1985 1st day - 364 days follow

40°F. 8:00 A.M. Clear -

Many fishermen out. Picked up some groceries and wine in Hopland. Arrived at Damien's place around 4:45. He and Virginia were setting new fence posts in concrete and worked until dark.

We enjoyed a wonderful BBQ'd steak for dinner and afterwards watched some TV programs we all liked.

Jane Fisk, new L-P spokesperson, phoned regarding SC's position on new EPA action on ocean disposal from pulp mills wastes.

Lunch at Lidgwood Summit after getting gas in Cloverdale. Lunch was really a great big breakfast at noon, something of bacon, eggs, hash browns, toast and coffee. It got me home nicely, arriving at 3:25. There had been very, very light traffic all the way - making the trip quite easy.

Bill and I walked to Luffenholz Beach and got back just ahead of some light rain - around 4:45.

Watched TV until 11:15 and read papers and mail during commercials. "Tish" seemed happy to have me back, but continues her bad habit of scratching and biting.

Rain got steady in late evening.

Did very large washing.

Some time out for walk with Bill along Scenic Drive - before he ~~to~~ went to town.

Home by 9:35. Greg came in shortly - and retired almost immediately - very tired from weekend activities in Searsville. He has brace work scheduled in Eureka in morning.

1985 29th day - 336 days follow 38°F. 7:30 A.M. Some

Greg got away before 8:30, but then dropped by on way home to pick up his wool jacket.

Did some laundry.

Met new neighbor Norman Wilson as he headed out on his bicycle.

Left at 7:10 A.M. for Santa Rosa via Sebastopol to pick up Damien at 12:30.

Chapter ExCom meeting began at 1:18 (we were late after stopping at a Salvation Army thrift store to pick up a large madame piece that Julie had set aside. This was for Fish Tang to climb on).

Large group at ExCom. Len was selected to Chair again this year - and I would continue as secretary. Damien would be vice-chair and treasurer - again. Len to continue as Conservation Chair.

A few new faces from Sonoma Group were on hand. The meeting ended around 5:30.

Light drizzle as we drove back to Damien's place.

Ursula Faasi and her mother came for dinner - about 8:30.

Damien barbecued steaks over apple wood. Delicious!

Watched "Land of the Tiger", which had been taped from the PBS program.

1985 33rd day - 332 days follow 29°F. 8:00 A.M. in Sebastopol

Left around 9:15 and then decided to stop in Healdsburg for gasoline.

Good driving conditions and very light traffic. A couple of light showers, otherwise nice clouds.


