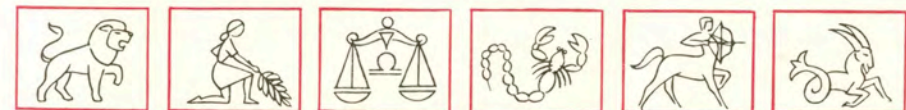

1984 1st day—365 days follow 43°F. 8:00 A.M. Variable
New Year's Day High cloudiness. Bright and cool.

Bill and I took a walk on the beach after a delightful breakfast (my lunch) of sour dough, whole wheat hotcakes — and bacon.

Drove to Big Lagoon to view the erosion of cliffs (sandstone) onto Agate beach. Old foundations of houses now exposed. Some part of road shut off — near bluff edge.

Took a couple of photos of the Coleman place — after-burn remains.
Watched some TV during evening.

43°F. 7:30 A.M. Fair with high cirrus clouds. ^{1984 2nd day - 364 days follow}
 Lovely and warm mid-day hours.

Watched Tournament of Roses parade from 9-11 while doing other things around the house. Some exquisite floats... always gorgeous flowers, designs, etc.

Bill worked a couple of hours installing the "pet door" in the hollow-core door from kitchen to garage.

"Sweetie-kit" explored alone and spent some time just observing from the upper terrace.

Moved her sand (little) boxes from sun deck to garage - and she accepted the move surprisingly quickly.

Bill went into town around 3.

1984 3rd day - 363 days follow 48°F. 8:00 A.M. Variable

clouds. The "kitten" found her way from driveway to front deck - on her own this a.m.

Wrote letters to Gerry, Jean, David & Linda mostly about the new kitten.

Bill went to campus after 12 - but phoned at 3 to say the building is undergoing needed repairs for instability between 1st and 2nd floors! (and it's still NEW!).

Did some house cleaning.

Plum Gavigi here for dinner - and the night, since he could not find a place, yet. He worked at Smithsonian earlier this year.

47°F. 7:30 A.M. Fog in valleys; ¹⁹⁸⁴ 4th day-362 days follow

otherwise clear.

Glenn left by 8 to register at HSU and look for living quarters.

1984 5th day-361 days follow 48°F. 7:30 A.M. Foggy.

Glenn was gone by 7:45.

Went to Arcata-to bank-to Kinko's for copies of statement- then to Eureka by 12 at City Hall- heavy fog caused delay in start of Coastal Comm. meeting (planes had to land at Kneeland) until 12:30. Many witnesses agencies; county and city govt's- and legislators (by reps.) made comments objecting to NHP rail line abandonment. For the Sierra Club, I presented a statement (about 4 minutes) in objection for environmental impacts removal would make on coastal resources. The meeting ended shortly before 5 p.m. - I hurried home to feed the kitten.

Glenn back for dinner. No luck yet on housing.

Watched TV shows awhile.

52°F. 1:00 P.M.

1984 6th day-360 days follow

Epiphany

Foggy morning hours - clearing in afternoon -

Spent most of day - after lunch - putting Xmas decorations away and doing some house cleaning -

Left at 8:00 A.M. in heavy fog to go to Eureka Inn for announcement by Wesley Chesbro that he would seek re-election to 3rd District for BOS. Very large gathering at 8:30 A.M. Coffee + croissants served. I dared not eat, because my upper plate was loose.

Went to Social Security office at 9:20 to begin procedure for receiving medicare.

Then quickly to Dr. Hemmets' office where he did a temporary repair of worn spot in center of plate.

Glen on hand for dinner -

Watched some TV.

1984 7th day-359 days follow 49°F. 8:00 A.M. Variable

cloudiness. Glen had coffee and toast with me.

Did a couple of loads of laundry. Glen returned in mid-afternoon, while Bill DeWall was here with the kitten (brother to ours) being taken to his mother.

The male was much smaller than our "S.K." They romped, scrapped, and bluffed one another for about $\frac{1}{2}$ hour.

Glen brought home all the groceries and wine to prepare a special "chicken loaf" for our dinner. He worked for several hours to turn out an elegant dinner for us.

