Did washing.

30°F. 7:30 A.M. Clear 1987 16th day — 349 days follow

Prepared to leave by 11 A.M. for Sebastopol.

After a few errands en route, I got away from Eureka about noon, and arrived at "Dewey's Ranch" around 4:40 (252 miles).

Many, many fishermen along the South Fork Eel. Conditions looked good — waters just slightly cloudy.

Lots of drift doilies, row boats and rafts.

Heavy frost along the roadides, especially just north of Willits.

Danien, Virginia and I drove into Sebastopol for Chinese dinner at Kins. Very good.

Low temperature expected so we covered the hood of my car, and the windshield, and parked it under a tree for added protection.

20°F. in Sebastopol

1987 17th day — 348 days follow

No frost visible, but it still was cold going in to Santa Rosa. Arrived at Barb Schmidt's home on Pioneer Street shortly after 9:30.

Exlom meeting started at 10:05. A busy agenda with 2 special guests scheduled — for 1:00 P.M. (county parks ranger) and 2:30 (for Stan Weident of the Mother Lode Chapter — to discuss "Sierra Club California" governance problems).

Elections resulted in 2 new members at large, Ned Orsett and Scott Stegeman. Officers elected: Barb — Chair; Brenda Adelman, V-Chair; Secretary (asst.) Vinyard; Treasurer, Laura Comm.

Ron would continue as Conservation Chair. Surprise birthday cake for Stan Weident around 2:30. Meeting ended at 5:25.

Danien barbecued steaks for dinner around 8 o'clock.

Iu bed about 12:30 — after long conversation with Virginia.

70°F. high in Santa Rosa. It had turned warmer after midnight.

44°F. 8:30 A.M.

1987 18th day — 347 days follow

Clear — then cloudy

Left for home just before 10.

Stopped for lunch at a drive-in in Willits at 12:50. Home by 3:20. (Earlier stop in Cloverdale for gas.)

More fisherman out all along the South Fork — and main stem of lower Eel.

Frost still on ground in shaded areas north of Willits — after lunch — to Scotia — around 2:30.

Bill went to town right after I got home, returning around 6:30.

1987 19th day — 346 days follow

Martin Luther King, Jr. Day

33°F. 7:30 A.M. Clear and very frosty.

Linda Violatore called. We made afternoon appointment to meet here at the house — for an interview on "women in the environment" and a film project she has developed for consideration of grants — and ultimate production. She arrived around 3 and stayed until nearly 5.

A lovely young woman — an actress, writer, backpacker! In spring 1986 she led an all women backpacking group (small group — 6) into Canyonlands — spirituality and earth a focus — fighting against nuclear waste dumping near Canyonlands.

Hal Wiedman phoned — will be up here tomorrow evening with his "gang" on annual trip.

Began draft of Chapter Explanatory minutes of meeting.

54°F. 7:30 A.M. Gusty winds about daylight. Much colder around Humboldt Bay, like 31°.

Bill off to HSU for first day of classes.

Worked about 3 hrs. on the injury removal effort; then got shaved up and prepared for Hal's arrival. He phoned around 5:15, had found fresh crab, would be out before 6.

Marta West, Bill Shepell and Marianne with him. They took over the kitchen and we sat down to our traditional crab salad, garlic bread, beer or wine, dinner.

Tired from the collecting trip from Sacramento, they left for the motel in Acreata around 9 P.M.

First crab feast of this year - Delicious!

worked for 2½-3 hrs. pulling German ivy from our beach road bank.

Read some SC material - bylaws for Chapter; proposed ^{set} for SC California.

Bill at school again 11-4:30.

45°F. 7:30 A.M. Cloudy. 1987 22nd day — 343 days follow

Rain during night.

Cloudy all day; some light, then gusty winds.

Stayed very cool all day. I remained in cloos — working on SC material — then relaxed and read "Jaguar" awhile.

FRIDAY

23

JANUARY

1987 23rd day — 342 days follow 47°F. 7:30 A.M.

Rained during night. Sunshine and showers this day.

Helen Liben phoned about KQED's TV program about P-L takeover — said poor image of environmentalists — it needed to be refuted publicly.

Went to Acrea to do errands and to take some flowers (growing primrose) to Lynn Ryan — in Mad River Hospital.

Met Lynn's parents there and stayed to talk nearly an hour! Lynn doing extremely well, only 2 days post-op.

Decided to settle in during the cool afternoon and finish reading "Jaguar".

