shower. At 3:40 he and Doug returned.

Dropped Doug off, mailed items in Trinidad and finally cleared the area around 4:30.

Stopped in Orisk, at Haystack, but Jean in Laleta. Bill and Carmen at house. Left there at 5:30. (We munch hot dogs from nearby stand.)

Had low tide at Grants Pass. Could not go on without repair, so pulled into station (Shell), luckily not yet closed, in Gold Hill. A stick had poked 3 holes into the thick tread. (cost \$3.50)

Drove on toward Crater Lake. Found a little cafe still open - serving Mexican food - Talk in area was centered around Lost Creek dam project. Shady Cove had incorporated recently.

Past Prospect and Union Creek we pulled off onto a Forest Service (logging) road, no longer maintained. It made an excellent overnight "campsite". Moon was about 3/4 full. Air was cool at 11:45.

xxx In morning found a rat had brought in a very large rat! Then disgorged things! In dining room.

1972 204th day - 162 days follow

Awoke at 7 to lovely sunshine.

Old logging road provided plenty of room to put our things out on fairly level ground for a leisurely breakfast. And it was a quiet place. At 10 A.M. we passed through Crater Lake, taking time to thrill to the incomparable blue beauty - and Dave could not resist a photograph. Noted many hitchhikers; even young campers at rim's edge. Snow in patches only. A cool breeze reminded me of the 7000' + elevation.

After leaving park we took turns walking and/or jogging alongside the forest edge on hwy 138 - doing a mile or two, with M.T.

We got gas and groceries in Bend - after taking time to visit the 3 Lava Butte Geological area. It was a fantastic view - 360°. Too lazy to find Shasta, but The Sisters and Broken Top and Mt. Jefferson were glorious.

At Redmond we left hwy. 97 and headed for Pineville and the John Day River country.

Stopped at 3:30 for a very late lunch. Collected algae sample along Marks Creek (hwy. 26) about 20 miles out of Pineville.

Around 8:30 we began looking for overnight site. Just beyond Dixie Pass we took a little Forest Service road and ended up quite alone in an area that looked little used, though not too far off main highway. The area had been selectively logged of ponderosa pine - and fire wood was no problem.

We had moonlight to help in cooking - no wind - but weather had slight chill after dark. (No insects.)

By ten thirty we were ready to bed down.

No. 7th Bridge Cr. Forest Rd 12002

1972 205th day - 161 days follow

Awoke early - scattered, high clouds. Breakfast around 8. All packed up by 9:30. I walked to highway with MT - about 1½ miles. Dave took another turn - wrong way, farther down, but did his jogging bit. Then came looking for us. Meanwhile, worried, we headed back up road and he came along. Then I took car and went a mile down highway while he and MT got in a fast jog. Brushed teeth alongside small stream (Bridge Cr.) near car. Weather beautiful!

Went on towards Baker - over forest lands, through sage brush & juniper country; through lush farm lands. Found larch trees on Dooley Mtn. Stopped briefly. Shopped for fresh fruit, etc in Baker around 12:30. Headed for high country - Wallawa-Whitman forest - and ended on the Imnaha River around 7:45.

Our decision to remain in area based on two things - (1) Flat tire going down mountain toward Rich Creek campground - and (2) generator went out - had to keep engine running.

Took time out along way for lunch at a rest stop - small spring in hot, dry region - rocks, sage brush, etc, but pretty interesting - about 2:30.

Later in afternoon we pulled off road to bathe in nearby Creek's cooling, fast flowing waters. MT got bathed, also - ^{at 6:30} - ^{at 6:30}.

Young FS fellow^{at 6:30} told us about a 2 mile hike to Blue Hole. We walked briskly to view and get back to camp before dark - Saw 3 deer in lovely, lush and flower strewn forest.

Brief small fire - had steak and salad dinner and then put things in shape - in case of rain - prompted by clouded moon.

JULY

24

MONDAY

Imnaha River - Indian Campground 4260'

Up at 8. Thunder cracked

1972

206th day - 160 days follow

Heavily once during night and several times it rained briefly. Left at 10 under extremely cloudy skies and sultry warmth. Gorgeous river - reported excellent fishing - salmon spawning stretch ~~above~~ upstream of camp area. Beautiful drive into Joseph. The mountains were spectacular; high & snowy near Joseph. Valley fertile and productive. Hwy 3 north to Lewiston - through lovely forest land, open valleys and velvety rounded hills. Viewed ~~Joseph~~ Canyon briefly - not daring to shut off engine. Got into Lewiston shortly after 2:15 - went straight to Datum dealer. (Dave had phoned ahead from Joseph). Work on car did not change problem - new brushes added.

Quite warm. Ate lunch, got a check cashed, phoned message to Bill of possible delay, depending on garage and tire repair. Finally left Lewiston at 6:30. Changed plans from trip through Magruder Corridor area to the Clearwater, Lochsa route. Stopped at Lowell for cafe dinner at 9 while battery charge was made.

Drove on along the Lochsa - full moonlight viewed on river at times. ~~For~~

Found a river bar unoccupied and easy to get into - all campgrounds full. Went to bed immediately - so as to get early morning start into Missoula.

TUESDAY

JULY

1972

207th day - 159 days follow

Awake at 5:15, by alarm; close to fog shrouded river. Underway as soon as possible and no stopping until a spot that would have scenery, some seclusion from highway - and sunshine as soon as possible - in order to cook breakfast. We located a delightful place, accessible by very obscure road not far north of Saddlepack Creek. MT and a red pine squirrel engaged in an amusing, continual observance of each other. Lovely, white sand and clumps of large trees - and lots of short brush & small trees between site (marked as FS, but no fire pit - just primitive) and highway. Underway again at 8:50. Spotted young cow moose along the river shore, and Dave turned around so we could possibly see it again -- we did! -- immediately below us and then it crossed the roadway behind us - so we all got a good look.

Skies clear, weather delightful 72° as we got to Missoula and the Datum dealer.

Lunched at Heidelbergans, then just waited near, or in garage until work was completed - around 5. Phoned Bill to hold off on dinner until we arrived.