And, right afterwards he began packing his things to move into an apartment-house with another student on L.K. Wood Blvd. Each to pay \$500 per mo. He was happy to start settling in close to campus.

But Slater phoned. Jan. 14 meeting cancelled by agreement. Ho.

1984 8th day-358 days follow

46°F. 8:00 A.M. Variable cloudiness, but generally clear - even warm at times.

Typed Group Exlon minutes and sent note to Ron Guenther agreeing to cancellation of Jan. 14th meeting.

Bill went into town around 2:30.

Split a lot of firewood and played with "sweetie" pet "outdoors."

Observed yellow-bellied sapsucker at close range near driveway.

1984 9th day-357 days follow

44°F. 7:00 A.M. Hazy, high cloudiness, increasing during morning hours.

Left at 7:50 for Eureka. Had Coastal Comm. make copies of SG statement to ICC to attach to copy of comments made at CCC workshop.

Then quickly to Dr. Hemmets' office by 8:40 to have upper plate new impression made - and left plate for additions and cleaning. Home again by 9:20.

Did some ironing, house cleaning, reading, typing.

Back to Hemmets' office by 3:45. New plate very comfortable.

Stopped in Arcata at Kinko's to do misc. copy work.

Phone call from Phillip Levell on Mill Creek Lane, off Quarry Rd., Trinidad.

A logging problem nearby looming up - could I assist? Arranged to look it over in morning.

1984 10th day—356 days follow

51°F. 7:30. Rainy.

Went to Levee's around 10. Walked over area scheduled for hi-lead logging, right to edge of Mill Creek. Beautiful, unspoiled second growth redwood.

Visited Marie Devael and new kitten afterwards. Home by 4 o'clock. Light rains, some spotty sunshine.

Scenic Drive in rough conditions. Sinking, cracking, road bed, and bluff slippage continuing.

Greg phoned - would be down Thursday.

Talked with Julie about Needles and material in my possession.

1984 11th day—355 days follow 42°F. 7:00 A.M. Mostly Clear.

Patchy fog - low in valleys. Drove to "Andy" Tuttle's home in Arcata by 8:05; left car there. We picked up Barbara Keely and Sue Doolay in Sunnybrae and headed out in Andy's Toyota station wagon for Ukiah. Beautiful day to drive. Had to detour briefly via Avenue of the Giants near Redcrest - to Orvilleville - to avoid road closure just north of confluence of So. Fork Eel and mainstem. A long time trouble spot (since 1956) landslide area - this time with a huge redwood added.

Workshop on deep-sea strip mining began at 12:30 and lasted until 3:30 - at the Lee Ann Motel's "Landmark" Room. (used by B.H.M.).

Warner Chabat was moderator for panel which included coordinator Richard Charter, a Dept. of Interior "biologist" in Minerals Mining Services, 3 county supervisors, Oceanic Society scientists.

Ron Guenther was there. Friends of Del Norte was represented by Ralph Hollingsworth. I was "observer" for Sierra Club, Humboldt County. It was a most informative session for approx. 35 people.

Back in Eureka by 7:30. Some delay in Willits for battery re-charge. (Lights had been left on, car was "backy" after push to start in Ukiah.

Home by 9:30 after talking awhile to Don and Andy; once home.

1984 12th day—354 days follow

39°F. 7:30 A.M. Mostly clear.

Took care of some Chapter correspondence
— to Ursula — for Needles.

Went to Eureka by 5:20. Met Bill and Greg at Arts Gallery for cocktails and dinner.

Left there at 6:45 to get to Susan's by 7 for North Group Ex Com meeting.

Meeting went smoothly. Richard and Linda could not attend, but we had a quorum — and a new member guest.

Home by 10:20 after taking Bob Wunner to his home (recent move) off Central Ave. in McKinleyville.

Greg stayed overnight.

1984 13th day—353 days follow

36°F. 7:00 A.M. Sparkling clear!

Greg had time for coffee and toast before heading to Orick around 8:30.

Took "SK" to vets at 10:10 — in full harness. She was noisy all the way to McKinleyville.

She received her first rabies shot; a worm shot; and had her claws trimmed. She was more relaxed on the way back home. Dave Trohity, DVM, and staff received the "new one" with much enthusiasm, seeing great pleasure for us.

