Results of Chapter Exlom election phoned to me from Mike Krikorian - Len Swenson, Betty Ball and Jim Owens were 3 top vote getters.

Phoned Jim the good news.



37°F. 7:10 A.M.

1990 4th day - 361 days follow

Clear, then increasing cloudiness,  
then light rain.

Spent most of the day cleaning up  
the laundry room, preparing for Andy's  
work on ceiling panels tomorrow.

Went through 2 foot locker and  
had fun "going down memory lane" -  
things from 1939 - 1959 - old  
letters, photos, etc. etc. - and threw  
out things moldy, moth eaten, or

1990 17th day - 348 days follow 36°F. 6:45 A.M.

Morally clear. Bill off to school early. Went to (frosty) Arcata by 9 for another oral history session at Tim McKay's.

Home before 12.

Linda Cappinaitis phoned re. RNHA. Worked on draft of North Group ExCom meeting minutes.

Ursula B. Brown phoned around 4:15 from Tucson to learn more about yesterday's earthquake in Humboldt County. We talked for a good half hour.

Jim Owens phoned, back from leader training (SC) in San Antonio, TX.

Awakened at 3:45 A.M. 1990 18th day — 347 days follow  
by  $M$  5.1 earthquake — Centered about  
30 miles NE of Eureka (around  
Willow Creek). No damage — just  
some good shaking.

Talked with Gerry B. (brother) about  
quakes and publications available.

1990 19th day — 346 days follow 45° F. 7:10 A.M.

Cloudy — with beautiful sunrise rainbow  
over the ocean.

Mark Zouan phoned about SC.

At noon Bob Dale arrived to have  
lunch with me. Afterwards, he taped  
an interview about my involvement in  
the "G-O load" issue from 1971 on —

We spent at least 2 hours  
talking about various happenings related  
to wilderness, the Siskiyou, and  
forest plans.

Bill was in town awhile.

Steve Lau phoned about next week's  
RNHA meeting and topics for dis-  
cussion.

Felt sick in early evening —  
sort of sore throat and upset  
stomach.

Did  $\frac{3}{4}$  loads of laundry.  
Dumped 4" rain (accumulated) from gauge.

Tom Pratte phoned around 11:45.  
No longer with The Surfrider Foundation!

Will be co-ordinating "Forests Forever" initiative in Orange County for next few months - a paying job.

Dear Wilderness Supporter:

It's renewal time again. Your membership in the California Wilderness Coalition is greatly appreciated along with your past support of our efforts to defend California's wild lands and waters.

Last fall we celebrated the 25th anniversary of the passage of the Wilderness Act. This anniversary was the theme of our four-day California Wilderness Conference last October in Visalia. Now we are looking forward to designating additional wilderness in the new decade—lands in the California Desert, lands elsewhere in the State managed by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM), and forest lands not protected by the California Wilderness Act in 1984.

This is a year of many changes. A new plan for the Shasta-Trinity National Forest recently has been issued, and we are expecting draft plans for the Klamath and Stanislaus forests. The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) has finished its review of wilderness study areas and will be releasing its final decisions soon. Efforts to protect the desert tortoise, spotted owl, and other threatened and endangered species are being opposed by special interests such as the off-road vehicle users and the timber industry.

As a result, we are stepping up our actions to defend our wild places. Last year and earlier this year we held several workshops to train activists interested in BLM wilderness; our next workshop will be held in this week. We joined local activists appealing ski developments at Mt. Shasta and June Mtn. and successfully forced the Forest Service to completely redo their environmental reports for these ill-advised projects. We went to court with other groups and stopped road construction and logging in the South Fork of the Eel River; BLM now has agreed to study the area for possible wilderness designation. We are party to appeals of the Sequoia, Eldorado, and Inyo national forest plans and the Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit plan.

We are continuing to work hard on the California Desert bill, Senator Alan Cranston's S.11, the measure that will designate 81 new wilderness areas and three new national parks. Hearings were held in Bishop and Barstow last year on HR 780, Representative Mel Levine's companion bill to S.11. Another hearing was held on February 10th in Los Angeles. The Coalition is committed to working for the strongest possible legislation to protect our wild desert.