Picked up 2 new tires also, got them mounted, and once more we were solidly mobile. Arrived Yellow Bay around 7:45. Found Bill in botany lab.

Dinner at South Shore Inn, around 9, after stopping briefly at Marie's on East Shore drive. We left MT for Mike and Ron to exercise. Picked MT up again around 10:45.

Dave spent night in camper, parked near botany lab.

Met Dr. Sharp and wife - as we searched for Dave's lost car key. Showered around midnight.

JULY **26** WEDNESDAY

Up by 8:15. With Dave, we ¹⁹⁷² 208th day - 158 days follow went down to picnic area at Blue Bay to cook our breakfast.

Around 1:30 Dave and I went into Bigfork to do (his) washing and get my broken wrist watch to Sam Stevens.

Went for very quick dip (no swimming) in frigid Flathead Lake around 5:00.

Dave apparently had gone shopping for groceries (meat, etc). We drove to Flathead Lake picnic area and had a leisurely dinner and stayed out to enjoy the warm evening and a beautiful lake view from above the highway just south of Woods Bay.

In bed by 12:30 with alarm set for before 6.

approx. 20-mile-hike to Grey Wolf Lake

THURSDAY **27** JULY

¹⁹⁷² 209th day - 157 days follow Up at 5:40. Dave and I (and not) took off for day long exploration of Grey Wolf Pk. region in lower ⁵⁵ Edge of Mission Mts. primitive area. Got gas first above Bigfork, then headed straight down (35) Swan Valley to Condon ranger station to inquire of roads, routes, trails, etc. Reached R.S. at 7:45. They opened up for us and were most helpful in our decision-making process for the day's travel. Before hitting the trail to Grey Wolf lake at 11:15 we went to west end of old logging road, which had been recommended as worth time for great panorama and photographs. No other travelers in area.

Trail easy through ridge ^{up} forest for 6-7 miles and down a bit to Buck Lake (right on wild area boundary). This took 2 1/2 hours. Stopped for rest and quick lunch - no swim - since mosquitos were devilishly thick. NT was having her problems with them, so we moved on to ^{open} slope, then the trail plunged steeply down to, first Whelp Lake, then magnificent, large Gray Wolf Lake. We clung to a large rock at lake edge and viewed through spotting scope the rugged, snow-cloth mountains - Grey Wolf Pk., but we could not see its glacier from our viewing point.

We headed back at 4:30, doing some cross country above Whelp Lake's NE edges, hitting the ridge trail without any delay. Kept up 3-mile-an-hour pace and reached trailhead at 8:05. Refreshed ourselves in nearby Beaver Creek and had the last of our Bourbon + 7 up.

Tried several times to phone Bill - line busy. Finally, from "Wilderness" cafe, got through. We met in Bigfork, drove to no. for dinner at crossroads to Swan Hwy.

Back at station around midnight.

 Prepared camp gear for two days out and headed out around 10. ~~Cooked~~ Breakfast at ~~Flathead Lake~~ at Crossroads place again on way to West Glacier. Stopped briefly for foodstuff for lunch & dinner, then proceeded to spend the entire afternoon exploring roads which might lead us close to Great Northern Mtn. - Pinnacle Cr. Rd., Paula Cr. Rd., Dickey Cr. Rd., Essex Cr. Rd. - then returned to Pinnacle Creek Rd. to make camp. Gorgeous views - Mt. Grant, Mt. Liebig, one way; Mt. St. Nicholas, Mt. Dordy, and others in the park, across the middle fork Flathead.

[Great Northern Mtn. - 8700']

Had a fine steak and salad dinner, then sat around a small campfire.

The moon was up - about $\frac{3}{4}$ - waning.

Dave & MT slept in camper.

Bill and I out on ground - nearby.

Logging had occurred here, but we kind of shut our eyes to it, because of overwhelming surrounding scenery.

Pinnacle Creek Rd.
 and Gunsight Pass hike
 SATURDAY 29 JULY (approx. 20.5 miles)

1972 211th day - 155 days follow

Beautiful morning, though I chose to stay in my bag awhile. Everything damp.

Around to going - to-the-sun point for Gunsight Pass trail. Bill took car, kept MT and would meet us at SPAT near Lake McDonald exit. Hit trail at 11:15. Nice breeze, good trail all the way to Gunsight Lake. Stopped above lake to rest and lunch - having covered 9.2 miles from trail junction ^{1 mi.} near start.

Viewed Blackfoot Glacier - walked steadily upward to pass - photographed a goat just above us on trail. Met many hikers throughout day. Fantastic views of Lake Ellen Wilson as descent, then ascent to Sperry Chalet. Counted at least 8 goats near pass. Met one on trail before reaching Chalet at 6:10. Rested only briefly at creek below chalet, before high-tailing the remaining 6 miles.

Got ahead of two women on horseback and kept up fast pace. Both of us getting trail-weary by this time. At 7:25, not yet to Snyder Creek crossing, a bear (? species) was coming toward us on trail. Gladly, for us, he moved into the forest. We talked loudly until I heard him moving away from us, crashing brush below trail. Bill had gone only short way up trail earlier and was back at car. Sat at Lake McDonald's edge for cocktail, then on to Swan Jet. for light dinner - at 10:45 - Back at Station around midnight - and straight to bed.

Up by 8. Sun shining brightly. 1972 212th day — 154 days follow
Showered and headed for botany lab. Dave not out of sack, yet.
Put coffee pot on and took ^{for} wash up road. When Bill and Dave were
all ready we drove to picnic area (north) to cook breakfast. Very
pleasant.

Once back at lab, Dave cleared his camper of Vinyard stuff and
prepared to go hiking in Jewel Basin Hiking Area.

Bill prepared selection of slides for "Historical" presen-
tations for visitors - open house - day - which went on
from 2-5 -- with Bill doing his thing every $\frac{1}{2}$ hour.

I spent my time - without a quiet moment - in
the Museum -- the coolest place on the station
as the afternoon warmed up.

And it got warm - and stayed warm.