Bill went to campfire around noon.

Phone call from Dan Marchetti of Eureka about a development next door — a problem — We would go over the site Sat. morning.

Walked on beach — to Little River — with Roberta Kemp, carrying Ethan^{5mo.} in front-pack. Brisk breeze, but absolutely beautiful!

Worked on final typing of Ex Com minutes for Chapter.

watched TV off and on during evening.

1984 14th day-352 days follow

40°F. 7:30 A.M. A few clouds -
increasing during day. Cool!

Gisela Rohde phoned.

Read a lot of coastal related material
after spending ^{mostly} 2 hrs with Dan
Marchetti and 1 neighbor on Cowler St,
Eureka. We bundled up to visit the
close by proposed bldg. site for 12
condominium units. Above a marshy
drainage area (Eureka slough) all redwood
trees in a remnant 2nd growth cluster
would possibly have to be removed. Area is
only 1.69 acres.

Home by 12:30 for lunch. At 1:30
Gisela's ^{family's} friends Betty & Bob Fish from
Maine ^{who} were interested in locating in the
Trinidad area, spent a couple of hours
with me, learning all they could about
people and possible bldg. sites.

Bill, who left at 8:30 for field survey
of marsh area near Arcata, returned
around 3:30.

At 5 we went to Erika Wharton's
new residence (small rental) on Down Prairie Rd.
for dinner. Plenty of time to play with
Matt. Relaxed with TV later - "Snoopy"
for Matt before bedtime at 9.

"Victor/Victoria" on Cinemax was for
us - until 11:15 or so.

Light rain on way home around 11:30.

1984 15th day-351 days follow 46°F. 8:00 A.M. Raining.
Martin Luther King's Birthday

Did 3 loads of laundry, all sheets + towels!

Phillip Levele phoned re. progress on logging
concerns - will go to Planning Director Wednesday.

Did first draft of North Group ExCom minutes.
Phoned Carol Moné and Sueie re. SC events.

Bill left for Arcata around 2:30.

Some clearing around 3:00 p.m.

37°F. 7:30 A.M. ¹⁹⁸⁴ 16th day—350 days follow

Crisp & mostly clear.
This was first ML King holiday.
Worked on SC materials.

Varied thrushes observed in driveway.

¹⁹⁸⁴ 17th day—349 days follow 26°F. 7:30 A.M. Clear and

quite frosty. Yellow-bellied sapsucker in elderberry.
Bill left around 10 for campus.

Phoned Fish and Game Dept. in Redding
re- "tag rewards"—mixed up correspondence!

Went to Aresta after lunch to do
copy work, mail Econews' to Tom, cash a
SC refund check, etc. Then to Trinidad
to market for meat and Bourbon—for
dinner, since we expected Greg.

Clipped news papers while dinner waited.

Greg arrived about 6:30. After
dinner he showed his beautiful
slides of the sailing trip in the
Galápagos Islands with Gil de Roy Moore,
his wife, Dick Laap, Lin Krall and Greg
Ester, (who was a guide on the Buccaneer).

Greg stayed overnight as he had
10 A.M. appt. in Eureka.

42°F. 7:45 A.M. Fair w/ scattered clouds.
 Greg left for a brace fitting in Eureka
 after breakfast - with kitten jumping
 to his lap before anyone could stop
 her - so fast!

Went to courthouse by 1:30 for start
 of public hearings on revised General
 plan (County). Ferndale's concerns over
 protection of watershed for their water
 supply was the major topic.
 Headed home shortly after 4:30.

1984 19th day - 347 days follow 45°F. 7:30 A.M. Cloudy.

Wrote over one dozen notes to ExCom members
 - and others - about possible change in meeting date
 for Feb. Wanted them all in Eureka just before
 going to Woodley Island for Water Quality CIB
 meeting re. aerial spraying of toxic herbicides.
 WQCB meeting began at 1:30 and lasted until
 about 3:30. I attended as SC observer only.

Jerry Rohde and others requested more
 stringent discharge requirements for 2,4-D
 and 2,4,5-T - down to zero level.

