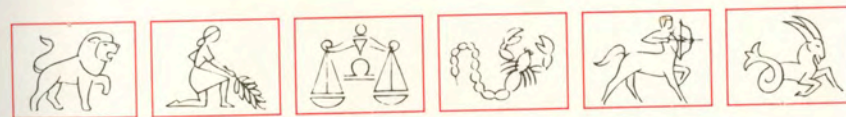

Cloudy.

Did a few brief errands in Arcata and Eureka as I left the area for Santa Rosa. Chased Eureka around 11:20. Stopped at my favorite vista point overlooking the Eel River for a quick lunch of sandwich + milk. Arrived S.R. by 4:00 P.M. and went straight to Bart Schneider's home on Beaver Street. Bart arrived shortly after I had let myself in.

We did an errand together - paper supply place, then met for an hour with counselor Mike Krikorian (5:10-6:10) to air our feelings toward each other. It was a successful session and we both felt good afterwards.

Bart prepared dinner. Ron Mayhew arrived around 8 - from SF Airport (from Atlanta, GA).

Bart + Ron went to a wine tasting party around 9, returning around 11:30.

Bart and I had sleeping bags on the living room floor.

Bert Schneiders tearfully stepped aside
after many complaints were heard.

Left at 12:30. Gas. and lunch stop
in Healdsburg. Non-stop home —
no rain at all, just clouds.

Arrived Moonstone 5:50 just as
darkness set in.

Bill arrived about 7.

1988 18th day — 348 days follow

40°F. 8:00 A.M. Cloudy with showers.

Did 2 loads of laundry.

Called Jerry B. about arrangements to get his car back.

Marta West phoned from Sacramento — would be in our area with students Wednesday for crab feed. Hal Wildman NOT coming up — just returned from extensive trip in Australia.

1988 19th day — 347 days follow 35°F. 7:00 A.M.

Partly cloudy, but mostly clear. Bill left early for 8 o'clock ~~class~~ ^{coverage} of Dennis Anderson's course. Typed up part of the chapters "blue sheets" for Club Directory.

Coastal Alliance's Beth Millemann phoned from "D.C." about a workshop on the Coastal Basins Resource System in Portland, Feb. 27.

— Stevie Dall phoned from Sacto. Jerry phoned around 6:30. The Ken 50' was nearly ready. He planned to drive it up here Thursday.

1988 20th day — 346 days follow

Dodge garage in Santa Cruz said
Did some housecleaning.

Went to Trinidad around
noon for some groceries.
Prepared garlic butter and
salad dressing for the crab
dinner event.

Marta and colleagues arrived
around 6:30 and plunged into
the dinner making bit. We
had a superb feast and
a quiet time later — until
about 10 — when they headed
out for their motel near Arcata.

Tish Tang had lots of attention
after dinner as we sat
around the fire in the living room.

Made reservations at motel for
Gerry and niece Gerry.

1988 21st day — 345 days follow 40°F. 7:30 A.M.

Partly Cloudy.

Bill used HTA bus to get to
school today, leaving at 9:26.

Went to Arcata after lunch —
a couple of quick errands.

Barb Schneider phoned around 2:30
and talked at great length.

Beth Millemann of Coastal Alliance
phoned from Washington, D.C.

Gerry and niece Gerry arrived close to
4:00 P.M. as anticipated. Bill had al-
ready returned — early — by bus.

Cancelled motel — talked Gerry in spending
night at Moonstone.

Good dinner — around 7 — after Bill
and young Gerry returned from a beach walk.
Gorgeous sunset.

Had a good evening of talk,
talk, talk, then to bed before
11. Gerry B. in Bill's room; Bill in my
room, GB in Tish's room; I was on studio
couch in attic. Tish stayed with me.

40°F. 7:00 A.M.

1988 22nd day - 344 days follow

Partly cloudy.

Phoned Dott to let her know they had left and that G.B. had left some keys.

Tried to reach Bill because Gerry ~~had~~ left her gloves in the truck, she thought.

Bill went into town for a few hours - around 3.

Finished up 2 loads of laundry.

Julie Verman phoned around 8 that she would be coming up here with Helen Liben on Thursday to attend Sen. Keene's forestry hearing on Friday in Eureka.

50°F. 7:30 A.M.

1988 24th day - 342 days follow

Var. Cloudiness. Nice - calm.

Bill went jogging around 10:30.

Tish spent a couple of hours out in the garden.

Phoned Madron, WI re. awards.