1972 213th day — 153 days follow

Social Security Tax Return Due

Up by 7 and ready to leave for
glacier Park by 7:30. Breakfast
at Gay 70's (thanks to cash loan from Danny Jackson).
Stopped at F.S. headquarters in Kalispell for maps and
picked up some Swan Range topo maps, then on to the
Park. (Dave phoned Don Januta, who confirmed Los Angeles
conference speaking date on forest practices - Aug 5).
Shopped briefly at West Glacier. Datum suffered vapor lock
problems close to top of Logan Pass, but after some doing we
made it on around to Many Glaciers. Also, we made
a brief stop for a quick take out lunch at St. Mary.

At 3 PM we headed out on trail to Grinnell Glacier.
Some clouds and rolls of thunder. Trail through forest
lovely, though horse traffic messed it up in wet areas.
After passing Josephine Lake the trail went steadily upward
through grizzly posted territory. Much banging of SC cup
and loud talk - as recommended. Flowers gorgeous.

Bought some BINGS on way back, arriving around 12:30.

Maire picked up boys around 2 o'clock.

Spent a little time in cabin taking care of clean clothes, then back to lab to date and sort many color slides.

At 5:40 we left for Maire's for dinner. Marvelous dinner after Mike & Ron showed me all over the place.

Royal and Betty stopped by for coffee on way from Missoula to Glacier Park.

Showed slides from near dark ~~to~~ until 10:30.

Skies all cleared - starry and cool as we drove back to station.

Cool, sunny. Up at 7:45. 1972 216th day - 150 days follow

Spent greater part of day in botany lab, catching up on Lima Clark correspondence.

Walked to Yellow Bay store around noon for a few lunch items.

Around 3:30 Bill and I took the raft out - from the boat dock around into the lake and swimming area. Stopped to sun - and swim - then, around 5:15, took raft up to cabin for safe keeping.

Had cocktails while enjoying early evening quiet with most of the students off to Canada for a few days, field tripping.

Drove up to Lake Cafe in Bigfork for dinner.

Received note that Dore had phoned, having arrived safely in Trinidad.

Wrote a couple of notes, then went to bed to read. Bill came in, woke me up, asking if I wanted to view the Aurora borealis. I was too sleepy to get up.

1972 217th day - 149 days follow

Bill & I went up to cabin - to try to stay cool - before 7 o'clock seminar.

Up by 8:15. Read awhile during and after breakfast.

Did some preliminary packing in the cabin before lunch.

Stayed at beach until 5:30. Bill got in too, with raft.

Went to dinner at South Shore Inn. Still very warm. Thunderheads in sky all afternoon - all gone. No wind; just plain warm.

Gathered up stuff in lab, then headed for bed around 11.

Cloudy - warm. Up by 8. Started washing - through by 9:30 - hung clothes at cabin, hoping for clear, bright sunshine. Cleaned cabin while Bill packed at botany lab. - then cleaned self!

Got away from station at 3. Stopped by Marie's to say our goodbyes to her - and Mike and Ron. Left at 4:00. Went over Lolo Pass - beautiful! Very warm. Stopped along Lochsa River around 6:30 to relax - with warm lemonade and bourbon. Stopped at Lowell cafe for dinner, then I drove on into Lewiston. Still hot! 95°. Had milkshake, then got gas and Bill took the wheel - we drove until 2:30 a.m. winding up near Battle Mt., Oregon.

Beautiful day. Unpacked - putting everything on clean garage floor - then washed Jeep.

Up by 9. Fog in process of going out. Beautiful day. Bill busy all morning, then in afternoon we went shopping for foodstuffs and extra gear & stopped at C.S.U.H. Talked with Dan's mother, and then he phoned back around 8 P.M.

Went up to Aunt's around 5:45. Lnd was there, too. Doris Pendleton & granddaughter also there awhile.

Bill showed slides of last September's trip to Lake Lakes Basin.

Went to bed by 12:30.

~~Woke~~ up by 8. Lovely day with some early fog. 1972 226th day - 140 days follow

Bill worked almost constantly on his packing, weighing, and putting stuff into car. I helped all I could. By 3 P.M. he was ready to relax, shower and plan route - and he got away around 4.

Around 7:30 Jean & I took run on Moonstone Beach - lonely!

Watched some old movie (Mae West) on TV after late dinner - then to bed by midnight.

Jean cooked dinner tonight - roast leg of lamb!

Both cats slept near me on couch - all night - one snuggled on right side; one on left side.

(Tasha caught a hummingbird today).

1972 227th day - 139 days follow

Up by 8. Dave & M. T. showed up around 10:30. He had left L.A. airport at 6:30 - gone home and jogged back here! I did some washing, then walked to Dave's. Bill Devall's a friend stopped there, after seeing us along scenic drive.

Dave then drove me to Arcata, where we both had errands to do. Went to his place, left car & walked home - around 5:30 or 6:00. Lovely day - warm while walking. Big "fluffies" to east; some clouds way out over ocean.

Dinner at Stanton's around 6:15 after getting copies of short SC statement Xeroxed in Arcata, regarding Stanton's development on Clam Beach.

Went to Planning Commission meeting at Court House in Eureka. An environmental film "Multiply and Subdue the Earth" with Ian McHarg was first at 7 - (rent one only). It set stage for agenda items to follow. Place crowded.

Surprise announcement - no need to remain - Stanton withdrew application for permit!

Dave & I went to Bill Dewall's place in Arcata for coffee & cookies, then right home to get ready to leave for Trinity Alps country.

Left at 11 - Drove to Hayden Flat Camp ground along 299. Stopped around 1 P.M.

1972 231st day - 135 days follow

Breakfast at Big Bear cafe. Stopped briefly at Weaver's Ranger Station, then drove up Weaver Valley Rd. Datum couldn't make the grade, so we went out by East Branch of Weaver Creek Road to Hwy. 3. Lovely day; big clouds; cool. Drove a bunch of roads below Granite Peak. Logging roads appeared to be "hurry-up" jobs - Had flat tire.

Then we drove to end of road to take trail to Granite Ph. Lookout.

Left car at 6:45. Very cloudy. Trail began with first mile old shut-off jeep road. 5 miles to L.O.