Home by 4:45 to play awhile with the
 kitten - and let her outdoors. She
 stood her ground against a neighbor's large cat.
 Feel asleep watching TV after dinner.

40°F. 7:30 A.M. Mostly cloudy. 1984 20th day—346 days follow

Kitten explored neighbors slope; stalked small birds.

Did 2 loads of washing in afternoon.

1984 21st day—345 days follow 49°F. 7:30 A.M. Light rain.

Some clearing in afternoon.

Went to Weathered post office & store before lunch.

Science bldg. closed again!

Bill went to campus after noon.

Tom Conlon arrived with a chunk of maple for a chopping block around 3:30, and sawed it down to a useful height.

The kitten found herself trapped on the neighbors deck railing by their large dog. She remained frozen while Tom was splitting a second chunk of maple he brought (so I could choose the most suitable one). When Bill returned, as Tom was leaving, we "rescued" the kitten.

Bill asked the neighbor to the north to keep the dog back a bit.

"Sweetie-kit" learned another "off-limits" area this day--- she was "petrified" in her no escape position.

1984 23rd day-343 days follow 38°F. 7:30 A.M. Clear; with

variable cloudiness by late afternoon.

Did some housecleaning. Phoned Dr. Vacuum cleaner had break-down, halting work.

Went to Eureka by 7:00 p.m. for CAC meeting re. EXXON project d EPR. About 7 members (out of original 20) showed up. Don Raffielli of Pub. Works Dept. explained changes made since our last meeting in August. "Side-by-side" of jacket assembly is now the preferred alternative.
Home by 9:30.

48°F. 8:00 A.M. Patchy fog with ¹⁹⁸⁴ 24th day-342 days follow
sunshine early.

Julie Verran phoned before 8 regarding the
C&L SCOPE funds for Hansen's Jan. 31 event.

Did some house cleaning - until the
vacuum cleaner stopped

Hal Wiedman phoned - would be here
tomorrow night with fresh crabs for
dinner.

Went to City Hall, Eureka, by 7:30 for
meeting (scoping session) regarding a pro-
posed shopping mall at Broadway and
Harris Streets (Pacific Lumber retail yard).
Spoke briefly as private citizen that
area should remain industrial, not
commercial - under the drift odors
of the pulp mills - Only a few speakers.
Home by 9:10.

1984 25th day-341 days follow 46°F. 8:00 A.M. Patchy fog -
sunshine awhile, lovely.

Went to Eureka after 1:00 P.M. Left vacuum
for repairs; left papers at Soc. Security office;
stopped at pet shop at Uniontown, Arcata;
stopped briefly at Suisun. Home by 3:30.

Hal and Marta arrived about 5:30 as
planned. We fixed salad, garlic bread,
and Hal cracked 3 crabs (high priced)
for the 4 of us. Great feast - good crab.

They left around 10:15 - it had been
a long day - from Sacramento - and
some trouble in Lake County.

Julie phoned (we were eating dinner, so
I would call her back early tomorrow).

42°F. 7:10 A.M. Mostly clear here at Moonstone, 1984 26th day-340 days follow

Some scattered high cloudiness.

Phoned Julie Reque & to read "Woods" letter to Exxon re. Sinkyone Wilderness hills.

Bill left around 10.

Went to Arcata to copy and mail letter to Dept. of Parks & Rec. re. ORVs on Gold Bluffs Beach.

Worked in garden a couple of hours - cutting extra long grass, and pruning until my arms got tired.

Talked Bill into movie in Eureka - "Never Cry Wolf." We attended the late showing - about 9:15. The photography was excellent and they told the Farley Mowat story without a lot of "Hollywood" additives.

Home under clear, star bright skies around 11:40. Watched Johnny Carson.

Larry Moss phoned regarding Chit action related to the ORV use on Gold Bluffs Beach by commercial fishermen and others. As under Sec. of Resources in 1972 he said he had started a move to ban all vehicles from State Parks and beaches.

1984 27th day-339 days follow 41°F. 7:40 A.M. Mostly clear

at Moonstone; foggy in other areas.

Worked around house until noon.

Went to Arcata and Eureka after lunch.

Mailed copy of Woods' letter to Julie, then drove out Sinkyone Peninsula road.