JANUARY

24

SATURDAY

50°F. 7:30 A.M. Raining - 1987 24th day - 341 days follow

Left my car at "Park and Ride" in Trinidad at 9:30. Lucie came by around 9:45 with her van full - Annette, Cindy, Bob, Jim - to meet RNP Supt. Doug Warnock and staff at the L.I.C. in Orick. Everyone was well prepared with rain gear, expecting the worst on our field trip into the Tall Trees area of Redwood Creek.

Steve Viers, Bill Weaver, Danny Hagene and Bob Belous were the "experts" on the activities we were concerned with - primarily streamside erosion control.

The rains had just let up, so the forest was dripping as we hiked down the tall trees trail. We found fallen trees and heard one go down as we came back up.

NOT A DROP OF RAIN FELL ON OUR ENTIRE OUTING. We ate lunch on the gravel bar near the gravel ~~moving~~ ^{moving} project to help protect the world's 6th known tallest tree (352'). Watched 5 deer nearby - totally unconcerned about our presence as they fed along the stream bank.

Did a lot of small household chores, then read part of USFS Six Rivers draft Forest Plan, which was delivered by UPS - a heavy bundle!

Talked with Ron M. awhile by phone, regarding the trip into the Redwood Creek area ^{last} Saturday.

Glen Berry's re-constructed house taking on some final shape - railings on deck were almost completed today.

1987 27th day - 338 days follow 53°F. 7:30 A.M.

Clouds - Sun -

Worked on Sierra Club stuff - typed No. Group minutes and other things. Heavy, gusty winds and torrential rain at times - secured all windows for the onslaught.

Bill was home in time to watch on TV - for the President's 35-40 minutes State of the Union address.

(There was not one single reference to environmental matters).

The Democrats' response followed.

Phone Leone Nichols (SC) in Napa for some information.

43°F. 7:30 A.M. Clouds. 1987 28th day — 337 days follow

Rain over the night; some clearing;
some spotty sunshine; some showers.

Went to KIFM-TV studios by 11:45 but
there was no camera on hand — so we tried
to arrange another time. Did one errand, then
called CH 3 at 12:15, 12:30, and 12:50 — no
luck — would try to contact tomorrow was
the message. Home for a late lunch,
around 1:30.

The bay was high and very blue,
which made diving alongside it very
interesting. 8.1 high tide this a.m.

Had a phone call from Linda
Villatore.

1987 29th day — 336 days follow 50°F. 7:30 A.M. Clouds.

Went to Create Plaza by 9:45 to meet Eric
Silvern, CH 3 news reporter. He did a
brief interview regarding the Six Rivers
Forest Plan. Home by 10:30 after
a stop at the NEC and after leaving
Linda Villatore's project material in her
mailbox on 11th Street.

Bought Jon Humboldt Gatter book
"Night Crossings" at North Town Books.

Asked Lee Titus if he would put on
a new chimney rain cover — he would,
and he did, as soon as I could
get back with one from McKinleyville.

Did some house cleaning and kept
an eye on the sky. Heavy rains and
high winds forecasted — and rain
began during the evening — but the
high winds did not occur here.

Read new book and watched
some TV.

8.3' high tide at 11:00 A.M.
Nothing spectacular at Moonstone.

43°F. 7:45 A.M. Clouds. 1987 30th day — 335 days follow

It rained during the night. Clearing during morning hours.

Surf very rough and tumbley. Little River marching north again.

Went to beach — picked up litter as tide was reaching its peak. Conrad Bonifazi and friend were also on the beach.

1987 36th day — 329 days follow

Phone call from Connie Parish — new Editor of Coastlines.

Went to HSU by 4 o'clock for Psych. Ed. class 4:30-6:30 on "Women in the Environment". As a guest, I spoke on my personal involvement as an activist in the community — and environmental awareness as background. Home by 7.

Mailed book to Jerry — "Night Crossings"

43°F. 7:30 A.M.

1987 37th day — 328 days follow

Variable cloudiness. Forecast: warm. Another gorgeous spring-like morning.

Worked on bank above beach road awhile.

80° high

54°F. 7:30 A.M. -- 60°F. 8:00 A.M. ¹⁹⁸⁷ 38th day -- 327 days follow

Warm, no wind, and just a very beautiful day.

Bill and I hauled garden prunings to the curl-de-sac before the road was closed for the Clam Beach Run.

Runners began "Thumping" down the Moonstone Beach Road around 1:40. Estimated over 900 entrants. Saw several friends and cheered them on from my bank-side viewing spot. Did some more pruning.