Dave went to top - alone. At 8:15, with pains in chest - I turned back. Dave had given me car key. Barely able to see trail, but got back to car without incident, at 8:10.

Alarm went off at 4:45. Dave &
I took off at 5:10. Clear & starry here;

of county. Breakfast at 6:30 in Garberville. Sunshine below
Leggett. Fog again around Ukiah, then fair and warm rest
of day in Santa Rosa. We arrived at S.C. at 5 to 10. Meeting
underway shortly. Lunch break at 12:15. Afternoon
session broke up close to 5. Good meeting. Lots of

Headed homeward immediately. Dave drove from
gas stop in Cloverdale to Eureka. We paused in

Painted dining room window frames - took a couple of hours.

Dave came in around 4:30 with maps ready for mailing. Before 5 we went to Arcata so Bill could get Jeep.

Dave returned again around 6. I put "GOOP" (macaroni, etc.) in oven, then we all went for walk to Luffenholty Beach. Cool-ish - almost sweeter weather.

Three large ships in - one from Osaka, one from Sweden and one from Callao. Watched pelicans + 1 ^{harbor} seal.

Coffee and pie at Stanton's around 3. Went for walk around 4. Met Dave + MT at Luffenbatter - coming our way. Together we walked to Baker's Beach, then turned homeward.

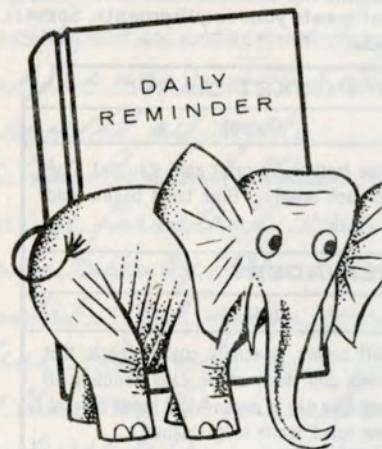

GENERAL MEETING -- The North Group of Redwood Chapter will hold its regular monthly meeting on Saturday, November 4 at the Arcata Presbyterian Church, 11th and G Streets, Arcata.

Potluck dinner is scheduled for 6:30 P.M. Please bring your own utensils in addition to food contribution. Coffee, tea and milk will be available. Guests are always welcome. Dress is informal. Program is scheduled for 8:00 P.M.

Program -- "Pollution in a High Sierran Wilderness" by Dr. Bill Vinyard

Overuse from human recreational activities in many of the nation's most attractive wildernesses is threatening values for which they were set aside. Research on the effects of people on wilderness ecosystems has only recently been instituted. Dr. Vinyard will report on one such investigation he is actively involved in and which is centered around water pollution in the Rae Lakes Basin of Kings Canyon National Park, an excessively used area along the John Muir Trail above 10,000 feet. This continuing study, begun in 1970, is sponsored by the National Park Service with the intent of determining the carrying capacity of the basin.

The program will be illustrated with color slides to show comparisons between pristine lakes and those most heavily used or abused by visitors. Biological as well as sociological factors in pollution will be discussed.

The rare beauty of this or other areas invites their own destruction, and mere designation as wilderness in no way prevents damage by means outside of those prohibited in the Wilderness Act of 1964. Other studies on wilderness impact now being supported by the Sierra Club will also be summarized.

TRINITY ALPS -- The Sierra Club, Wilderness Society, and other conservationists are shocked and outraged by the Forest Service proposal for a Trinity Alps Wilderness which excludes the eastern third of the existing Primitive Area, and ignores altogether another 230,000 acres or so of de facto wilderness adjacent to it.

Their proposed eastern boundary slices through the highest and most scenic core of the area, a wondrous jumble of serrated ridges and peaks, glacial lakes and snow fields. The fabulous "Red Trinities" sector east of Stuarts Fork is excluded altogether. It is a sham of a proposal.

In contrast, conservationists are urging establishment of a 600,000 acre wilderness, with special management to take place on certain adjacent lands.

In a move guaranteed to limit citizen response from the western region of the Trinity Alps, the Forest Service is holding only one hearing, December 9, in Redding.

We are preparing a brochure on our proposal and attempting to arrange some transportation to Redding. We need donations immediately to cover these costs. You have been hit hard, we know, to support the Proposition 20 effort and many others, but PLEASE dip - again - into your money bags for the Trinity Alps if you can. Thank you.

1972 317th day - 49 days follow

Up at 8:30. Variable cloudiness all day. Did housecleaning until Bud arrived around noon to watch TV ball games. Then I went outside to split kindling and saw up fire wood.

Jon Knupp here to work on algae project all afternoon and evening. Dave showed up before football games ended - and was here for dinner.

Arranged 2 redwood benches behind Franklin stove with folded Navajo rugs for cushioning - and cleared area on floor (behind stove) for the pro-ty cot - (she liked it).

Gary brought me an old (1901) book "In The Days of Audubon". I began reading it immediately. Dave and Bill prepared dinner - eaten in living room with good fire going. I had cocktails, no dinner - only coffee.

Bill got the record player in operation once again, but we turned from records to opera on radio at dinner time.

Everyone went home around 10:30 - about the same time I left room for bath and shampoo.

High winds came up in late, late evening.

Up at 7:20. Cloudy most of day. 1972 318th day - 48 days follow

Left at 8:40 for walk along ocean - going as far as the Wothyns-Jamieson driveway. Very light rain a couple of times - otherwise perfect conditions for enjoying scenery. Very few cars - one runner with 3 dogs - only others.

Dave arrived after noon, having done "his thing" at a class of "Forestry for non-foresters" along with Bill DeWall. We started writing his Trinity Alps "pitch" for Redwood Chips and I typed it 3 times before it was ready to ship off by bus to Phil Kay. Dinner late - about 8:30. (Doug took the package to Arcata for us around 8.)

Went for walk after dinner (about 9:30) with Dave + M.T. - to Luffenholty Beach - Bill busy correcting test papers.

In bed by midnight.

1972 319th day - 47 days follow

Up by 7:30. After breakfast phoned FS office about timing to do blue prints of map. No sign of Dave, so drove up ocean road - found him - and Bill Van Fleet - quite by happenstance - at place south of Luffenholty Beach. Shocking news - Bill VF looking over building site (person from New York interested in place).