Watched 4 marsh hawks in area where Exxon project is proposed. Too lazy for photos -- and there was a coal breeze.

Spent quiet evening - some TV watching.

42°F. 7:30 A.M. Clear, warm. 1984 28th day-338 days follow

Did 2 loads of washing.

Worked on bank under Bishop pines.

Removed blackberries and dead branches

Did more grass cutting on lower terrace.

Enjoyed watching "S.L." play in the dirt.

She also used it for the first time.

Later on - on the upper terrace while playing to catch a bee, she ended up getting stung in the mouth!

Glen Yanagi was here awhile, going over some material with Bill.

- Around 11 - and we all enjoyed a fresh baked loaf of sour dough, Bague shepherd's, whole wheat bread - with butter and plum jelly -

Gorgeous day - like summer.

Showered after 4 and rested until after dinner. We left at 7:10 to see F.O.E.'s film, "The Cry of the Condor" at the Arcata Community Center. Excellent! Noticed that Martin Licon was pilot for aerial photography over the range. (Los Padres N.F.)

Home before 9.

Went to bed early - fell asleep with TV going.

1984 29th day-337 days follow 44°F. 7:40 A.M. Fair.

Variable cloudiness. Warm sunshine. No wind here.

Typed up letter to Coastal Commission regarding Pool extension for Navarro Head project.

Worked in garden until hands and arms gave out - about 3 hours - raking, weeding on south bank - nice loose soil -

Bill left for town around 3 - and I come inside.

Lots of people at the beach.

Watched some TV - off and on - during evening.

30

MONDAY

40°F. 7:30 A.M. Patchy fog.

Took letter to Coastal Commission's District office sometime after 10, then stopped briefly at (A) Dan Hansen's office to leave a copy of SC letter re. ORV's (to DPR) on Gold Bluffs Beach. Home again by 11:30.

1984 30th day-336 days follow

(Pl. Com.)
Did some reading on County's draft General Plan until young man from "Clean Sweep" arrived around 2:30. Clear earlier, the fog returned about then, low, thick and very wet. The chimney got cleaned for \$3500, about a one hour job.

Went to Peninsula School - in dreadfully heavy fog - hard to drive in - by 7:30 for public meeting on the proposed EXXON project.

County Public Works and Planners were present, along with consultants and EXXON representatives to make presentations, show slides of site, assembly plans, and to answer questions from Fairhaven residents and other concerned persons. Only 5 of the original 20 CAC members were there to listen to concerns.

Dense fog on the Peninsula and in certain areas coming home.

Watched some late TV.

TUESDAY

31

JANUARY

1984 31st day-335 days follow 45°F. 8:00 A.M. Coastal fog.

Social Security and Withholding Tax Return Due

Julie Kuran phoned before 8 - before I had a chance to have breakfast - and we talked "Sinkyone, Econews, Exlorn" for 40 minutes!

Went to Eureka for workshop at Bd. of Supervisors' meeting regarding vehicles on Gold Bluffs Beach. The chambers were full of people opposed to any closure of road or access - native Americans, the senior citizens, commercial and recreational fishermen - and others.

I spoke for limited - controlled use - and phased out total ban of vehicles. Home by 5:30.

47°F. Beautiful day.

1984 32nd day-334 days follow

Took Bill's Army discharge papers to Social Security office around 10:15 and returned home.

Did some laundry - nice enough in afternoon to hang a few things outdoors. Did some more garden clean up.

1984 33rd day-333 days follow 41°F. 7:30 A.M.

Worked on statement for Gen. Plan.

In Anata by 2:45 for a haircut. A warm afternoon - no sweaters needed to go outdoors.

39°F. 7:30 A.M. Began packing **Sierra Club** materials in car and planned on leaving by 10:00. Delivered comments to Planning Dept, left typewriter to be cleaned - and got away from Eureka at 11:20. Munched cookies and milk after stopping for gasoline in Garberville. Met Ron Guenther in Wellits at 2, as planned. Had a bite to eat before heading on to Santa Rosa. Beautiful day. Excellent driving conditions. Lots of young lambs in already "greened-up" fields. The Eel River was gorgeous shades of jade green - and lots of fishermen were out. There were also a lot of trucks on the 101 - as stated to ICC since NWP "abandoned" the rail line.