Typed up supporting material on Lucie to mail as soon as possible to awards committee.

Bill in town a few hours.

1988 25th day - 341 days follow 43°F. 7:30 A.M.

High, thin clouds.

Went on field trip to Mathews' proposed subdivision on Humboldt Hill from 2:30-3:30, riding with Don Bryant and Tom and Barbara Torgerson. Then "talk time" over coffee at the Torgersons' until nearly 5. Raced home to catch CH6 TV News, who had been along on the field review and did a brief interview with me - and Don.

Julie V. phoned to confirm her stay on Thursday night.

1988 26th day — 340 days follow

Var. clouds. Warm.

Worked with Lynn Ryan on materials to mail off for a SC award for Susan from 10-12. Home by 12:30.

Typed in final form Cindy Emerson's comments on lease sale 91 - for No. Group. (5 pages)

1988 27th day — 339 days follow 51°F. 7:30 A.M.

Clouds.

Took Cindy's statement to her at 10:45 at Valley West Shopping Center. Mailed copies to Rod Halmgren and Ron Guenther.

Ray Reat picked me up at 6:15 to attend RNHA meeting at Redwood Park Information Center (RIC) near Orick. Vince Kefti was chosen new chair. Home by 10:30.

50°F. 7:30 A.M.

1988 28th day — 338 days follow

Rain.

Did 3 loads of laundry.

Went to Arcata on brief errands after lunch.

Went into Arcata again around 8:00 P.M. to pick up Julie V. from a "strategy" meeting at the NEC.

1" rain overnight

1988 29th day — 337 days follow

Rain-showers. Left at 8:20 for Eureka Inn. Sen. Kenner Senate Select Committee held day long hearing on SB 1641 — Sustained yield bill. Huge attendance. Not all speakers were able to give testimony, but could submit same during next 2 weeks. Gail Lucas and Greg Blomstrom gave Sierra Club statements. Home by 5:30.

Julie returned to Santa Rosa with Helen Liden, leaving the Inn around 4 o'clock.

38°F. 7:45 Var. Cldy. 1988 30th day — 336 days follow

Kept luncheon appet. with Earth First!'s Todd Swatthout at 11:30 in Arcata at The Golden Harvest restaurant. He presented the new proposal for a redwood forest wilderness area (old growth on P-L (Maxxam) lands. We discussed it for about 2 hours. He would be at the Group Ex. Com meeting on Feb. 9, complete with color slides.

Home by 2. Put Tisa outdoors.

Bill in town several hours - then back for a short walk on the beach.

Began reading the BLM's draft Arcata Resource Area Mgt. Plan.

1988 31st day — 335 days follow 40°F. 7:20 A.M.

Rain showers and sunshine.
Did some laundry.

35°F. 7:10 A.M.

1988 32nd day - 334 days follow

Partly Cloudy.

Went to Red Lion Inn, Eureka, by 8:45 for public hearings on OCS Lease Sale #91 - Humboldt and Mendocino coastal areas.

Overflow crowd!

Lunch at 2:30 in coffee shop - after my $2\frac{1}{2}$ minute testimony, given at 2 o'clock.

Ron M. joined me for lunch. Drove home at 3:30. Fed Fish. Listened to KHSU (FM) coverage of hearings until 5, then returned to the hearing room - just in time to hear Carl Zischella, who was in the area from his Wisconsin home. Carl spoke as "a professional conservationist".

People kept arriving all evening. I headed home at 10, listened to KHSU - still going at 11:45.

Had to scrape ice from the car windows before driving home.

Matthews' subdivision area. ←

Called Tom Torgerson, who had new information on geology, re -

1988 33rd day - 333 days follow 33°F. 7:15 A.M.

Clear; COHD! Frosty roof tops. Jennifer came in a few minutes before noon to talk about the Lease Sale 91 hearings.

Tom Pratte phoned around 12:15 - 12:30 - wanting to know what happened at the hearings.

At 1:45 the Matthews appeal was heard by the Bd. of Supervisors. It lasted about 2 hours. Although the appeal was denied, the staff was directed to make significant modifications that would address the geologic instability of the area. Don Bryant was allowed to show aerial photography by video tape - about 2-3 minutes before 5.

Went to recycling center and did a few errands in late afternoon.

1988 36th day - 330 days follow

Prepared to leave for Sebastopol (Dewey's Ranch) and got away shortly after 11.

Stopped to eat my lunch at the Eel River Vista Point south of Scotia.