Dave and I spent 2 hrs. in Six Rivers (FS) getting 26 copies (2 huge ^{our} maps) of Trinity Alps proposal. Dave talked me into my first "Mac donald's" hamburger (60¢) and I didn't like it!

Delivered maps to Fish and Game, County Park, Van Fleet, for Audubon Society, then picked up auditions for FStone at blacksmith shop (Crescent Machinery Co.) Home by 4. Beautiful, warm afternoon - but no time left for a walk.

Fixed dinner as early as possible since it was Community Concert night. Jean + Ted arrived 6:30. Jean on way to night school; Ted remained. Dave ate and ran to talk Trinity Alps to Board in Blister Club on campus.

We were treated to the "Dancers of Mali", a group of 35 beautiful people who danced, sang, did acrobatics, played drums - stomped - etc. Beautiful staging. Cool, clear night. Home by 10:30 to find Dave doing dishes!

Played 2 games of Yahtzee before folding up. Dave spent night on couch. I slept in dining room on chair lounge.

up by 8. Cloudy - some 1972 320th day - 46 days follow
light rain. The Kids spent an hour here from 9:30-10:30! Bill was just leaving at 9:30. Dave already gone and he didn't show up again until about 2, then only briefly. He left MT, however, and she + I went for exploratory walk - in light rain at times. We took trails to ocean edge at point below old house foundation south of Luffenhotz. Then onto Baker's beach, arriving home again about 4. Talked Gary W. into cutting up alder chunks (to fit stove) with his tiny chain saw - finishing just ahead of more and heavier rain.

Dave back for dinner, but feeling "woozzy". Gary in for cocktails.

Long phone talk with Al Whitney regarding Chapter-Group boundaries and other conservation issues, like getting list together of people to be considered for regional Coastal Comm. - as follow-up to successful passage of Prop. 20.

Dave went home around 9:30.

Listened to records while enjoying fireside.

1972 321st day - 45 days follow
up at 7:45 at the insistence of the cat. A beautiful day - warm - scattered clouds - just got-glaus! Did some wood splitting after cleaning up kitchen and other chores. Too nice to stay inside, so asked Gary to take walk with me - around 1:30. We explored the small, remote, hard-to-get-to beach just south of Baker's beach. The trail down was steep - and wet. We came up the small creek which plunges downward steeply, too, between huge boulders. Home again by 2:30. Dave came by around 3 and put maps into mailing tubes, then dashed out in time to get them into McK. post office. He brought MT back for dinner.

Sonya - and Gary - were both down - at different times - Sonya to use the phone; Gary with some weird water plant in jar that he has been watching.

Dave took 2 more maps into Greyhound at 9 to go out to Weaverly + Redding tomorrow. We played a few lines of Yahtzee and then Dave went home - for a change!

~~Jan and~~ Packed overnight things, finished typing, along with "choices" and finally, around 5:15 Dave and I were ready to head out for Sacramento. First, a stop at HSD Library for copies of my statement, then Bill Devall's place to leave SC program publicity material; then to Env. Center to drop off a mimeo stencil I had just cut. A quick stop or two in Eureka - Dave for a McDonald's hamburger, then for gasoline for car.

In Garberville I had a sandwich and coffee. Crossing via Hwy. 20. we met road block -- a "killer" hitch-hiking possibly - lock doors, do not stop, unless to report to next patrolman down road. My adrenaline flowed, driving under such conditions! Met heavy fog as we dropped out of hills - glad to reach a small motel in Williams at midnight.

Up at 7-Chad as a bell. 1972 332nd day - 34 days follow

Breakfast at Dunnigan. Arrived State Capitol 9:15 - (Dave driving). Went straight to Public Works Board meeting room - 6th floor of annex. Talked with staff members about presentation.

Stansons - father and son - were there. Two items on long agenda were taken care of quickly by board action, then (#15) was next heard - since we were all from out of town - and it was controversial.

The board decided on passing of resolution that State acquire property after questioning of Stansons - and me, following presentations. The issue consumed more than one hour's time. (Dave also added some support to State) and dismissed forest practices.

Saw Rod Turtle before lunch at Capital Tamale. After lunch, phone calls to Times-Standard, then 3 o'clock appointment with Resources Agency Administrator, Ike Livermore. Oh - left notes for Gov. Reagan regarding wild fires legislation with his receptionist - (the Gov. was in Mexico). We also had brief words - in hallway passing - with Sen. Peter Behr.

Barbara and Tony Chastain and 2 of Ike's staff were on hand for "Trinity Alps" and "Minarets" wilderness proposals to look over. We had Ike for two hours - finally leaving Resources Bldg. around 5:30.

Dinner at Dunnigan - crossed over 20 again. Coffee in Willits. Clear and cold. good driving conditions. Home about 1:10 A.M.

Dave grabbed sleeping bag.

1972 333rd day - 33 days follow

Up by 8. Fair. Saw Bill when he was leaving - as he brought cat into my bed. Jack Davis (Supt. Redwood Nat'l. Park) phoned that he had plans for our approval or comments - could he perhaps stop by. Meanwhile Dave re-wrote material and I typed. Jack here from 11 until about 1:30. Good talk session and we approved plans for a parking area to the Tall Trees unit.

Walked to Trinidad and back.

1972 334th day - 32 days follow

Dinner at Anthas. Pastors there, too.
Home before 11.

1972 335th day - 31 days follow

Up around 8. Lovely day.
Helped Dave do his article for Pacifica by
typing a couple of rough drafts ~~before 3 o'clock~~.

Bob Jordan arrived around 11:30. We had
lunch there, enjoyed views and just talked.

Around 3:30 we interrupted Sud at Trinidad
Market - no chance to get the two men together
another time. Bill came in - with Gordon Ash
(from Modoc County) just as Bob was
leaving at 4:30. Dave and Gary also
showed up briefly.

