Took some snow scenes from the deck - around 9:30.

Bill left for town about 3:00. Went to Acata around 3:30 to do Xeroxing and buy postage stamps.

Acata roofs were still white.

FEBRUARY

1989 35th day - 330 days follow 31° F. 7:05 A.M.

Snow - 4" thick on decks, cars, roofs, etc. Beautiful change. Some lovely pink clouds with dark gray ones over the ocean. Put fish out on deck, but she took a dim, dim view of the cold white stuff as I held her on the picnic table. For M. came by around 10:30.

The snow flurries continued -

The Clam Beach run scheduled for today became questionable, but took place when shortened by 3 miles - starting at Trinidad, rather than at Stagwood Rd.

I watched off and on from the windows. There was a time set for walkers, also - for the first time.

Dave Van de Mark was here briefly at noon. Bill Devall and Mark? came in for awhile in late afternoon - having removed storm damaged trees at Trinidad house.



27°F. 7:30 A.M. - Clear. 1989 36th day - 329 days follow

Lots of snow still on ground and roofs.

Mark Bucklen phoned that a SC outing would begin at 12:30 - the trail around Trinidad Head - instead of Jed. Smith, due to icy road conditions in Del Norte Co.

About 15 (and 2 very small ones) participated in the snowy walk. The water was extremely calm, and the air crystal clear. We observed 3 porpoises - from atop the head - just below us.

The wind came up around 3, after we had reached the parking area again.

Bill D. brought me some KRONCA related reading material - a "Trust" deal for the Big Flat area.

Received lengthy, interesting packet from cousin Bob Haas from West Germany (where he now lives), about his life events - and a copy of his published account of our great grandfather William Chauncey Bartlett (from Pacific Historian, Spring '86).

Went to North Group ExCom meeting at Lusia's - from 7 - 9:50.

1989

39th day - 326 days follow

Ash Wednesday

37°F. 7:30 A.M. Clear, breezy.

Planned to leave with Ron M at 11:45 for RNP headquarters, Crescent City. We got away about 12:10.

The snow scenes all through Prairie Creek & Del Norte Coast Redwood State Parks - and right down to Crescent Beach were outstanding.

Talked with "Act. Supt." Doug Warnock for about 20 minutes about Ron's proposed removal. ~~He~~ Also talked with Joe Lusa about SC trail maintenance in RNP.

Late lunch - about 3:30 at the "Harbor", then back to RNP Headquarters for some files that Ron needed for his grievance case.

Stopped briefly at Big Lagoon so Ron could check water pipes at "Katy's cabin", (Kate Buchanan), which he uses at times. Home by 6:30.

Watched some TV.

40th day - 325 days follow

Cloudy - Snow disappearing along driveway, on terrace, on decks. Called David's house, hoping to find Jerry there to wish him a happy 72nd birthday. Not there. Talked at length with David about many things.

Lon M. brought a pizza for dinner - around 6. I had called him about the materials I was to read and send on to S.F.

Watched TV after 9 o'clock.

1989 41st day - 324 days follow 44°F. 7:00 a.m.

Raining lightly.

Richard Swisher, maintenance person for Westhaven Community Services District, arrived around 10. With a metal detector he located the box and shut-off valve for our water supply. Loaded up and ready to head back to Mammoth around 10:30. Bill more confident and kept up with Greg's pace. Very few stops. Weather was perfect - few clouds - blue skies. Large herd of bison at Bisunt Basin - others scattered - Saw a few elk at edge of burned forest. Animals paid no attention to passing vehicles.

View of Electric Peak was spectacular from Swan Lake area; also Bunker Peak; and near the end of the run, the view of Mt. Everest and distant mountains was superb. Around 1:00 P.M. we were back at the garage. Some elk and a large mule deer were sighted as we neared the Headquarters area.

Greg took care of the machines while Bill and I drove back to his house. Hot shower felt good.

A good fire, soup and crackers were also very nice to have.

We read and nibbled in front of the fire until 6:30 -