Arrived ahead of 5 o'clock rush in Santa Rosa and left Ron at Bart Schneiders. Arrived at Damien and Virginia's on Sebastopol fringe around 5. Had a chance to see young lambs and goats before dusk.

We had fresh crab (from Eureka) which had been iced down for travel. Virginia made salad and had rice - and wine. The crab was excellent! (2 Dungeness crabs cost \$12.70).

After dinner we talked "Sierra Club" and watched some TV.

1984 35th day - 331 days follow

Clear and warm.

The Chapter meeting began at 10:10 and lasted until nearly 5. We ate lunch outside around 12:20.

Election of officers followed. Sierra up-date by Assemblyman Don Hansen's ^{field} rep. Mike Kelly. Len Swenson, Chair; Damien Austin, V-Chair; Virginia, Secy. Damien, treasurer; Ron Guenther, Chapter Conservation Chair.

The ~~election~~ ballot results were: Barb, Herb, Damien. Solano Group is almost totally re-activated - election on-going. Julie stayed a short while and Wanda came after lunch. Bob Irwin had limited time before lunch. Barb also had to leave for Oakland at 2.

Virginia baked chicken breasts for dinner. We talked more, watched some TV and headed for bed before 11. Ron returned to Santa Rosa for the night. Barb would drive him back to Wellits, where he left his car.

Foggy in morning. Awake by 7:30. ¹⁹⁸⁴ 36th day-330 days follow

A new lamb was born early - named "Lucille"! After coffee and toast and a look at the new, still wet, lamb, I headed for the coast. Took Green Valley Rd to near Occidental, then to Jenner, via Guerneville, which was NOT the way I wanted to go, but it was lovely. Lots of fishermen along the Russian River. The Sonoma Coast was beautiful! Ocean waters blue to blue gray, then gorgeous blues and blue-greens along Mendocino coast.

Stopped at 12 in Pt. Arena for a hamburger and coffee. Stopped in Fort Bragg to fill gas tank. Clouds increased going north. Counted no more than 10 cars on hwy. 208 to Leggett. Ran into some light rain for about an hour. No rain around Humboldt Bay.

Home by 5:10.

Bill came in around 7.
Watched some TV.

46°F. 7:30 A.M. Mostly clear. worked on SC business, made phone calls to Julie (A.M.) and to LCP's Lois Ewen in Coronado (p.m.). Talked briefly with Herb Klarev.

Did some copy work at Lintas for Julie and Paula Caswell re. Sinkyone.

Had to do a SC list for HCL by long hand - miss the typewriter.

Wild current, elderberry bushes, and lots of other things are beginning to "burst."
The red rhododendron is a great mass of flowers now.

43°F. 7:30 A.M. Variable clouds. 1984 38th day-328 days follow

Talked with Paula Cancell on SC business.

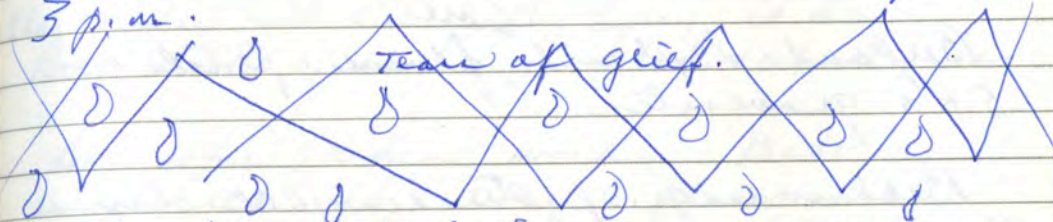

Drove to Big Flat to meet raft people, then a shuttle to Pigeon Point where we put-in around 11:50. Mary Abbott, Andy Alm, Deborah Heindman, Rod + Jena, 2 others, Mark Larson. Bill Perico were some of the participants. Andy did NOT go with us - he had done it day before.

7 in paddle raft; 4 in oar boat (raft). Bill went in paddle raft. I rode in other.

The river was beautiful - liquid Trinity River deep green jade. There were other rafters and a group of expert-type canoeist who provided color and exciting rapid runs to watch.