Thelma & Gene Kirsman, after phoning, showed
up around 5:30 and ranted and raved to me
about the Sierra Club (press release on Trinity
Alps had been in evening paper). They finally

Up by 8:30. Cloudy.
Worked around house. Lue came by to watch ball game on TV. ~~We borrowed his "saw"~~

Bob Kirby dropped by - briefly.

Bathed, then fixed some garlic french bread for the Sierra Club potluck dinner. Holly Gibson came in around 5:15 - already to ride in with me to the church - early to get big coffee pot on. Dave arrived as we left.

Bill and Dave came in after 6 to set up Trinity Alps display.

About 25-30 people for dinner, but 50-60 for program by Jim Lovelace, Linda Lovelace and Maureen Brandman, who had been to Environmental Conference in Sweden and toured Europe together. They talked of pollution problems - air + water primarily.

Home by 10:30. Drizzling. Dave stayed until almost midnight.

Sawed and chopped quite a lot of wood during afternoon. Did not have time for a wash.

1972 338th day - 28 days follow

Rained hard during night.

First Sunday in Advent

up before 9. Got a fire going and enjoyed bacon + egg breakfast in living room.

Just arrived to watch ball game on TV. We used the "Scout" to get a load of fireplace wood from Arthur's place. Rain showers throughout day.

Another load of wood arrived just as we were ready to leave for the senior Devalls, around 5:20, (to attend Bill's birthday gathering).

Nice evening with new people - friends of Bill's - and his parents - Dave + Doug among guests.

Cold and starry as we drove home at 10:45.

1972 339th day - 27 days follow

Heard rain during night, but woke up to clearing skies and ice on front deck. Had a fire going all day. Very cold and a wind chopped sea. Saw a few crab boats out before seas churned up.

Gary Williams popped in and out - mushrooming was holding his interest. Only ventured out to get mail. Dave showed up long enough to get some captions written for his photos of Trinitis (for Pacifica article) and for me to type them - then he never came back!

Gary was back again before we had dinner (6:30-7:30) to try identifying the huge specimens he found beyond Drive Rd.

Very cold evening. Down to 32° before 9 PM.

Bill unable to meet classes - 1972 340th day - 26 days follow

Very cold - about 30° when I got up around 7:30. Phoned Biology Dept. before 9.

Signs of storm approaching. Bill stayed in bed (intestinal problems) until 2 PM, then he relaxed near fire in living room, ate lunch, and read awhile.

Dave was here around mid-day - making phone calls while I re typed his Pacifica article. Then he took off at 1:15 for 2 PM discussion on Trinity Alps at Board of Supervisors.

Rain began - turned to hail in late afternoon.

Lud arrived about 6:30 - for the evening, while Jean went to night school.

Dave here for cocktails and quick dinner then gone again - to Boost'n Blister Club all evening. Bill went back to bed about 8:30.

Phone calls from Bill Shapero - then Ken Lytle - Jean here only brief moments - to get Lud & go home.

Dave reappeared, but getting too late for him to be sensible. He had backed into another car (at the college - little damage) and had left Gray's house without Bill's warm jacket - borrowed - / He went home to get some rest - and sleep!

1972 341st day - 25 days follow

Up by 8. Snow showers off and on during day and evening. Very cold - some wind - seas rough at times - once in awhile a spot of sun.

Bill went into school around 10. Dave was in - and out - and in - and out during day and evening. Phone calls kept me busy. Bob Jordan, calling from Coffee Creek Ranch, reported $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. of snow and still falling. Dave was busy a few hours at Env. Center, after I did a small amount of typing for him. He called a few times from town on various things - hospitality, bus travel, wilderness, timber sales, etc. Lud in briefly at 4:15.

Gary Williams here a couple of hours, mostly trying to identify some mushrooms. Bill watched Apollo 17 lift off on TV - so did poopy cat!

Dave made presentation on Trinity Alps to Arcata City Council.

I hemmed up (shortened) one dress and one skirt while tending the fire, answering phone and trying to keep warm.

Quite a lot of snow on our roadway and deck around 11. Cars were having trouble going up beach road from Merryman's restaurant.

Bath & Shampoo after 10. Dave reported in and went home early.

3" snow in Red Bluff today with high of 35° !!

Snow! And cold! 2" on deck. ¹⁹⁷² 342nd day - 24 days follow

Got up, dressed, and headed out, without breakfast, by 7:45 - immediately following Bill's departure. A transformed area - breathtakingly still - and beautiful. The entire sweep of Ocean Beach was white.

Ended up walking all the way to Dave's place and had toast and coffee before heading home. They decided to follow. I had a T. They finally caught up with me near Baker's Beach. Then I drove them home around 11:30 - after coffee - and phone calls.

Dave returned later to take care of many calls and coordinate transportation. This went on before, during, and after dinner - until 11:30, when Dave decided he needed a good night's sleep. 29° at 12. Clear. Reports of 12° in Weaver's and 1 foot of snow in Redding.

Feast of Immaculate Conception

Very cold - snow remaining in shady places - icy all around. Spent entire day inside, working with Dave on his statement. Gary came down and typed his, too. 344th day - 22 days follow

Up at 6:15 to start typing Sierra Club statement. The household came alive shortly after seven - I managed to get down orange juice, one piece of toast and one cup of coffee. At 9 o'clock the last page was done. With the small Hermes typewriter it had been rather slow going, but it looked all right and away we went, with Egon, to the very large, new Civic Auditorium. The hearings were just getting started - ground rules were laid, USFS

proposal made. Dave was 5th speaker and was allowed maximum of 15 minutes.

The statement read well and Dave presented it well. At lunch break we went to Sambo's in town with Luis and Laverne Ireland, then proceeded to get separated - so had to get ride back with Eric Gerstung's friends, also at Sambo's.

The conservationists proposal received good, solid support from the majority of speakers - Gary kept track and when the evening session ended at 8:30 (dinner break 5:20-6:20) the count was 101 for large wilderness and 15 opposed.

We all piled onto the bus, made a stop for liquid refreshment and left Redding around 9. Everyone was highly elated, but all in need of sleep, and everything quieted down after a coffee break in Del Loma. Waited at Bill Devack's place for Bill to drive in to pick us up. In bed by 2:30.

