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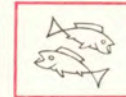

a hefty roast beef and cheese sandwich
made up at Hitchins Grocery in North Town.
Drove to Vista point overlooking Eel River
for $\frac{1}{2}$ hour lunch and mail reading
stop. Kept going then without a
break all the way to the Sea Ranch -
just south of the Gualala River. A lot of
rain falling, heavy at times, as near
Garberville and Leggett. Occasional
light breaks in the clouds. Went over
208 (Leggett to Westport). Ocean was rough
looking - all grey and white and whipped
by winds.

Arrived at our "retreat" house around
5:20 - before dark, which allowed me to
follow directions easily. A few others already
there and more came in for the night -
10 of us. Some had beds; others put
sleeping bags on floors.

Lots of heavy rain and wind hit
after dinner. House was nicely located
in trees with view of raging ocean about $\frac{1}{2}$

Home again around 1:00 P.M. just ahead of the Annual Claw Beach run participants. 4000 were expected. Bill and I looked out windows - it was so cold. Majority of runners wore shorts!