We keep you posted on California's wild lands through the *Wilderness Record* and Wilderness Alerts (if you have returned a questionnaire). Stephanie Mandel, our editor, keeps the monthly newsletter out on time and full of interesting information.

But there is much more that we need to do.

And only with your continued membership can we keep defending our wild natural heritage and working towards completion of our state and federal wilderness systems. Thank you for your support.

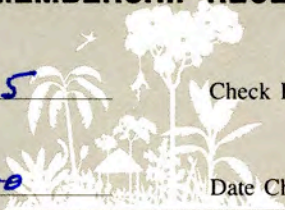

**FOCUS ON FORESTRY INITIATIVES:** November 6 is a critical day for the forests of California. The Forests Forever initiative (Prop 130), written and sponsored by a coalition of environmental groups including EPIC, faces off against the timber industry's well-financed Prop. 138. Prop. 138 would make it easier for the industry to overcut, despite their promotion of their initiative as "The Global Warming and Clear-Cutting Reduction, Wildlife Protection & Reforestation Act of 1990." Prop. 138 was drafted by big timber to accomplish one thing: to invalidate the forest protection measures in Forests Forever and Big Green, if it passes with more votes. A Sacramento Superior Court judge recently found the ballot arguments for Prop. 138 to be false and misleading, but allowed them to fraudulently state that it will result in a reduction of clear-cutting. The ads for Prop. 138 spread misinformation as well - including Earth First! authorship of 130. It's going to be a challenge to get the truth out on this one!

**HEADWATERS FOREST** update: southeast of Eureka, owned by Pacific Lumber (PL - MAXXAM), Headwaters is the largest unprotected redwood forest ecosystem remaining on the planet. Still very pristine, it is one of three intact habitats left for the marbled murrelet in California. It is the #1 priority for state acquisition if Forests Forever (130) passes.

Responding to public pressure, the CA Dept. of Forestry (CDF) denied two PL logging plans within this forest, 1-89-762 and 1-89-793, but PL is appealing them to the Board of Forestry at its November 6-7 meeting, scheduled for Ukiah. The Board, cozy with industry, could conceivably defy the public and CDF and approve these plans, and if 130 passes, the price tag to taxpayers for Headwaters would go up. If 130 fails, it would be logged. **PLEASE WRITE TO THE BOARD OF FORESTRY** by Nov. 4th at Box 944246, Sacramento, CA 94244-2460, and ask them to uphold CDF's denial of these plans. Publication A13 can give you more details. EPIC stands ready to go to court for Headwaters Forest again if these plans are approved.

**A DETAILED SUMMARY OF EPIC LAWSUITS** written by The Man Who Walks in the Woods is now available to assist other forest activists. See Pub. A12.

**PATTERN & PRACTICE LAWSUIT:** The CA Supreme Court ruled on September 19, that the trial court must examine the basic procedures of Timber Harvesting Plan (THP) approval by CDF as illustrated by 65 randomly chosen THPs. A legal milestone: in the past the court considered only single THPs. Argued by Sharon Duggan of San Francisco. It is #7 in our Legal Summary. Funds are needed for this important case. Info: Pub. A14.

**SUSTAINABLE LOGGING & ECONOMY:** Efforts are underway in Humboldt County to develop economic alternatives to boom and bust timber industry economy. The programs will encourage small scale logging with centralized milling and marketing. Ask to be on the mailing list of PCEFP to hear more.

**WOODS IN SIBERIA!** The Man Who Walks in the Woods was honored in August by being chosen as forestry representative on an environmental delegation to the Soviet Union. He had a fascinating journey, mainly in Siberia on Lake Baikal. He talked to Soviet government officials and environmentalists about the logging plans they are now making with Louisiana-Pacific, Georgia-Pacific, and other corporations. Woods and George Davis, former head of the Wilderness Society, also worked with a member of the Supreme Soviet's Committee on Ecology to draft recommendations for major reforms to Soviet logging practices.

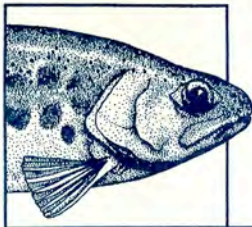