345th day - 21 days follow

Second Sunday in Advent

Everyone slept late - Breakfast around 11.

Steve Birdleough arrived; did a lot of phoning regarding a case scheduled for tomorrow. Donna Hankins and 2 friends came in to talk to Dave about a new venture.

At 3:30 Dave, John, Doug, Gary, Bill, M.T. and I went for walk along scenic drive. Bill turned back at Luffenbrey. Great icicles on rocks above water. Many killdeer flitting around us, feeding along highway edge.

We went all the way to Dave's place, had a drink and headed back as it got dark. I had them stay for dinner, using up left over dinner items. Brad Sundborg phoned just as the

going left about 9 to take water to Antha, whose ^{water} pipes were frozen - along with nearly everyone else in Trinidad. They returned around 11:30 - shortly after I had just finished cleaning up the kitchen.

Clear & cold again. John took 1972 346th day - 20 days follow

Dave and Doug home, prepared to leave for the "southland". Bill went into his office awhile.

Walked to Davis place and back in afternoon. Scenic drive views superb - water very calm. Saw a whale spouting off Clam Beach area. (Gary W. had called my attention to some sighted earlier in day.)

Jan and Lud appeared around dinner time. Lud stayed - Jan went to M.K. to do washing.

Around 10:30 they put Dave and Doug into back of pickup, a sleeping bag wrapped around them, saving us a special trip. Frigid cold, and some clouds showing up.

All our fuchsias, pelargoniums and even the ivy - frozen to unsightly messes. Everyone's plants in same condition all over the county.

Eureka - record low 21°F.

Typed a couple of pages (re-typed) of the SC statement before going to bed.

1972 347th day - 19 days follow

Woke up to rain! Everything changed after midnight! Went up for Dave before 9. We made corrections and slight additions to T.A. statement for final typing.

Bill home by 11:30 to start correcting test papers.

Left around 1:30 for Eureka, stopping first at HSU library for 20 Xerox copies of 6 pages of statement - to be mailed out.

Gave up trying to get to Supervisors meeting - too late. Shopped at Health Food Store, went to post office, then to O.H.'s Townhouse around 4 for the work session of the Northwest Regional Water Quality Control Board. Had a couple of cocktails waiting for late arrivals. People dining from south were troubled with snow and ice from Willits north.

Brad Lundberg hosted us for dinner - in place - & all sat at the same table to carry on the work session after dinner.

"Timber beasts" were there in force!

We took Ray Peart home (he had joined group after dinner), and brought Brad home with us for the night.

Bill and Doug had dinner together. We relaxed - and talked until 12:30 - then Dave and Doug went home. Their frozen pipe situation was getting better. Brad slept on couch. Clear and cold again - storm passing.

Dark (!) when alarm woke me at 7. Dave and Doug arrived for breakfast around 8. Clear, frosty, but snow left only in coldest places. Left for Eureka with Brad and Dave at 8:40.

Gary was back again after having his dinner, then went home early.

Dave left about 10 o'clock. Bill gave last final this morning - so can relax awhile.

Becky C. gave us some more good records, plus a gift subscription to KKH / Schedules. In bed before 1.

Guess the astronauts left the moon's surface today.

1972 350th day - 16 days follow

1972 351st day - 15 days follow Up at 5:05. Had to wait about 15 minutes for Dave (at his place) because he had failed to respond to his alarm. Raining lightly. Picked up Bill Devall about 6:20 in Arleta. Breakfast in Garberville. Bob and Julie Morris came in around 8 (they had overslept, too and were $\frac{1}{2}$ hr. late). Dave had decided to return home with the Morriszes, so Bill & I headed on down to Ukiah. Hard rain, warm, melting off latest snowfall fast. Snow right to edge of Ukiah.

Meeting held in Mendoc. Savings & Loan Bldg. Began about 10:30 with 9 present. Lunch break 12:30-1:30, then we continued until 3:30. It rained all the while. Rain was extremely hard at times, lots of little rock slides to watch for. Coffee stop in Garberville, then home again by 7:45.

Phoned Bill at Patton's, where he went for dinner and the long evening. Dave checked in with me around 9 - only briefly, as I was waiting to take birthday cake out of oven.

Had problems with the frosting, but finished and got to bed by ten. Bill did not return until 2:45!

Steve and Doug walked down, arriving at near dark. Meanwhile, I had bathed and relaxed on couch. Gary came in. So did Jean & Lud. It was a birthday celebration - Bill, Jean & Lud prepared dinner. I did not eat anything, but enjoyed champagne. Others returned to their homes around 11; Pattons stayed until 1:20.

1972 353rd day - 13 days follow

Storm seemed to be moving. Had breakfast around 8:30, but went back to bed until 10. Bill went into town to have 4 tires put on Jeep. Did some housecleaning. Dave showed up on way to town.

I went in at 1:30, picked him up at HSU Library, then went onto Forest Service in Eureka for meeting with USFS and Dir. of Highway planners. Topic was sound barrier design near Grassy Flat Camp ground on to be improved highway 199. Meeting included FS landscape architect, 3 D of H., 3 USFS - plans ^{made} ~~referred~~ on spot, with our approval.

Went to Don Tuttle's office awhile. Shopped for shoes without luck. Home by 5. Early dinner. Picked up Dave at 7 - went to Parks & Rec. Commission meeting in Court House - from 7:30 - 9:00. Coffee at Stanton's. Home by 10.

1972 354th day - 12 days follow

Up by 8:15 Raining - and it rained ALL day. Lunch with Bill Deval at Stanton's at 12:30. Delphine Fountain there, too. Arranged for 16 mm projector for our TA 5-min movie, but since discussions, decisions and emotions were running high on controversial issues, the TA did not come on until 4:30. Dave relinquished time to others (after only 5 min & no movie! WTA (John Keam) took up 40 minutes. Adjournment came at 5:45! Home by 6:15.

Fixed dinner, but ate little - had hot buttered nuts and eventually fell asleep on couch. Dave and Bill had hot words.

Dave left in stormy mood. Bill went out later - but didn't return until 4:45!