A class 3 run for us covering 8 miles. Some wet, tricky rapids, handled well by guides Mary, Jena and Deborah. Rod had 7 years past experience to rely on. We had an extended lunch stop about $\frac{1}{2}$ way down river. Some went for quick swims in deep, cold pools. We were hardly aware of the highway nearby.

Back at Big Flat take-out point, it was warm and turning very windy.

Phoned Annamaria around 9. We planned to meet for lunch at 1:00 at the Red Lion Inn. Joining us were her close friends Ida Francisconi and Kathleen Halvorsen.

1968 (Lucille & Jean)

We chose not to go to the top of the mesa to visit Sky City because the road suddenly became very sandy. We were dubious as to the rental car's ability to negotiate the terrain. We then turned back via another road, 14 miles of smoothed down sandstone, to reach the main highway again. Arrived at Grants around 7:00 P.M. Found a motel and relaxed awhile before walking across the highway for dinner. Less wind here tonight - even at 6420' elevation. Also warmer. In bed by 10:30.

April 25 Up fairly early (for us) - around 6:45. Showered, in-room coffee, and underway at 8:00 A.M. Decided to have a solid breakfast before heading into the "unknown", so ate at a quaint little trailer cafe in Thoreau, just off 66, east of Gallup. The quaint little cafe was operated by an interesting female type, who might have stepped out of the pages of Steinbeck's "Grapes of Wrath". The place was clean, the food good, and she was very pleasant.

Headed out to Crownpoint. Here was a large boarding school, the high school which Van Epsitty had attended. We photographed the area, asked directions to a road that would get us to Two Gray Hills, and went on through the vast reservation, with hogans and houses widely scattered and sheep and goats, horses and cows also widely scattered. Forage was sparse. In the distance loomed Shiprock, visible from nearly 100 miles away. A brief stop at Buffalo Springs to pick up some lunch type nibbles and scan Indian goods. Went on north to Newcomb, turned on dirt road to Two Gray Hills Trading Post. Spent short time there. Jean picked up two small rugs. No others available. (Collectors and NPS buyers had already been around). Proceeded to Toadlena. Large boarding school there. Inquired about possibility of going over mountains to Crystal. Were advised against it (with the low slung Ford) because of recent heavy snowfall. Returned to main highway by another route, recently paved. Drove south to Sheep Springs, inquired again about route to Crystal. Continued south to Gamerco, where we turned west to highway that would get us to Window Rock. Quick drive around Window Rock, then on to Fort Defiance and to Lukachukai to visit Totso Trading Post. There we spent a couple of hours - chose rugs, concha belt and squaw belt. Left there at 7 o'clock (with bags of popcorn to munch on) and went on north to Tes-Nez-Pah for the night. (The Lukachukai area was beautiful - glowing reddish-gold and purple in the late afternoon light.) We stayed at the small motel at Tes-Nez-Iah on route 164 (from Kayenta to Shiprock) - all new four years ago. Had cold sandwiches and coffee for dinner, being too late for the griddle to be in use, and got to bed by 9:30.

April 26 Lovely morning - scenery beautiful as we back-tracked part way. Took Canyon de Chelly turn-off to get to road to Crystal, which was five miles of good paved road off main route.

Low perennial herb with slender rootstocks. Leaves basal, divided or compound. Stems scapose, bearing 1 to 3 white flowers. Sepals 5 to 7, petal-like. Petals 5 to 7, small, linear, hooded above. Stamens 10 to 25. Pistils 10 to 12, stipitate, in fruit forming an umbel of follicles. (Greek koptein, to cut, referring to the divided leaves.)

1. C. Laciniata Gray. Scapes 2 or 3 flowered, 4 to 6 in. high; leaves trifoliolate, each leaflet deeply 3 to 5 cleft or divided, or more or less completely replaced by 3 separate leaflets; leaflets ovate, serrate or incised, 3/4 to 2 in. long; sepals slender, 4 to 5 lines long, the slender petals a third shorter; follicles 4 to 6 lines long, exceeding the stipes. -- Woods near the coast from Mendocino Co. to Del Norte Co.; n. to Wash.