Lots of fisherman out along the South Fork Eel.

Easy drive. Arrived at Dewey's Ranch before 5, having stopped in Hopland for gift wines and a milkshake.

Around 7:30 Damien, Virginia and I went out for Chinese dinner at our favorite place in Sebastopol.

1988 37th day - 329 days follow

Frosty, but nice. Went to Chapter office on College Ave. for 10 o'clock start of ExLom meeting. Brenda Adelman chaired the session brilliantly and we were able to adjourn by 4 o'clock.

Bart Schneiders was around most of the time working in adjoining room and occasionally participating in ExLom discussions. At one point Brenda had to be extremely firm and outspoken with Bart.

Julie came out to the ranch after dinner - barbecued steaks - and joined us for dessert.

Al Whitney brought Mendocino Lake members Betty and Gary Ball to the ExLom - from Ukiah. He acted as alternate delegate.

30°F. at Denver's Ranch. 1988 38th day — 328 days follow

Left Sebastopol in clear weather at 9:30. Gas stop in Healdsburg. Picked up lunch stuff in Ukiah. Ate at roadside rest 14 miles north. Easy drive home. Many fishermen out in beautiful So. Fork Eel River — in waders, on shore, and many drift boaters.

Home at 2:55. Watched sudden death play-off at Pebble Beach Pro-Am.

Bill went into town for a few hours.

Julie phoned around 9 with messages from RCC mtg. in Sacramento.

1988 39th day — 327 days follow 49°F. 7:30 A.M.

Light rain fell during the night.

Beth Millemann (Coast Alliance) phoned from "D.C." about workshop changes.

Talked with Lucie about S-R-L and Smith River Nat'l. Park legislative action.

Ron Grentner phoned about travel plans to Portland.

Did 2 loads of laundry and kept an eye on Tish outdoors — after lunch.

drizzle

51°F. 7:30 A.M.

1988 40th day - 326 days follow

Grey and drizzly. Fair and warm in afternoon.

Worked on SC materials - drafting Exlow minutes - until noon.

Went to Arcata around 2:15, then to Eureka City Hall for an Administrative hearing re. a coastal permit application for commercial area at 101 and Indianola Road.

Hearing began at 3:10 in a conference room before the Director of Community Development.

Concerns were raised by Sierra Club about paving, wetlands protection and outdoor lighting and it was all over in about $\frac{1}{2}$ hour with concerns addressed in final approval conditions.

Went to North Group Ex low meeting at Susies - 7-10:20.

Resolution passed re. old growth moratorium after presentation by Earth First!

1988 41st day - 325 days follow 40°F. 7:30 A.M.

Patchy, coastal fog - and clear seas.

Did some outdoor work - removed a cotoneaster bush from the upper terrace, which had been a "fixture" for summer shade for many years - and a berry bearing place for robins each winter season after maturing.

Summer shade will come from the Japanese umbrella pine in the future, since it reached nearly 10 ft. in height now.

43°F. 7:30 A.M.

1988 42nd day — 324 days follow

Patchy fog — and sun.

Went to Anita's Portuguese Hall for Mrs. Chesher's breakfast event, announcing a re-run for 3rd District Supervisor.

Home by 11:30 after a stop at the NEC.

Worked outside awhile. Nice!

At 4 Bill and I drove to Clam Beach County Park, crossed Strawberry Creek, and walked about 3/4 mile south to view the 35 ft. grey whale that washed ashore last week. It had not been cut up yet, so we could really see what a great creature it was. It was most pleasant walking, with just a sweater over my shoulders, and only a very light breeze at the time. Fog was still well off shore.

Talked with Lay Schultz about a possible water leak in our driveway.

1988 43rd day — 323 days follow

Lincoln's Birthday

43°F. 7:30 A.M. Patchy fog.

Worked with Sue on comments for the COE re. wetlands and mitigation in South Eureka area.

Home for lunch.

Drafted comments for COE response.

43°F. 7:30 A.M.

1988

44th day — 322 days follow

Mostly clear.

Typed final version of comments to the CDE. Went to Acreta for a copy, then to Sueba's main post office to send it off.

Watched the Claw Beach Run from 1:30-2:30 from deck at Merryman's Beach House. Saw numerous friends go by as they hit the beach.

Bill went into Mc Haleyville around 4 for groceries.

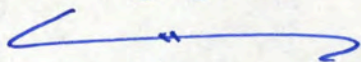