1972 355th day - 11 days follow

Cloudy and light drizzle. Took phone messages to Dave at 9:30 - by car right after breakfast. Turned around, this time on foot, and walked in balmy 60+ weather to Dave's place and back, enjoying wild ocean.

8.3 tide at 10:54. MT came back with me. Dave arrived around 1:30 to prepare material for TA presentation to Areata City Council.

Bill went into Eureka and McKoon Islands. At 7:20 Dave and I left in his car to pick up Vern Korb - to run projector at Council meeting.

Last minute ~~to~~ turn down on time by Mayor Falor - put on agenda Jan. 3 instead. So - home again - to put blue chip stamps in books!

Gary Williams had come down around 6:30 and had a bite to eat with us.

Cloudy with rain showers. 1972 356th day - 10 days follow

Worked around house. Dave was in for awhile around noon for phone calls and to gather up materials for Supervisors meeting - he would finally have opportunity to show Vern Korb's ~~film~~ film.

I worked on four brief statements to present at evening meeting of County Planning Commission - after a quick drive with Bill to a Clam Beach Rd. - Blows Prairie Rd. planned subdivision site.

Had a quick bite to eat at 6:30 then dashed off to Eureka.

Two items were held over until January. Most controversial was zoning along Old Stagecoach Rd. north of Trinidad.

Left meeting (still on) at 11:25. Bill was up at Dave's place when I got home, but before I could drive up there, Bill had returned. I was on phone with John Jennings at midnight.

1972 357th day - 9 days follow

Cloudy, light drizzles once in awhile. At 8:45 I delivered Dave's rent to Glen Berry, then walked to Trinidad and back to enjoy the wild, stormy ocean.

Bill went into Eureka awhile, returning at 4:30 - just time enough to change clothes and head out for Eureka again. This time to meet Chris, Lex (new) husband Joe, and go to their place in Rio Dell for dinner.

Pamela and Beverly both there. We had a most pleasant evening - enjoyed everything - and got home at 1:30.

Raining early, then cloudy ¹⁹⁷² 358th day - 8 days follow until mid afternoon, when rain was harder. Put up some Xmas decorations. Bill spent much time at typewriter on project for NPS - a grant, perhaps?

Gary and I walked Scenic Drive to enjoy stormy ocean - and to explore here and there - weeds, houses, building pits, and returned around 2:40.

Began raining hard. After soup - in front of fire - I went to M.K. to get a few groceries. Gary here with Bill when I returned at 5 - and I had him stay for dinner. (Jean P. back.)

Bill Sevall came in after dinner, remaining an hour or so.

Bob Morris phoned from Weaverville.

Fourth Sunday in Advent

Ocean wild and wonderful. Clear Fair today and warmer.

Gary topped eucalyptus tree for me after lunch.

Then we walked scenic drive - from 3 - 5 - taking a marvelous side trip to explore the southern point of Baker Beach, where neither of us had ever been before. We scrambled up and down wet, slippery, trail to just above crashing waves. Found a cave and blow hole. Gary went lower on wet rocks than I could, since I had tennis shoes on - and he had lug soles. We were thrilled about our discovery of this most exciting place to be during rough seas - great swells - wind, etc.

Gary came down for waffle dinner with us - Bill went on working until after midnight.

Lo. 48° High 58°-60°

Beautiful day - Clear with 1972 360th day - 6 days follow

Some ^{Christmas} cloudiness in late afternoon to make lovely sunset. Bill took off for the Univ. at 11 for awhile.

Worked around house until 11:20, when I picked up Becky Coleman to spend an hour or so with us here at Moonstone and environs.

Fixed goodies for dinner. Iris phoned. Went to Devalls from 5-6. Returned to start dinner (having forgotten to turn on oven at 4:30!) and it was delayed one hour.

We brought Gary (and bicycle) back with us from Devalls and he stayed for dinner with us.

Iris & Lee came out around 8 - staying until midnight - Bill phoned Caroline and Helen to give holiday greetings.

1972 361st day - 5 days follow

Up at 8:45. Variable cloudiness. Put furnace cement on Franklin stove, then cleaned up kitchen. Split some wood, sawed some junk wood - then went for walk with Gary from (around) 2 to 3. We watched the rough ocean at various points, going only to (near) Bakers beach.

Bill had gone into school and town for errands meanwhile.

Sawed up some eucalyptus branches, working until 5.

Started some washing, in spite of discolored water yet, out of necessity. Had a pick up, buffet, eat when you want to kind of dinner - all the good things left from Xmas dinner.

Peggy Aikman's book, "Edge of life" arrived this afternoon - inscribed to Bill.

Rain 8

WEDNESDAY

Up very early to get to Univ. 1972 362nd day - 4 days follow
for 8:15 program "Ecology of the Redwoods" - a
panel discussion - before Western Society of American
Naturalists. Raining hard! Home by 12:30.
Began working on new skirt - cutting out, that is.

Jon and Lud came in after dinner,
stayed until 10:30 or so. I had to
stop work on new skirt.

Jon Krupp and sister Debby here awhile in

Went shopping in Arcata from 3-5.

Gary W. here around dinnertime. Bill
kept typing to finish "project", then went into
the ASWA meeting (program) at Ramada Inn.

Gary & I watched TV Cronkite special, then
I continued watching TV until 1 A.M. long
after Gary had gone home - and Bill returned.

Frosty. 37°. Worked around 1972 364th day - 2 days follow

Louise. Dave phoned from Arcata airport around 11. I went in for him, and then took him home after he had talked about ^{his} trip home to Bill; while I continued work on skirt.

Bill went into college to hear one paper (ASWN), returning around 5. Meanwhile Dave showed up - borrowed a drill - said he'd be back.

PUBLIC HOLIDAYS—1972

In most States when a Holiday falls on Sunday, the Monday following is observed. Holidays in some States are observed only by common consent, or when appointed by the Governor, and not by legislative enactment.

At the time this book went to press the District of Columbia by Act of Congress, and most States by legis-

lative act, changed the observance of Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Columbus Day and Veterans Day to certain Mondays. These changes, where adopted, are given effect in the table below. States where such changes are under legislative consideration are indicated with an asterisk (*).
